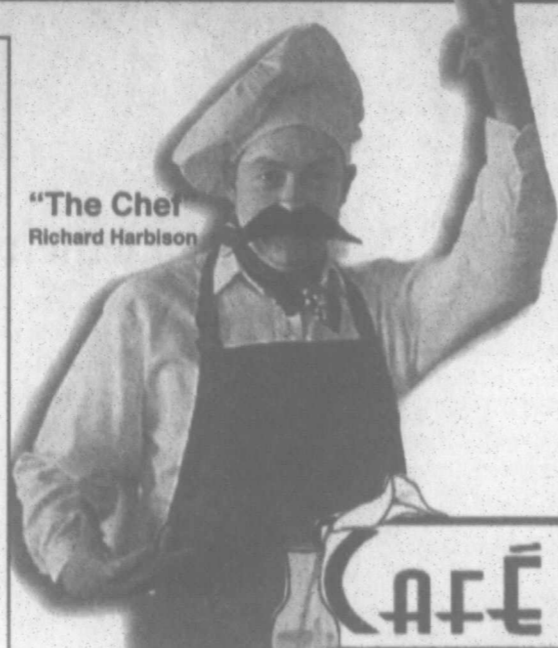

Seven Persons Arrested On Grand Jury Charges

Seven persons recently indicted on felony charges by a 106th District grand jury in Tahoka have been arrested and processed at Lynn County jail. Those indicted include:

Domingo Charco Gomez, 17, of Lubbock, charged with tampering with a government record.

Adam Navarrette, 37, Lubbock, driving while intoxicated, two or more offenses.

Lucas Moreno Gutierrez, 28, Tahoka, burglary of a habitation.

Joseph Wade Kemp, 40, Lubbock, possession of a controlled substance, methamphetamine, and possession of a prohibited substance in a correctional facility.

Christopher J. Benavides, 29, Tahoka, possession of a controlled substance, cocaine.

Antonio Padilla, 28, of California, possession of a controlled substance, cocaine, plus tampering with or fabricating physical evidence.

Carlos Guzman, 25, of Wilson, attempted aggravated sexual assault, attempted indecency with a child.

In other reports this week, county resident Joan Knox, who lives south of Tahoka, was taken by EMS ambulance to Lynn County Hospital for observation Monday after her late model Chrysler 300 was involved in a

collision with a sheriff's department unit, a 2007 Chevrolet pickup driven by Deputy Jim Bingham, 44, at the intersection of County Rd. 30 and U.S. 87 south of Tahoka.

Wilson school reported a rock was thrown through a classroom window last Tuesday night or early Wednesday, Feb. 4.

Two other incidents of criminal mischief were reported to Tahoka police. A 1994 Ford Ranger pickup owned by Jeffrey Wright Martin was egged while it was parked at his residence, Saturday night or early Sunday. And Martin Lopez reported two flat tires on two vehicles at his residence on S. 2nd St.

Six persons were booked into Lynn County jail during the last week, bringing the total jail population to 36, including 11 held for Lubbock County and five for Gaines County.

The most recent arrests were for aggravated assault/family violence, Dawson County warrant on assault, violating promise to appear (plus speeding), grand jury indictments for aggravated sexual assault plus indecency with a child, obscured vehicle registration plus fictitious inspection sticker, and driving while intoxicated plus evading arrest.

Gins Tally 228,086 Bales From '08 Crop

The eight area gins who report bale counts to the Lynn County News have a final tally this week, reporting a combined total of 228,086 bales of cotton ginned from the 2008 cotton crop by area producers. Last year, those same eight gins processed a record-setting 575,403 bales from the 2007 crop, and did not finish ginning until April 8, 2008.

New Home Coop-Lakeview Gin reported the most bales ginned, at 80,117 as they finished this week. That's less than half of last year's record-setting numbers, when the gin processed 108,905 from the 2007 crop.

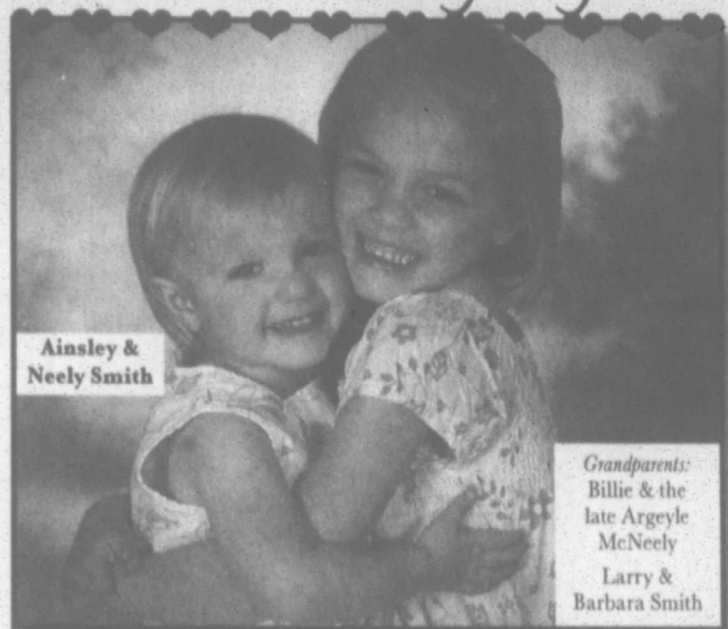
Texas Star Gin, with plants in Wilson and Union, reported 68,230 total bales this year, compared to a record-setting 145,156 bales reported last year.

