Woodwork ... by Dalton

IF YOU WANT job security, you probably should work for a company which does road and highway repair and construction/obstruction. It is my belief that every road in the world more than 75 miles long is under construction somewhere, thereby guaranteeing that folks who work on roads always will have something to do.

One of the problems is that by the time road construction is finished on one section of a highway, especially those supposed to be four-lane, it is time for repairs on that section which carried twice the normal load while work was being done on the other side.

Is that confusing? Well, it is just as confusing (and hazardous) to those who drive their cars and trucks through endless construction areas, trying to negotiate the Yellow Barrel Highway.

Of course, what is really needed is for the highways to last longer under the heavy loads of traffic, cars, pickups, monster pickups and SUVs and 18-wheelers. Scientists now can send people to the moon, although not many people want to go there, and they won't let me pick out who to send on a one-way ticket. But nobody has come up with a material which will last for 20 years or so on a busy highway. If someone would just invent some material that really is virtually indestructible, it would sure serve the driving public better than concrete which is nice when new, but doesn't last long.

The late Glenn Woody, of Woody Tire Co. in Lubbock, used to say in one of his radio ads that the real solution to making tires which last longer is to have concrete tires and rubber highways. This probably is not practical, just like the predictions I read years ago that one day all vehicles would float on air a few feet above the surface, as soon as somebody invents an acceptable system (I can imagine the kind of wrecks that would occur before all the bugs were worked out of that setup).

The idea of having super highways to move traffic faster and safer from one place to another, like driving long distances without having your way blocked or slowed down by construction.

It's a good idea, but it's not working, guys.

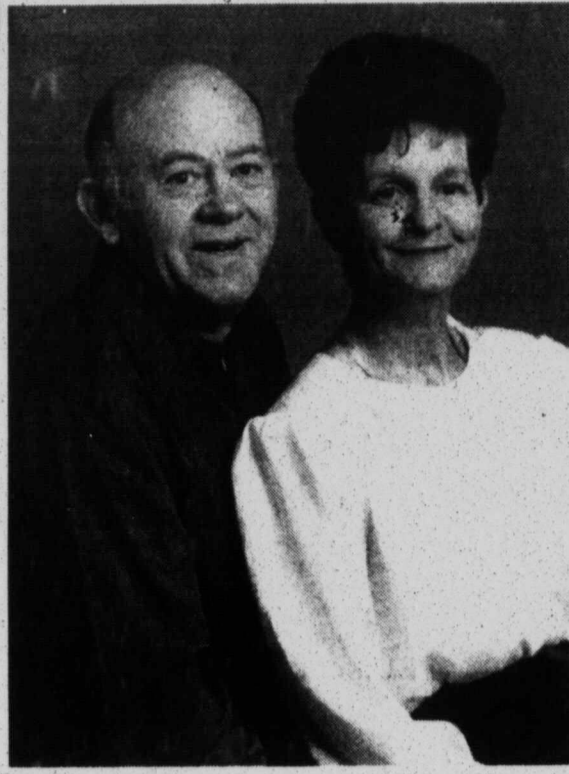

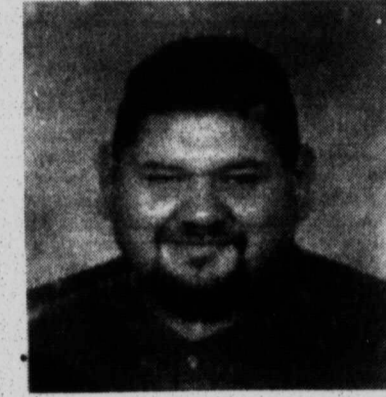

"All students, friends, family and anyone else are welcome to attend," stated Mrs. Edwards.

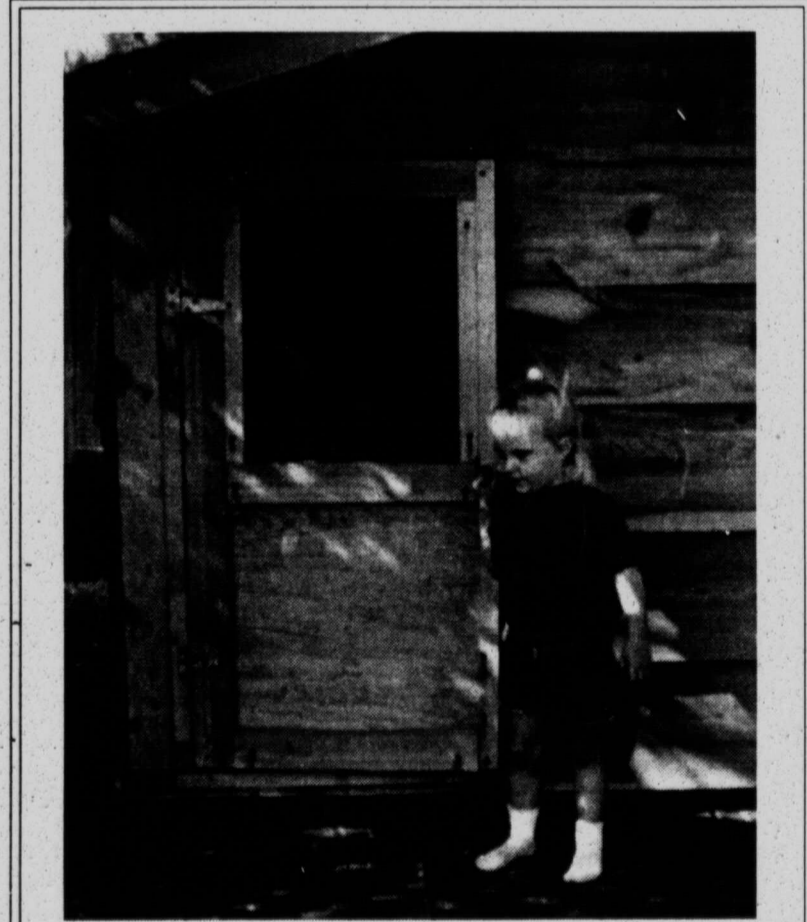
