Brian Kingston Sworn In As New County Attorney

Brian Kingston, 47, was sworn in as the new Lynn County Attorney Monday morning, May 22, as family and friends looked on. County Judge H.G. Franklin officiated the ceremony.

Lynn County Commissioners appointed Kingston to fill the position previously held by James J. Napper, who resigned as County Attorney when he filed to run as a candidate for District Judge. Kingston will serve through Napper's original term of office, which ends in December 2008.

Kingston brings a wealth of experience to the county office, most recently serving as Assistant District Attorney in Midland County, since August 2004, prosecuting felony cases, misdemeanor cases and protective orders. For three years prior to that, Kingston was Assistant Criminal District Attorney and Chief of Special Crimes Unit and Chief of the Misdemeanor Unit in the Lubbock County District Attorney's Office. He served as Assistant District Attorney in the Travis County District Attorney's Office in Austin for nine years, from 1992-2001.

He was a staff attorney at Hammerman and Gainer in Austin, and

at Lynch, Chappell, Allday & Alsop law firm in Austin. Kingston also served a three-year stint in the Military Police with the United States Army in Fort Hood, assigned to C.I.D., investigating sensitive situations and assisting civilian law enforcement agencies.

He earned his Doctor of Jurisprudence at South Texas College of Law in Houston, and a Liberal Arts Degree at The University of Texas at Austin. He is a Certified Peace Officer for the State of Texas.

Kingston also has instructed law in various capacities, including a three-year stint as Adjunct Professor at The University of Texas School of Law in Austin, teaching trial advocacy classes to law students, and he has served as guest instructor in Austin and Lubbock, teaching legal issues regarding domestic violence, sexual assault, child abuse, family violence and penal code issues at police academies, sheriff's office academies and other training facilities.

He is a member of the Texas State Bar Association and the Texas District and County Attorney's Association.

Other THS honor graduates who are graduating in the top ten percent of their class include Samantha Lee Andrews, daughter of Karen and Ralph Huffaker, with a GPA of 4.619; Brandi Blair Raindl, daughter of Mitch and Donna Raindl, with a GPA of 4.592; and Porscha Danielle Mitchell, daughter of Terri Tillman, with a GPA of 4.495.

Wilson High School has 11 seniors graduating in commencement exercises at 7 p.m. Friday, May 26 in the Wilson Gymnasium. Amber Autry, daughter of Terri Autry and the late Brian Autry, is the WHS Valedictorian with a GPA of 3.91. Lett Hernandez, daughter of Melissa Tobias, is the Salutatorian with a GPA of 3.67.

New Home High School commencement exercises will be held at 8 p.m. tonight (Thursday) at the high school gymnasium, with 14 seniors graduating. Class Valedictorian is Katie O'Rourke, daughter of Dennis and Betty O'Rourke, who has a 4.0 GPA. Matthew Hymes is Salutatorian with a 3.8 GPA. He is the son of Terri and Dale Hymes.

O'Donnell High School graduated 35 seniors in commencement exercises held last Friday, May 19 in the Glenn and Donna Hopkins Memorial Auditorium. Rebecca Brewer was Valedictorian with a GPA of 3.51. She is the daughter of Burley and Beth Brewer. Salutatorian was Mandy Forbis, daughter of Donna and Craig Forbis, who had a 3.48 GPA.

Tahoka Independent School District Board of Trustees approved contracts for an administrative position and five new teachers, including a head football coach, at last Thursday night's board meeting, and Superintendent

Jimmy Parker announced one staff resignation. All personnel contracts were made by unanimous decision of the five trustees present at the meeting.

Alecia Hancock was named Tahoka Elementary Assistant Principal, with an annual salary of \$47,000. Mrs. Hancock has been the Physical

teacher at Tahoka Elementary for the past three years, and taught fifth grade for six years prior to that.

James (Jay) Hellums was hired as the new head football coach for Tahoka High School, and he will also teach high school science.

