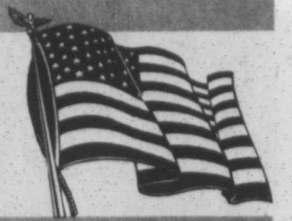

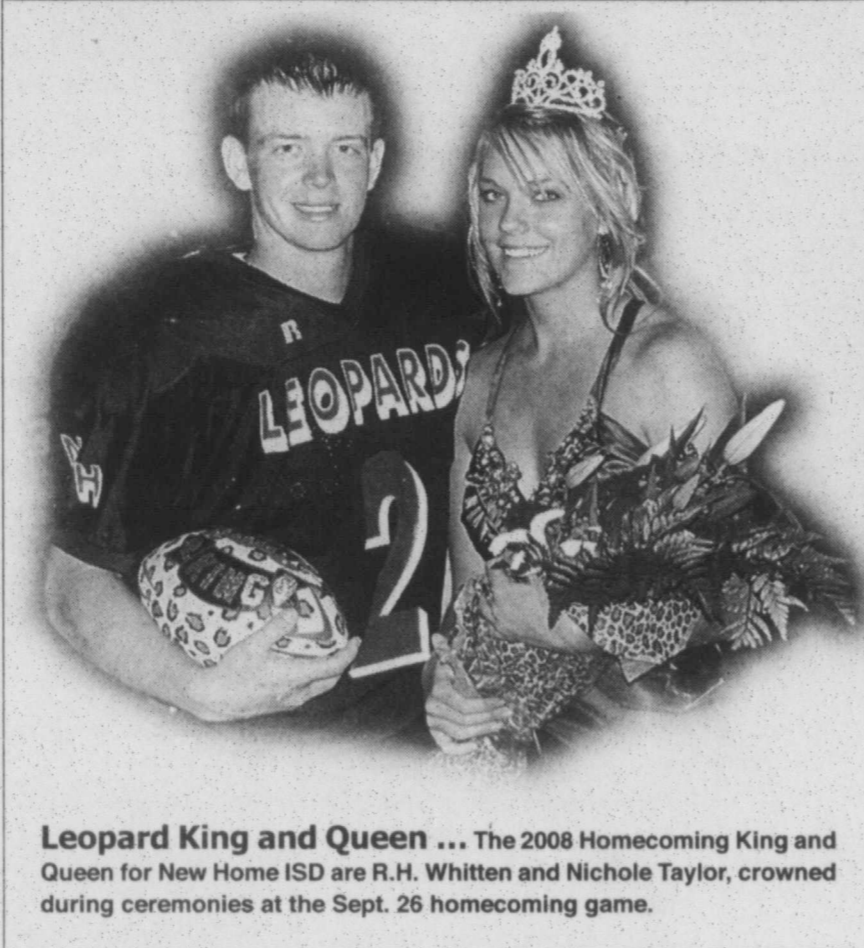

Rotary Club To Bring Back 'Moonlight Madness' Here

Tahoka Rotary Club is bringing back "Moonlight Madness" to the Tahoka square this year, with plans to invite all organizations and citizens in Lynn County to the courthouse square on Monday night, Dec. 1. The event will be somewhat different from years past, with school organizations from all four county schools invited to participate in different aspects of the evening, choir performances and other live entertainment, horse and buggy rides, live Christmas scenes at the courthouse square, refreshments, and of course, Santa Claus will be here to visit with children.

The official lighting of the courthouse and surrounding grounds will also take place at Moonlight Madness, and Rotary Club is asking all businesses in the downtown area to decorate for the event. Businesses close to the square may also want to stay open later or host

an open house. "We are asking for monetary donations from organizations, businesses or individuals to help sponsor the event, and are also seeking people interested in helping to sponsor an event or wanting to help with any aspect of Moonlight Madness," said Rebekah Filley, a member of the Rotary Club's Moonlight Madness Committee. Donations may be given to any Rotarian. "We are hoping this will be an annual event to bring our community closer together and to help celebrate the holidays," she added. Local Man Pens Thriller

Book-Signing Set at Lubbock Stores



A Vietnam veteran who now drives a truck for a living and makes his home in Tahoka has written a fast-paced adventure novel, published by AuthorHouse, that is now available in Lubbock bookstores. Duarl Richardson will be signing his book, entitled "Zammatra," at three Lubbock bookstores this weekend, where his book is for sale.