Farmers Coop Assn. #1 in Tahoka reported 24,470 bales, compared to last year's 73,455 record numbers. Woolam Gin in O'Donnell processed 18,639 bales this year, compared to last year's 73,689, again a record for that gin.

Farmers Coop Gin in O'Donnell reported 7,398 bales this year, compared to 67,539 last year, but not as high as their record-setting year in 2005, which was 81,654 bales, according to records kept by The Lynn County News.

Wells Coop Gin reported 19,934 bales this year, compared to 62,498 bales processed last year, a record for them. Grassland Coop Gin processed 4,883 bales this year, and had a record last year of 26,285 bales. And, Close City Gin in Post reported 4,415 bales this year, compared to 17,876 last year, which was a record high for them.

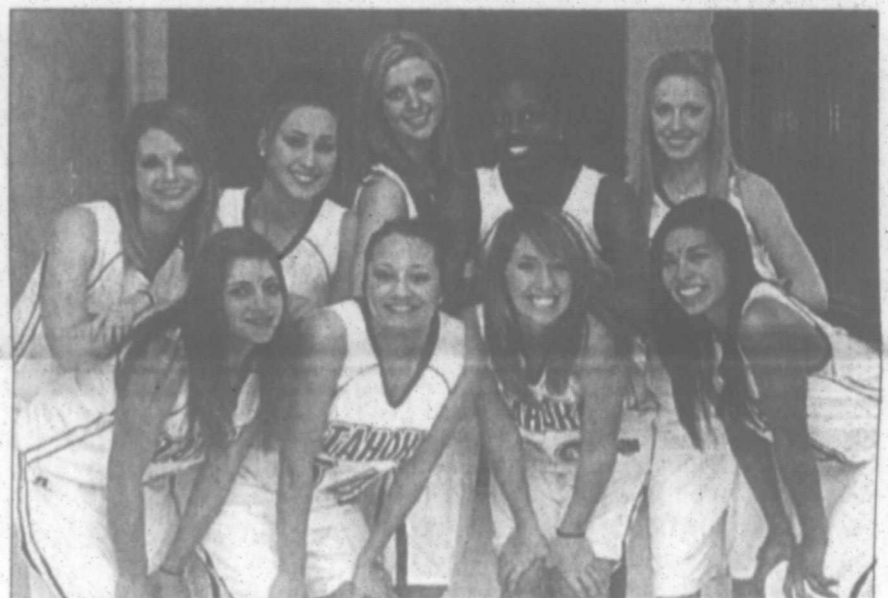

HERE IT IS already the second week in February, with Lincoln's birthday and Valentine Day coming up this weekend.

Abraham Lincoln, if he were alive, would be 200 years old today, and I think I am beginning to realize how he would feel. He was born poor and, although he is considered one of the greatest leaders of all time, he could never be president in today's political scene, because now you have to be pretty wealthy just to make a run at the job.

He was called Honest Abe, and may have been the last honest man ever to hold office in Washington. Well, maybe not, but an honest politician these days has little chance of success. I had a friend who used to say, "I don't want an honest man in office; I want a crook who is on my side."

He was assassinated while attending a play in a theater. I don't recall ever hearing what the play was all about, if it was almost over, or what.

VALENTINE'S DAY, once celebrated with machine gun fire up north, and originally based on some kind of Roman holiday where young girls were chased around and whacked with switches or some such nonsense, is better celebrated locally by grandparents bragging on their kids, and a lot of cute ones are shown in this issue of the newspaper.

St. Valentine was two people, the encyclopedia tells me. It was a name given to two Christian martyrs whose feasts were formerly observed on Feb. 14. One was believed to be a Roman priest martyred "during the persecution of Claudius the Goth, and buried on the Flaminian Way; the second was probably a bishop of Terni martyred in Rome. It is possible that these two legends were based on real people or, as some believe, one person. The association of St. Valentine's Day with love and courtship may have arisen from the coincidence of the date with the Roman festival of Lupercalia, a feast day dropped from the Roman church calendar in 1969."