Hellums comes to Tahoka from Skidmore, Texas, where he has been employed at Skidmore-Tynan ISD as an IPC teacher and coach, serving as defensive coordinator, track coordinator, head golf and head powerlifting coach, since 2004. He was athletic director and head football coach at George West ISD in George West, Tx for three years prior to that, and he has

Investigating DPS trooper David Hoard said the driver was Wesley Fitzgerald, 20. The passengers were Megan Valdez, 20 and Amanda Hernandez, 21. All three were taken to Lynn County Hospital emergency room by Lynn County EMS ambulance. They were treated and released.

Another accident occurred in Tahoka Friday afternoon when a 2002 Ford Explorer driven by Albert Frances Pelton Jr., 78 of Tahoka was involved in a collision at S. 1st St. and Ave. K with a 1998 Dodge van driven by Marie Aguirre Bertreaux, 37, also of Tahoka.

There were no injuries, according to the police report.

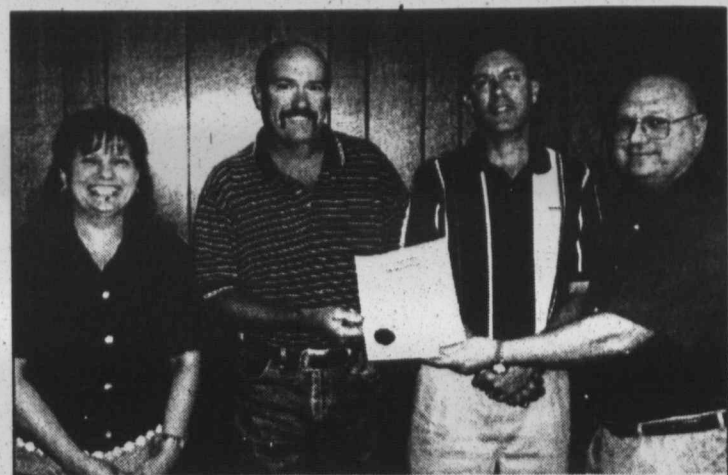
During the week Tahoka Police also took reports of ha-

assing telephone calls, an assault case involving teenagers, and made arrests for public intoxication and driving while license invalid.

Jailers again were busy at Lynn County Sheriff's Dept. during the last week, with 23 more persons booked into cells, bringing the total jail population as of Tuesday to 43, with 9 of these held for Lubbock County, 5 for Gaines and one for Garza County.

Charges for which suspects were arrested included warrants from Lubbock, Cherokee, Hale and Lynn Counties, and included the following offenses, with 10 persons facing multiple charges:

Driving while license invalid, possession of controlled substance, driving while intoxicated, public intoxication, minor in consumption of alcohol, theft of service, robbery, theft, unlawfully carrying a weapon. Most of those arrested were on charges related to drugs or alcohol.

Now, according to the article, McCartney is still energetic and enthusiastic. So I guess he is answering his own question with a demonstration of a good quality of life at the age of 64.

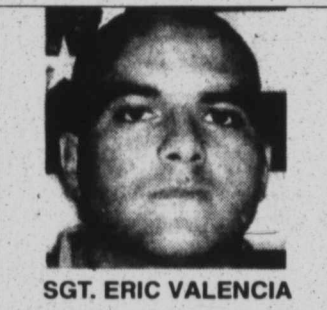

April, May Sales Tax Up Over Last Year

Texas Comptroller Carole Keeton Strayhorn said recently that state collected \$1.57 billion in sales tax revenue in April, up 17.2 percent compared to April 2005.

"The Texas economy is healthy and sales tax revenue is expanding at a pace I have not seen since I have been Texas Comptroller," Strayhorn said. Local governments are also enjoying double-digit sales tax growth. Strayhorn said local governments will receive \$501.9

million in May sales tax allocations, up 10.1 percent compared to May 2005. So far this calendar year, sales tax allocations to cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose taxing districts are up 15.3 percent compared to a year ago.

Comptroller Strayhorn sent May sales tax allocations of \$344.3 million to Texas cities, up 10.2 percent compared to May 2005. Calendar year-to-date, city sales tax allocations are up 14.2 percent compared to the same period last year. Texas counties received sales tax payments of \$29 million, up 9.3 percent compared to one year ago. Calendar year-to-date, county sales tax allocations are 16 percent higher than last year.

