Texas Counties recently named Texas Counties recently named
by the Secretary of Agriculture as eligible for louns to cover part of actual production losses re-
sulting from the drought, high sulting from the drought, high
winds and extreme temperawinds and extreme tempera-
tures. Barlow said farmers may be eligible for loans up to 80 per
cent of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue in business, whichever is
less. For farmers unable to obless. For farmers unable to ob-
tain credit from private commercial lenders, the interest is 3.75 percen. "As a general rule, a farmer percent loss of production to be eligible for an FSA emergency
