### Ribbon cutting set Saturday for Big Blue Coin Op laundry

Ribbon-cutting ceremonies will be held at 1 p.m. Saturday at Big Blue Coin Op, the new laundromat facility opening in Tahoka at 1631 Ave. J, next door to the Poka Lambro office. Tahoka Mayor John Baker will preside at the ceremonies, welcoming Kent Powers and his partner and son-in-law, Todd Hosmer, owners of Big Blue Coin Op, to Tahoka. Citizens are invited to attend the Grand Opening ceremonies and see the new facilities.

And, although no ribbon cutting ceremonies are planned, Mayor Baker also welcomes Schwartz & Co. as a new business in Tahoka, which opened last Wednesday at 1615A Lockwood, next door to Lynnco Automotive NAPA store. Schwartz & Co. offers space for vendors selling new and used items, and also sells some concession items and takes orders for Krispy Kreme doughnuts. Call Schwartz & Co. at 548-4410.

Powers, a Tahoka native who lives in Lubbock, formerly operated Ray's TV & Appliance in Lubbock for many years, and has returned to his Tahoka roots to provide modern laundry facilities for the community.

The Big Blue Coin Op laundry has 14 washing machines, including two extra-large units for washing larger items such as king-size bedspreads and comforters, and 12 dryers, including four extra-large units that Powers says will dry three laundry loads at once in approximately 30-40 minutes.

He has not yet set hours of operation for the laundromat.

Vending machines will offer snack items, and Powers says there will be a person on-site to oversee the facilities. A TV will also be available to watch for those waiting on their laundry. He hopes to have someone soon to offer ironing and sewing repair work onsite

### Candidate may request official recount in commissioner race

Lynn County Commissioner Brad Hammonds has indicated to Lynn County Republican Party Chairman John Baker that he plans to file an official request for a recount to be conducted in the Precinct 4 Commissioner election in the March 2 Republican Primary. He cannot file the request until after the party chairman has canvassed the election results on Thursday, March 11, and must submit the petition before 2 p.m. the following day (Friday).

The candidate requesting the recount must also submit a deposit to the party chairman for the cost of the recount, which in this situation is \$300 (\$60 per voting box precinct in which the election was conducted - in this case, Voting Boxes 4, 9, 11, 13 and the Early Voting box). If the outcome of the election is changed by the recount, the deposit is returned to the candidate who filed the recount request.

Hammonds was one of three candidates on the Republican Primary ballot for Pct. 4 Commissioner. There were only 8 votes separating all three candidates in the election, with Danny Martin leading the ticket with 94 votes, Toby Taylor with 89 votes, and Hammonds with 86 votes. There was some confusion in the tallies on election night however, and the voting box tallies were

added again with different results that changed the outcome that had already been reported to candidates, but individual ballots were not recounted. The top two vote-getters, Martin and Taylor, are scheduled for a runoff election on April 13 to determine the Republican candidate for the November election.

Because of a tight timeline in ordering new ballots for the runoff election, Baker has scheduled a manual recount of the commissioner race for 6 p.m. Friday, March 12 to comply with the anticipated recount petition.

The March 2 Republican Primary ballots in Lynn County were counted manually, not electronically, at the request of the county chairman. If a recount is ordered, the recount will also be conducted manually.

If Hammonds decides not to file a petition for a recount, the recount will not take place, as a governing body of an entity cannot conduct a recount on its own motion, for example, at the can-

"This is a very important election for the citizens of Lynn County, and the Republican Party does not at all mind a request for a recount," Baker told The News. "All we want is a fair and accurate election, and if the request is filed we will be happy to conduct a re-

## Last minute filings create interest in city, school board elections

A flurry of filings in the final few days of the filing period is creating interest in several elections set for May 8, with five of the eight taxing entities to have contested races for seats on their respective boards. The filing deadline ended on Monday, and unless writein candidates file before the March 15 deadline, the City of Wilson, City of New Home, and Lynn County Hospital District will have the option of cancelling their elections due to uncontested races.

In Tahoka, five candidates are seeking the Dist. 2 council seat on the City Council, and Tahoka ISD has two contested races with two candidates for Dist. 1 and three candidates for Dist. 2 trustee. In O'Donnell two have filed for the mayor's seat and four candidates filed for two council positions, and in the OISD election there are six candidates for three trustee seats. Wilson ISD has five candidates for three trustee seats.

voted unanimously to submit an application for a waterline replacement grant/loan through the Texas Water Development Board's Economically Distressed Areas Program. The cost for submitting the application is \$7500, City Administrator Jerry Webster told The News, but if the grant is awarded it could provide a major portion of the funds needed to replace much of the city's water system.

This is a two-phase grant/ loan, with funds awarded in the first phase for designing the project and funds in the second phase for construction of new waterline systems," Webster said. "We have been told it will be 8-10 months before the grants are awarded, so this is just the first step in seeking that funding," he added. The cost of replacing the waterline system in Tahoka has been estimated at just over \$1 million.



Tahoka Police last week investigated an accident resulting in plate glass windows being broken at the Lynn County Hospital fitness center, and incidents of drug possession and family violence.



Arrests were made for attempted sexual assault plus hold for immigration authorities, driving while intoxicated, warrant on six misdemeanor charges, warrant for DWI, parole violation, warrant on failure to identify, theft over \$1500, warrant for three misdemeanors, possession of marijuana and assault/family violence.






Talented Haley Fowler, a Smyer sophomore, was named the Overall Most Valuable

#### **New law affects** 18- to 24-year-old **DL** applicants

Starting March/1, 2010, driver license applicants between the ages of 18 and 24 must complete an approved driver education course and a driving skills test to become a licensed driver in Texas. Applicants must submit a certificate proving that they successfully completed a driver education course approved by the Texas Education Agency.

Senate Bill 1317, passed by the 81st Texas Legislature in 2009. created this requirement and authorized the development of a sixhour adult driver education course to meet the needs of this group of drivers.

Applicants who present proof of successful completion of the approved course will not be required to submit to the written highway signs and traffic laws test required under section 521.161 of the Texas Transportation Code, but must still pass the driving skills examina-

A driving safety course or drug and alcohol driving awareness program are not acceptable as driver education courses for this require-

This change in the law does not affect applicants ages 15 to 17, who are still required to complete a driver education course to be li-
