

Everyone is welcome to come inside for refreshments.





officers reported this week. After the fight in the early morning hours of Nov. 12 at a residence in the southwest part of Lynn County, the 20-

year-old man involved told officers the next day he wished to file assault charges against the 22-year-old woman. About a day later, she also reported the incident to the sheriff's department and said she wished to file charges against him. Deputies talked to each, then turned the case over to the county attorney for possible filing of charges.

Jail population early this week totaled 39, with 13 of these held for Garza County, two for Gaines and five for Lubbock. Seven persons were added to the list during the last week, on these charges: seven Collin County warrants on unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, burglary of a vehicle plus unauthorized use of motor vehicle, unlawfully carrying a weapon plus driving while intoxicated, Dawson County warrant on theft by check, warrant of driving while license invalid, warrant on possession of controlled substance with intent to deliver, and warrant on resisting arrest.

STOP SWEATING THE SMALL STUFF!!!



PANDEMIC INFLUENZA continued..

Last week we introduced you to pandemic influenza. As you may recall, pandemic influenza is different from seasonal influenza in that it is a world wide outbreak of a NEW strain of influenza that spreads easily from person to person. And since pandemics generally involve a new strain of virus, humans have little to no immunity to it. Health officials at the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), and the World Health Organization (WHO) are cautioning health care providers and American citizens that the Avian/ Bird Flu is currently a pandemic threat. Although officials are expecting a pandemic to occur, they cannot predict when it will occur or how severe it will be

So, should a pandemic occur. how would it affect life in Lynn County? Officials advise that due to wide spread illness, we could experience a shortage of workers across the land, which in turn would likely lead to a temporary breakdown of our society's infrastructure. For example we might experience a shortage or lack of utilities like electricity, natural gas, water, groceries,

gasoline, etc. We might experience a temporary closure of schools and other public gatherings to prevent the spread of illness. Although a different set of circumstances, we saw a similar infrastructure breakdown in Louisiana and surrounding areas caused by the natural/National disaster "hurricane Katrina"

Since we are aware that health authorities believe there is a threat of a pandemic, we have the luxury of being able to prepare ahead of time. Our intention is not to frighten you, but to share knowledge, and as we all know, knowledge is an essential component of effective preparation.

There are a number of things each of us can begin doing now to get ready and to protect ourselves and our families in the case of a pandemic or any other disaster:

· Become educated - reliable information is available through many sources.

· Stay healthy- Prevent the spread of respiratory illness.

· Stock up- on essentials to prepare for an extended stay at home.

We'll cover these suggestions more thoroughly in next week's column

TDA To Mail Ballots For Regional Boll Weevil Vote

Cotton farmers and landowners with cotton production are eligible to vote in a Dec. 12 referendum that will determine whether to continue a boll weevil eradication program in the Western High Plains Boll Weevil Eradication Zone.

Eligible voters in the zone should receive an official ballot by mail after Nov. 20. A postagepaid return envelope will be included. Completed ballots must be postmarked on or before Dec. 12 to be counted. Producers who planted cotton in 2006 but do not receive a ballot should contact TDA at (512) 936-2450 or 800-TELL-TDA (800-835-5832).

In addition to deciding if an eradication program should be continued in the zone, voters will elect a board member to serve on the statewide board of directors

for the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation Inc.

TDA received one nomination for this position before the filing deadline. The name of Don Parrish of Yoakum County will appear on the ballot as a board nominee. Parrish has been farming since 1979.