Richardson will sign books from 1-3 p.m. Friday, Oct. 10 at Hastings Book Store located at 50th and Indiana; from 1-3 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 11 at the Hastings store located at 320 N. University; and from 1-3 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 12 at Barnes and Noble bookstore located at 6707 Slide Road.

The author says the novel pits two sisters against one another, one of whom is an FBI agent and the other a terrorist, in a fast-paced adventure set against a backdrop of international terror and intrigue. "Raised in separate societies, and indoctrinated to very different beliefs, one becomes an FBI agent and the other becomes a terrorist. Both are bent on their missions - one to destroy lives, the other to save lives - and they soon find themselves pitted against each other in a deadly game," according to the book synopsis. "Zammatra is a woman raised by lies and a brutal father. Will she find out the truth in time or is it too late for her to understand the truth? Jessica misses the sister she believes dead. Will she unknowingly destroy her? As a terrorist plot unfolds, both sisters will follow their destiny and choose their path towards a head-on collision. Hero or terrorist, savior or survivor - follow them to a climax that will keep you glued to the pages, in a brutal race against time."

In a biographical sketch on his book's back cover, Richardson says the events of Sept. 11, 2001 changed his way of looking at the world forever. "Hating terrorists for their acts against humanity is the way we should feel, but you can't condemn a nation or religion for the acts of a few," he says. "I believe education is the way to peace, not war, but sometimes we are forced into situations ... In the 1960s it wasn't the violence that brought change in our own country, it was education," says Richardson, who served in the U.S. Army for five years, and spent two of those years in Vietnam.

Richardson says driving a truck for a living gives him lots of time to think about plots, and he is already putting the finishing touches on a sequel, with plans for a third book in the Zammatra trilogy.

Anyway, a friend sent me some other redneck sayings last week, and here are some of the better ones (I don't know where they originated):

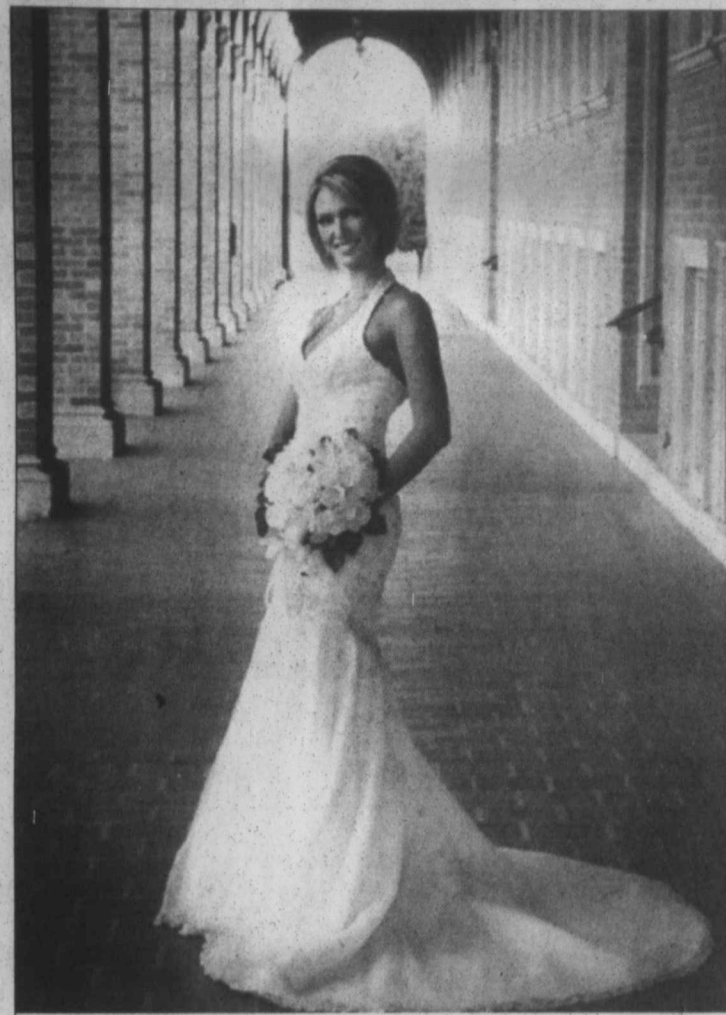
- YOU MIGHT BE A REDNECK IF ...

