The O'Donnell High School baseball team won their Class 1A Bi-District playoff game over Ira to advance to the second round of playoff action. They beat Ira 8-2 at Snyder's Moffett Field, under the direction of head coach James Dillard. They will play again at Snyder's Moffett Field in the next round, facing Forsan at 4:30 p.m. Friday.

An Eagle six-run second inning rattled the Ira Bulldogs, starting with Tanner Hancock's two-out double. He was followed by big hits from Junior Castillo, Chris Nava, Justin Ramirez, Justin Forbes and Michael Miller. Ira got two runs in the top of the third inning, which were answered by two runs by Michael Miller and Junior Castillo. Chris Nava had an RBI single. "Junior Castillo pretty much pitched seven scoreless innings of playoff baseball for us tonight," said Coach Dillard of the Eagles pitcher.

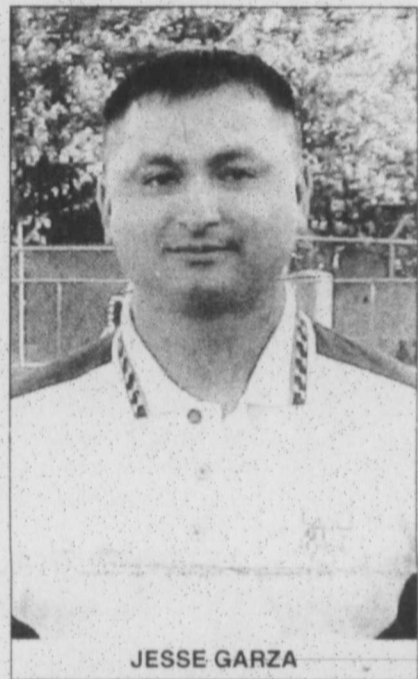
## Burglary Of Home Near Wilson Cleared

A burglary at the home of Dennis Heintze north of Wilson on County Rd. 1 last Wednesday night or Thursday was cleared up over the weekend when officers in Lubbock County caught suspects in the act of burglarizing another home on FM 41. The suspects admitted the Lynn County burglary and turned over to officers a quantity of tools stolen from the Heintze home. The tools were valued at \$2531. Sheriff's officers also are investigating a report from Billy Parmer, who lives northwest of Wilson, that his 2007 Chrysler 4-door car was damaged to the extent of \$2,281 when a male suspect jumped on top of the car at a party in New Home. In the report filed last Wednesday, Parmer said the damage to the roof and the interior of the car was estimated by a repair facility.

Only two persons were jailed in Lynn County in the last week, leaving the total number in jail as of Monday at 40, with 14 of those held for Lubbock County.

One person was arrested on a grand jury indictment for forgery and another was jailed for parole violation.

During the month of April, dispatchers processed 293 calls, including 141 for the county, 93 for Tahoka Police, 13 fire calls, 28 ambulance calls, and 18 for O'Donnell Police.

## Garza Named New TISD Head Football Coach

Jesse Garza has been named as new head football coach at Tahoka High School. Supt. Jimmy Parker said this week. He will succeed Jay Hellums, who has served as head football coach for the Bulldogs for the past two years. Supt. Parker said that Hellums informed school officials he would not be here next year, but he has not yet submitted an official resignation.

Garza has been an assistant coach at Tahoka ISD for one year, and also teaches high school math. His reassignment as head coach comes just as spring football training begins here, and the announcement was made to student athletes this week.

The Superintendent said that board action was not required in making the position reassignment on the coaching staff.

## Storms Drop Moisture in Northern Lynn

Thunderstorms Monday and Tuesday dropped some much-needed moisture in the South Plains area, with the northern portions of Lynn County getting more than the southern half.

Pea to dime size hail was reported in the New Home area about 5:30 Tuesday evening, and unofficial estimates of anywhere from 2-3 inches of moisture accumulated from several rounds of thunderstorms both nights.

The Wilson area also received heavy rains both nights, reportedly a couple of inches during the night Monday and more than an inch of rain falling Tuesday evening and again in the early morning hours Wednesday.

