 Prayer Back in Schools

For those that may have
missed it, on June 11,2007 , Texas Governor Rick Perry signe as Governor Rick Perry signed
into law House Bill 3678, the Religious Viewpoint Anti-Dis crimination Act. HB 3678 clari fies a student's right to religious
expression in school and creates a model policy for district adop tion. HB 3678 took effect on September 1, 200 mindedness and learning from one another's thoughts and philosophies, said Perry. There
fore we cannot - and should fore - shield or discourage our children from expressing reli-
gious views in school. Stifling discussion in order to appease a secular-only environment will prevent students from growing
both academically and person both academically and person-
ally." Though the United States
Supreme Court holds religious discussion in schools permis-
sible, some Texas schools may bave been misapplying the la and restricting student's legal
expression. This may be due to expression. This may be due to
outdated school policy or an unintended consequence of effort
to promote a neutral learning en vironment.
HB 3678 requires school
districts to adopt and a policy establishing a limited public forum for student speak ers at school events. The bill tricts may directly adopt or use for reference.
Policies must contain language which: - Protects a student from be ing punished due to expressing
a religious viewpoint verbally or a religious viewpoint
in a class assignment - Creates guidelines for stu
dent speakers at graduation cer dent speakers at graduation cer
emonies and other school-wid events

- Allows students to organize - Allows students to oryanize
religious groups and activities Kelly Coghlan, a Houston
attorney, is the legal author of
the Schoolchildren's Religious

Liberties Act and obtained the first federal injunction preventing the censorship of a student's
voluntary public prayer in Ward vs. Santa Fe ISD.
"While "While school personnel
must remain neutral, parents, must remain neutral, parents,
pastors, students and other nonpastors, students and other non-
school officials are free to encourage students to communicourage students to communi-
cate God-honoring viewpoints
whenever they publicly speak," whenever they publicly speak,",
said Coghlan. said Coghlan.
According to Sec. 25.154 of HB 3678 , students may organize "see you at the pole" gatherings, or other religious gatherings before, during, and after school are permitted to organize other noncurricular student activities
and groups. Religious groups and groups. Religious groups
must be given the same access to school facilities for assembling
as is given to other noncurricular groups without discrimination based on the religious content of the students' expression.