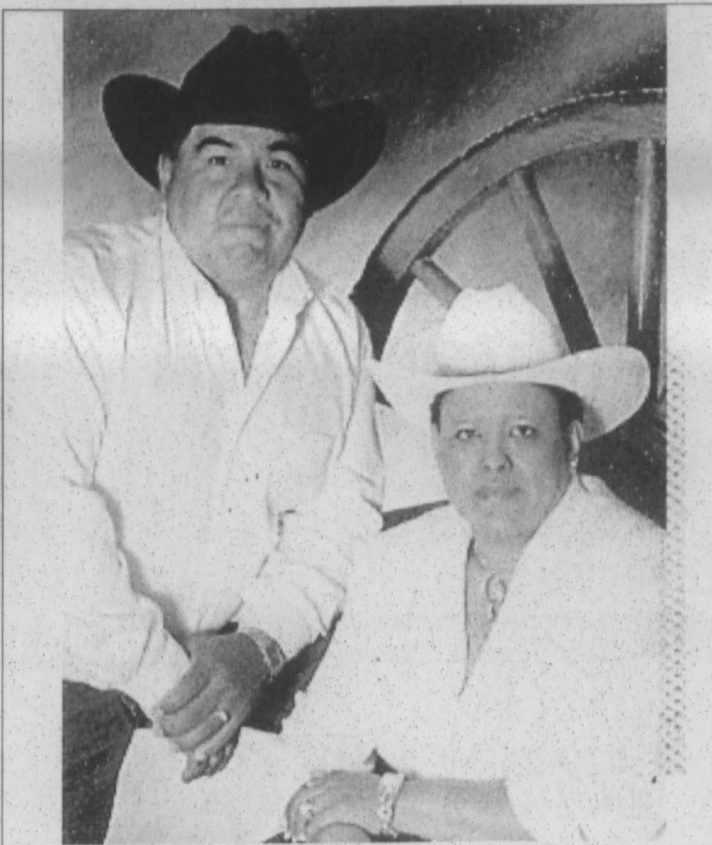
"Needless to say, I am quite proud of Trey and his accomplishments and am looking forward to seeing how far he can go, this his senior year," stated director Carroll Rhodes.

Tax Rollback Election Questions? Tahoka ISD Board Sets Public Meeting For Oct. 13

Tahoka Independent School District Board of Trustees and Superintendent Jimmy Parker invite area residents to an informational meeting scheduled for 7 o'clock Monday evening, Oct. 13 at The Center for Housing and Community Development to present information about the school district's need for a tax rollback election. Voters residing within the school district will have an opportunity to approve or disapprove a tax rate of \$1.17 for Tahoka ISD, in the Nov. 4 election.

Currently the tax rate is \$1.04 per \$100 of property value, which is the highest rate allowed by law for Maintenance and Operating funds. The district is asking voters to approve a \$1.17 tax rate, which is 13-cents higher than the rollback tax rate, necessitating a rollback election.

Trustees approved a budget of \$6,121,366 for the 2008-09 school year, with revenue projected of \$5,735,268 at the \$1.04 tax rate, which leaves a shortfall of \$386,098. If voters approve the \$1.17 tax rate, revenue would be expected to increase by \$400,000 to \$500,000, which would bring the budget into the black.

All interested citizens are invited to attend Monday night's public meeting at the Housing Center, located at South 3rd and Ave. K, and questions from the audience will be taken.

