Police Shut Down Game Room Here

The Lucky 7 Game Room operating at 1529 Ave. J in Tahoka was shut down after Tahoka Police and other officers, about two dozen in all, executed a search warrant of the facility and the home of the operator, identified as Joe Calvillo of Tahoka.

Police Chief Doyle Lee said authorities have reason to believe that cash was being paid to persons playing the machines, commonly called eight-liners, rather than just prizes, and that cash payments of that type are illegal in Texas.

Local, state and federal officers reportedly were involved in the raid, which drew a large crowd of sightseers near the home in the west part of Tahoka. Raids were made simultaneously at the game room, the home at 2528 N. 1st St., and Calvillo Bail Bonds at 1531 Ave. J.

Tahoka Police spearheaded the raids, and other agencies taking part included the Dept. of Public Safety, Internal Revenue Service, Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Lynn County Sheriff's Dept., Lee said.

No arrests have been made in the case, with investigation continuing, according to Lee.

No information was released regarding what evidence was obtained from Calvillo's home or bonding company. At the game room, the machines were left in place, but rendered inoperable by removal of key parts.

Major thefts of copper cable again were reported in the county, with Poka Lambro Telephone Cooperative being hit for the second time in about a month. This time, 671 feet of large copper cable valued at \$12,635 was stolen off the yard, between May 22 and May 27.

Sheriff's officers also were advised that 140 feet of copper wire about an inch in diameter was stolen sometime before May 30 at a pivot sprinkler location next to the intersection of U.S. 380 and FM 1054. The owner, Brad Hammonds, valued the stolen cable at \$7,000.

Glen Norman of Post reported to the sheriff's office Saturday that a 20x8-foot car hauler trailer with ramps had been stolen from a farm location about a mile northeast of Grassland.

Last Thursday afternoon a New Home School bus carrying students on the last day of school was involved in a collision with a car on a curve about four miles north of New Home on FM 1730. The bus did not overturn, and most of the students apparently were not injured. Two were taken to a Lubbock hospital for treatment. Informa-

tion on the accident was incomplete as the investigating officers could not be contacted.

Information also was not immediately available on an accident about 4 a.m. Wednesday about 11 miles north of Tahoka on U.S. 87, where an 18-wheeler reportedly burned, with no injuries reported.

Forty-three persons were in Lynn County jail as of early this week, with 17 of those held for Lubbock and two for Gaines County. Latest to be jailed were persons charged with failure to

appear on charges of possession of marijuana and driving while license invalid, application to revoke probation on conviction of felony driving while intoxicated, applications to revoke probations on convictions of aggravated assault and fraud, and theft by check (Midland).

Dispatchers at Lynn County Sheriff's Dept. answered 257 calls in May, including 121 for the county, 93 for Tahoka Police, 14 for O'Donnell Police, 20 ambulance calls and nine fire alarms.

The couple plans to marry on June 28, 2008 at the Tahoka Activity Center.

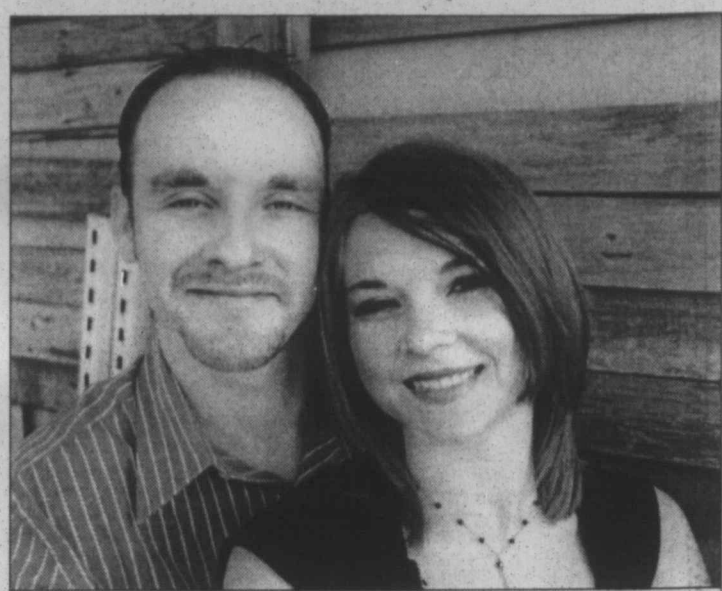

Rylin Rock would like to announce the engagement and upcoming marriage of her father, Rhuston Tyler Rock to Haleigh Blane Ross.



ACU Gives Perfect Score To Neugebauer

WASHINGTON, DC—Congressman Randy Neugebauer (TX-19) was recently recognized by the American Conservative Union (ACU) with a perfect rating of 100 percent. The ACU, America's oldest and largest conservative advocacy group, uses their annual ratings "to provide a balanced, comprehensive picture of each Member of Congress's ideological predisposition based upon recorded votes."

