



BY THE TIME you start reading this, gasoline prices likely will be over \$4 per gallon. And if it takes you as long as 10 minutes to read this, by the time you are finished, prices may be up to \$4.25.

That's how fast gasoline prices are increasing, and people who supposedly know what is going on say there is no end in sight just yet; prices could reach \$6 or more per gallon right here in Lynn County, and when that happens, people may start staying at home more.

Although I have seen some stories that claim otherwise, I believe that very few people are modifying their driving plans yet. Traffic prognosticators predicted that 31.7 million people would take trips on Memorial Day weekend, which was either last week or this week, depending on what you go by. And if that happened/happens, it would be almost as many as took to the highways last year, when gasoline was 60 cents a gallon cheaper.

You can go to Lubbock, or anywhere else in this area, and not notice any less traffic. Most folks around here, and all over the nation, apparently, are driving just as much as they ever did, only they are complaining more.

A man told me he put \$100 worth of gas in his SUV the other day. I told him I could remember paying no more than that for at least three different used cars I bought some years ago.

TAHOKA now has a new traffic signal, a whole bunch of lights that turn red, yellow, and green, with arrows and yield signs that are sure to confuse a few older folks who have long been accustomed to a single light hanging down from a wire in the middle of the intersection of U.S. Hwy. 380 and Loop 472, or whatever they call Main St. at that point.

Pretty uptown stuff, with poles extending out across the intersections at each entrance, all because (someone said), the older type hanging down in the middle did not meet certain standards.

Now they've got it fixed so that when the wind blows the traffic lights down, it will smash every car in the intersection, instead of just one vehicle. This is called sharing.



# Lubbock Water Pipeline **To Cross Lynn County**

from Lake Alan Henry to the City of Lubbock is expected to cross a portion of Lynn County, Commissioners learned at their regular meeting Tuesday morning. Joe Pate of McDougal & Company explained to Lynn County Commissioners that all property owners in the proposed path of the pipeline have been sent surveys regarding the proposed pipeline.

Pate said the pipeline would be 48-inches in diameter and would be buried 8 to 10 feet deep across a 65-mile stretch, with approximately 15 miles in Lynn County. They expect to have water flowing by June 2012. The company was not re-

questing any action by county commissioners, but simply informing them of the project's scope.

In other business Tuesday morning, commissioners discussed internet service for the county. Dee Dee Pridmore, representing Poka Lambro, gave a presentation on internet service options, and County Judge H.G. Franklin also had figures from Windstream to consider. Commissioners tabled any decision on the issue until a future meeting.

Commissioners discussed closing the county-owned dumpsite, as the new City of

A pipeline connecting water Tahoka landfill is available for usage by county residents. Tahoka City Administrator Jerry Webster met with the court to discuss allowing a container for burn barrels for county users, and commissioners said they would send a couple of representatives to the next city council meeting for further discussion. They did not set a date as yet for closure of the county dumpsite.

> The county burn ban currently in effect was discussed again, with commissioners voting unanimously to leave it in place at this time. The burn ban prohibits all outdoor burning within the county, including inside cities within the county, and is in effect until July 28, 2008.

> County employee retirement plan considerations were discussed, and commissioners voted to not make any changes in the current plan, leaving it as is. Some discussion was held on whether to apply for an emergency grant for much-needed electrical work at the courthouse, and commissioners asked Judge Franklin to check to see if a grant proposal would affect future considerations on the courthouse restoration project grant, which the county is still seeking.

> Sheriff Jerry D. Franklin reported on his department, and monthly bills were approved. No action was taken on consideration for the sale of countyowned lots in O'Donnell. Commissioners were to have met with Tom Keyes, Gaines County Judge, to consider a software project proposal, but Judge Keyes was unable to attend the meeting. Commissioners moved to table this item and to meet with Judge Keyes at 1 p.m. on Friday, June 6.

All four commissioners were present at the meeting, and Judge Franklin presided.

#### **MOSQUITOES** and WEST NILE VIRUS

COLLEGE STATION - Annoying little mosquitoes not only can aggravate and leave an itchy bite for a week, but they could also put you or your horse at risk for West Nile Encephalitis. But there are ways to stop the itching, learn more about how you can get it, the symptoms to look for and ways to prevent contracting West Nile.

