Suspects In Kidnap, Burglary Nabbed; Armed Robbers Sought

Two suspects in an armed robbery early Sunday morning at O'Donnell were being sought this week, and officers also arrested suspects in a car theft and burglary and another suspect in a Lubbock kidnapping.

A clerk at Allsup's store in O'Donnell told sheriff's officers that a white couple, both small and slender, robbed the store at gunpoint about 2:30 a.m. Sunday, pointing the gun at the clerk and ordering him to place money from the register into a bag, He said the woman came in first. keeping the clerk occupied while the



Tahoka Independent School District Board of Trustees met last Thursday, hearing several reports including the district's financial audit for 2002-03. Greg Gilbert, representing Bolingar, Segars, Gilbert and Moss, presented the audit to the board, which was approved unanimously.

Trustees conducted public hearings on the district's State Financial Accountability Rating, which was rated as "Superior", and on the district's Academic Excellence Indicator System rating of "Academically Recognized." Superintendent Jimmy Parker and Sherri McCord, Director of Curriculum, presented the information at the meeting. The district's rating was also reviewed on the "No Child Left Behind" federal law

The District Campus Improvement Plan was approved, and school trustees voted to join the Alvarado Interveners in the West Orange-Cove case regarding school funding.

Supt. Parker reported the resignation of Dana McKay, a teaching assistant at the high school campus. In his report, the superintendent also noted that old yearbooks from the school would be displayed at the Tahoka Pioneer Museum. Campus principals presented reports, as did Nathan Ehlert, Business Manager.

Present at the meeting were six of seven trustees, with trustee Leighton Knox Jr. absent. The next meeting was scheduled for Dec. 11 at 7 p.m. in the Harvick Educational Building.

Wilson Independent School District officials recently closed the deal on a property purchase for the school district, after approving the purchase in their October board meeting. In the October WISD board

meeting trustees met in closed session to discuss the purchase of real property located at 1502 Green Avenue, and upon returning to open session unanimously approved the purchase. According to Superintendent Mike Jones, the purchase price of the property was \$63,000 with the district paying most of the closing costs. The appraised value of the house was \$74,000 in December of 2001.

The residence will be owned by the district for housing the superintendent and family. Wilson ISD owns several homes in Wilson for staff housing, including the current house of the superintendent.


