Water line bursts; residents urged to boil water for consumption

City of Tahoka officials urge residents to continue boiling water for consumption (at least 5 minutes) until water samples indicate it is safe for drinking, after a crack in a main water line on S. 2nd and Ave. H turned into a 3-foot gash Tuesday afternoon.

"It started as a small crack, and then just kept spreading, until we had to remove a 3-foot section and replace it," said Jerry Webster, City Administrator. Water was cut off from around 5 p.m. until after midnight, although it was turned on for about a half hour around 10 p.m. Workers had problems keeping water out of the ditch to work on the line, and had to borrow an additional pump from the City of Lamesa to complete the job.

As soon as samples indicate safe drinking standards, city officials will let TV stations know to report the water is safe, and will place that info on the city marquee. Call City Hall, 561-4211, if in doubt.

Brad Hammonds announces for Pct. 4 commissioner

Lynn County Commissioner Brad Hammonds announces his bid for reelection for a second term as Precinct 4 Commissioner. He has filed on the Republican ticket for the March 2 Primary Election.

Hammonds was born and raised in Lynn County, and graduated from Tahoka High School. As a Lynn County farmer and resident of Tahoka, Hammonds is familiar with the needs of both rural and city residents.

"During my tenure as commissioner I have worked diligently for this precinct to become debt-free, which it is at this time. I have completed many hours of certification regarding various issues of county business and have faced challenges such as revising rules and regulations governing new subdivisions within the county. Currently there is one new subdivision and it is possible two more subdivisions may be viable as well," said Hammonds.

"I am eager for progress that brings new people or new jobs to the county, such as the wind energy industry and the courthouse restoration project. I am very excited about the courthouse preservation/restoration project that will use grant funding to preserve the historical look of our courthouse but will update it for the business needs that must be conducted through these offices. One of the conditions of the project is that local workers, if available, must be considered for the restoration project when the actual work begins. I have been diligent along with the other commissioners to budget matching funds for the project so that when it is time to begin the work, Lynn County will be ready and able to fulfill our obligations for the project.

"As part of the matching portion of our funds in the courthouse project, we are looking at completely rewiring the electrical work in the building, which due to safety issues is something that was going to have to be done regardless of grant funding. This way, using county funds for something that was going to be have to done anyway, applies towards getting a completely new and restored building that should serve the needs of the county for many years to come," Hammonds added. "It is an honor for Lynn County's courthouse to be chosen for this project, and I am committed to getting the project completed."

There are approximately 280 miles of county roads to maintain in Precinct 4, and Hammonds says he has a good work crew on a four-day workweek schedule, which saves fuel costs. He also purchased a tandem to plow bar ditches to help keep the weed population down in ditches near farmers' fields.

"I am willing to listen to every individual's concerns and to work with you, and am open to suggestions and ideas regarding county issues," he added.

Hammonds began his farming career in 1982. He and his wife Kim have three daughters, Kalese and twins Jeni and Jaci. He has served on several local and area boards, including 12 years on the Tahoka Independent School District Board of Trustees, and 10 years on the Lynn-Garza County Farm Bureau Board. He is currently a volunteer fireman with the Tahoka Volunteer Fire Department, where he has been a member for 25 years. Hammonds is a longtime active member of the First Baptist Church of Tahoka, volunteering in many capacities throughout the years.


"I will appreciate your vote and support in the Republican Primary," said Hammonds. "I encourage everyone to vote - remember early voting is Feb. 16-26 at the county courthouse, and anyone who is homebound can request a ballot by mail by calling the Lynn County Clerk's office."

COMING SOON, to a place near you, and maybe to your house: somebody trying to steal your identity and your money by claiming they are with the Census Bureau, and asking you for information that nobody needs to know.

The scams are out there, and they are going to increase as the U.S. Census gets underway, so how do you know whoever knocks on your door is really from the Census Bureau? The Better Business Bureau and others have offered some suggestions for verifying they really are with the Census, and I'll get to that in a minute.

First, let me say that even if someone really is with the Census, the only thing you have to tell them is how many people are living in the house. I remember in one year the Bureau of the Senseless wanted to know things like how much money you make, do you own your house, how many flush toilets are in the house, and other things which are nobody's business except yours.

Here are some suggestions from the BBB:

If a U.S. Census worker knocks on your door, they will have a badge, a handheld device, a Census Bureau canvas bag, and a confidentiality notice. Ask to see their identification and their badge before answering their questions. However, you should never invite anyone you don't know into your home.

Census workers are currently only knocking on doors to verify address information. Do not give your Social Security number, credit card or banking information to anyone, even if they claim they need it for the U.S. Census. While the Census Bureau might ask for basic financial information, such as a salary range, the Census Bureau will not ask for Social Security, bank account, or credit card numbers nor will employees solicit donations.

Eventually, Census workers may contact you by telephone, mail, or in person at home. However, the Census Bureau will not contact you by Email, so be on the lookout for Emails claiming to be from the Census.

Never click on a link or open any attachments in an Email that are supposedly from the U.S. Census Bureau.

If someone says they are with ACORN and are assisting the Census Bureau, hit them in the mouth or turn your dogs loose on them.







David Thomas in Super Bowl

David Thomas; tight end for the New Orleans Saints (#85) who will be in the Super Bowl in Miami Feb. 7, has relatives in Tahoka, where his parents attended school.

Thomas is the son of John and Leesa Thomas. His father originally was from Grassland and graduated from Tahoka High School, and was superintendent of Frenship schools in Lubbock when David was a star player for Frenship. David's mother, Leesa, is the daughter of the late Maurice and Grace Huffaker of Tahoka.

David was a starting tight end at the University of Texas and played in the NFL for the New England Patriots before being acquired last year by the Saints. During Sunday's win by the Saints over the Minnesota Vikings, Thomas played most of the game on offense, and the TV announcers commented that he was playing a very good game, both blocking for runners and catching passes.

According to NFL career stats on the New Orleans Saints website, Thomas was acquired by the Saints at the conclusion of the 2009 preseason, and brings blocking prowess and experience to the club's tight ends group. Thomas enters the 2009 season having played in 32 games with 13 starts since joining the Patriots as a third-round selection in the 2006 NFL Draft. Through his first three NFL seasons, Thomas has caught 21 passes for 261 yards and a touchdown. His contributions as a blocker in 2008 helped the Patriots to their best rushing season in more than 20 years in terms of total yards (2,278), rushing average (4.4) and rushing touchdowns (21). Thomas started a career-high 10 games in 2008 to lead Patriots tight ends.






