## Live Hand Grenade Found In Tahoka

A hand grenade fell out of some steel tubing being moved at Hernandez Tire Shop in Tahoka last Thursday, and grenade.
David Hernandez, one of the shop owners, said that workers at the shop in the $1600-$-block of Ave. C passed the
grenade around and looked at it after it grenade around and looked at it after i
came out of the recently-acquired came out of the recently-acquired
lengths of tubing, and he decided to call the sheriff's office to determine if possession of a hand grenade was legal Deputy Abraham Vega said he advised Hernandez to put it down, get away from it, and someone would be
out to the scene quickly. The bomb out the scene quickly. The bomb
squad of the Lubbock County Sheriff's squad of the Lubbock County Sheriff's
Dept. was contacted, and two men from that squad came out and took possession of the grenade, which they x-rayed on the spot and determined that it was live. The bomb squad duo first taped the firing pin on the grenade to assure
that it wouldn't come out, officers said. that it wouldn' t come out, officers said.
The bomb squad later advised the Lynn County Sheriff's Dept. that the grenade appeared to be a Vietnam-era weapon of the U.S. military, and that it appeared to be primarily an incendiary bomb, meaning that it could cause more damage from fire than from the
explosion iscelf. explosion itself.
the bomb squad officers were told that the bomb squad plans to detonate the grenade within a week or so as part of
bomb squad training bomb squad training exercise. Hernandez told officers the stee tubing had been obtained from Nooni
Rogers of Tahoka. Rogers, who deal Rogers of Tahoka. Rogers, who deals in scrap metals, later reportedly told
officers he had no idea how or when the officers he had no idea how or when the
grenade got into the tubing. The bomb squad searched through the rest of the tubing at the Hernandez shop and found no other devices.