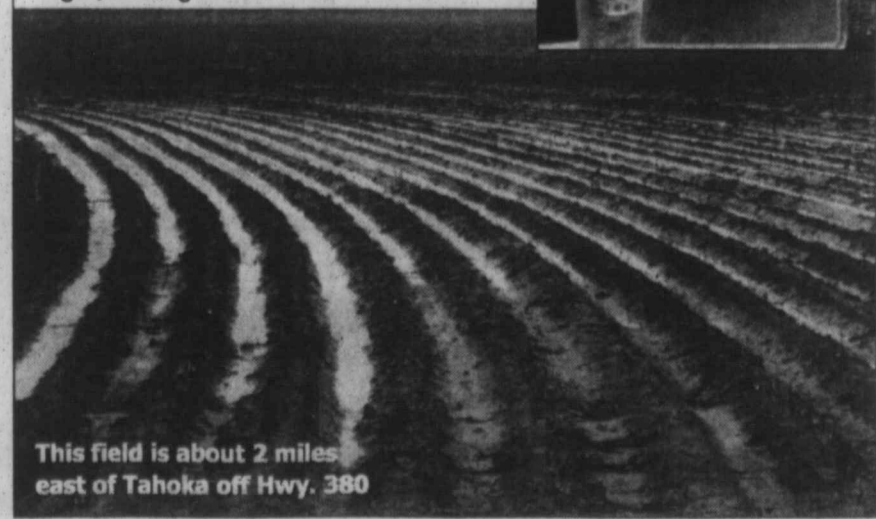
Lightning was probably the culprit in starting a grass fire in northeastern Lynn County, with Tahoka Fire Dept. called out to respond to that fire Tuesday evening. A camper was reported overturned also in that area, with no injuries reported, due to high winds and heavy rains.

Tahoka received 2 inches of rain during the night Monday, and another half inch the following night.

The southern part of the county received some intermittent showers, with less than an inch of moisture estimated in the O'Donnell area for both nights.

## Rain at last ...

Farmers and everybody else were happy to get some much-needed moisture Monday night, as a thunderstorm dumped nearly 2 inches of water in the Tahoka area. This rain gauge shows nearly 2 inches from a home in Tahoka, with an official 1.98" recorded by Haney Wells for the National Weather Service. Up until this point, only 0.71" of moisture had been recorded in Tahoka during the first four months of 2008. Another half inch was recorded Tuesday night, making a total of 3.26" to date.

## Polls To Open Saturday For City/County/School Elections

Polling locations will be open from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. on Saturday, May 10 for several local elections, including city and school elections, and the Lynn County separation of offices issue. In Lynn County there will be one polling location in each city, with the Tahoka location at the Life Enrichment Center at 1717 Main Street, Wilson City Hall in Wilson, New Home City Hall in New Home, and at the O'Donnell High School Commons Area in O'Donnell.

The ballot for the two county propositions will be available at all four polling locations in the county. Otherwise, the city/school elections will be held at the above-listed polling locations in the towns they affect.

Following is an explanation of elections and list of candidates.

**Lynn County Separation of Offices:** Two separate propositions to consider: (1) authorizing the offices of the Lynn County Clerk and Lynn County District Clerk to remain separate; and (2) authorizing the office of the Lynn County Tax Assessor/Collector to remain separate from the Lynn County Sheriff.

**City of Tahoka:** Two council seats, for one at-large district and one single-member district: Dist. 2 - Clara Calvillo (*incumbent*) and Bianca Baker; Dist. 5 At-Large - Ray Box (*i*) and Daniel Harper. All city residents (who are registered voters) may vote in the At-Large Dist. 5 race, but only those residing within District 2 may vote in the Dist. 2 race. (See map of districts at polling location.)

**Tahoka ISD:** Two trustee seats.

both single-member districts: Place 3 - Jimmie Bingham and Mike Rivas; Place 4 - Frank McLelland (*i*) and Starlyn Knox Bray. Voters must reside within Place 3 or Place 4 to vote in these elections (see precinct map at polling location).