Trustees met Oct. 7 for their monthly session, conducting routine business quickly in a short meeting. Supt. Parker informed the board the Tahoka ISD had received a "Superior" rating for their financial reporting practices, in the Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST) rating report. Campus principals presented reports, and monthly bills were approved.

Supt. Parker informed trustees that the Booster Club had requested the school to consider

improvements to the softball field, but the field is city-owned property and not under school jurisdiction.

Public Meeting Oct. 21: Wilson ISD Rollback Election Nov. 4

Voters in the Wilson Independent School District will have an opportunity to vote on the school tax rate in a rollback election set for Nov. 4. The school district is asking voters to approve a \$1.23 tax rate, which includes \$1.17 tax rate in Maintenance and Operating funds, and a 6-cent tax rate in the Interest and Sinking fund to repay bonded indebtedness.

WISD Superintendent Raymond Lusk and the Board of Trustees have set an informational meeting for 7 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 21 to present information to the public about the district's need for the increased tax rate. All interested citizens are invited to attend the meeting, which will be held in the school cafeteria.

Currently, the Wilson ISD tax rate is \$1.14727, which includes \$1.04 for M&O and \$0.10727 for I&S. The proposed tax rate is 13-cents higher than the school district's rollback tax rate of \$1.04, which is the highest amount allowed by law without voter approval.

With budget figures increasing by 3.5% from the previous year, school officials expect Wilson ISD to have an estimated budget deficit of \$157,950 if the district remains at the \$1.04 M&O tax rate. The bonded indebtedness of \$255,000 is from a bond election approved by voters in 1995 for the construction of new gymnasium, and the I&S tax rate pays this debt.

Ernie Torrez and Christina Dela Garza announce their engagement.