West Nile Encephalitis, also known as a bird disease, is technically an inflammation of the brain; It is called a bird disease because. contrary to what many people believe. birds are the natural hosts of the disease.

While many people think mosquitoes are the hosts, they only serve as intermediate hosts and transmit the disease from birds to people and horses.

"While over 100 species of birds host the disease, the most susceptible are blue jays, crows, and hawks." says Dr. Floron Faries. a veterinarian at the College of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences at Texas A&M University.

"Once a mosquito bites an infected bird, it takes 10 to 14 days for the disease to get into its salivary glands. It is not until after this time period that a mosquito can transmit the disease to people and horses. Cats, dogs, and other animals can get the infection, but do not show symptoms."

There are two vaccinations available for horses. Recombitex is a vaccine that should be administered yearly and another. Innovator. twice a year. Although there are currently no vaccinations for people. there are plenty of ways to lower your chances of contracting the disease

"Don't depend on the city to fog out mosquitoes. Be proactive when it comes to prevention." says Faries.

"I recommend controlling stagnant water by getting rid of junk laying around. Mosquitoes reproduce in small containers of water. such as cans, jars and pots. Also, wear long clothes if you must be outside during the hours of dusk and dawn and use plenty of mosquito repellant that contains DEET."



come sick, only about 30 percent will result in death, Fairies says. Only 6 percent of people who develop the disease will die.

Symptoms are similar to that of rabies. Depression. muscle twitching, weak limbs, and walking problems are common. Horses usually stand up by raising their head, putting weight on the front legs, and finally standing on all four. When encephalitis is present, the back legs, are usually too weak to put weight on, and the horse ends up sitting like a dog. Faries explains.

"You can't just assume the diagnosis, though. If these symptoms are present, it might not even be West Nile," says Faries. "The horse," could also have rabies. Eastern equine encephalitis or Western. equine encephalitis. Laboratory tests should be taken to be sure which disease is present."

# Memory Loss Can Be Attributed To Many Causes

Many people believe that memory loss and aging go hand-inhand: as a person gets older his or her memory begins to fail. Not true! Whether they care to admit it or not, many people think that their forgetfulness is the first sign of Alzheimer's disease. However, we now know that most people remain both alert and able as they age, although it may take them longer to remember things.

A lot of people experience memory lapses. Some memory problems are serious, others are not. People who have serious changes in their memory, personality and behavior may suffer from a form of brain disease called dementia - the two most common forms of dementia being Alzheimer's disease and multi-infarct dementia. Dementia seriously affects a person's ability to carry out daily activities.

Sometimes older people have emotional problems that may cause memory loss and be mistaken for dementia. Feeling sad, lonely, worried or bored may be more common for some older adults for a variety of . reasons

Adapting to change may leave some people feeling confused or forgetful.

mended. A complete medical examination for memory loss may include gathering information about medical history, including use of prescription and over the counter medicines, diet, past medical problems and general health. Because a correct diagnosis depends on recalling these details accurately, the health provider also may ask a family member for information.

Lab tests may help your health provider find any problems. There are also tests of mental abilities: memory, problem solving, counting and language. A brain scan may assist the doctor in ruling out a curable disorder. A scan also may show signs of normal age related changes high-profile link to Texas EDGE, in the brain. Many older adults, in fact, people of all ages, wonder how they may try to keep their memory sharp. #### HEALTHY SNACKS FOR KIDS

It's about that time again - The kids will be out of school within the next few days. Get ready for the "I'm bored" statement to start fairly soon. And then there is the "I'm hungry" proclamation. According to Bridget Swinney, MD., author of the book Baby Bites, It is important to treat snacks as opportunities for busy bodies to refuel. Below are a few ideas for some healthy snacks to give your kids as an alternative to chips and cookies.

Mini pizza: Help them put together a pizza using one-half of a whole-grain English muffin or small whole-wheat pita bread; ketchup or marinara sauce; and grated cheese. Use olives, shredded carrots, and other vegetables for facial features

Snack mix: Set out small bowls of plain Cheerios, dried fruit, and chopped nuts, sunflower seeds, or roasted soy nuts. Give kids a bowl or small plastic container and let them mix it up. Throw in a few mini chocolate chips for a sweet treat. This trail mix is also good mixed

and 1 ice cube. Add milk or yogurt to achieve desired consistency.

Pop a single-serve bag of lowfat microwave popcorn. Sprinkle with grated Parmesan cheese.