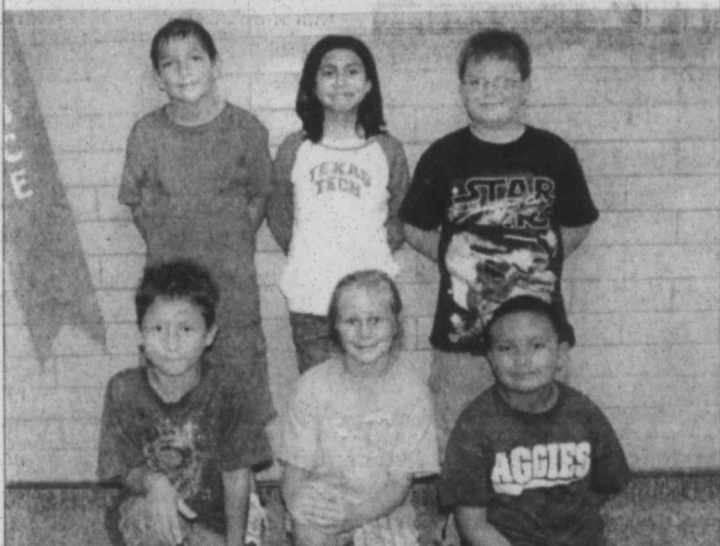

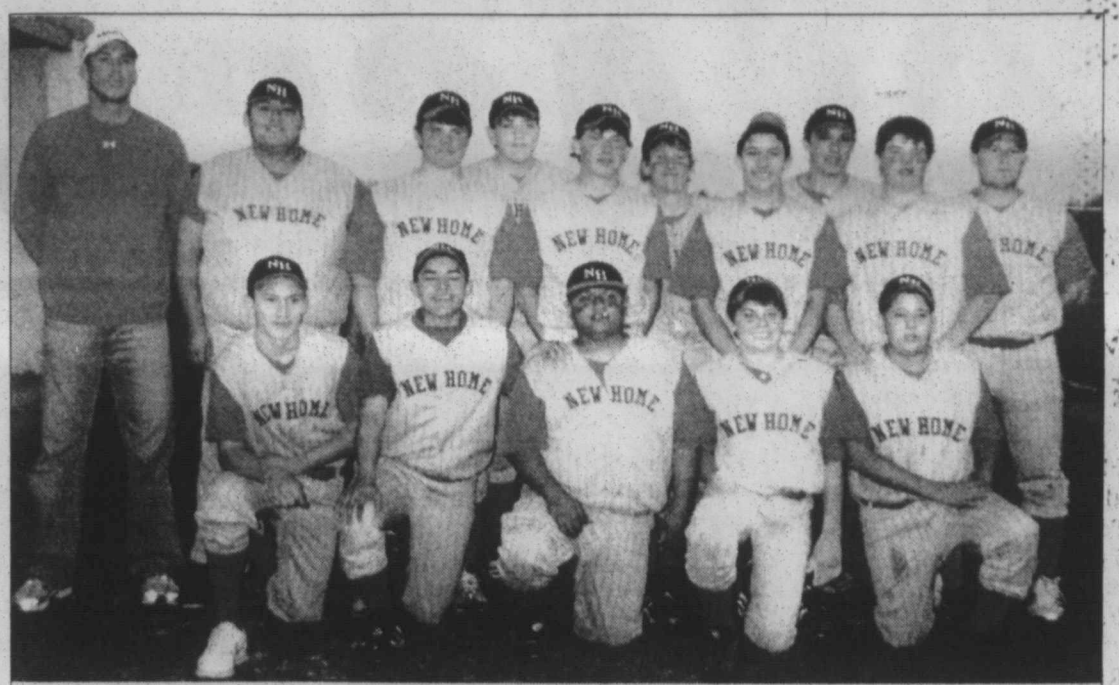

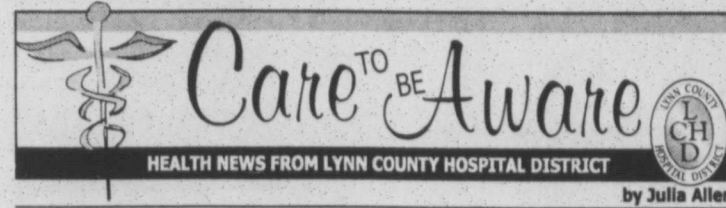

MOSQUITO SEASON IS HERE - BE PREPARED

Mosquito season is upon us. The cities are working hard to spray and keep their population down. But mosquitoes are still out there. We find ourselves outside more and more as the nights get longer and longer. Baseball, BBQ's, family gatherings and yard work beckon us out. In view of that here is some information on the best repellents to use.

You can buy many different kinds of insect repellents. Some work better than others.

It is important for pregnant and nursing women to follow these tips for safe use of insect repellents. If you have a question or concern about the use of insect repellents, talk with your doctor.

Products that work the best DEET, according to WebMD, works the best. Insect repellents that

contain DEET are available in different strengths. You get about 5 hours of protection to your skin that contains 24% DEET. DEET strengths greater than 50% do not provide much better protection. Wrist, ankle, and neck bands that contain DEET do not work well.

Although there have been concerns about the safety of using DEET on skin, studies over the past 40 years have not shown that DEET causes cancer or other illnesses in adults.

But remember these guidelines:

- Do not use DEET on children younger than the age of 2 months.
- When applying DEET to children 2 to 24 months of age:
 - Use only when there is a high risk of insect bites.
 - Use repellents with the lowest concentration of DEET available (usually 5% to 10%).
 - As with all insect repellents,

use sparingly and never apply to the hands or near the eyes.

- Apply no more than one time per day and avoid prolonged use.

• When applying DEET to children 2 to 12 years of age:

- Use repellents with the lowest concentration of DEET available (usually 5% to 10%).

- Apply no more than three times per day and avoid prolonged use.

Other things to keep in mind when you use DEET:

• DEET reduces how well sunscreen works by one-third. If you need to use sunscreen and DEET at the same time, put on sunscreen first and wait 20 minutes before applying DEET. You should take a shower, when coming in, as in any use of a chemical you need to wash it off of your body. You do not want the chemical residue on your sheets either.

• Be careful if applying DEET to clothing. It can damage some man-made fabrics, such as nylon and polyester.

Next week we will look at some other repellents than DEET.