Another \$14.5 million went to 108 special purpose taxing districts throughout the state, up 16.4 percent compared to last May. Ten local transit systems received \$114 million in sales tax allocations, up 9.4 percent compared to a year ago. May's sales tax allocations

to local governments represent March sales that were reported to the Comptroller in April by monthly tax filers, and January, February and March sales reported to the Comptroller in April by quarterly tax filers.

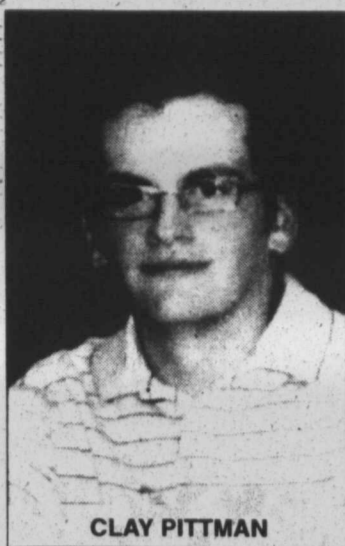

Families must meet federal income guidelines. Proof of income can be provided by using: 2005 income tax return, 2005 W2 form or check stubs from January to December 2005, or check stubs for the preceding 12 months (from May, 2006 to June 2005).

Children who receive TANF, or SSI (Supplemental Security Income), or are a foster care child are eligible, regardless of income. The Head Start program is currently taking applications for classes starting in August. Please call 1-866-894-2207 to schedule an appointment to complete the application or to get additional information.

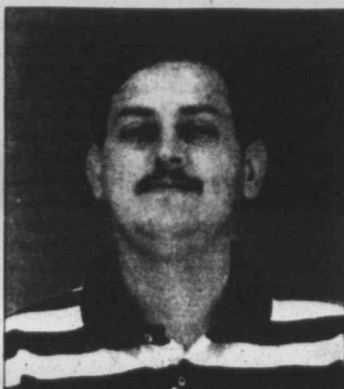

Ag Producers Reminded Of June 1 Sign-Up

Agricultural producers have until June 1, 2006, to sign up for the 2006-crop Direct, and Counter-cyclical Payment Program (DCP), said the Lynn County Farm Service Agency (FSA).

USDA will accept late-filed DCP applications through Sept. 30, 2006, if accompanied by a \$100 late fee. Producers will be unable to apply for 2006 DCP payments after Sept. 30, 2006. Sign-up for the 2006 DCP began Oct. 1, 2005.

"I encourage farmers and growers to sign up for DCP by June 1 by visiting the USDA FSA office or by using the convenient online DCP service," said the Lynn County FSA. "This program plays an important role in providing producers income support."

The program provides payments to eligible owners, operators, landlords, tenants, or sharecroppers on farms enrolled for the 2002 through 2007 crop years. There are two types of DCP payments — direct payments and counter-cyclical payments. Direct payments are tied to acreage bases and yields. Because direct payments provide no incentive to increase production of any certain crop, the payments support farm income without distorting producers' current production decisions.

Counter-cyclical payments provide support counter to the cycle of market prices as part of a federal farm program "safety net" in the event of low crop prices. Counter-cyclical payments for a commodity are only issued if the effective price for a commodity is below the target price for that commodity.

The 2002 Farm Bill requires producers sign annual contracts through 2007 to participate in DCP. Producers may choose not to participate in DCP in any year. USDA has issued more than \$28 billion in DCP payments to producers since the program began in October 2002.

ONLINE DCP SIGN-UP

Producers may also sign up for DCP online at http://www.fsa.usda.gov/egov/edcp_default.htm. Applicants must have an active USDA eAuthentication Level 2 account to use the service. This requires filling out an online registration form at <http://www.eauth.gov> and visiting the local FSA office for identity verification.

The online service allows producers to choose 2006 DCP payment options, assign crop shares, as well as sign and submit their contracts over the Internet. The service was designed to reduce paperwork and speed up contract processing at FSA offices.

The DCP was authorized by the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002 (2002 Farm Bill) and is administered by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farm Service Agency.