Sliced apple, peach, pear, bananas, or cooked sweet potato, dipped in low-fat vanilla yogurt.

Baby carrots, celery sticks, sliced red bell peppers, cherry to: matoes (cut in half) or any other cooked or raw vegetable paired with low-fat Ranch dressing; hummust nut butter; or sunflower seed butter;

Think of snacks as mini-meals and offer the same foods you'd fea: ture at mealtimes. You probably wouldn't dream of serving your child sodium-laden snack crackers and a sugary beverage for dinner, so don't give it to him or her as a snack. either

Whether your kids are tots or teens, you should probably schedule in healthy snacks, even if loosely; That's because eating at regular mtervals discourages kids from grazing, characterized as near-continuous nibbling or drinking, or both, throughout the day. How much should you serve at snack time? Enough to take the edge off a child's hunger. Start small; you can always serve more. And don't worry if your child is not particularly hungry at the next meal, Swinney says. Left to their own devices, kids typically curb food consumption accord-

Emotional problems can be eased by supportive friends and family or by professional help from a health provider or counselor.

Stress, anxiety or depression can make a person more forgetful. Forgetfulness caused by these emotions usually is temporary and goes away when the feelings fade. However, if these feelings last for a long period of time, getting help from a professional is important.

Treatment may include counseling or medication, or a combination of both.

In fact, there are several conditions that may be treated or reversed which cause memory problems. Reversible conditions can be caused by a high fever, dehydration, vitamin deficiency and poor nutrition. bad reactions to medicines, problems with the thyroid gland or a minor head injury. Medical conditions like these can be serious and should be treated by a health provider as soon as possible.

People who are worried about memory problems should see their health provider. If he or she believes that the problem is serious, then a thorough evaluation may be recom-

Exercise is important to keep. your body healthy but it is also important for your mind. The brain needs exercises and challenges so that it can remain active and keep up with your daily life. Try to challenge your brain daily to keep it active and alert. Also, remember that a healthy diet is very important to the body's function and especially to the mind. Although no special diets or nutritional supplements have been shown to specifically address memory problems, a balanced diet helps maintain overall good health.

Some physical and mental changes occur with age in healthy people.

However, much pain and suffering can be avoided if older adults. their families and their health providers recognize that memory loss is not part of normal aging. Texas A&M College of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences, says there are frequent

causes of "the itchy pet." Stickney notes that itching is most commonly caused by three different instigators. The first are parasites like fleas, ticks or skin mites. These creatures latch onto the animal's skin causing irritation, which animals scratch in response. There are numerous over-the-counter and prescription treatments for fleas and ticks, but Skickney recommends sticking with prescription brands.

"Over-the-counter treatments do not remain effective for very long, while the prescriptions given by a veterinarian are proven to last a month between doses, continue working even after bathing or swimming and are much more effective. Flea collars are especially ineffective," he confirms.

Skin mites or "scabies" pose a different threat than fleas or ticks. Skin mites feed on blood,



from a veterinarian, and Stickney says it is important that pet owners keep an eye out for constant itching, or the pet may be experiencing the same symptoms in the near future.

The second most common cause of itching in dogs is food allergies. According to Stickney, pets are usually allergic to a certain protein contained in the food, such as pork or chicken.

"If your pet has food allergies, the animal will itch all the time and have recurrent ear infections," informs Stickney.

If these symptoms arise, he says it is important for the pet to visit the veterinarian as soon as possible. The veterinarian will most likely place the animal on a novel protein diet, which has a form of protein for which the animal has never been exposed. The veterinarian will likely use a "trial and error" feeding regime to discover a protein that the animal can tolerate. The animal will eat a food with a certain protein

for two months, and the veterinarian will monitor the pet's progress. During this time, it is very important that pet owners restrict the animal's consumption to only the prescribed food with no extra treats, Stickney notes. This process will continue until an acceptable protein has been found.


The third most common skin irritant is called atopy. According to Stickney, these are the equivalent of human allergies. Pets may be allergic to pollen, dust mites or any other allergen that plagues humans, but instead of reacting with a runny nose or a headache, pets scratch their skin

"One of the most apparent signs of allergies in a dog is that the dog will constantly lick its paws," Stickney says.

Allergies can be treated with shampoos, antihistamines or through allergy testing.
