Bulldogs Start Fresh With New Head Coach, Lots of Seniors

There are not a lot of players on the Tahoka Bulldogs varsity football team getting ready for a new season, but 15 of the 21 players listed on the squad at this point are seniors, and included are a couple of players who last year were unanimous choices for first team all-district.

Running back Ja-Vaen (Jay) Tillman averaged 5.4 yards per carry while gaining 961 yards last season despite missing one game because of an injury, and he returns to the offense a little heavier and hopefully just as fast as ever. He was a unanimous first teamer in a district which had many good running backs.

Also returning is unanimous first team all-district defensive back Damon Moore, who was the leading tackler on the team last year, credited with 93 solo tackles and 40 assists. He also excelled at quarterback and running back, gaining 441 yards and averaging 8.7 yards per carry.

New head coach Jay Hellums is gearing up for an I-back offense and Moore will be directing the attack from under center.

Hellums said he will be running a split 6 defense.

Ty Cloe, a returning senior line-man listed at 253 pounds, was second team all-district last season as an offensive guard. Another returnee of note is senior tight end/defensive end Matt McLelland, 6-4 and 230, who was second team all-district defensive end last season.

The Bulldogs scrimmaged at Ralls last Saturday and will scrimmage

Crosbyton here Friday, at 5 p.m. First game will be at Sundown, one of three teams which beat Tahoka by a single point last season. In 2005 Tahoka broke a two-year losing streak and eventually won three games.

Tahoka will compete in district with Slaton (a pre-season favorite), Idalou, Post, Denver City and Roosevelt. Shallowater has moved into another district, but the Bulldogs will play the Mustangs in a non-conference game, Tahoka's first home game on Sept. 8.

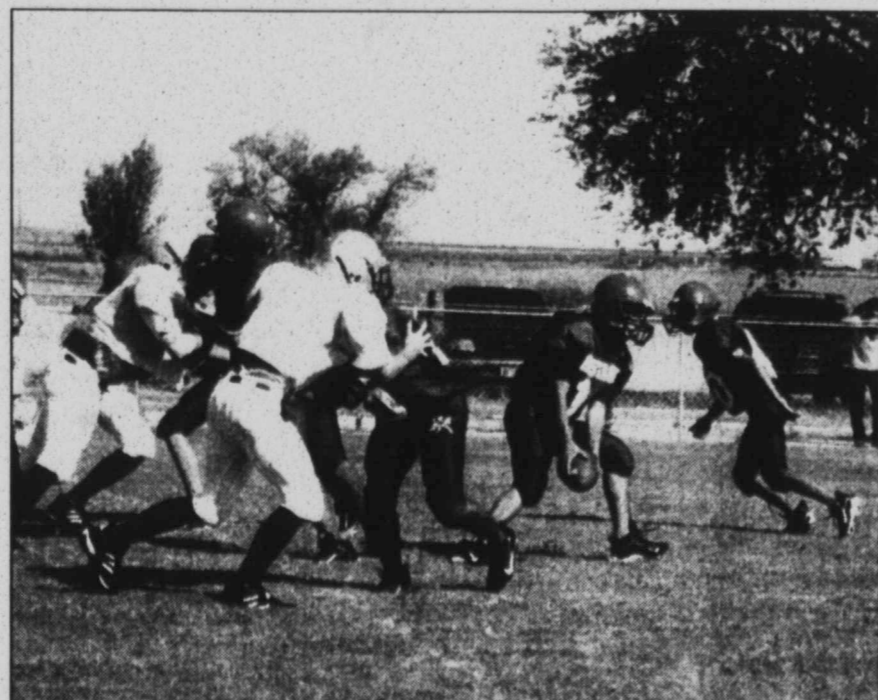

Wreck, Vandalism, Golf Cart Battery Theft Reported

A one-vehicle traffic accident with no injuries was reported three miles west of Tahoka on U.S. 380 Wednesday morning, when a 1998 Ford pickup driven by Euel McNeil, 52, of Slaton went out of control and left the roadway.

During the last week, law enforcement officers in Lynn County also recovered two stolen vehicles and took reports of theft and criminal mischief.