Since the St. Valentines had their feasts on the same day the Romans had a love feast, so the day comes to be a day of love and courting. We observe the feast part by pigging out on chocolates.

The encyclopedia digressed into birthstones and associated beliefs, and told me that the purple amethyst is St. Valentine's stone and it also protects its owner from drunkenness. I never saw a purple amethyst; it sounds like some kind of demon. Nor do I need any protection from intoxication.

Council Sets May 9 For City Election

Tahoka City Council met Monday night, setting the city election for May 9 and conducting other business. The general election on May 9 will be held for the purpose of electing a mayor and two council members, in Districts 1 and 3. Currently holding these positions are Mayor Mike Mensch, Dist. 1 councilman Rudy Tejeda and Dist. 3 councilwoman Amy Preston.

The filing period for the election opened on Feb. 9 and continues through March 9, at city hall. Early voting for the election will be conducted April 27-May 5. No applicants have filed to date.

City attorney Cal Huffaker presented information about the possibility of the city accepting the old Keltner Hotel building from the Lynn County Historical Society, but no decisions were made. Currently, the Historical Society rents the building to SPARTAN, who uses the first floor of the facility. The building is located across the street

from the Pioneer Museum, on Lockwood.

Tahoka Fire Chief Steve Sanders addressed the council, informing them that the city had recently received a reimbursement check from FEMA in the amount of \$17,860 for fire department expenses related to fighting grass fires in 2005-06. He told council members that the department was interested in using the funds to purchase a used truck that could be used as a tanker truck for the fire department, and council members indicated the department could begin looking at possibilities.

Council members heard a police department report from Steve McKay, and Raymond Yega reported on the city utilities department. A resolution was approved authorizing the submission of a Texas Home Investment Partnerships Program application for owner-occupied housing assistance, a program offered through South Plains Community Action. Monthly bills were approved.

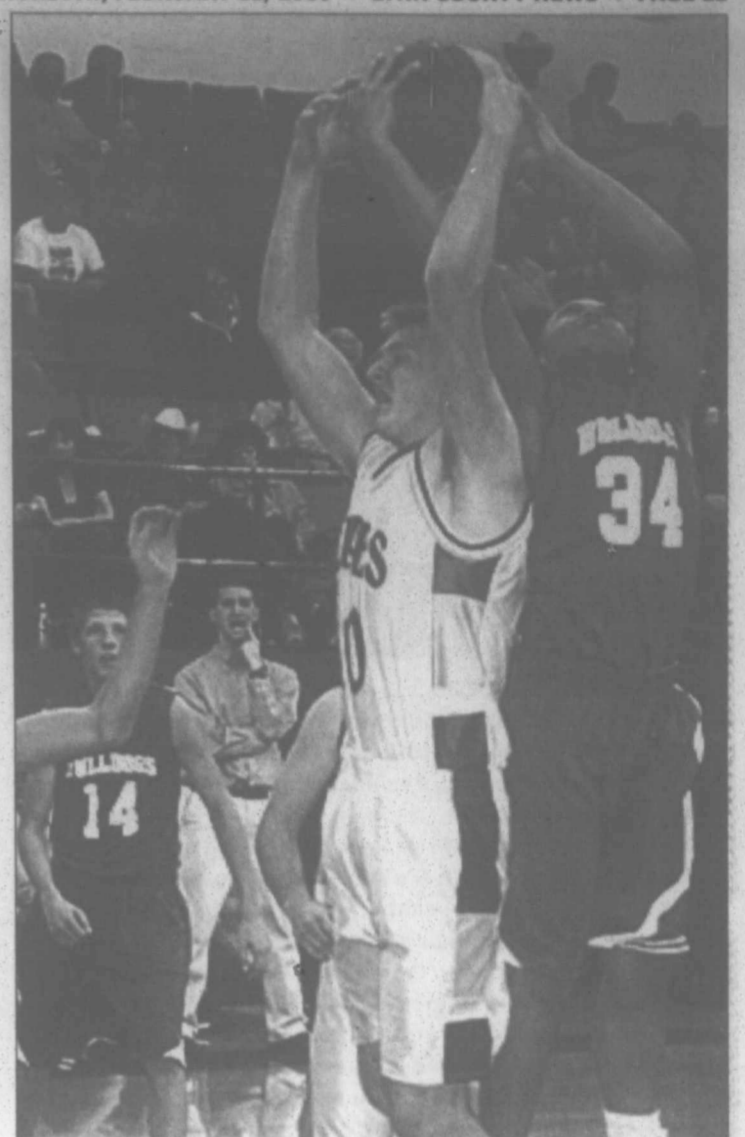
County Accepts FB&T Bid For County Depository

Lynn County Commissioners accepted a bid from First Bank and Trust for another two-year period to serve as the county depository, which will continue the current depository contract with FB&T. First National Bank of Tahoka also submitted a bid for the depository contract, with bank president John Krey representing the bank at Monday morning's meeting. Representing FB&T were Mickey Hughes, Sharon Isham, Greg Garland and Abel Castro. Commissioners Mike Braddock, Keith Wied, and Brad Hammonds, and County Judge H.G. Franklin, voted 4-0 in favor of the FB&T contract. The other commissioner, Don Blair, abstained from voting, citing Local Government Code 116 with a conflict of interest.

