

Breaking Regional Records ... Ty Cloe of Tahoka set both the Squat Lift and Dead Lift record at the Boys Regional Powerlifting Meet held March 10 in Levelland, and also broke the Regional Overall High Combined Total Weight Record with 1,670 pounds. The THS junior is heading to the State Powerlifting Meet in Houston on March 24, where he set a squat lift record in his weight division last year - a record he surpassed by 100 pounds at the regional meet this year.

Charges Filed In Dumping; Drug Raid Made In City

One person was charged in the dumping of eight barrels of possibly hazardous materials near New Home on Feb. 7 and then indicted by a 106th District grand jury, sheriff's officers reported this week. Sheriff Jerry Franklin said the case is still under investigation, and that the material in the barrels, which were illegally left near the road and then punctured by gunshots, has been determined to be a fuel-based hydraulic oil. Name of the suspect has not been released pending an arrest. &

Officers from the sheriff's department, Tahoka and O'Donnell police departments and the Dept. of Public Safety raided a home at 1504 S. 8th St. in Tahoka around midnight Saturday, seizing 14 grams of methamphetamine.

Owner of the home, Henry Pina, 76, was charged with manufacture and delivery of a controlled substance, plus felony possession of a firearm. While the raid was underway, a man who came to the house, Arturo Garza, 46, was arrested on a warrant for violation of parole.

Both city and county officers reportedly had received numerous inquiries from citizens regarding possible drug trafficking at that location.

Deputies arrested a 35-year-old Slaton man at a Wilson home Monday

night after a 25-year-old Tahoka woman claimed she had been struck and choked. The man, Randy S. Garcia, already had been indicted by a grand jury on two counts of assault/ family violence, and also was wanted in outstanding warrants for other assaults and traffic violations.

Tahoka police also arrested a 21year-old man for civil disturbance and four outstanding traffic warrants and investigated the burglary Sunday night of the home of Manuel Juan Sanchez on N. 3rd. St. Stolen from his residence was a Polaroid DVD screen valued at \$120.

Twelve persons were jailed during the last week in Lynn County, bringing the total jail population to 48 as of Monday. Fifteen of these were held for Garza County and five for Lubbock

Of those jailed last week, five were for driving while license invalid, with one of those an application to revoke probation. Others were arrested for manufacture and delivery of a controlled substance, failure to identify plus no drivers license or seatbelt, warrant on four Class C misdemeanors, possession of marijuana, parole violation, possession of a controlled substance and public intoxication.

He lifted 365 pounds in the bench press competition.

Tahoka's Ty Cloe set three records

in the Regional Boys Powerlifting

This was the second year for Cloe to break records at the regional event, after setting a regional record of 585 pounds in the squat competition last

year on his way to the state meet. He set a new state record at last year's state meet in the squat competition, lifting 605 pounds in the squat lift. He placed second overall in last year's state meet, competing against athletes in Class A and AA, lifting a total weight of 1,425 in squat, dead lift and bench press com-

Two other Bulldog powerlifters placed in regional events last week, with Heath Ross tying for fifth place with a total weight of 1,210 pounds combined, and Jacob Stephens lifted 775 pounds to place in the top ten at regionals.

Cumulative weight totals from the best in three different powerlifting events are considered, including squats, dead lift and bench press. Competitors are given three opportunities to lift in each event, competing against others in their body-weight division.

In the girls powerlifting division, Marissa Gomez and Amanda Paredes will represent Tahoka High School at the Girls State Powerlifting Meet in Killeen this weekend



LAST WEEK as I was preparing to take my car in to the shop to get rid of an annoying rattling sound, I asked my wife if she had any idea of the origin of the phrase, "first rattle out of the box."

She said no, but she had heard that all her life, and like most of us, knew that it simply means immediately, or at the first attempt.

Curious, I Googled it on my computer, and learned only a little more, mainly that nobody seems to know where or how the phrase originated, although the Google result said "the phrase appears in Chapter 31 of Babbitt by Sinclair Lewis, published in 1922. It also pops up in a Google search, throughout the English-speaking world."

One respondent said "I found these expressions in a reference but it doesn't say what the origin is. It has 1909 as the earliest citation. It also has 'first shot out of the box.' The reference says 'first rattle out of the box' is a cowboy's expression meaning 'prompt action'."

It also said that in some areas the phrase is "first crack off the bat," referring to baseball, and in other places, "first crack out of the box."

I never heard either one of those. "First cracker out of the box" might make some sense, for a salad, but I never heard that either. I know a couple of cowboy-type people, but I was unable to

contact either one of them. Guess they don't carry cell phones on their saddles, but I'll bet they have them in their pickups.

Anyway, I was a bit disappointed that Google let me down. Usually you can type in almost anything and Google will tell you all about if, first rattle out of the box.

IF YOU are reading this on Thursday, it's March 15, the traditional Ides of March, made famous by William Shakespeare's play about Julius Caesar where his character says (Act I, Scene II) "Beware the Ides of March," because that was the day on which Caesar was assassinated in 44 B.C. (also the last time there was no street construction going on in Lubbock).

Anyway, I don't know what an Ide is, except that it has something to do with astrology, and it falls on the 15th day of March, May, July and October, and on the 13th day of other months. According to what I read, Ides had meaning only in the Roman calendar ... It also mentioned that there was a rock music group by that name. Again, I tried Google, and this time I got lots of information, more than I could absorb. There were 8,230,000 hits, or responses, on the word "Ides."