**City of Wilson:** Two council seats: Cody Paul Donald, Oscar Follis (*i*) and a blank line for a write-in candidate (Doris Behrend has filed as a write-in candidate but her name will not be printed on the ballot). The mayoral election was cancelled due to Donald Klaus being unopposed for the seat.

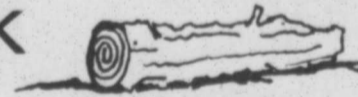
**Wilson ISD:** Two trustee seats: Clyde Wilke (*i*), Danny Mendez (*i*), Josh Isham, Christi Clark, and Kim Steen.

**City of O'Donnell:** Mayor and two council seats: James Williams (*i*) unopposed for Mayor; for council: Harry Howell (*i*), Scotty Martinez (*i*), Max Mendietta, and Rex Little.

**O'Donnell ISD:** Special Election for a 1-year unexpired term: Sharmye Jonas, Brian James; and Trustee Election for two full-term seats on the board: Stella Arguello (*i*), Cade Furlow, Maria Casillas, Craig Dempsey and Chad Summers.

**Two Elections Cancelled:** Lynn County Hospital District cancelled their election for two directors due to unopposed candidates, as did the City of New Home, with three council candidates unopposed. New Home ISD schedules their election in November. The only ballot at the New Home City Hall polling location will be the county propositions ballot.

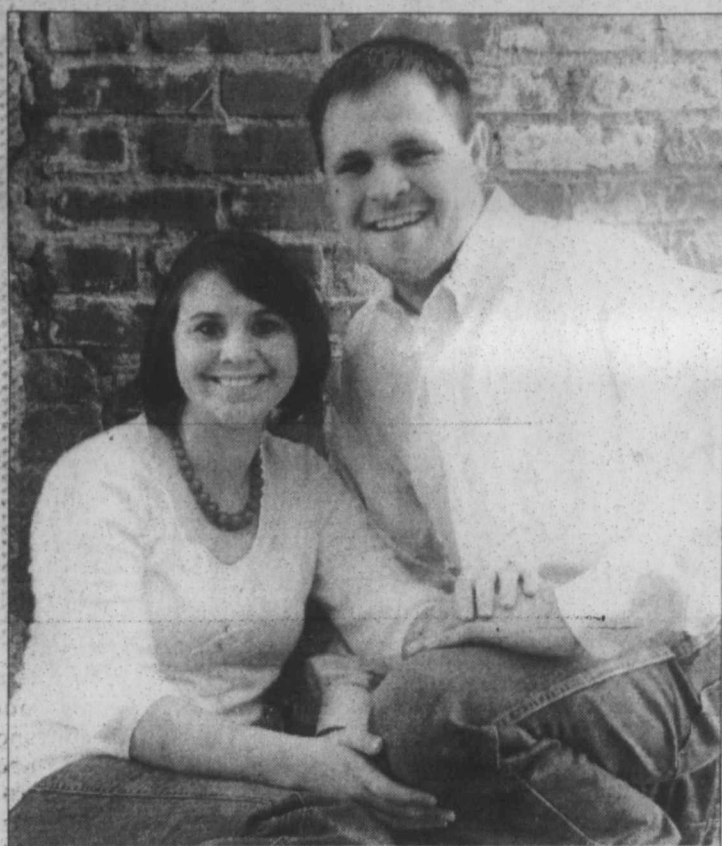

The kitchen normally serves carryout food every Saturday and Sunday.

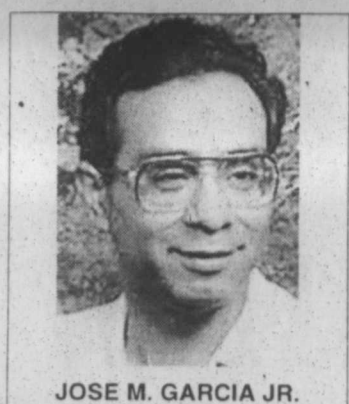

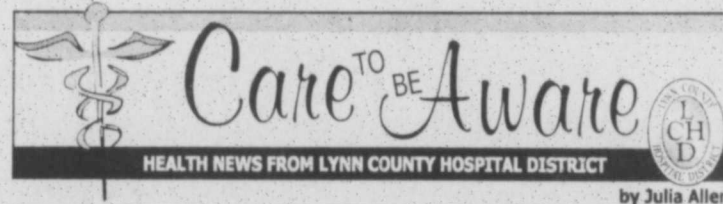

### 5 Steps to Better Bone Health: Series Continued

We are looking at the 5 steps to better bone health. Calcium, exercise, no smoking, no excess drinking, bone density tests are all necessary, according to Kathryn Diemer, MD, professor of medicine and osteoporosis specialist at Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis.