In other business, commissioners approved another burn ban in the county, effective for 90 days, through May 9, due to extreme dry conditions. An insurance premium payment to Fenton Insurance Agency was approved for insurance for the extension office building located at S. 1st and Ave. J, and commissioners also renewed the county's liability insurance with Texas Association of Counties.

A provision regarding the Family Medical Leave Act was removed from the county employee handbook, as the county does not qualify for the act based on the number of employees in the county. Monthly bills were approved, and Sheriff Jerry D. Franklin reported on his department's activities.

Judge Franklin led the two-hour meeting, with all four commissioners present.

Dawson / Lynn Soil Sampling Program Offered

The Dawson/Lynn Integrated Pest Management (IPM) program will offer a soil sampling program. Testers will sample the field and send the samples to the Texas AgriLife Extension Service's Soil, Water and Forage Testing Laboratory in College Station.

Cost of the service will be \$25 for fields up to a quarter section plus the cost of the lab analysis the producer requests. An additional charge of \$5 will be added if a field is to be sampled as more than one management zone based on soil type, landscape position and/or yield zones. Cost for fields larger than quarter section will be calculated by number of acres.

Forms are available at the Dawson and Lynn County Extension offices, and area gin offices.

The results of the soil testing and recommendations will be sent to the producer directly.

"We ask that all fees and costs be paid prior to the samples being taken," said a Dawson County Extension office representative.

The domestic wastewater treatment facility and disposal area are located approximately 0.25 mile northwest of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 1730 and State Highway 211 in Lynn County, Texas. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting reconsideration of the executive director's decision and for requesting a contested case hearing. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in a state district court.

TO REQUEST A CONTESTED CASE HEARING, YOU MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN YOUR REQUEST: your name, address, phone number, applicant's name and proposed permit number; the location and distance of your property/activities relative to the proposed facility; a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the facility in a way not common to the general public and, the statement "I/we request a contested case hearing." If the request for contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request must designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify an individual member of the group who would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the information discussed above regarding the affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected; and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are relevant to the group's purpose.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The Commission will only grant a contested case hearing on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decision on the application. Further, the Commission will only grant a hearing on issues that were raised in timely filed comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. TCEQ may act on an application to renew a permit without providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.

If you submit public comments, a request for a contested case hearing or a reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision, you will be added to the mailing list for this specific application to receive future public notices mailed by the Office of the Chief Clerk. If you wish to be placed on the permanent and/or the county mailing list, clearly specify which list(s) and send your request to the TCEQ Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below.

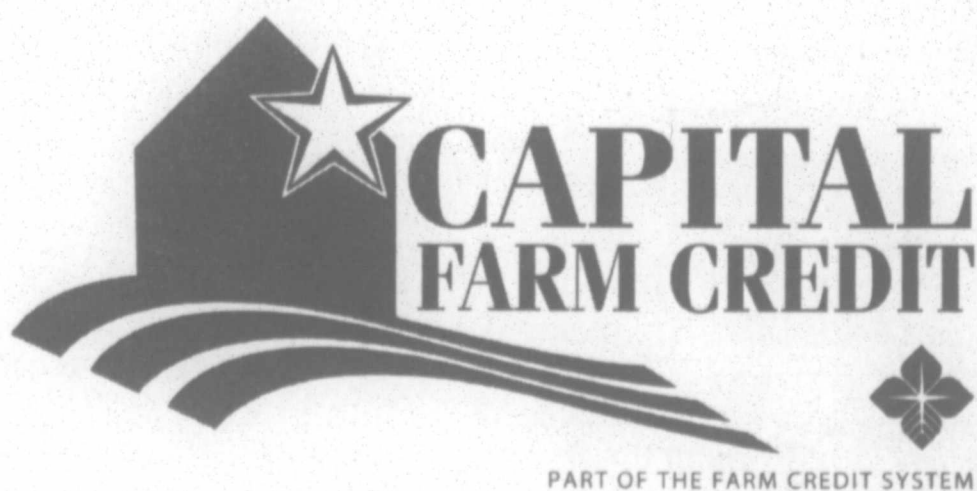