An E-Z-Go golf cart battery charger was stolen from a cart house at T-Bar Country Club Sunday. Mickey Kieth of New Home, owner of the charger, valued it at \$400. It was taken from his cart house while he was playing golf on the course.

Vandalism damage to the rear window of a 2003 Chevrolet Avalanche was estimated Saturday at \$285 by the owner, Raymond Hernandez of Tahoka.

Police were given the name of a suspect in the theft Saturday of a 2003 Saturn Ion owned by Antonio Calvillo of Tahoka, and the car later was recovered in Plainview.

A Lynn County sheriff's deputy Friday noticed a 1966 Cadillac parked in an alley at New Home and the car was found to be stolen from Lubbock on Aug. 16.

A clerk at Allsup's store in O'Donnell advised sheriff's officers that a vehicle she described had left without the driver paying for \$20 worth of gasoline Aug. 15. It later was determined that the vehicle may have been stolen out of Lamesa.

Fifty-one persons were in jail in Lynn County during the last week, eight of these held for Garza County, five for Lubbock County, four for Gaines and one for Dawson County. Charges resulting in jail time during the last week included speeding, possession of a controlled substance, five persons for driving while intoxicated, three on Lubbock warrants for possession of controlled substance with intent to deliver, failure to appear on charges of possession of marijuana, burglary of a vehicle, warrants from Crosby, Atascosa and Burnet counties, unlawfully carrying a weapon.

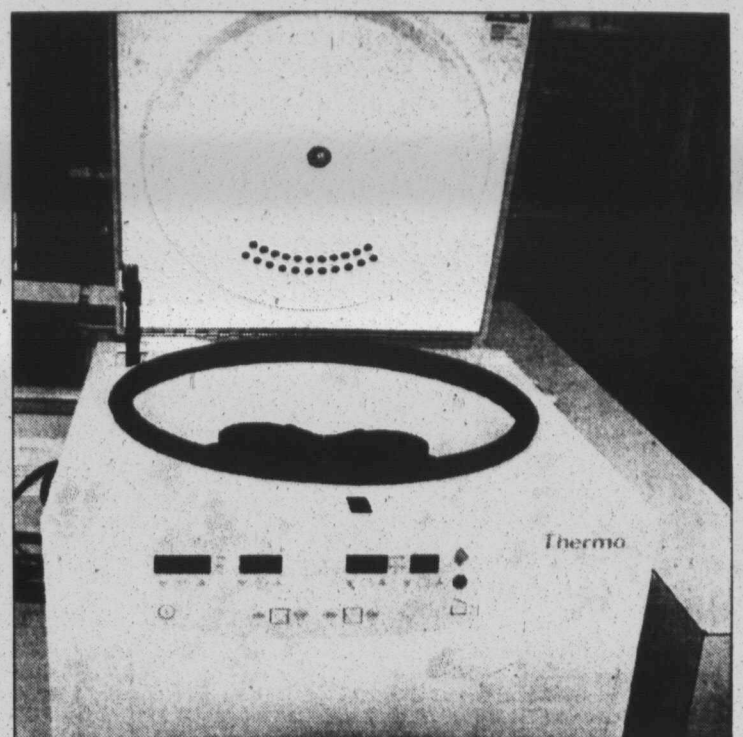

O'Donnell ISD Public Hearing Set Tonight

O'Donnell Independent School District Board of Trustees will meet tonight (Thursday) at 7 p.m. in the Board Room, conducting a public hearing from 7-7:30 p.m. for public input on the proposed tax rate and 2006-07 school budget, with a regular board meeting to follow. Trustees are expected to adopt the tax rate and budget during

regular session.

The board is proposing a total tax rate of \$1.3863 per \$100 of property value for the 2006-07 school year, which includes a rate of \$1.2813 in Maintenance and Operating (M&O) - a decrease of nearly 12-cents from last year's rate of \$1.40. A half-cent increase, however, was proposed for the Interest and Sinking (I&S) fund for debt service, raised to 10.5-cents from the previous year's 10-cent I&S rate. O'Donnell ISD had a total tax rate of \$1.50 for the 2005 year.
