

Former Tahoka resident killed in car accident

A former Tahoka resident, Douglas Gene Barham, 47, of Victoria, was pronounced dead at 8:41 p.m. Sunday, May 24 at the scene of a one-car vehicle wreck near El Campo. A 14-year-old girl, Alyssa Burleigh, who was traveling with the Barham family, was also killed.

According to information from the Victoria newspaper website, the Barham family and friends were traveling in a 2001 Chevrolet Suburban which left U.S. Hwy. 59 South just outside of El Campo, striking a guard rail and causing it to go into a side skid. The Suburban then skidded off an overpass, rolling several times and coming to rest underneath the overpass.

The group was coming back from a family gathering in Houston and shopping in Katy when the crash occurred. DPS officials were not certain what caused the driver, Garrett James Barham, 17, to drift to the right. A total of seven people were inside the vehicle. Seatbelts were reportedly worn by all in the vehicle, except possibly Doug Barham, who was the only one thrown from the vehicle.

Garrett and the other passengers, Doug's wife, Maritia, 46, daughter Maddie, 14, son Carson, 11, and his friend Chase Weaver, 11, were all transported to hospitals. Garrett was listed in stable condition with leg injuries, and Carson was listed in stable in condition with cuts and bruises. Maddie, Chase and Maritia were listed in stable condition with internal injuries and possible broken bones, and it was reported in Tahoka that Maritia may have suffered a broken vertebrae in her neck.

Both Doug and Maritia graduated from Tahoka High School, and their children attended school here before moving to Victoria.

STDs - A Serious Problem A touchy subject but an important one

According to Kidshealth.com the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) found that a staggering 3.2 million teen girls could potentially have a least one of four common STD's (sexually transmitted disease). Unfortunately, as this report states, STDs have become common among teens. Because teens are more at risk for getting some STDs, it's important to learn what you can do to protect them.

STDs are more than just an embarrassment. They're a serious health problem. If untreated, some STDs can cause permanent damage, such as infertility (the inability to have a baby) and even death (in the case of HIV/AIDS).

One reason STDs spread is because people think they need to have sexual intercourse to become infected. That's wrong. As person can get some STDs, like herpes or genital warts, through skin-toskin contact with an infected area or sore. STDs also spread easily because you can't tell whether someone has an infection. In fact, some people with STDs don't even know that they have them. These people are in danger of passing an infection on to their sexual partners without even realizing it.

Some of the things that increase a person's chances of getting an STD are:

· Sexual activity at a young age. The younger a person starts having sex, the greater his or her chances of becoming infected with an STD.

· Lots of sex partners. People who have sexual contact - not just intercourse, but any form of intimate activity - with many different partners are more at risk than those who stay with the same part-

· Unprotected sex. Latex condoms are the only form of birth

And second, regular exams give doctors more opportunities to check for STDs while they're still in their earliest, most treatable stage. In order for these exams and visits to the doctor to be helpful, people need to tell their doctors if they are thinking about having sex or if they have already started having sex. This is true for all types of sex. Don't let embarrassment at the thought of having an STD keep you from seeking medical attention. Waiting to see a doctor may allow a disease to progress and cause more damage. If you think you may have an STD, or if you have had a partner who may have an STD, you hould see a doctor right away. If you don't have a doctor or prefer not to see your family doctor, you may be able to find a local clinic in your area where you can get an exam confidentially. Some national and local organizations operate STD hotlines staffed by trained specialists who can answer your questions and provide referrals. Calls to these

hotlines are confidential. One

Heflin-Authored Economic Development Bill Passes Texas House

(Austin, TX - May 15, 2009) An economic development bill authored by State Representative Joe Heflin passed the Texas House of Representatives on a vote of 143-0 today. Rep. Heflin's House Bill 3676 extends a portion of the Texas Economic Development Act that was set to expire in 2011. Rep. Heflin said the extension is absolutely critical to keeping Texas "open for business" and for keeping the state's economic development climate among the best in the

"This legislation is about job creation and capital investment," Heflin explained. "It will help both businesses and workers, and it will help ensure property tax fairness for individual property owners. It's truly a win-win-win for everyone." According to Rep. Heflin, the Texas Economic Development Act, originally passed in 2001, has been one of the state's most valuable economic development tools in bringing new investments and jobs to Texas. Heflin's HB 3676 leaves the intent of the original economic development program in place to spur economic development in all parts of Texas and in all industries, while clarifying certain tax abatement and funding issues that have arisen since original passage. . "My bill will help Texas remain the number one spot in the nation for business expansion," Rep. Heflin continued "In addition, the bill promotes greater accountability and transparency for businesses receiving tax abatements. It will help ensure that promised investments and new jobs are realized, or re-

quire that companies receiving tax abatements pay applicable property taxes."

> HB 3676 was one of a very small number of bills carried on the major state calendar in the Texas House of Representatives this session, and it is unusual for a second-term representative such as Rep. Heflin to carry a major state bill. HB 3676 now must pass the Texas Senate before being sent to the Governor.

Rep. Heflin represents Texas House District 85, including Borden, Crosby, Fisher, Floyd, Garza, Glasscock, Hale, Howard, Jones, Kent, Lynn, Irion, Reagan, Sterling, Stonewall, and Terry Counties. 





