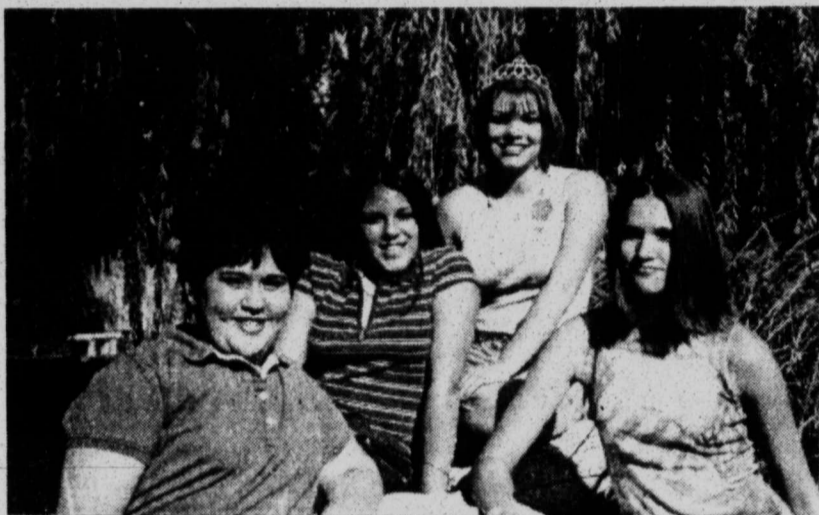

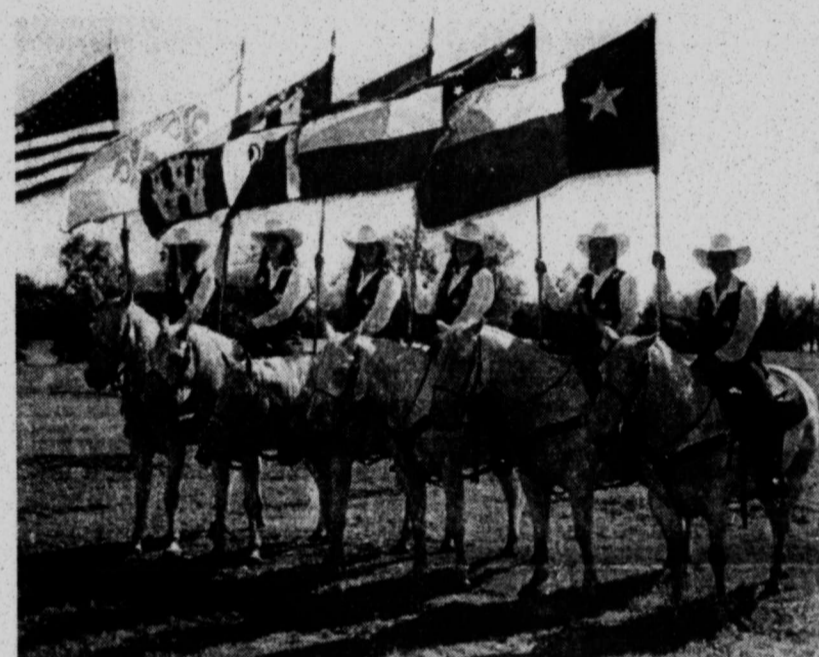

## Lynn Officers Raid 8-Liner Operation

Lynn County Sheriff's officers and state troopers from the Dept. of Public Safety Special Crimes Service and highway patrol last Sunday afternoon raided an eight-liner operation in Lynn County near the Lubbock County line.

Cash and more than 100 machines were confiscated by the officers, who said that the 8-liner game

room was operating illegally by paying cash prizes to winners.

According to Sheriff Bob Wilson the game room on U.S. 87 less than a mile south of the Lubbock County line had been under investigation for more than a month.

The amount of cash seized was not disclosed by the sheriff's department.

Neither the operators of the business nor any of the customers were arrested or charged at the time of the raid. However, if customers accept cash prizes they reportedly are breaking the law and subject to fines up to \$500, according to a story in the *Lubbock Avalanche-Journal* Tuesday.

The raids were coordinated with raids in Lubbock, where 25 of the customers also were arrested, according to one source.

Wilson said he hoped that Sunday's raid sends the message that Lynn County does not want to become the eight-liner capital of West Texas.

He did note that in Tahoka, there are other eight-liner operations, so called because there are eight ways to win a prize. However, he stressed that eight-liner operations are not illegal, as long as the prize is less than 10 times the worth of one play, or \$5, whichever is less. Eight-liner operators may not give out cash prizes, however.

In other law enforcement activity during the week, Tahoka Police Dept. investigated a report from two men who said another Tahoka man had pointed a rifle at them Monday. Also investigated was a report that a Tahoka man had threatened a 65-year-old Tahoka woman, also on Monday.