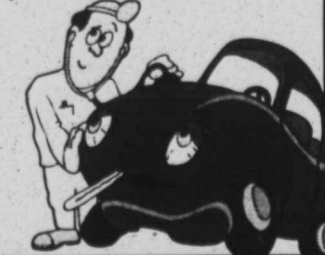

Lynn County Appraisal District Provides Public Information and ASSISTANCE

This is the time of year the Lynn County Appraisal District sends notices of appraised value. Lynn County notices will be mailed by May 27, 2006. Property owners will be mailed a notice as a result of any of the following circumstances affecting real property: if the 2006 proposed value is at least \$1000 more than the 2005 certified value; if the property owner has filed a timely rendition; if 2006 is the first year the property is listed in the appraisal records; if the property changed ownership during 2005; or if the property is a producing mineral interest. Notices will also be mailed to owners of taxable furniture, fixtures, machinery, equipment, vehicles, and inventory used in a trade or business.

Property owners who have questions, or want to discuss the value placed on their property should contact the appraisal district office. The legal deadline for filing a timely protest is thirty days from the date of your notice. Those who receive a notice in Lynn County have until June 27, 2006 to file a protest. If you believe the proposed market value of your property is incorrect, be sure to contact the appraisal district prior to your deadline. It is important to ask questions or call to our attention unusual facts about your property as soon as possible. In the case of value questions, property owners are urged to present conclusive evidence regarding the true market value of their property. Such evidence consists of closing statements, listing agreements, fee appraisals, income and expense statements, pictures, and surveys. Our goal is to treat all property owners in a fair and equitable manner; and this can best be accomplished when you provide evidence to us about your property as soon as possible.

The following publication is required by Section 41.70 of the Texas Property Tax Code.

Property Tax Protest and Appeal Procedures

The law gives property owners the right to protest actions concerning their property tax appraisals. You may follow these appeal procedures if you have a concern about:

- the market or special appraised value placed on your property
- the unequal appraisal of your property
- the inclusion of your property on the appraisal roll
- any exemptions that may apply to you
- the qualification for an agricultural or timber appraisal
- the taxable status of your property
- the local governments which should be taxing your property
- the ownership of property
- the change of use of land receiving special appraisal
- any action taken by the chief appraiser, appraisal district or appraisal review board that applies to and adversely affected you.

Informal Review

You may call (806) 561-5477 to discuss your protest with a CAD employee and try to come to a settlement without meeting with the ARB.

Review by the Appraisal Review Board

If you can't resolve your problem informally with the county appraisal district (CAD) staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB).

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the CAD to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. If necessary, you may request a hearing in the evening, Saturday or Sunday. Prior to your hearing, you may,

ask to review the evidence the CAD will use to uphold their determination. The CAD may ask you for a copy of the evidence you plan to present. The hearing will be informal. You or a designated agent may appear in person to present evidence or you may send notarized evidence for the ARB to review at your hearing. The CAD representative will present evidence about your case. You may cross-examine the CAD representative. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. The CAD has the burden of establishing the property's value by a preponderance of the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest form from the appraisal district office at 1615 Main Street, Tahoka, Texas.

Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARB members outside of the hearing. The law requires ARB members to sign an affidavit saying that they haven't talked about your case before the ARB hears it.

Review by the District Court

After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal to district court. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of the date you receive the ARB's order.

Tax Payment

If you appeal and your case is pending, you must pay the lesser of the amount of taxes due on the portion of the taxable value not in dispute or the amount of taxes due on the property under the order from which the appeal is taken.

You can also get a pamphlet describing how to prepare a protest from the appraisal district or from the State Comptroller's Property Tax Division at P.O. Box 13528, Austin, Texas 78711-3528.

praisal because you changed the use of your land), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change didn't result from a protest you filed), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

If you believe the appraisal district or the ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest until the day before taxes become delinquent (usually February 1). The ARB decides whether it will hear your case based on evidence about whether a required notice was mailed to you.

Deadline for Filing Protests with the ARB*

Usual Deadline

On or before May 31 (or 30 days after a notice of appraised value was mailed to you, whichever is later).

Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason beyond your control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides whether you have good cause.

Late protests are due the day before the appraisal review board approves records for the year. Contact your appraisal district for more information.
