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Cotton Crop Looks Good For County Producers

The 2005 cotton crop is progressing nicely for Lynn County, with approximately 300,000 acres of cotton currently growing in the county. "Overall, the crop looks good at this time," said Bryan Reynolds, County Extension Agent for Lynn County.

There were some problems earlier in the growing season with some of the cotton, the agent said, noting that dry areas in the soil, nematodes and blowing sand were the major contributors to some of the problems. However, this cotton has recovered and is trying to get back on track, he predicted.

"We certainly have not seen the heavy rainfall that we saw during the last part of July in 2004, but the recent rainfall will be beneficial to the crop," Reynolds said.

"In some areas, producers were able to turn off irrigation systems last week which will help in terms of production costs. However, many of the systems were not turned off and continue to run as cotton enters its highest demand point in terms of water usage," Reynolds said.

"Most fields are going into peak bloom now and are using as much as .25 to .40 inches of water per day," stated Reynolds. "As those blooms turn to bolls and fiber development begins, the plant uses a great deal of water," said Reynolds. Limitations on water during this time affect yield in the end, according to the agent.

"August is a critical time due to the bolls developing and filling with fiber. We need all the help we can get in terms of available water for the plant to fill those bolls - if moisture is limited, the cotton plant compensates by shedding squares and bolls that it knows it cannot sustain," Reynolds explained.

The biggest problem this year has been weeds. With the record rainfall in 2004, weeds have done extremely well in 2005. "Producers continue to make herbicide applications and have crews hoeing fields to help control those weeds," said Reynolds.

From May 15 through August 1, the Tahoka weather station has accumulated 1469 heat units compared to 1505 heat units for the same time in 2004. "We remain pretty much on track for 2005 as compared to our long term heat unit accumulation," stated Reynolds.

Heat units are a measure of temperature where the high and low temperatures are added together, then divided by 2 and then a constant of 60 is subtracted to determine heat units. It takes 2300 to 2600 heat units for a typical cotton crop to mature.

"The telling factor for this year's crop will be the weather conditions this fall. Producers could use another good rain in August and warm, dry weather throughout the fall to finish out this crop," Reynolds concluded.

Tahoka's Head Football Coach Steve Heryford (right) began instructing the Bulldogs in the art of football during two-a-day practices which started Monday morning. Although Heryford came to Tahoka ISD in February from an assistant coaching position in San Angelo, this is his first season to lead the Bulldogs. He was born in Midland and graduated from Greenwood High School there. While coaching at San Angelo Central High School, his team won district, bi-district and regional championships, and tripled their win total from the previous two years. He was head football coach from 2000-2003 at San Felipe/Del Rio CISD, when his team won 20 games in four years with a program that had only won one game the previous three years. Two-a-day practices continue here in preparation for the Bulldog season, which opens with a home game against Sundown on Aug. 26. A couple of scrimmages are also scheduled, here against O'Donnell on Aug. 13, and at Crosbyton on Aug. 19.

Three persons were added to the jail list during the last week, and the total jail population as of Wednesday was 42, including 13 for Lubbock County and one for Garza County.

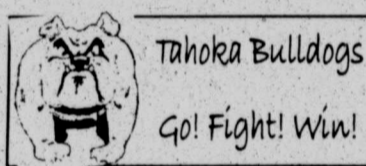
Pride Corp To Sell T-Shirts

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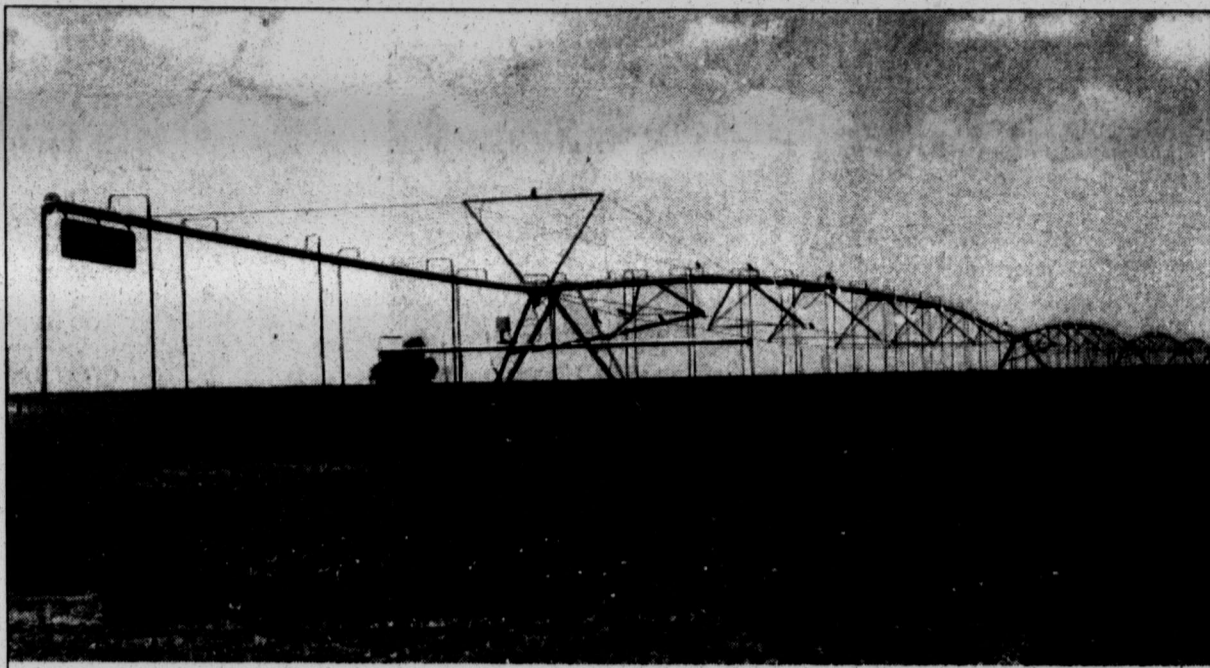