Fourteen persons were taken to Lynn County jail during the last week. Four were jailed on charges of driving while intoxicated, one of these for DWI second offense plus traffic warrants and another with the added charge of failure to appear. Three others were charged with public intoxication, and charges against the remaining subjects included judgment and sentencing for unlawfully carrying a weapon, furnishing alcohol to a minor, traffic warrants, minor in consumption, possession of marijuana under two ounces, possession of a controlled substance, judgment and sentencing on theft conviction.

During the month of June, dispatchers at Lynn County Sheriff's Dept. processed 278 calls, including 126 for the county, 105 for City of Tahoka, 19 for City of O'Donnell, 24 ambulance calls and four fire alarms.

## O'Donnell Rodeo Slated Next Week

The "Biggest Little Rodeo In Texas," O'Donnell's annual rodeo, will be held July 10-12, with Six White Horses from Hardin Simmons University in Abilene performing at the parade and rodeo on Saturday. Events are held nightly at 8:30 p.m. at the rodeo grounds, and a dance will be held Friday and Saturday nights, with the band, Devil Ridge, performing.

The parade begins at 6:30 p.m. Saturday, July 12. For parade information, call 428-3463. Entries in the rodeo events will be accepted from 9 a.m. until 8 p.m. Monday, July 7. Rodeo office phone is 747-2575. Two-

phies will be presented to the best riding clubs in the parade as well as the grand entry.

Kids 10 and under may participate in the goat sacking and mutton bustin' events (no entry fees) and children ages 6 and under are invited to participate in the Stick Horse Rodeo at 5:30 p.m. Saturday in downtown O'Donnell, prior to the parade.

Saturday night after the last event, the Pro Senior Bull Riders Association will compete.

General admission is \$4.50 in advance or \$5 at the gate, reduced for children ages 12 and under to \$2.50 in advance and \$3 at the gate.

## Finances, Audit Discussed At Commissioners Meeting

Lynn County Commissioners met in routine session last Monday, June 23, discussing county finances and meeting with auditor Melvin Eaker for an update on the county audit. The auditor is still obtaining information from county offices for the complete audit. Eaker made some suggestions regarding consolidating county office accounts under the county treasurer's office, but no decisions were made by commissioners.

District Clerk Sandra Laws met with the court to request permission to pay for her temporary help from monies received from the Attorney General's office from child support cases, but commissioners tabled the request. According to minutes from the meeting, the District Clerk's office has \$800 in the budget to pay temporary help but has already paid \$3,400 to date this year. Mrs. Laws was asked to turn in any outstanding monthly reports for the auditor.

County Treasurer Janet Porterfield reported on the county's finances, informing commissioners that the county needs approximately \$140,000 per month for the next

seven months to operate for a total of \$980,000, and as of this time figures indicated that the county may be facing a deficit of about \$176,000.

Sheriff Bob Wilson reported on jail changes regarding security and commissary purchases, and said the electrical outlets in the cells needed to be removed, filled with cement and placed above the metal ceiling of each cell. He said he was also going to replace the shower rods with PVC pipe. He informed commissioners that the department has obtained seven televisions for the jail and that only shipping would have to be paid for the TVs.

Lynn County is hosting a Jail School from June 30 through July 11 at the Life Enrichment Center in Tahoka. Wilson told commissioners. He noted that all jailers must be offered the Hepatitis B serum, and that new sheriff's department vehicles were being equipped with the necessary equipment.

Commissioners voted to pay monthly bills. All four were present for the meeting led by County Judge H.G. Franklin.

## First Baptist Calls Harbison As Pastor Here

First Baptist Church of Tahoka has called Rev. Richard Harbison, currently pastor at First Baptist in Spur, to pastor the Tahoka church. Rev. Harbison holds a Master of Divinity from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, and both he and his wife, Carole, graduated from Wayland Baptist University.

Rev. Harbison has been pastor at Spur First Baptist for the past eight years. He spoke at Tahoka First Baptist on Sunday, June 29, after which the local church invited him to be their pastor. Although no date has officially been set by church officials, the new pastor and his family will probably move to Tahoka by August.

Currently, Rev. Jim Turner is interim pastor of the Tahoka church.

The Harbisons have four children, including three sons, Jackson (6), Bentley (4), and Quincey (1-1/2), and a daughter, Sarah (5 months). Richard grew up in Phillips, and Carole is from Shallowater. She holds an elementary teaching certificate.

## Hospital Orders New Sterilizer

Lynn County Hospital soon should receive a new sterilizer, a piece of equipment similar in size to a refrigerator, to sterilize all surgical and medical instruments used by any of the medical staff of the hospital.

The old sterilizer, at least 20 years old, just barely works and will be dismantled, said hospital administrator Dan Powers, who added that the new one already should be in shipment. The sterilizer will cost about \$27,000 with a \$15,000 grant approved for part of the payment.

Powers told the hospital board at its regular monthly meeting last Wednesday that the hospital also plans to use the O'Donnell ambulance on occasion as a backup ambulance. It also is expected to be put in service for O'Donnell football games. O'Donnell no longer has qualified ambulance personnel, and the community now is served by Lynn County EMS, based at the hospital in Tahoka.

