# Stolen Vehicle Involved In County Wreck

A 2002 GMC pickup which had been reported stolen in Lubbock was involved in a collision with a car on U.S. 87 15 miles north of Tahoka near the Lubbock-Lynn County line Monday morning.

The driver of the pickup. Victoria Robledo, 19, of Lubbock, was airlifted to a Lubbock hospital for treatment, but was released later in the day when her injuries appeared not to be serious. Investigating DQS Trooper Quintin Kingham said the pickup had been stolen and that the driver was charged with unauthorized use of a motor vehicle.

The trooper said she was attempting to get onto U.S. 87 from County Rd. 2 when she struck a 2005 Ford Crown Victoria headed north on U.S. 87 and driven by Don Williams, 43, of Midland, who was not hurt. Both vehicles then went into the ditch on the east side of the highway, and the pickup overturned, the trooper said.




## New Home Mascot Is Still "Leopards"



**O'Donnell Band Recognized** At OISD Trustee Meeting

The O'Donnell ISD band program was recognized with the Celebration of Excellence award at the OISD Board of Trustees' meeting on Nov. 29. Superintendent Rodney Schneider and board members expressed their appreciation to directors Palmer and Rackley and the entire band program, for the band's instrumental role in helping the year start in a positive manner and for their success in the band contests. Attending the ceremony as representatives of the band were Rustin Furlow. Portia Grant and Rebeca Pena, who presented the board with a gift of appreciation on behalf of the band.

In other business, the board conducted a public hearing on several academic programs and accountability reports, including the district AEIS report, noting that the district had increased the accountability of two campuses from "Academically Acceptable" to "Recognized;" a Violent Criminal Incidents report (none); Higher Education Coordinating Board report, which is a report on student performance during the fist year enrolled in post-secondary education after graduation from high school (OISD students ACT scores improved in almost every category); and the Texas English Language Proficiency Assessment System, detailing scores of students' English language skills. The school district showed improvement in the Performance Based Monitoring and Analysis report, and the Texas Primary Reading Inventory regarding reading fluency for elementary students.

"The Board sends it congratulations to OISD staff for their role in significantly increasing student performance." Supt. Schneider said. "It was clearly measurable in a quantitative manner in the many reports above that our staff has done a

tremendous job of increasing student success. In almost every report given we increased our accountability rating or showed marked improvement.'

Trustees unanimously approved continuing a partnership agreement with South Plains Community Action Association (SPCAA) as part of the pre-kindergarten program, through which OISD will received grant funding of approximately \$50,000 annually.

Supt. Schneider was added to the district's depository signature cards, and a WADA agreement with Borden County ISD was approved. A Shared Service agreement between O'Donnell ISD, Loop ISD and Seagraves ISD was approved for operation of the Texas Reading First grant program.

The board met for an hour in closed session for consideration of a student discipline issue, and upon returning to open session voted unanimously to deny an appeal of an administrative dismissal of a student discipline complaint due to untimeliness.

District enrollment figures were reported, and principals reported on campus activities. Upcoming board training opportunities were noted, and monthly bills were approved.

The next regular board meeting was scheduled for Dec. 20.



#### HOLIDAY STRESS





### **New DPS Troopers Sought For Border** Security Needs

The Department of Public Safety is now accepting applications for anyone interested in becoming a state trooper, but the deadline is approaching fast.

The application deadline for Texas residents is January 4, or December 28 for out-of-state applicants. The recruit school will begin March 30, 2008, in Austin.

"We need applicants to help us fill positions created by the Legislature for border security and commercial vehicle enforcement," said DPS Director Col. Thomas A. Davis Jr. "Our intern program allows recruits to earn money right away after they are accepted while they wait for the class to begin-and it helps them get acclimated with different areas of the Department."