FSA Extends County Committee Nomination Deadline To Aug. 15

County farmers have an extra two weeks until August 15 to decide if they would like to serve on the Farm Service Agency County Committee or nominate one of their neighbors to run for election. According to Jimmy Woodard, FSA County Executive Director, the county committee nomination period has been extended to Aug. 15 in order to ensure producers have sufficient time to nominate candidates.

The nominations would be from the area in the North West part of Lynn County known as Community "A" (LAA #1). Elections are held each year for a County Committee member for one community each year in a rotation system allowing one member elected each year. The term of the elected committee member is three years. Election for Community "B" (LAA #2) located on the East side of Lynn County will be next year.

"The extension will give agency personnel, community-based groups, farmer organizations and others more time to continue their outreach efforts," Woodard said.

The FSA county committee applies its judgment and knowledge to make decisions on county price-support loan eligibility, establishment of allotments and yields, conservation programs, disaster programs, employment and other federal farm program-related issues.

Individuals may nominate themselves or others as a candidate. In addition, eligible candidates can be nominated by community-based and other organizations in the county before the close of the nomination period.

Nominations and elections are open to all eligible candidates and voters without regard to race, color, religion, nation origin, age, sex, marital status or disability. The

nomination form (FSA-669A) is available at the county office and online at <http://www.fsa.usda.gov/pas/publications/elections/>.

Producers should keep in mind several important dates regarding the upcoming county committee elections. Producers can request, fill out and submit nomination forms up to Aug. 15, 2005. Ballots will be mailed to eligible voters by Nov. 4, 2005. The deadline to return ballots is Dec. 5, 2005.

Elected committee members and alternates take office on Jan. 1, 2006.

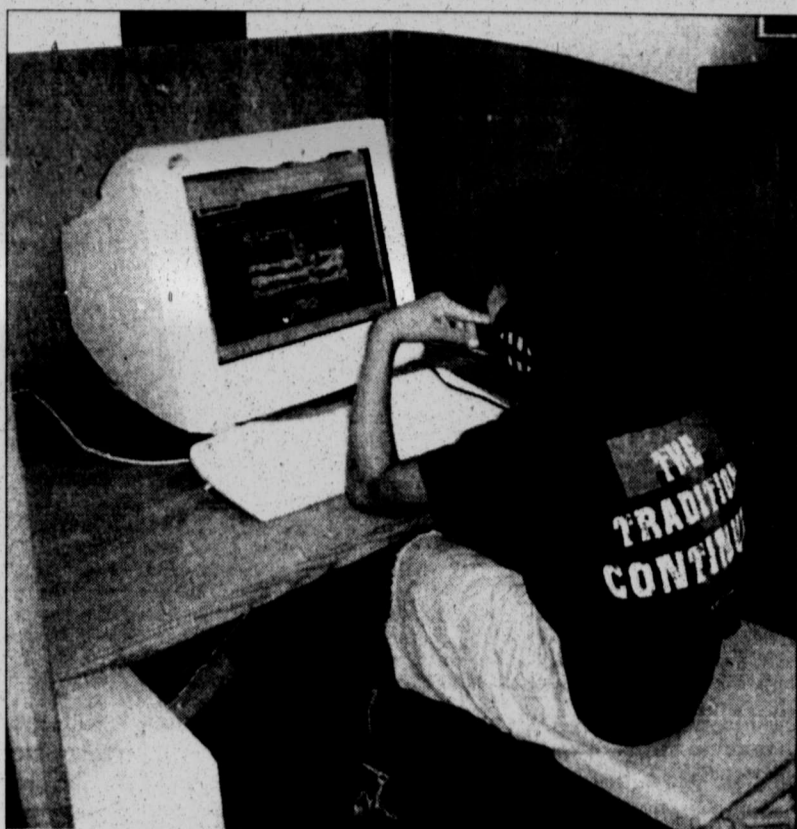

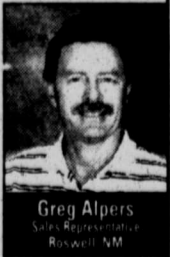