The board approved medical staff privileges for Lubbock radiologist Dr. Steven White, and authorized Powers to proceed as necessary on a lawsuit against a Lubbock health insurance firm for recovery of payments made by the hospital to some employees.

Board vice president Jerry Ford presided in the absence of board president Billy Tomlinson. Also present were members Joan Knox, Virginia Griffing, and Dalton Wood.

## Three Resign At Tahoka ISD

Three teachers have resigned their positions at Tahoka Independent School District, according to information from Superintendent Jimmy Parker this week. One teacher from each campus has resigned, including sixth grade teacher Tim Tatum, middle school science teacher Leslie Hunt-Bond, and high school teacher/coach Brent John, head baseball coach for the Bulldogs. He taught government, economics and world geography at the high school.

The superintendent said no new teachers have been employed as yet, but that the school board will meet in regular session next Thursday, July 10.

### Elias Paniagua, Sr.

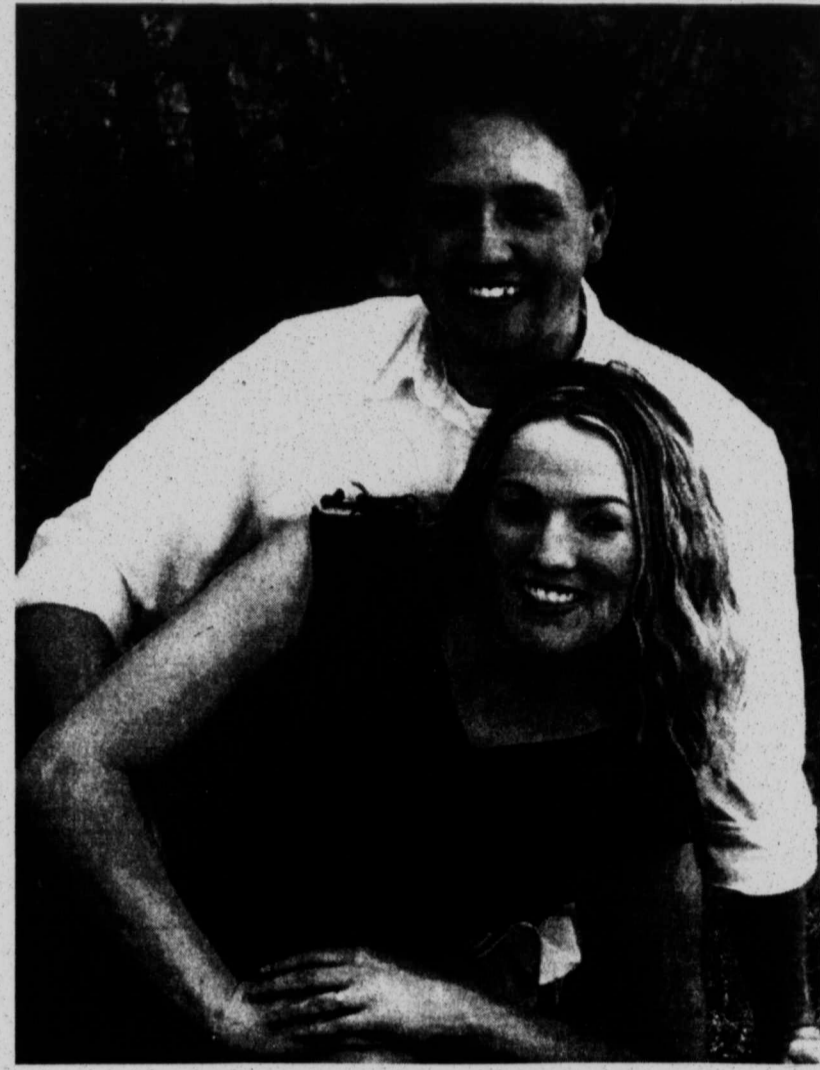

The Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) has notified the City of Wilson water system that the drinking water being supplied to customers had exceeded the Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for FLUORIDE. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) has established the MCL for Fluoride at 4mg/L, and has determined that it is a health concern at levels above the MCL. Analysis of drinking water in your community for FLUORIDE indicates a level of 3.8 MG/L.  
This is not an emergency. However, some people who drink water containing FLUORIDE in excess of the MCL over many years could get bone disease, including pain and tenderness of the bones. Fluoride in drinking water at half the MCL or more may cause mottling of children's teeth, usually in children less than nine years old. Mottling, also known as dental fluorosis, may include brown staining and/or pitting of the teeth, and occurs only in the developing teeth before they erupt from the gums.  
You do not need to use an alternative water supply. However, if you have health concerns you may want to talk to your doctor to get more information about how this may affect you.  
The City of Wilson has inquired about getting an Reverse Osmosis plant to deal with this problem and without the help from grants this system has been too costly to put in at this time. The City is also looking for alternative water supply sources.
