Making History ... The Tahoka High School 3-D Band made history last Saturday, advancing for the first time ever to the State UIL Marching Contest, after marching in the finals at Area UIL in Lubbock. Under the direction of Carroll Rhodes, the THS Band has set a standard of winning in the past several years, as this was their third consecutive time to advance to the Area marching competition, and second consecutive time to advance to the finals competition in Area. But this time, the third time was the charm, as the Tahoka Band was one of only four 2-A bands to qualify (out of 22 bands) for the state contest. The band will march in the State UIL Marching Contest at 4:15 p.m. Monday, Nov. 5 at the Alamodome in San Antonio. Class 2-A finals competition begins at 8:50 p.m. that night. Tahoka fans who want to help send the band off are invited to a pep rally honoring the band this Saturday, Nov. 3 at 7:30 p.m. at the Tahoka football field (or possibly in the gym).

Tanoka 3-D Band To **March at State Contest**

The Tahoka High School Band set a landmark in school history last weekend, qualifying for the first time ever to compete in the UIL State Marching Contest. The announcement came at the end of a day of marching competition at the Area A UIL Marching Contest in Lubbock last Saturday, when the Tahoka 3-D Band placed in the top four to advance to the prestigious state contest this coming Monday, in the Alamodome in San Antonio.

After competing against 22 2A bands from four regions in the preliminaries, Tahoka was ranked fifth and qualified for the finals at the Area competition. Marching again that night against the nine other finalists, the 3-D Band moved up to 4th place behind Panhandle, Crane, and Reagan County. Tahoka is the only 2A band from Region 16 to qualify for state this year. Sundown and Sudan also qualified in 1A for the State contest.

"Needless to say, we were over-

joyed and overwhelmed by being selected," stated directors Carroll Rhodes and Johnathan Smith. "This is a huge honor and opportunity, which many outstanding bands never get to enjoy. Our kids came through in a big way this year and especially in the finals at Area."

"The 3-D Band appreciates the tremendous support from Tahoka as there were around 200 people at the preliminaries and 100+ at the finals that night. There are no better fans than what we have in Tahoka. In addition, the reception that our kids received when they came into town was something they will remember for the rest of their lives," said Rhodes.

The Tahoka 3-D Band will be leaving this Sunday morning at 8:00 a.m. for San Antonio and the UIL State 2A Marching Contest. They will stop and practice on the way down and arrive in San Antonio that evening, where they

On Sunday police arrested a 34year-old Tahoka man for public intoxication and resisting arrest. Also arrested Sunday was a 35-year-old Tahoka woman accused of assaulting a 47-year-old woman in a family dispute.

Fifty-one persons were in Lynn County jail as of early this week, with 12 of these held for Garza county and two each for Lubbock and Gaines counties.

Latest arrests were for warrant on possession of marijuana, theft by check (Guadalupe County), bond forfeiture plus driving while license invalid (Taylor County), two persons for failure to pay child support, burglary of a habitation, theft by check, failure to identify fugitive plus possession of a dangerous drug, burglary (Oklahoma), aggravated assault (Pecos) plus DWI third offense or more, assault and two more persons for DWI.

I REMEMBER when I was a kid, my mother sometimes would tell me I was "in a peck of trouble," and although I didn't know exactly how much trouble that was, I did understand it was quite a bit. Now, all these years later, I realized just last week that I still wasn't sure how much a peck is. Or was, since I don't think that's a unit of measurement that is used any more.

The conversation came up at lunch time at the Lynn County senior citizens center, where conversations frequently tend to center on such important things, so we started asking around, "just how much is a peck anyway?"

A couple of folks immediately thought of the song which says "I love you, a bushel and a peck," and one lady thought of the tonguetwister, "Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers," etc. Nobody seemed to know for sure, but most figured it must be less than a bushel, or the peck would have been mentioned first in the song. And the lady thinking about Peter Piper figured it was less, too, her logic being "a bushel would be an awful lot of peppers to pick."

I pointed out that if it weren't for bushel baskets, we probably would have no idea how large a bushel is. But they weren't quite ready to get into that; they just wanted to know about a peck, and I promised I would look it up. So here's what I found, using Google:

A peck is a dry measurement of 8 quarts, or 537.6 cubic inches. There are four pecks to a bushel, so the peck is smaller, of course. Therefore a bushel is 32 quarts of material, something else I didn't know.

I remember people joking that "he (or she) eats like a bird—by the peck." And of course I remember my mom telling me I was in a peck of trouble. I doubt that I would have been as impressed if she had said, "young man, you're in 537.6 cubic inches of trouble!"





Letter To The Editor

To Taxpayers of **New Home ISD**

On Nov. 6, 2007 the New Home School District is conducting a Rollback Election. The District's proposed tax rate is \$1.25668 per \$100 valuation. If approved by voters, this tax rate will result in \$135,319 of additional revenue, bringing the District's total revenue to \$1,844, 033. If the Rollback measure does not pass, the New Home Independent School District's revenue will be \$1,708,714.

Last year's tax rate was \$1.459935 per \$100 valuation, and the budget was \$1,754,905. This year's budget is \$1,844,033. The New Home Independent School District's current budget does not include new programs or expenses.