Step one was watching your calcium and vitamin D.

### Bone Health Step 2: Weight-Bearing Exercise

"The body needs 'encouragement' to rebuild bone," Diemer adds. "The skeleton needs to be under stress so it will get stronger." That's why exercise is important for better bone health.

Here are some types of exercises your doctor may suggest.

- **Make walking a daily ritual.** Walking, jogging, and light aerobics make your bones and muscles work against gravity — which puts stress on the skeleton, which strengthens bones. Bicycling is also good for bones; it offers some resistance, which improves muscle mass and strengthens bones.

- **Do 30 minutes of weight-bearing exercise** five days a week if you can, but at least three times a week at the minimum.

- **Core strengthening is critical, too.** Abdominal exercises, lower back exercises, yoga, Pilates, and tai chi help strengthen the spine. Most common fractures are in the spine, and strengthening muscles to

the spine gives more support to the spine. The other thing about yoga, Pilates, and tai chi — they improve balance, which prevents falls.

The LCHD Fitness Center has a wonderful weight system and the staff there will help you develop an individual strength program. They also have a room and TV with a DVD & VCR for you to work on your Pilates, yoga or any other program you may have. Just call Gina at 561-1340 for more information.

If you have osteoporosis tell your instructor. You need close supervision to make sure you don't harm yourself. Be sure to talk with your doctor before you begin any exercise regimen.

### Bone Health Step 3: Don't Smoke & Moderate Alcohol

Nicotine is toxic to bone states Dr. Diemer. "The first thing I tell patients who smoke is, if you don't stop smoking there's very little we can do for your bones. You counteract all medications." So, get help in stopping smoking.

Alcohol in moderation is fine, but just one or two drinks a week if you must. Alcohol in excess causes about 2% bone loss in a year's time. Nicotine also causes 2% bone loss. If you're having alcohol and nicotine both in excess, the combined bone loss is actually doubled — 8% bone loss.