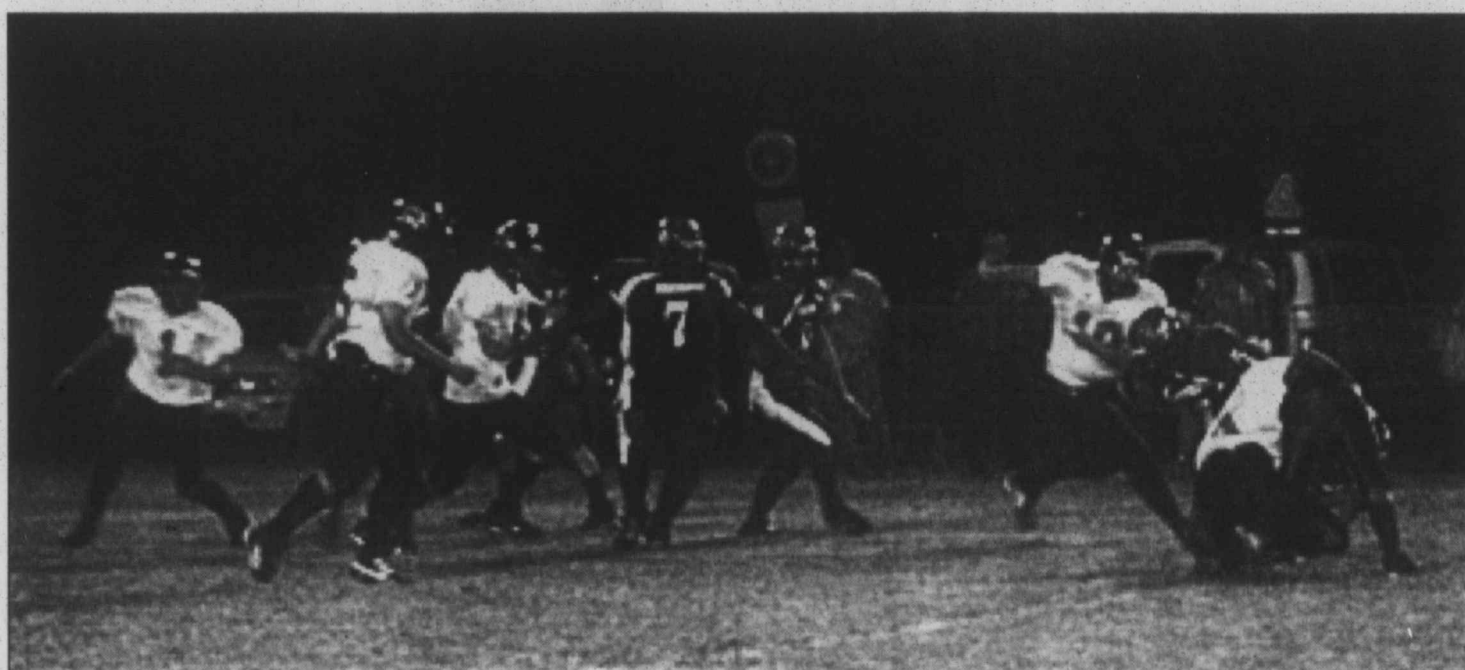

Police Investigate Domestic, Criminal Mischief Incidents

Tahoka Police investigated domestic incidents and a case of criminal mischief during the last week. One of the complaints was a report from a man that his daughter had been struck in the face by her boyfriend, who was an illegal immigrant. Police discovered that four illegal immigrants were living at the residence on Lockwood, and all four were taken to the sheriff's office, then released to a Border Patrol agent.

Another report involved a Lubbock woman who reported a 3-year-old girl had been injured when spanked with a belt by the child's grandfather.

Police also arrested a 45-year-old Tahoka man on an outstanding warrant, and took a report from Christian Aguirre of Tahoka who said her 2002 Hyundai had been keyed on the hood last Thursday, deep into the paint.

Only four persons were jailed in the county during the last week, on charges of driving while intoxicated third offense or more (two persons), possession of marijuana, and

application to revoke probation on conviction of furnishing alcohol to a minor.

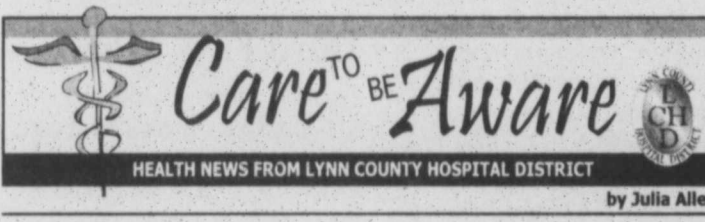
Total jail population early this week was 35, with 12 of those held for Lubbock County and five others for Gaines County.

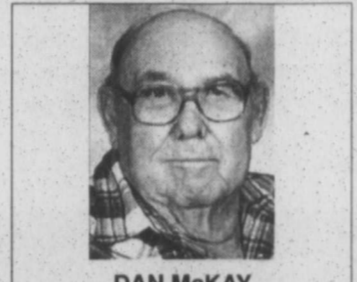

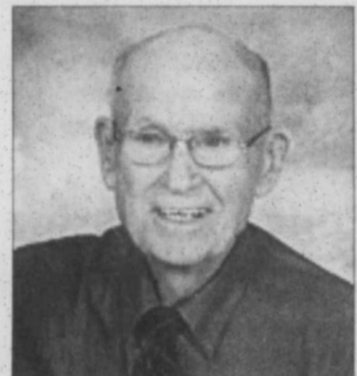

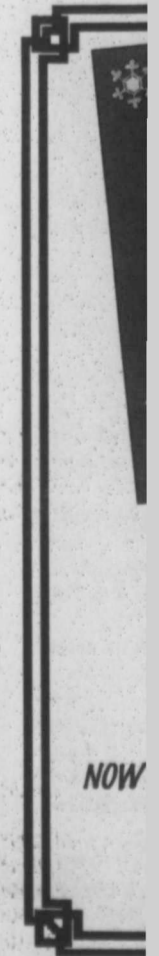

South Plains College's Division of Distance and Continued Education will offer two continuing education courses on the Levelland campus.

