

Superintendent soon: **Steve Burleson named** lone finalist for TISD

At the regular board meeting on Thursday, January 14, the Tahoka Independent School District Board



Mr. Burleson currently lives in Lubbock, and is serving as Assistant Superintendent of Administrative Services at Frenship ISD. He has 34 years of experience in public education, ten of those years as a teacher/ coach in Sanderson, Perryton, Gruver, and Sweetwater. He served 11 years as a campus level administrator in Perryton, Booker, and Abernathy. He then served as Assistant Superintendent in Morton for two years before being named as Superintendent of Schools at Spur ISD. Burleson served as Superintendent at Spur for five years before going to Frenship. He completed his under-graduate and graduate level work at Sul Ross State University in Alpine

TISD trustees chose Burleson after meeting a second time with him at last

State law dictates that the Board must now wait 21 days before taking action to officially hire Burleson for the job. That meeting is scheduled for 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 10.

"The Board attempted to find a night other than church night, but due to all of the activities already scheduled, that was the only evening available that would fit everyone's schedule," explained Gary Harrell, Interim Superintendent at TISD. "Immediately following Board action to employ Mr. Burleson on Feb. 10, he will be introduced to the public in the high school auditorium. The public is invited and encouraged to attend. This will be followed by a cake and punch reception," he added.

Burleson and his wife, Shirley, who already have ties to Tahoka with a daughter who works in the school system, will move to Tahoka for the TISD position. Shirley is an ALTA Certified Dyslexia Therapist at North Ridge Elementary in the Frenship Independent School District. She will continue in her current position at North Ridge after they relocate to Tahoka.

The Burlesons have two children, Stan and Shelly. Shelly has been a teacher in the Tahoka ISD for the past six years, and is currently serving as the district counselor. Her husband, Drew, is the former Tahoka ISD Athletic Director and Boys Basketball Coach at Tahoka and is currently farming in the Tahoka community. They have three boys: Braden-7, Bryson-5, and Brogan-3. The Burlesons' son, Stan, is the music and missions minister at First Baptist Church in Perryton. His wife, Angie, is a Reading Interventionist at Perryton Elementary School. They have two daughters, Kylan-16 and Kamber-14.

SECO Stimulus Program - We have finalized and submitted our application for the State Energy Conservation Office stimulus monies passed through the Texas Comptroller's Office. Our portion of the stimulus package is \$23,030. We are going to replace the windows and doors at city hall with more energy efficient ones. The current doors and windows are original to the building which was built in 1953. We estimate the energy savings will be a minimum of 25%. We hope to have this project completed by the end of April, depending on how long it takes to get the stimulus monies out to all the cities and counties.


Botkin named to Who's Who







Elected school board trustees serve communities well

School board members have a thankless job - trying to juggle their local school's needs with available funding while being sensitive to local student needs, tax issues, teacher/staff salaries, and a myriad of other issues - all the while complying with state and federal regulations that in many cases simply don't allow much wiggle room.

Add to the fact that a new trustee comes onto a board with no prior experience, usually for an initial three-year term, and discovers that being a good school trustee tends to take many hours of their time, energy, and dedication, and can be both frustrating and rewarding. School superintendents and principals are paid to worry about their school districts - trustees are elected volunteers who get to worry along with their school's administrative

staff, without financial compensation. Trustees serve because they care about their schools and their communities.

Lynn County's four school districts have a slate of school board trustees who have dedicated many years of service to their local schools, and three of those trustees have service time that ads up to double digits. At New Home ISD, board vice president Andy Maeker is currently in his 16th year of service as an elected trustee, and Joe Calvillo has served 15 years on the board at Tahoka ISD. Clyde Wilke has served 11 years on the Wilson ISD Board.


