Three Hurt In Wrecks During Week

Three traffic accidents were reported on highways in Lynn County during the last week, the latest involving a pickup and trailer, a cow on the road, and a module truck.

About 8:30 p.m. Tuesday on FM 1317 west of U.S. 87 a 1998 Ford F450 pickup pulling a trailer and driven by Rodrigo Chavarria, 40, of Tahoka, struck a cow on the roadway. A module truck behind the pickup swerved to avoid a collision and went into a ditch. Chavarria was taken by EMS ambulance to Lynn County Hospital, where he was treated for a minor injury to his thumb, and then released. No other injuries were reported.

Two traffic accidents south of Tahoka on U.S. 87 were investigated by DPS troopers, one last Wednesday and one early Sun-

About 4:30 a.m. Sunday an 18-wheeler overturned and slid into the median of U.S. 87 about 6 miles south of Tahoka, scattering a load of cottonseed over the roadway. Driver of the truck, Oscar Rivera, 55, of Sebastian TX, was taken by Lynn County EMS ambulance to Lynn County Hospital and later transferred to a Lubbock hospital for treatment of leg and neck injuries. He remained hospitalized as of late Tuesday.

Last Wednesday 80-year-old Hilda Tiedermann of Mississippi was traveling from Portales, NM to San Angelo when her car overturned 3.4 miles south of Tahoka in a construction zone. She was treated for apparent minor injuries at Lynn County Hospital and released. She was transported by Lynn County EMS ambulance.

Tahoka Police investigated a report that a 4-year-old boy had been bitten by a dog. The dog was penned for observation.

Police also investigated a fight between three pre-teens, and a report from a convenience store employee that a man had exposed himself in the store early in the morning of Oct. 24. Pol ce also arrested an 18-year-old man on a outstanding warrant for application to revoke probation.

During the month of October, dispatchers at Lynn County Sheriff's Dept. processed 243 calls, including 107 for Tahoka Police, 100 for the county, 16 ambulance calls, 6 fire calls and 14 for O'Donnell Police.

New Voting Machines fill up basement corner ...

Lynn County Clerk Susan Tipton stands amid a multitude of boxes and cases which were delivered to the County Courthouse last week, holding the 15 new electronic voting machines and related equipment for the county. Training for election officials will be conducted Dec. 13-14, and county officials plan to have public demonstrations of the equipment before the March 2006 primary elections, when the equipment will first be used in an election. Total cost of the equipment was \$153,790, which was completely funded by a grant, at no cost to the county. "Anyone who is worried about learning to vote on the new equipment can call us at the County Clerk's office, and we will set up a time for them to come in for some 'hands-on' training on this new equipment," says Mrs. Tipton, adding that after the December training session she hopes to have a machine set up at all times in her office for the public to learn how to use. Polls Open

County from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. Tuesday. Nov. 8 for voting in the Special Election to adopt or reject the proposed Constitutional Amendments as submitted by the 79th Leg-

Early voting continues through Friday at the County Clerk's Office at the Lynn County Courthouse. As of Tuesday afternoon, 81 early voters had marked ballots.

There will be four voting locations open Tuesday in the county, with Boxes 1, 5, 6, 7, 9, 12 and 14 at the Lynn County Courthouse: Boxes 2 and 8 at Wilson City Hall (Green Museum); Boxes 3 and 10 at O'Donnell High School; and Boxes 4, 11 and 13 at Now Home City Hall. Voting will be with peper ballots as in previous elections, with the new electronic voting machines not yet available for election use.

There are nine propositions on the ballot. Proposition 2, which upholds a ban on same-sex marriages in Texas and prohibits political subdivisions from creating or recognizing any legal status for same-sex marriages, is the most publicized amendment.

A voter's guide explaining the nine proposed amendments, with arguments for and against, is available at the Lynn County Clerk's Office.

I may have a touch of it already, since I am beginning to waddle like a duck, and when I have to drive on a really busy Interstate highway, I start feeling kind of

The MSN homepage on my computer said that President Bush was determined to keep bird flu out of the U.S., and was asking Congress for \$7.18 to develop vaccine. They left off the word "billion". For a little over seven bucks, it ought to be worth it. The President wants to develop a vaccine which will work only on people who voted Republican.

Well, okay, he didn't say that, but he is worried about bird flu as well as other kinds of flu. He kept talking about a "pandemic," which, I guess, is an epidemic gone crazy. We don't need that.

IN THIS issue of *The News* is a picture of costly new voting machines which voters must use in any election after the current balloting on proposed Texas constitutional amendments. The government has mandated that these voting machines will be used, and there will be seminars to show people how to use

Regardless, I predict that the result of this latest Big Brothering will be to keep more people away from the polls. Already the turnout of voters in even hotly contested elections is low. With voters now required to use machines, many will just say, "Forget this - I'm not going to the trouble of messing with those machines!" And they will just skip the voting process.