Please exercise your right to vote on November 6, 2007 at the New Home City Hall, 106 East Broadway, New Home, Texas. Or, voters may vote early between October 22 and November 2 at the Lynn County Courthouse, 1600 Main, Tahoka.

A YES vote will set the District tax rate at \$1.25668 per \$100 valuation (down from \$1.459935 last year). A NO vote will result in a loss of revenue for New Home ISD of \$135,000 (\$50,000 local tax revenue plus \$85,000 in state aid).

While the state legislature has promoted and mandated lower property tax relief, they have failed to maintain adequate funding for public education. The potential loss of local tax revenue will not be replaced by the state. Mandated increases in salaries, coupled with higher utilities cost, higher fuel and transportation costs, and increasing insurance rates, in conjunction with the loss of local tax revenue, will make financial decisions for all school districts extremely difficult. Hospital Personnel Changes Discussed

Resignations of the heads of two departments at Lynn County Hospital were reported to the hospital board last week by administrator Jim Morris.

The dietary manager and the lead person in the laboratory have resigned, but these jobs are being carried out by other personnel while replacements are sought, Morris advised, noting that interviews already have been conducted with some candidates.

Business manager Donna Raindl appeared before the group to explain hospital policies regarding bad debts.

Voters To Mark Ballots Nov. 6

Registered voters in Lynn County may cast ballots on Tuesday, Nov. 6 in the Constitutional Amendment election at four polling locations, or early voting will continue this week through Friday, Nov. 2 at the Lynn County Courthouse. Early voting is conducted during regular business hours at the Lynn County Clerk's Office, from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Voters should bring their voter registration cards.

Polling locations on election day will be at the Life Enrichment Center in Tahoka (for Voting Boxes 1, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 12 and 14); the Green Museum in Wilson (Voting Boxes 2 and 8); O'Donnell High School (Voting Boxes 3 and 10); and New Home City Hall (Voting Boxes 4, 11 and 13). Polls will open 7 a.m. until 7 p.m.

There are 16 proposed amendments for voters to consider statewide, and in the New Home Independent School District voters also have a school tax of Tahoka Trinity Church, will rate to consider in a rollback be accepting monthly food orders election held in conjunction with at Tahoka Trinity Church on the amendment election. New Home ISD voters have an opportunity to vote for or against a proposal setting the New Home ISD tax rate at \$1.25668, which is a 20-cent reduction from the previous year's tax rate of \$1.45668, but is higher than the rollback rate for 2007.

New Home ISD officials are asking voters to approve a tax rate that is 15-cents above the rollback rate of \$1.10 in the school district. The \$1.25668 tax rate includes a Maintenance & Operating (M&O) rate of \$1.17 and an-additional \$.08668 rate for Interest & Sinking (I&S) to pay bonded indebtedness. If voters do not approve the tax rate, then the New Home ISD tax rate will automatically drop to the rollback rate of \$1,106745 for both M&O and I&S.

Because the New Home ISD tax rate will not be determined until after the Nov. 6 election, property tax statements for New Home ISD will be mailed following the election results.

Ledru F. (Jake) Jacobs

Funeral services for Ledru F. (Jake) Jacobs, 85, of Denver, CO will be held at 10 a.m. Saturday, Nov, 3 at the First United Methodist Church of Tahoka, with Gordon Smith and Vernon Baker officiating. Interment will follow at Nevels Cemetery in Tahoka under the direction of White Funeral Home of Tahoka.

Jacobs died Sunday, October 28, 2007 from complications from a hip fracture in August. The seventh of eight children, he was born September 2, 1922 in Elmwood, Oklahoma to Albert Leroy Jacobs and Viola Adams Jacobs. He attended schools in Spearman, graduating in May of 1940. He then went to West Texas State. Jacobs entered the army in 1943, serving in the Military Police as a part of the occupying forces in the Philippines and Japan. After the war, he returned to West Texas State, meeting and marrying Patricia Hill of Tahoka. Jacobs graduated in 1947 with a Bachelor of Science Degree. He received his Master's Degree in Education from Texas Tech in 1952.

Jacobs played basketball for the West Texas State Buffaloes as a part of the "tallest team in the Land". Their picture appeared on the cover of Look Magazine in January 1942 after they played in the NIT finals in Madison Square Garden in New York. After graduation from WTS, he moved to Tahoka, coached basketball, and was the athletic director from 1947-1966. Jacobs was also the principal of Tubb (North) Elementary School until 1966. In that year, he moved to Bovina to become their high school principal. He became the Superintendent of Schools in Bovina and Wilson. In 1981, Jacobs retired and moved to Lake City, Colorado, where he served as the County Administrator of Hinsdale County. Jacobs and his wife moved to Parker, Colorado in 1991, where they both lived until recently, when he moved to an independent living facility

The Texas Roundup Association acknowledged Jacobs in 1958 by awarding him the title of "Coach of the Year" for Texas High School Basketball, recognizing his contribution to the high ideals of true sportsmanship and in appreciation of his outstanding achievement. He maintained memberships at the First Methodist Church in Tahoka and Wilson and at the First Presbyterian

Church in Lake City, Colorado. Survivors include his wife; three daughters, Vicki Taylor of Albuquerque, NM, Becky Ferguson of Conifer, CO, and Fran DuBose of San Antonio; one brother, Jerry Jacobs of Gonzales: five grandchildren




Hawthorne Named Tahoka ISD Trustee