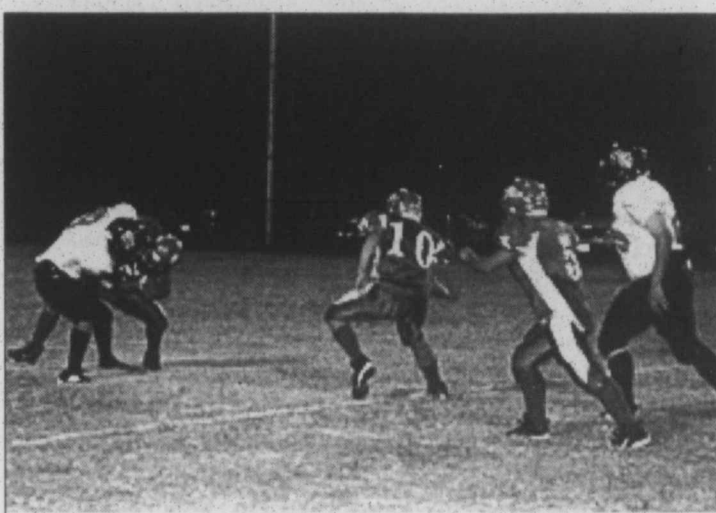

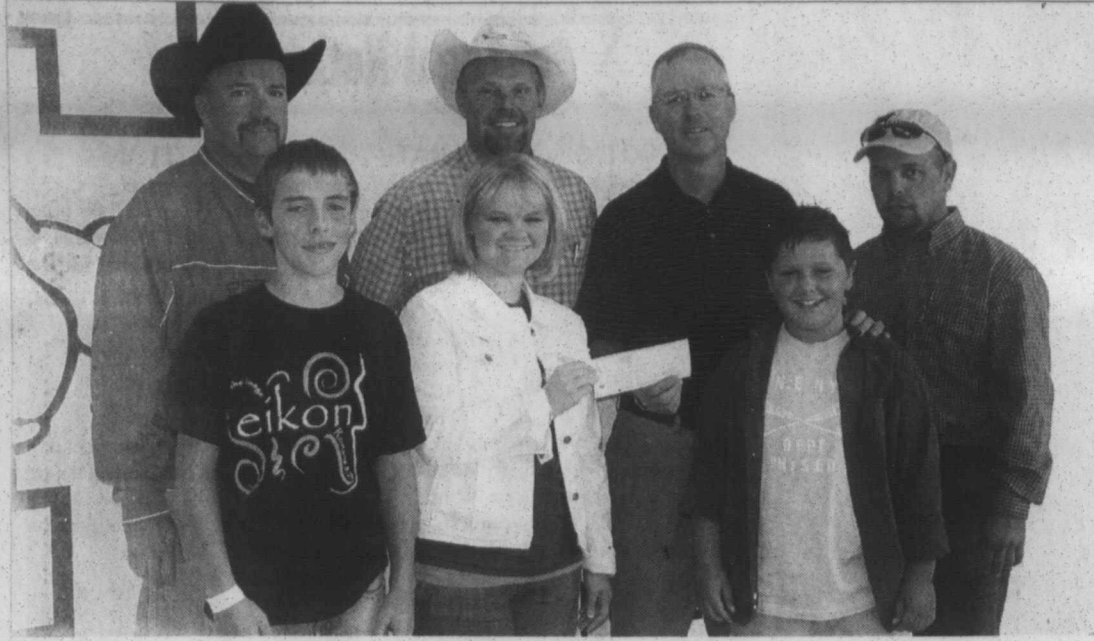

CRP Payments Being Paid To Eligible Producers

Rodney Schoppa, County Executive Director for USDA's Farm Service Agency announced that beginning this week USDA will begin issuing \$139,882,022 in Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) payments to eligible producers in Texas. More than \$1.7 billion in CRP payments are being made on 34.7 million acres across the country.

"The Conservation Reserve Program works cooperatively with America's farmers and ranchers to conserve and preserve the soil and water that we, and numerous wildlife species, depend on for survival," said Schoppa. "These payments represent an investment in the nation's land that will pay dividends in the form of a cleaner environment today and for our grandchildren."