I like the old way of doing things. So what if it does take longer to count? The best way to vote on somebody is to put all the voters in a room and ask for a show of hands by everybody who wants Sen. Whoozit to stay up there in Washington and not ever come back here.

Free testing by qualified healthcare personnel is available for glucose, cholesterol, Hemoglobin and bone density. Participants also may check their blood pressure and oxygen saturation level. Information about Home Health, Hospice care and Swingbed hospitalization also will be available.

New to the Health Fair this year will be education classes on diabetes, heart attack and men's health, all conducted by local healthcare personnel. These sessions will be held as follows: 9:00-9:15 a.m. and 1:00-1:15 p.m.- Diabetic Teaching by Dr. Griffith Thomas; 9:30-9:45 a.m. and 1:30-

1:45 p.m. - Heart Attack Education by Dr. Donald Freitag; 10:00-10:15 a.m. and 2:00-2:15 p.m. - Men's Health by John Benson, PA; 10:30-10:45 a.m. and 2:30-2:45 p.m. -Home Health Education by NursCare; 11:00-11:15 a.m. and 3:00-3:15 p.m. -Swingbed Information by Joey Quintana, RN; and 11:30-11:45 a.m. and 3:30-3:45 p.m. - Hospice Care Information by NursCare.

Men and women are welcome to the health fair. Two health fairs are planned this year, one for adults and one for children and teens. The children's health fair will be on Nov. 11 at the Tahoka Elementary gym.

Flu shots will be available next week in Tahoka and Wilson. The vaccine will be available Wednesday. Nov. 9, from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Senior Citizens Center in Tahoka: and on Thursday Nov. 10, the vaccine will be given at the Wilson City Hall at 10:00 a.m.

The flu shot will cost \$20 for private pay. Cash in the exact amount, or a cheek, will be accepted.

"If you have medical insurance as your payer source, your shot will need to be administered in your physician's office. If you are on Medicare, please bring your card with you," said a representative.

THS Band Makes Finals At Area Marching Contest





Signup Dates Set For County's "Christmas For Kids"







Scott Dimak Inducted Into SFA Athletic Hall of Fame

Tahoka resident Scott Dimak letterman during the 1985 to 1989 was inducted into the Stephen F. Austin State University Athletic Hall of Fame during ceremonies held at halftime of the Oct. 29 SFA vs. Southeastern Louisiana football game, during the university's annual Homecoming weekend celebration in Nacogdoches. Former SFA Eumberjacks Greg Chapman of Houston and the late Bennis Franks of Lufkin were also inducted during the cer-

We had a great weekend – it was a nice honor," said Dimak, adding that he and his wife, Rehecca, and daughters. McKenzie and Maci. staved in a guest room of the dorm where he had lived while attending SFA. "I got to see a couple of my coaches, and some people that I knew. They did the presentation of the plaques during halftime of the football game, but we also got to ride in the homecoming parade and other activities. It brought back a fot of memories," he added.

Dimak said that SFA officials would display his photo in the athletic field house and at the basketball coliseum as a Hall of Fame inductee.

A native of Metairie, La., Dimak had a successful high school hasketball career at Class 5A Archbishop Rummel High School where he was named Most Valuable Player for the district and the City of New Orleans and received First Team All-State honors. He also received the Rufus Award as Rummel High School's most outstanding athlete his senior

He joined the SFA Lumberjack basketball squad and was a four-year erative in Tahoka.

Dimak was a point guard on the 1986-87 team that won the Gulf Star Conference championship. In 1985, Dimak finished No. 4 in the nation in three-point, field-goal percentage. He also was SFA's leading scorer in the 1988-89 season with a 19.9 average that placed him third in the Southland Conference standings. He represented SFA as a member of the Conference All Stars in a basketball tour of Scotland.

During his senior year at SFA, he set the Conference record for most consecutive free throws made - 32 in a row. He was the first Lumberjack in 14 years to break into the top 10 all time scorer's list, and was the 8th all time leading scorer in the history of SFA with 1406 points.

Dimak continues among the Top 10 SFA record holders with the following statistics: No. 3 in most assists in a career with 341; No. 4 in free throws made with 341; No. 4 in most points in a single game with 40 against Texas Southern in 1989; No. 6 in free throw percentage with 80.8 percent (341 of 422 attempts); No. 7 in most games played with 110; No. 8 in leading scorer in SFA basketball history with 1,406 points; No. 8 in free throws attempted with 422; No. 9 in most free throws made during a game with 14 on two separate occasions; No. 10 in most assists in a game with 10; and No. 10 in field goal attempts for a career with 988.

Dimak graduated from SFA in 1990 with a degree in business administration. He is an accountant with Poka Lambro Telephone Coop-
