

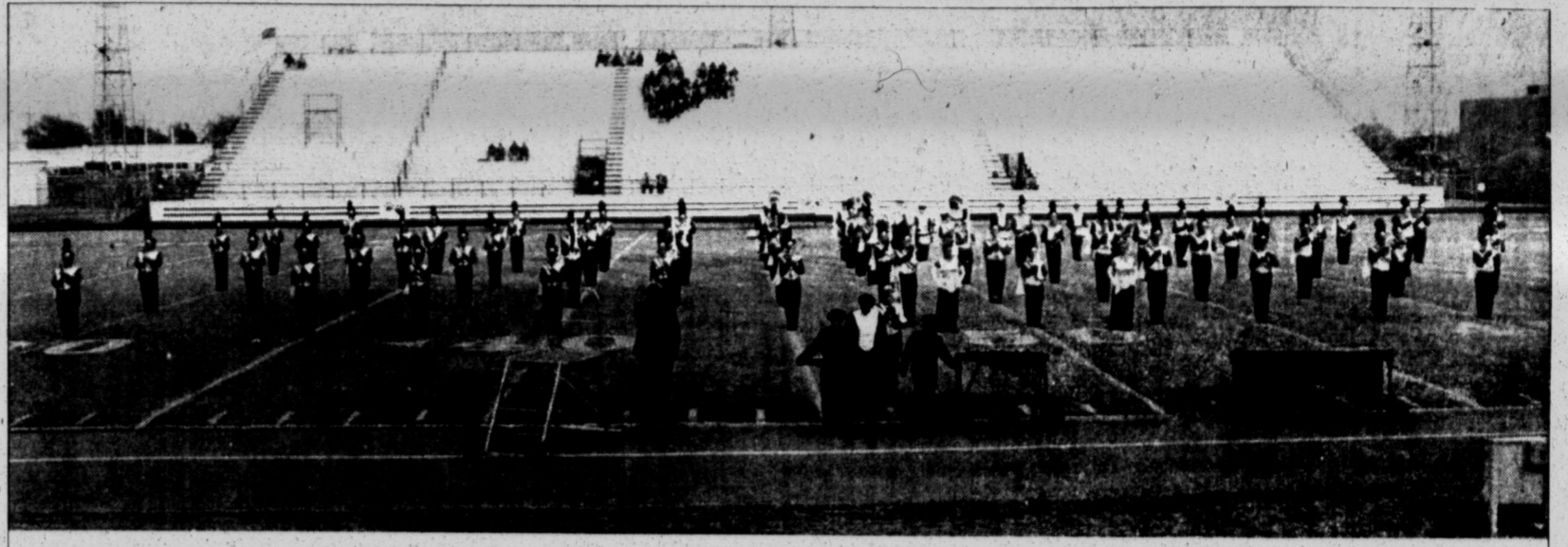
THS Band Makes Finals At Area Marching Contest

The Tahoka High School 3-D Band, for only the second time in its history, competed at the Area A Marching Contest in Plainview this past Saturday, October 29. In competition against 17 bands from the four regions of Lubbock, Amarillo, Midland-Odessa, and El Paso, they placed in the finals for the first time ever. They marched initially at 6 p.m. then qualified for the finals where they marched again at 10:45 p.m. The 3-D Band placed seventh overall, their best showing ever. Since there are five regions in the state of Texas, of the 211 2A schools in Texas, the Tahoka 3-D Band was in the top 35 2A bands in the state.

Directors Carroll Rhodes and Lora Smith stated, "We are extremely proud of these outstanding young people and their performances

Saturday. After the prelims, when we found out we had advanced to the finals, we told the young people what the judges said they needed to do. They then went out to the finals extremely focused and did exactly what we asked them to do, marching and playing the best that they had all year. Unfortunately, UIL did not video tape the finals. If anyone has a video, please let us know."

In addition, Tahoka as usual had two to three times more fans than any band there. "There were 200+ people in the stands not only at the 6 p.m. marching time but there were well over 100 there for the finals at 10:45 p.m. That was awesome! What was even more wonderful was that many of the fans had on Incredible masks. If nothing else, Tahoka has State Quality fans. You are super!" added Rhodes.

Signup Dates Set For County's "Christmas For Kids"

"Christmas For Kids," which provide Christmas gifts for needy Lynn County children, began taking applications from families on Saturday, Oct. 29, and four other application dates will be available.

Other signup dates, which will be held at the Lynn County Courthouse basement courtroom, are on Nov. 8, 5:30-7 p.m.; Nov. 12, 10 a.m. until noon; Nov. 22, 5:30-7 p.m.; and Dec. 3, 10 a.m. until noon. No applications will be accepted after Dec. 3.

Applicants must have WIC, Medicaid or Food Stamp Card before their application can be taken, and applicants must provide photo identification, proof of address (such as a utility bill), a physical address and mailing address, and a contact phone number. Only children actually living in the home will be eligible, and each family must fill out their own application. Children under 1 year and up to the age of 14 will be accepted if funding is available. No one over age 14 is accepted, and any false information will result in denial for all children in the family.

Families will be contacted when their gifts are ready for pickup. Those who have not received a call by Dec. 21 are asked to call the Lynn County Treasurer's Office at 561-4055. No packages will be released to a child.

Cats Scratch Dogs 28-0

 After it looked like Idalou was going to blow out the Tahoka Bulldogs by 50 or more points last Friday, the scrappy Bulldog defense came back in the second half to hold the visiting Wildcats scoreless, but four touchdowns in the first half still won it for Idalou, 28-0.

Tahoka's offense never could get a lot going, although early in the game, an apparent touchdown play of 40 yards for the Bulldogs was called back on a penalty.

This week Coach Steve Heryford will take the Bulldogs to Slaton for the final game of the season. Slaton, somewhat like Tahoka, has been an up-and-down team, losing big to Idalou, but upsetting Post 17-7 last Friday. Slaton beat Shallowater by a point, and this and other game results would suggest that the two teams are about equal.

The Bulldogs would like a win to cap off a season which already has included three wins and the Bulldogs already have exceeded the expectations of most outside observers.

Idalou opened last Friday's game with a long drive after the kickoff, all on the ground except for the scoring play, a 4-yard pass from Jarred Dewbre to Patrick Magee. A kick by