The payments announced today are annual rental payments earned on the 3.9 million acres enrolled in CRP for fiscal year 2008 in Texas, including acres enrolled in the Continuous Sign-

up Program. Texas currently has 24,974 CRP contracts on 18,132 farms. The number of contracts is higher than the number of farms because producers may have multiple contracts on a single farm.

Other CRP payments are made throughout the year, including a 50-percent reimbursement of expenses for establishing cover and incentive payments for enrolling eligible conservation practices, such as wetland restorations and conservation buffers.

This voluntary program helps agricultural producers safeguard environmentally sensitive land. Producers enroll in CRP and plant long-term, resource-conserving covers to improve water quality, control soil erosion and enhance habitats for waterfowl and wildlife. In return, USDA provides producers with rental payments. CRP contract duration is from 10 to 15 years.

Land to be enrolled must be either highly erodible, contribute

to a serious water quality problem, provide important wildlife habitat or provide substantial environmental benefits if devoted to certain specific conservation uses.

"As a cooperative, we are owned by our customers, and they stand to benefit when we grow stronger," Novosad said. "Customers can still expect the same great products and services from a friendly and knowledgeable staff. That is what we are known for."

Novosad said the lending organization will also continue to share earnings with its customers through its patronage program. In recent years, Capital Farm Credit has distributed almost \$200 million in combined cash patronage to its customers and has allocated additional equity available for future disbursement.

