LOOKING BOTH WAYS—A pessimist is someone who looks both directions before driving his car across a one-way street.

To avoid that run-down feeling, cross the street at intersections. Those things just popped out; I really meant to write a few things about what has happened in March in the past and what is supposed to happen in late March, in Texas, in the future.

For example, on March 25, 1843, Texan prisoners from the Mier Expedition drew black beans to determine those to be executed; 17 black beans and 159 white ones were drawn. Survivors marched to prison in Mexico City.

Sales of black beans in Texas have been very low ever since. The first April Fool's Day was very late in March, like March 32nd. In 1915 Gov. William P. Hobby signed the Primary Suffrage Bill, giving women the right to vote in Texas Primary elections. This, of course, was a major blunder (put down that bat, ladies, I am just kidding).

Looking ahead, in the Texas Events calendar, I see many activities scheduled in the Lone Star State just for the last few days in March. Here are few of the more interesting ones:

March 26-30: Race week at the Texas Motor Speedway in Fort Worth. This is a huge place out near Grapevine. The most interesting race may be by cars trying to get out of the gigantic parking lot and back onto Hwy. 114, or whatever that road is.

March 27: San Pedro Guitar Concerto at Brownsville. There are lots of guitar players, good and bad, but I don't think I will drive that far even to hear the good ones.

March 28-30: Seventh Cavalry Reenactment at Grandview. Save your Confederate money; the war isn't over yet.

March 29-30: Texas Gun and Knife Show at the Civic Center. A convention of gun nuts and slashers?

March 30: Capitol 10K race at Austin. Texas' largest race and one of the nation's top 10K runs. This must be for people whose brains are gone, but their legs are still in good shape.

March 31: Shakespeare for Kids, at Odessa's Globe Theater. Observer 1, watching a man leaving a restaurant: "Yon customer has a lean and hungry look."

Lynn County Sheriff Resigns Position Here

Lynn County Sheriff Jake Diggs has resigned his position here, submitting a letter of resignation to county officials on Friday, March 21, effective on Monday, March 31. Diggs was unavailable for comment, but County Judge H.G. Franklin told *The News* that Diggs' letter of resignation did not list any reasons for the action, but that the sheriff had told him he was leaving for "personal reasons," and not because of any issues with other county officials.

Franklin reported the resignation to county commissioners at Monday morning's regular meeting, but no action was taken regarding filling the position.

"We will most likely have to post the position and take applications for an interim sheriff," Judge Franklin told *The News*.

In the meantime, Chief Deputy at the Sheriff's Office is Jerry D. Franklin, who is the head officer during the absence of the sheriff.

Diggs was appointed interim sheriff by commissioners in October 1998 and then was elected sheriff in the 2000 election. His term would have been up in 2004, when the next general election occurs.

Diggs moved to Lynn County in

1984 and began working at the Sheriff's Dept. in October of 1986. During his law enforcement career in Lynn County, Diggs has served as a deputy, Chief Deputy, and as Sheriff.

In other business at Monday's meeting, commissioners approved internet service at the Lynn County Law Enforcement Center in order for emergency planning to be connected with other law enforcement/emergency personnel offices, at a cost of \$15.95 per 100 hours per month.

DPS Trooper Rynn Sappington met with the court to request a new computer meeting DPS requirements for the DPS office at the Lynn County Law Enforcement Center, which

commissioners approved. Judge Franklin informed the court of the Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation's request for use of the county's radio tower, but commissioners tabled the issue until the next meeting when more information would be available.

Commissioners unanimously approved changing disposal service from Duncan Disposal to BFI, and moved to apply for official designation to the Texas Plains Trail. Monthly bills were approved as presented.

All four commissioners were present at the meeting, with Judge H.G. Franklin presiding.

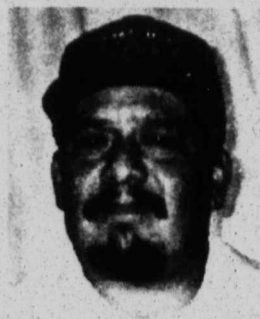

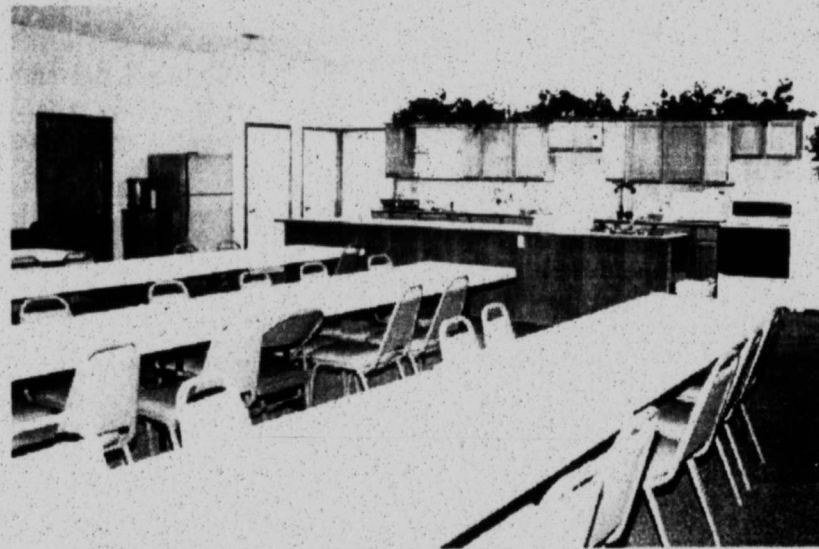

She died Sunday, Mar. 23 in Lubbock.

