

DA's Race to be determined in Republican Primary

Early Voting Starts Tuesday

Early voting in the Republican and Democratic Primaries begins next week, on Tuesday, Feb. 19 at the Lynn County Clerk's Office in the county courthouse. Voters should bring their voter registration cards when voting, and may vote in only one party's primary election.

Early voting is conducted during regular business hours at the courthouse during weekdays (8 a.m.-5 p.m.), and will continue through Feb. 29 for the March 4 Primaries.

The new District Attorney for Lynn and other counties in the 106th Judicial District will be determined in the Republican Primary election. O'Donnell resident Brian Kingston and Lamesa resident Sammy McCrary face each other on the Republican ticket, with no Democratic candidates seeking the office, which will make the Republic Primary winner the only candidate in the Nov. 4 General Election. The 106th Judicial District includes Lynn, Dawson, Gaines and Garza counties. Current DA Ricky Smith is not seeking reelection.

There are several local offices on the Democratic Primary ballot, but all are unopposed, both in the primary and general elections. Lynn County Sheriff Jerry D. Franklin, Lynn County Tax Assessor/Collector Sherry Pearce, Lynn County Attorney Donnis Scott, Precinct 1 Commissioner Keith Wied and Precinct 3 Commissioner Don. Blair are all unopposed in their bid for another term in their respective offices.

State and national offices are also on the Republican and Democratic Primary ballots, including the presidential race.

Head-On Crash Kills Two Near Wilson

Two Wilson residents in a car which apparently crossed the center median on FM 211 about two miles west of Wilson Monday died as a result of the head-on collision of their car with a westbound pickup.

The driver of the 2006 Ford Taurus, Antonio Riojas IV, 25, was pronounced dead at the scene, and his passenger, Santanna Flores, 21, died of injuries Monday night at Covenant Medical Center in Lubbock, where she had been taken by Aerocare helicopter.

Investigating DPS troopers said the accident happened about 8:40 a.m.

at a curve on the highway where the Taurus collided with a 2007 Chevrolet Crew Cab pickup driven by Michael Steuart, 41, of Levelland.

Steuart was taken to Covenant Medical Center by Lynn County EMS ambulance from Tahoka. His injuries were serious, reportedly with multiple broken bones.

Officials with the Lynn County sheriff's office, DPS, Lynn EMS and Wilson Volunteer Fire Dept. responded to the scene. The Wilson VFD used the jaws of life to remove Flores from the wreck.



SOMEHOW, Ground Hog Day got by me. I didn't even notice anything about the old Indian chief at Post this year. Well, I'm not sure that the tradition of predicting good or bad crop years by the wind at Post really has anything to do with Ground Hog Day. Anyway, today is Valentine's Day, and I can't let that go by without some kind of comment about tough love.

Early Valentine's Day celebrations were tough on the women, for example, because the celebration supposedly is based on the Feast of Lupercalia, a Roman festival associated with love and romance because—get this—the Roman guys at that feast traditionally would chase the women and beat them with whips made out of goatskins, believing these beatings would make the women fertile.

Boy, that wouldn't work too well today. If I had ever tried to take a whip to any of the women in my family, they would immediately be more hostile than fertile.

The basis of the name of the day may have been pretty tough on a couple of guys, too. One of my sources says there were two St. Valentines, both of them "Christian martyrs whose feasts were formerly observed on Feb. 14." Tradition says one was a Roman priest, the other a bishop martyred in Rome.

The Romans apparently held a lot of feasts. Everybody who was anybody at all had his feast day. They are a lot; there probably were no skinny Romans, because every one of them had a big annual festival with tons of food, sort of like Lyntegar does at the Tahoka football stadium (no, I have never seen anyone chasing women around the stadium with whips made of goatskins).

Whether there was really just one St. Valentine, or two, whoever they named the day after must have had a tough time, because they were martyrs, and my dictionary says a martyr is a person who willingly suffers death rather than renounce his or her religion.

I don't think I would want to be a martyr. I am reminded of the story of the young couple about to marry, and she asked him if he loved her a whole lot.

"I sure do," he said.

"Is your love so great that you would die for me?" she asked teasingly. He thought a minute, then said, "I don't think so." "What!" she exclaimed. ""Why not?"

"Mine is an undying love," he replied.

Hood Sisters Graduate From Wayland Baptist



Tahoka, Wilson, O'Donnell Schools **Implement Broadcast Alert System**

delays or cancellations due to bad weather is the main purpose of an emergency notification system that is being implemented in the Tahoka, Wilson and O'Donnell Independent School Districts. The system, provided by Poka Lambro, will automatically call the homes of students and staff members with a prerecorded message authorized by each school's Superintendent.

The new system has been operational since the beginning of

The message system will be used in case of ice, snow or any inclement weather that might make it unsafe for buses to run or students to get to school. In addition to weather related delays and cancellations, the notification system will be used should the need ever arise for an emergency evacuation.

"We have been looking for some way to do this that was reasonable in terms of both time and economy," said Mike Jones, Wilson ISD Superintendent.

Weather related messages will give parents "official" notification on whether school has been canceled or delayed and whether or not buses are running. The schools will still use radio and television as forms of notification but the broadcast message system gives the dis-

Alerting parents of school tricts flexibility in getting information to its staff and student body. The system makes simultaneous phone calls and can quickly work through each district's {confidential} call list. Once the decision has been made to cancel or delay the start of school, calls will begin to go out at the same time television and radio stations are notified.

> "Making a decision about whether or not to call off or delay school during bad weather is not easy," noted Jimmy Parker, Tahoka ISD Superintendent. 'Unless it is really obvious, we really can't make a decision the day before. We try not to close school unless we really have to,' Parker added, "because no one remembers how bad the weather was when the time comes to make that day up.'

Rodney Schneider, Superintendent of O'Donnell ISD commented that "the implementation of the [broadcast messaging] system gives us another avenue in keeping the parents and guardians of our student body apprised of situations as they arise. We believe that the system will give us an advantage when it comes to making the decision of whether or not to delay or cancel

All three superintendents agreed that the safety of all students and employees is always their first consideration.