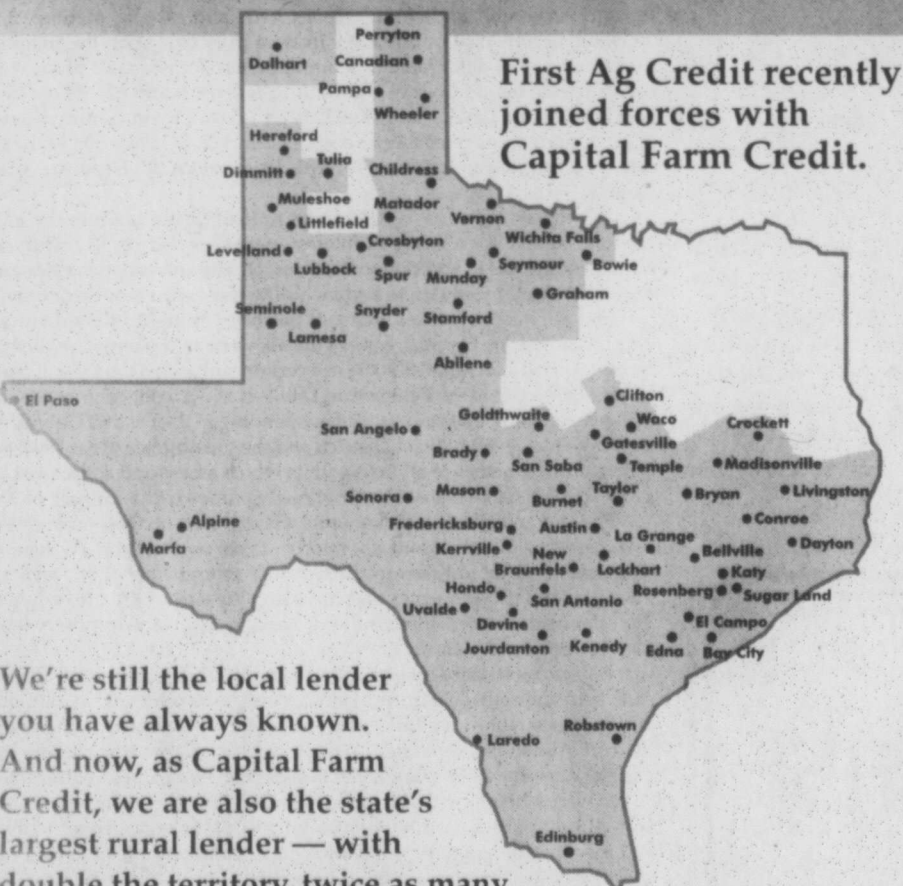

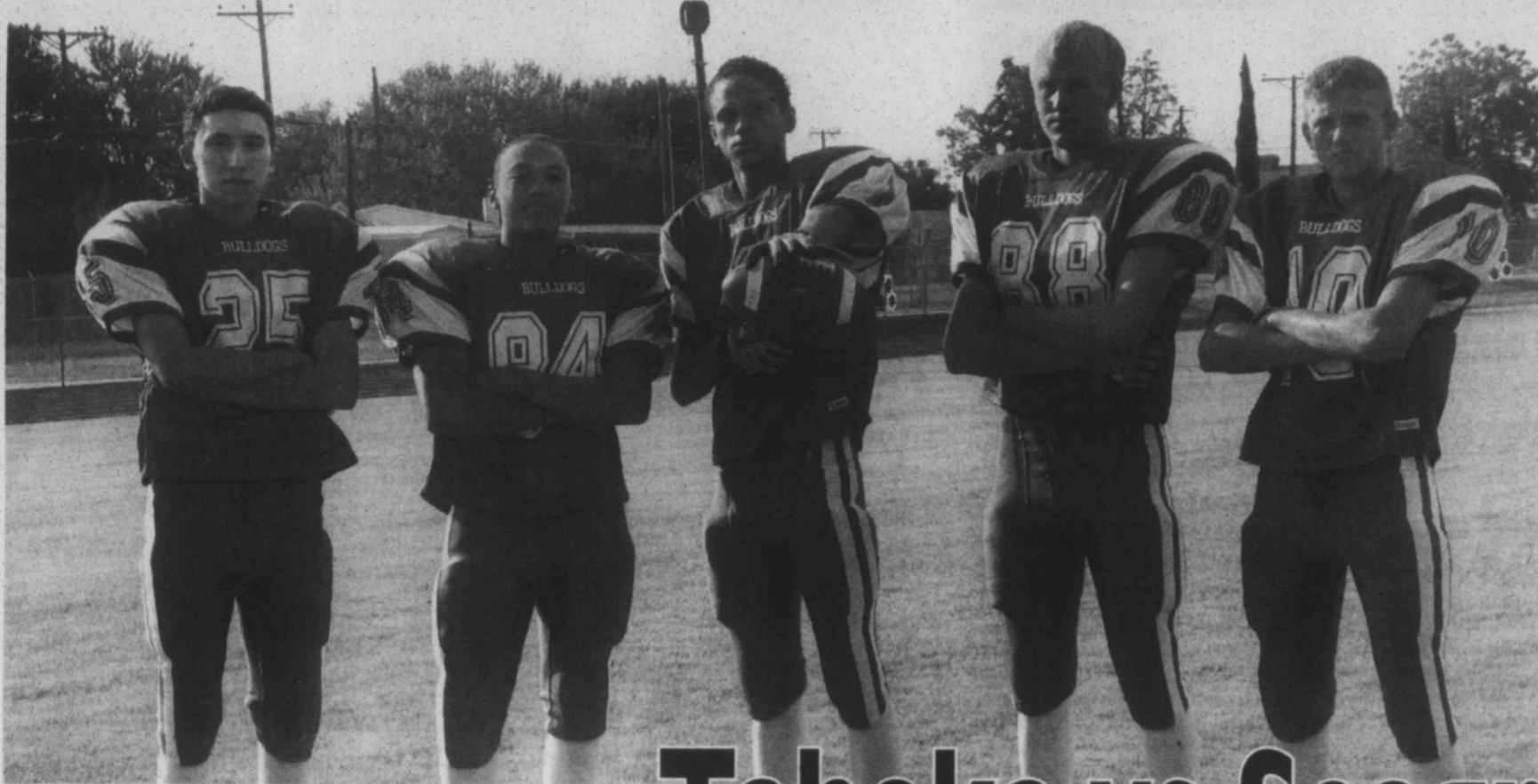