I read the first one, but it may be awhile before I get through all the others.



For Local Elections

Filing Period Ends

The filing period ended at 5 o'clock Monday, March 12 for candidates wanting to have their names placed on ballots in city, school and hospital district elections in Lynn County. Several entities will have the option of canceling their elections due to uncontested races, and Lynn County Hospital District may cancel their election due to having no candidates at all. No one filed for two directors terms on the seven-member board, and Hospital Administrator Jim Morris said that the board will probably appoint two persons to serve on the board of directors, at their next regular meeting in April. The directors serve threeyear terms. Terms expiring were for Dalton Wood and Virginia Griffing, who was appointed to fill the vacancy left by the resignation of Joan Knox.

Elections will be held on May 12 for Tahoka ISD, O'Donnell ISD and City of O'Donnell, with contested races on those ballots, but uncontested races will allow the option of canceling elections for the City of Tahoka, Wilson ISD, City of Wilson, and City of New Home. New Home ISD has opted to hold their election in November this year.

Tahoka ISD has three trustee seats to fill, but only one of the precincts has a contested race. Incumbent Joe Calvillo will face challenger Carlos Moralez for the Precinct 2 seat, while incumbent Kent Kahl filed for re-election in Pct. 1, and newcomer Tony Garcia is the sole candidate for the Pct. 5 seat formerly held by Carmen Chapa, who is not seeking re-election. School officials have not yet indicated whether ballots will be printed for the two uncontested races in Precincts 1 and 5, but an election will be held for the Pct. 2 seat.

O'Donnell city and school will hold a joint election with contested races for both entities. Five candidates have filed for three city council seats, and five candidates filed for three trustee terms on the school board in O'Donnell. Incumbents Willie Luera, Wayne Mott and Roger Doss are all seeking re-election to the O'Donnell City Council, along with two more candidates, Jesse Ray Perez and Paul Houston. Incumbents in the O'Donnell ISD election are also facing two more challengers for three seats on the board, with Liz Luera and Cody Furlow adding their names to the list along with

incumbents Mark Roye, Ben Franklin and Kirby Williams.

The City of Tahoka will most likely cancel their election, with incumbents unchallenged for reelection, including Mayor Mike Mensch, District 1 councilman Rudy Fuentes, and District 3 councilwoman Amy Preston.

Wilson ISD remained one candidate short of a full slate, with incumbent Janie Rios and newcomers Casey Donald and his brother, Cody Donald, filing for the three full-term slots on the board of trustees, and no candidates filing for a one-year unexpired term on the board. The WISD Board of Trustees will have the option of appointing someone to fill the unexpired

The City of Wilson was also one candidate short for four seats on the city council, but the three incumbents filed for re-election for the three full terms, including Dennis Moore, Stephenson andf Servando Benavidez. No one filed for the one-year unexpired term, which the council may appoint some-

Mayor Steve Lisemby and councilman David Gandy are both seeking re-election on the New Home City Council, and newcomer Greg Nieman filed for the other slot on the city council, where incumbent Leroy Nettles declined to seek re-elec-





May 12 Constitutional Amendment Election To Address Reduction of Frozen Taxes

Lynn County Commissioners met Monday morning in regular session to consider routine business, including a vote to consolidate voting boxes in Lynn County down to four boxes for an upcoming May 12 statewide special election for one constitutional amendment, which will be held in conjunction with local city, school and hospital district elections.

The special election ballot will have only one constitutional amendment for voters to consider, which will read: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for a reduction of the limitation on the total amount of ad valorem taxes that may be imposed for public school purposes on the residence of homesteads of the elderly or disabled to reflect any reduction in the rate of those taxes for the 2006 and 2007 tax years."

In plain English, the amendment, if passed, would allow legislators to pass a law to reduce the amount of taxes paid by those whose taxes were frozen at a higher rate than the 2006 and 2007 rates for ad valorem taxes in school districts in Texas. School districts across Texas significantly reduced tax rates in 2006 and will again lower tax rates in 2007. Whether the new calculations would be based on current homestead values or values calculated at the time the taxes were frozen, is not known at this time, according to officials at the appraisal district.

"The amendment only designates that the taxes would be reduced, but does not propose how the rates would be figured. If the amendment passes, state legislators would decide how to calculate the reductions," said Marquita Scott, Chief Appraiser at the Lynn County Appraisal District. "We don't know if the 2006 and 2007 tax rates would be figured on current homestead values, or at the value placed on the homestead at the time their taxes were frozen (at age 65, or for disabled homeowners), or it is possible that a simple percentage reduction calculation may be used," she added.

In Lynn County, the amendment would affect 577 taxpayers, including 539 whose school taxes are frozen by claiming the over-65 homestead exemption, and 38 whose school taxes are frozen by claiming the disability exemption, according to figures

released by the Lynn County Appraisal District. That's almost 15% of the 3,873 "owners" (including land, homes, commercial, mineral rights, etc.) on file as taxpayers at the Lynn County Appraisal District. In Tahoka Independent School District, there are 1,760 owners, of whom 282 have taxes frozen by claiming the over-65 homestead exemption, and 22 with the disability exemption.

Commissioners approved the May 12 special election to be conducted at only four voting boxes in the county, one each in Tahoka, Wilson, O'Donnell and

A proclamation was signed by County Judge H.G. 
Ephesians, chapters 4, 5 and 6