Click it, or Ticket

Texas law enforcement wants you to click it, not risk a ticket. From May 18 to May 31, law

enforcement officers across the state are conducting the eighth "Click It or Ticket" enforcement mobilization to remind drivers and passengers to buckle up.

"We continue to participate in 'Click It or Ticket" because there are still about 9 percent of Texans who are not buckling up," said Texas Highway Patrol Chief David Baker. "That may not sound like many, but for every percent increase in safety belt use, 25 fewer Texans will be killed in traffic crashes."

When people don't buckle up, it costs everyone. Since 2001, the use of safety belts in Texas has saved the state and society an estimated \$8.25 billion in wage and productivity losses, medical expenses, insurance rate increases, travel delays and administrative and other associated costs

Who is not buckling up? Front seat passengers don't wear their safety belts as often as their drivers, even though they face just as great of a chance of being thrown through the windshield during a crash. Wearing a safety belt increases the odds of surviving a serious crash by 50 percent, and for pickup trucks, the odds are better with an increased chance of survival at 60 percent.


Texas law requires every person sitting in the front seat of a vehicle to wear a safety belt. The law also states that all children under 17 must be secured with a safety belt, or in a child safety seat, whether they are sitting in the front or in the back seat. A child less than five years old and less than 36 inches tall must be secured in a child safety seat. Drivers can be stopped and ticketed for a safety belt violation if they, or any of their passengers under the age of 17, are not buckled up or properly restrained. Traffic fines for failing to use a seat belt or secure a child in a safety seat can run from \$25 to \$200, plus court costs.

The Texas Department of Public Safety has had a zero-tolerance policy regarding seat belts and child safety seats since 1999.


Do We Have The Ingredients For A Good 2009 Crop?

Plains Cotton Growers Inc. It takes a number of factors to start, and grow, a cotton crop. These include: Dirt; Seed; Sunshine; Water. How are we doing with these onthe High Plains of Texas with the

2009 crop? DIRT - The High Plains is blessed with a lot of dirt. In PCG's 41 county area, we calculate there are approximately 25,000,000 acres of dirt. Some of this is covered in roads, rails, and towns. We've also got some sizable public lands, such as Rita Blanca National Grasslands, Palo Duro Canyon State Park, and Lake Meredith National Recreation Area. When you take all this out of the 25 million, and subtract Conservation Reserve Program acreage, ranch and pastureland, playa lakes, gullies, draws and dirt roads, along with land planted to crops other than cotton, we end up with around 3,500,000 acres to accommodate the 2009 cotton crop.

SEED - The A-Z of seed actually goes from A-S: AFD, All-Tex, Americot, Croplan, Dyna-Gro, D&PL, FiberMax, NexGen, PhytoGen and Stoneville. A wide and

diverse choice. The grower's selection of seed is helped with the use of PCG's seed cost calculator but it's still a formidable task making the right choice. SUNSHINE Sunshine over

the past couple of months has raised soil temperatures to the needed level that will allow germination of cotton seed. Cotton plants are little solar powerhouses. Through photosynthesis they take energy from sunlight, pull carbon dioxide out of the atmosphere, mix with a little water and create cellulose (that's cotton lint). While doing all this, they put oxygen back into the air and also make seed that can keep the cycle going, or be turned into oil for food, feed or fuel.

WATER - 55% of the acres planted to cotton in PCG's 41 county area is Dryland. That means it's totally dependent on rainfall. The other 45% is under irrigation, but is more correctly described as supplemental irrigation. It doesn't take a huge amount of water to raise a cotton crop when compared to other plants. That's a good thing because the High Plains is classed as semiarid, having relatively low annual rainfall between 10 and 20 inches. Timing of that rainfall makes all the difference between an average crop and a bumper one.

So, as planting of the 2009 cotton crop progresses, we've got all the ingredients - but do we have the right proportions? Dirt - it is what it is. Other than fertility management, what you see is what you get. Seed - the choice is yours, and you can't go far wrong with some careful study. Sunshine - that's life on the High Plains of Texas. Which brings

(AUSTIN) - A new slide show on the Texas Comptroller's Web site can help homeowners who are protesting their property tax appraisals.

County appraisal districts establish the taxable value for residences, but in most counties, homeowners have until June 1 to file a protest.

How to Present Your Case at an Appraisal Review Board Hearing: A Guide for Homeowners makes the property tax process more transparent by providing easy-to-understand information about what to expect at a property appraisal protest hearing.

"Homeowners are empowered by understanding the protest process, knowing what information to present to the local Appraisal Review Board and how to present it," Texas Comptroller Susan Combs said. "It helps homeowners make convincing appeals and helps the review boards make better decisions."


Appraisal review boards generally hear property appraisal protests between May 15 and July 25, except in major urban areas with extended protest periods.

Harris County Appraisal District Chief Deputy Sands Stiefer said the slide presentation is a welcome new resource for property taxpayers.

"We plan to link our Web site to the Comptroller's video, and we are considering running the video in the waiting room at our ARB hearings," Stiefer said.




