### Theft, Harassing Calls Reported

A 31-year-old Tahoka woman reported obscene and harassing telephone calls from two persons in Brownfield, and Tahoka Police indicated in a report Sunday that the case would be presented for prosecution.

Tahoka Police also were advised during the last week that a cell phone had been stolen from a church hall where it was left while the owner, Virginia Lee of Tahoka, was helping with Vacation Bible School. The Upstate II Sprint phone was valued at \$300.

Lynn County jail was home to just 35 inmates this week, with only four persons brought in during the last several days. Those four were jailed for execution of a court order regarding deadly conduct, parole violation, driving while license invalid and driving while intoxicated third offense or

### **City To Add Late Penalty** For Past-Due Water Bills

Tahoka residents who wait to pay their city utility bills after the 15th of the month will find a new late penalty fee attached to their past-due notices, starting in the August billing cycle. Tahoka City Council members unanimously approved the new fee in their regular monthly meeting held Monday

"The city sends out water/sewer/ garbage bills on the 25th of each month, with payments due on the 1st," explained City Administrator Jerry Webster. "If payments are not received by the 15th of the month, past due notices are sent out. Starting in our August billing cycle, those past due notices will have an extra 10 percent late. fee penalty added to the bill."

The late-fee penalty is being added to encourage residents to pay their bills by the 15th, not only because it would save the city from having to send out hundreds of past-due notices each month, but also to bring those funds to

city coffers earlier in the monthly

In other business, council members approved a request from the Lynn County Commissioners Court to allow the placement of a container at the city landfill site for county residents to put burn barrels in. The request was approved contingent upon county commissioner approval for the following fee schedule: a one-time \$2500 fee to modify the city landfill permit would be required, as well as a \$200/month container rental fee and \$100/month to subsidize the salary for the city employee to oversee the container. These fees would be paid by the county, if

approved by county commissioners. City officials approved a resolution suspending the effective date for a rate increase by Xcel, joining a coalition of other cities seeking to reduce the rate

IT WAS IN JULY of the year 1981 B.C. (before computers) when I first wrote the column you are about to read unless you find something better to do. All ages and levels of fitness are welcome to join. "It's a relaxing way to loosen up your muscles and help stay in shape," stated a representative.







### **Buy-In Waiver For Supplemental Agricultural Disaster Assistance Programs Underway in New Farm Bill**

2008 - USDA's Farm Service Limited Resource," or "Begin-Agency (FSA) will allow producers who would otherwise be ineligible for the new disaster assistance programs to become eligible by paying a fee as required by the Food, Conservation and Energy Act of 2008 (the 2008 Act).

The 2008 Act requires producers who wish to participate in the new disaster programs to have crop insurance or non-insured crop disaster assistance (NAP) coverage for the land for which assistance is being requested, and for all farms in all counties in which they have an interest. Since the 2008 Act was enacted after the application periods had closed for those programs, producers who did not have such coverage could in order to be eligible for the new disaster programs. However, the 2008 Act authorizes a waiver that allows producers to pay a fee, called a "buy-in" fee, to be eligible for this new disaster assistance.

Every producer whose crops, including grazing lands, are not fully covered by crop insurance or NAP may take advantage of this one-time opportunity. The buy-infee is due no later than Sept. 16, 2008, 90 days after the date of Act. Those who miss this opportunity will not be eligible for disasreminded that the payment of the applicable buy-in fee does not afford the producer crop insurance or NAP coverage; it only affords programs.

### **Emergency Farm Loan Applications Accepted**

Applications for emergency farm loan for losses caused by drought on January 1, 2008 or by fire on March 31, 2008, are being accepted at the Farm Service Agency (FSA) office located in Tahoka, FSA Acting Farm Loan Manager Linda Turner said recently.

Turner said farmers may be eligible for loans of up to 80 percent of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue in business, whichever is less. For farmers unable to obtain credit from private commercial lenders, the interest is 3.75

"As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30 percent loss of production to be eligible for an FSA emergency loan," Turner said. Farmers participating in the Federal Crop Insurance program will have to figure in proceeds from this program in determining their loss. Applications for loans under this emergency designation will be accepted until February 27, 2009, but farmers should apply as soon as possible. Delays in applying could create backlogs in processing and possibly over into the new farming season," said Turner.

FSA is a credit agency of the U.S. Department of Agriculture. It is authorized to provide disaster Emergency loans to recognized farmers who work at and rely on farming for a substantial part of their living. Eligibility is extended to individual farmers who are U.S. citizens and to farming partnerships, corporations or cooperatives in which U.S. citizens hold a majority in-

The FSA office in Tahoka is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Plains Underground Water Conservation District will have an opportunity to comment on proposed administrative changes to the district's rules at two public hearings in early August.

The first hearing is set for Aug, 5 at the Hereford Community Center, 100 Avenue C, in Hereford. A second hearing is set for Aug. 7 at the High Plains Water District office, 2930 Avenue Q, in Lubbock. Both meetings begin at

This proposed revision to the Water District's rules includes introduction of a new printed format and addition of new procedural rules resulting from passage of House Bill 1763, now codified as Chapter 36.108 of the Texas Water Code.

'The Water District has operated under these procedural rules since the legislation was passed; however, they have not been specifically referenced in the district's rules. This revision to the district rules will correct that," said General Manager Jim

He added that the new procedural rules deal with citizens' lawsuits pertaining to illegal water wells drilled without a permit from the district, water well permit hearing procedures, and rulemaking hearing procedures.

"Each proposed addition is now State Law. We are simply incorporating them into our district rule booklet for the convenience of our constituents," Conkwright said.

Also, the district rule booklet has been reorganized so that rules on a given subject are grouped in one location rather than being scattered throughout the publication. "We hope that the new printed presentation of our rules makes them more user-friendly. There are now 11 section headings and the district's 23 rules have been placed under the appropriate headers for easier reference," he