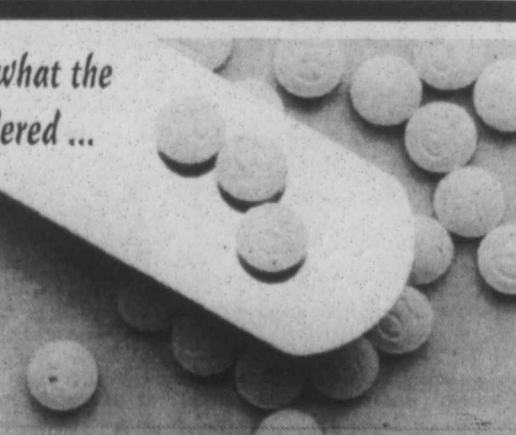

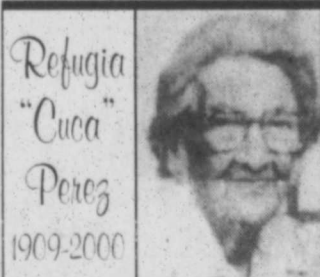

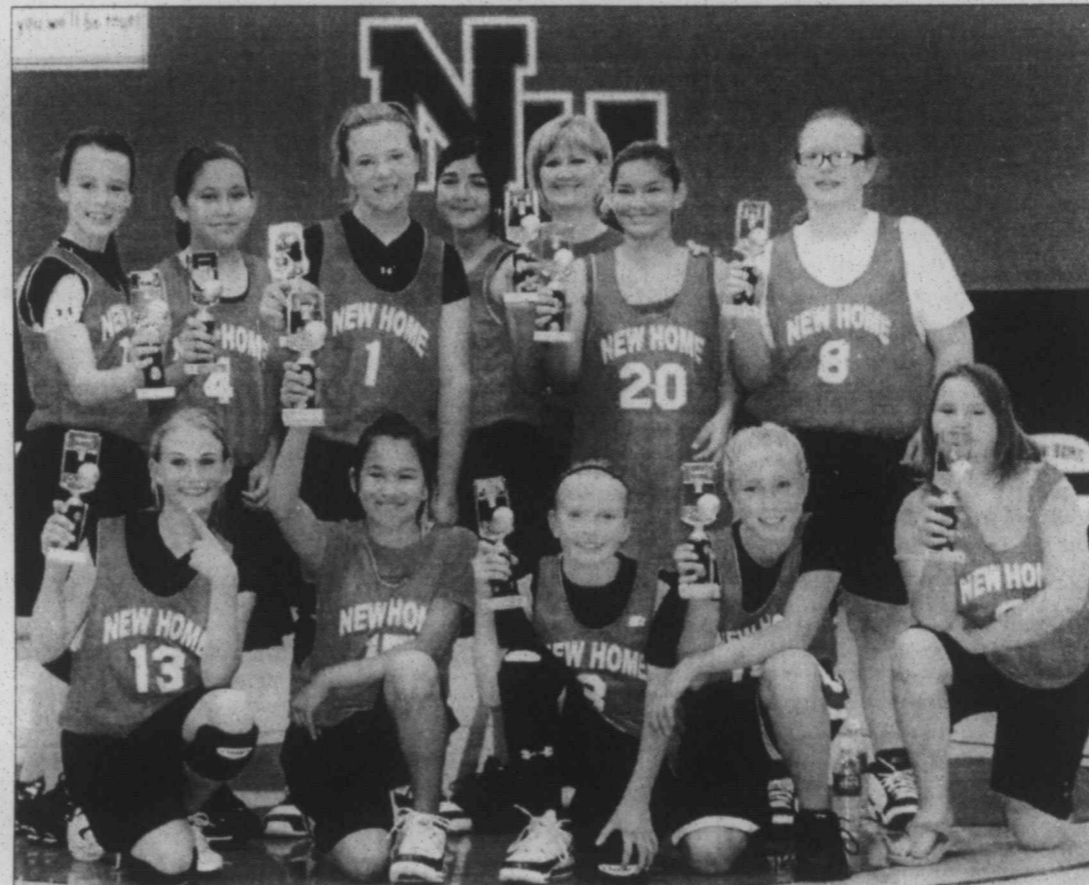

## New Program To Remove, Control Feral Hogs

The Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) recently awarded Texas AgriLife Extension Service \$1 million for the agency's new Texas Feral Hog Control Program: Moving Towards A Long-Term Abatement Strategy.

Texas is home to more than 2 million feral hogs, the largest feral hog population in the U.S., and their numbers continue to increase due to high reproductive potential and the lack of predators.

Feral hogs wreak havoc on property, livestock, crops and pastures across the state and frustrate landowners because of their destructive nature. In fact the Extension Service estimates the statewide annual economic damage caused by feral hogs is close to \$52 million.

A \$500,000 pilot program was administered by Texas AgriLife Extension Service and Texas Tech University through a TDA grant in 2006-2007 and did provide technical assistance to landowners at three sites, and promote educational events for other landowners statewide. The pilot project succeeded in removing more than 3,000 feral hogs, saving landowners/agricultural producers an estimated nearly \$3 million in losses.

## 200 Cast Ballots In Early Voting

Nearly 200 county residents cast ballots at the Lynn County Clerk's Office during the early voting period, April 28-May 6. Lynn County Clerk Susan Tipton reported Tuesday afternoon.

At 3 o'clock, 196 ballots had been cast, with two hours remaining until early voting closed.

Polls will be open at four locations in the county from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. on Saturday, May 10 for voting in city and school elections, and the county propositions ballot. See story on page one for more specific information.

## May Is Motorcycle Safety Month

May is Motorcycle Safety and Awareness Month in Texas, and DPS urges all motorcyclists and the traveling public to practice safe driving habits.