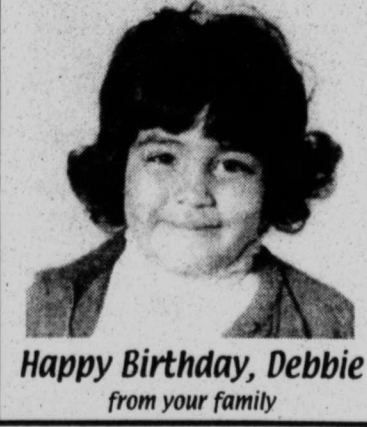

April 17 has been set for the first play day of golf at T-Bar Country Club. Play Days are held every Thursday throughout spring and summer months.

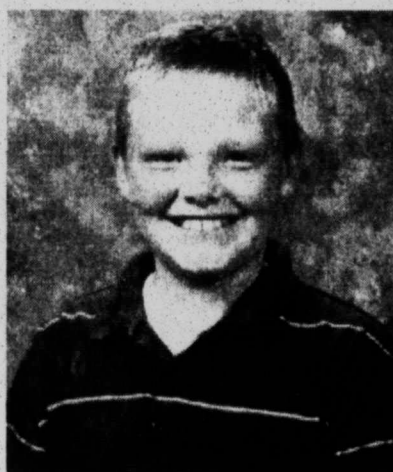
Four open golf tournaments have also been scheduled this spring and summer.

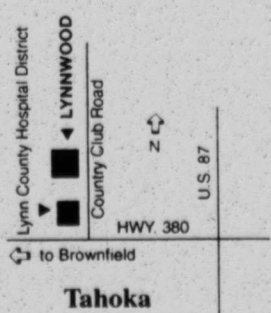

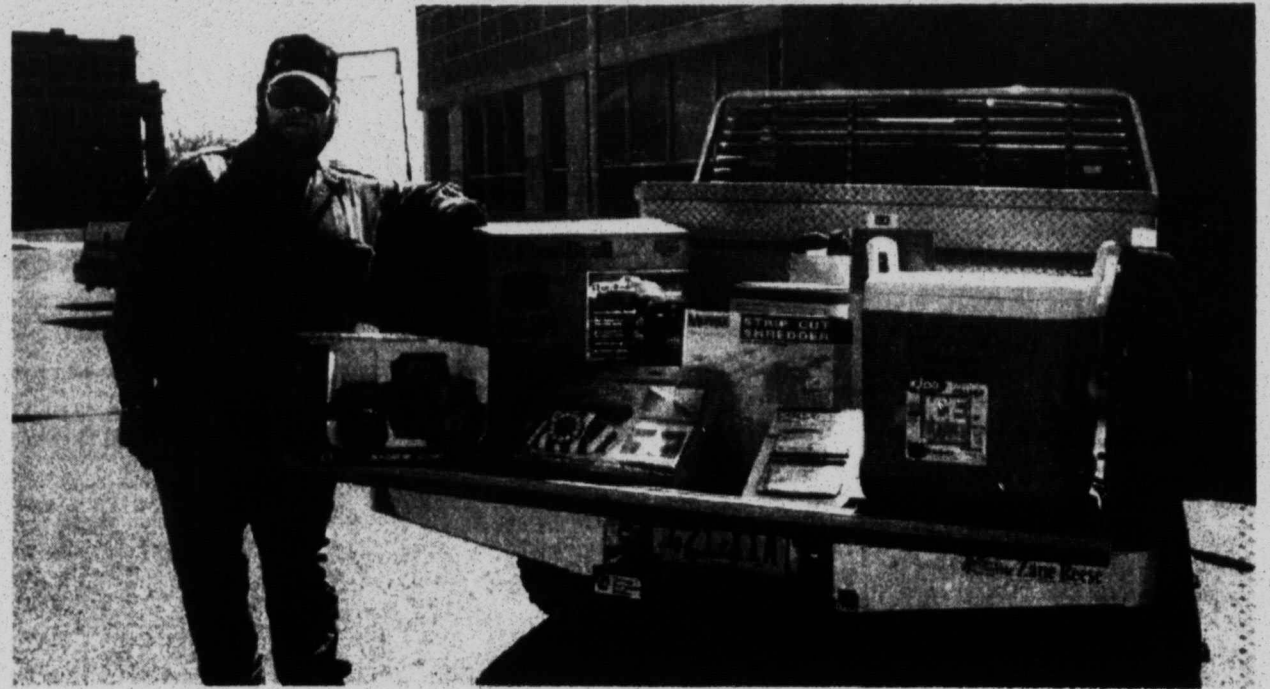