The 852,781 licensed motorcyclists in the state can improve their own safety by following this advice from DPS:

- Attend a professionally taught motorcycle safety course,

(Call 1-800-292-5787 for information.)

- Wear protective equipment, including a helmet, whenever riding.
- Ride defensively.
- Avoid risk-taking behavior, such as speeding, weaving in between traffic and riding while intoxicated.

Nationally, almost half of all motorcycle fatalities involve alcohol.

Drivers in vehicles other than motorcycles should realize that motorcycles are sometimes difficult to see, so keep an eye out for them. Don't cut them off, and give them extra space.

Record numbers of Texans are taking advantage of the basic and advanced motorcycle operator training offered by the DPS Motorcycle Safety Unit. Last year, 33,697 Texans took either the basic or advanced course, setting an all-time record number for the thirteenth straight year.

The basic course may be used to waive the licensing road test, and both of the courses may qualify for ticket dismissal and insurance discounts. Motorcycle riders can locate the course nearest to them by visiting the DPS Web site [www.txdps.state.tx.us/msb/](http://www.txdps.state.tx.us/msb/) and can take advantage of 81 permanent locations and nine mobile sites across the state.

"We continue to notice an increase in crashes involving returning riders, meaning those who have ridden before, took some time off from riding and are getting back into it," said John G. Young, coordinator of the DPS Motorcycle Safety Unit. "We want to encourage them to enroll in one of our courses to brush up on their skills."

In 2006 (latest statistics available), 346 people in Texas died as a result of motorcycle crashes-63 percent of those were not wearing a helmet. Texas law states that in order to be exempt from wearing a helmet, a person must be at least 21 years of age. In addition, they must successfully complete a motorcycle safety course or be covered by a health insurance plan

providing at least \$10,000 in medical benefits for motorcycle-related injuries. DPS recommends all motorcycle riders wear helmets.

**Farm Bill Update**

I am pleased to report to you that there has been significant progress in the 2008 Farm Bill. The Conference Committee met until 1:30 am this past Thursday night and closed out many outstanding provisions, getting us closer to a final product.

All elements of the new Farm Bill were approved, leaving only a few remaining issues outstanding. During this last meeting, I offered my supplemental crop insurance program as an amendment that would have replaced the permanent disaster provision. This amendment would have saved money that could have been reinvested into crop insurance, creating more options for producers when making risk management decisions. It would also have eliminated proposed reductions in direct payments to producers. Unfortunately, this amendment did not pass.

We are expected to meet tomorrow to hopefully finish the conference report. Among one of the most important issues to finalize is the commodity programs. Optimistically, if the few outstanding issues are agreed to, we could see the 2008 Farm Bill go to the House and Senate for a vote within the next two weeks.

Completion of the Farm Bill is not only important to the 19th Congressional District, but to the entire nation. We cannot afford to move forward without a sound farm policy for our producers. Without it, we face the risk of becoming dependent on other nations for food and fiber as we already are for energy. Now is the time to roll up our sleeves and finally take this long overdue legislation across the finish line.

*Ensuring Continued Access to Student Loans Act of 2008*, by a bipartisan vote of 388 to 21. I voted in favor of this legislation. It is a bipartisan bill designed to protect students and families by ensuring that the disruptions in the financial markets do not prevent students from pursuing their higher education goals. This bill has passed both the House and Senate and has been sent to the President's desk and is awaiting his signature.

The *Ensuring Continued Access to Student Loans Act of 2008* contains reforms developed on a bipartisan basis to respond to student loan market instability. These reforms include efforts to inject liquidity and restore investor confidence in the marketplace. It creates new flexibility for parents, provided through an optional grace period, which permits them to defer PLUS loan payments until after their children graduate. It also ensures that parents struggling with the difficulties in the mortgage market are not automatically denied the chance to help pay for their children's education through PLUS loans.

The purpose of this bill is to prevent a student loan crisis before it occurs. H.R. 5715 is a pro-taxpayer solution that protects students and families without increasing federal spending. H.R. 5715 is a first step, but it is certainly not the only step.
