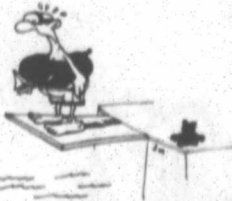

New hospital board members start terms

Two newly-elected members of the Lynn County Hospital board of directors were given their oaths of office and hospital officers were re-elected as the board met last Thursday.

New members beginning their terms are James Craig and Victoria Baker. They were sworn in by notary Carmen Chapa.

Officers re-elected were Jerry Ford, president; Jannis Horwood, vice president; and Jim Morris, secretary.

Brent Fuller of Discovery Healthcare Consulting Group gave a refresher presentation of the operation of the UPL program, a government-sponsored program designed to minimize the shortfall in reimbursement between Medicaid funding for private hospitals. The board took no action related to this issue.

Morris, hospital administrator, re-

ported that the Tahoka Rotary Club has presented the hospital a check for \$28,750.93, money raised by the annual auction and fish fry. Most of the amount will go toward the purchase of a new computerized radiography scanning system in the x-ray department, which Morris said would upgrade the quality of images produced. He explained that the currently used system is old and has quality issues, and that the new system will help the hospital meet new standards required by legislation to be in place by 2012 in order for the hospital to be reimbursed by Medicare for advanced diagnostic imaging.

Members present were Ford, Horwood, Craig, Baker, Frances Truehart, and Cal Huffaker. Absent from the meeting was member Nancy Guilliams.

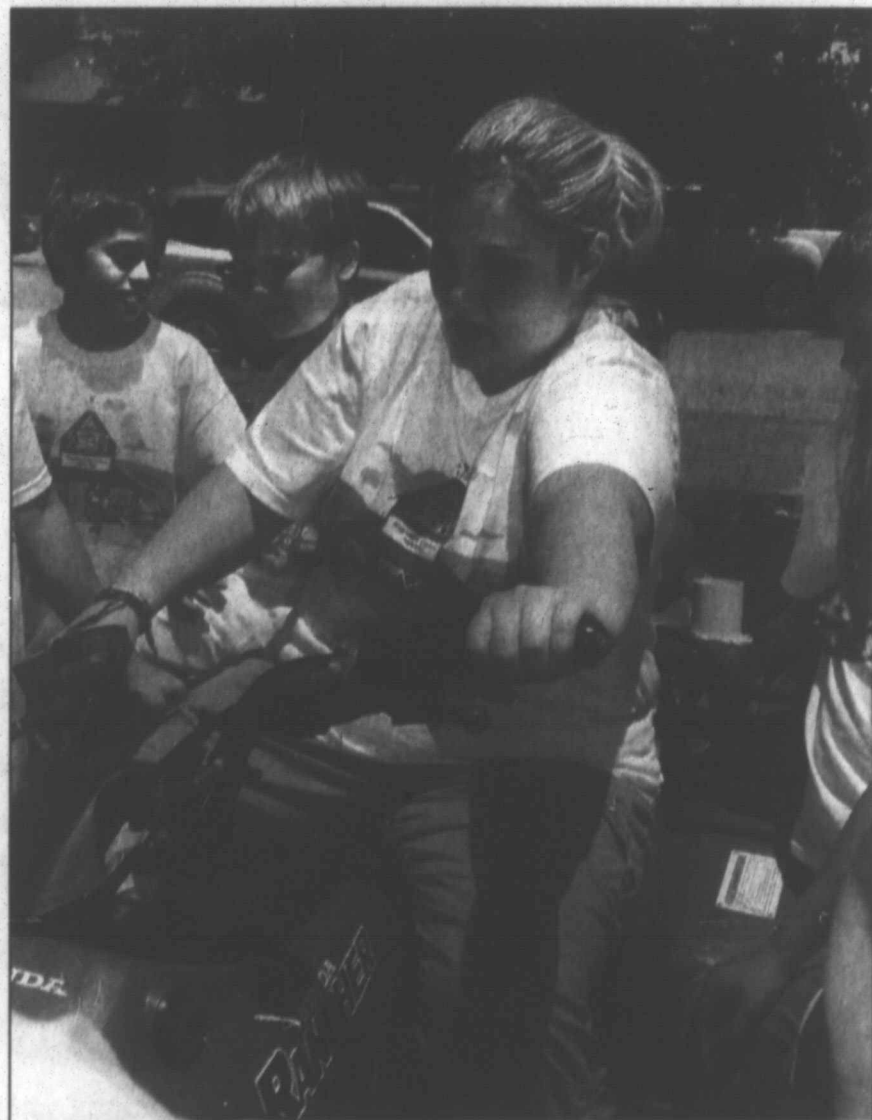
Lynn County Democratic Chairman RosaLinda Gutierrez informed *The News* of the candidate's name Tuesday afternoon.

Auto pilot devices stolen off tractors

Two auto pilot monitors were stolen from two tractors in Lynn County on May 14, it was reported this week. Sheriff's officers were advised by the owner, Gary Cook of Lubbock, that the monitors are valued at \$8000.

The sheriff's department also is working on several thefts at Wilson, the latest of which occurred on May 23 when a 1985 Ford pickup was stolen from an address on Dickson Ave. Owner was listed as Brandon DePrang of Slaton.

On April 11 someone broke into the Wilson High School gymnasium by breaking a window. On April 19 a 50-gallon air compressor, valued at \$750, was stolen from the Fiber Bright plant in Wilson. And nine vehicle batteries owned by Keith Wied were stolen from a location on FM 400 in Wilson on April 30.

Two persons involved in a reported

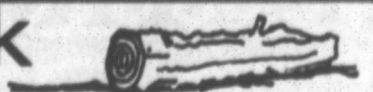
altercation involving several persons in Tahoka shortly after midnight Monday were arrested by Tahoka police and jailed. A 23-year-old man was charged with assault, and a 39-year-old man was charged with driving while intoxicated. Both are Tahoka residents.

On Saturday afternoon, police stopped a vehicle on U.S. 87 in Tahoka city limits for speeding, and subsequently arrested the driver, a 28-year-old Midland man, on warrants for probation violation and bond forfeiture, both from Midland County.

Rusty Wayne Waggoner, 29, of Lubbock was arrested on a grand jury indictment of possession of marijuana.

Dispatchers at Lynn County Sheriff's Dept. processed 303 calls in May, including 125 for the sheriff's office, 118 for Tahoka police, 22 for O'Donnell police, 23 ambulance runs, nine for animal control, and six fire alarms.

Ag/home safety is always important, children learn at Ag Safety Day event

More than 215 fourth and fifth grade students in Lynn County, teachers and volunteers learned how to identify and deal with hazards around the home and in the community at the Progressive Agriculture Safety Day on Thursday, May 20, at the First Baptist Church, Lyntegar, Tahoka Fire Department, and City Park in Tahoka. The event was coordinated by the Texas AgriLife Extension Service in Lynn County in conjunction with the Progressive Agriculture Foundation. The Safety Day in Lynn County was one of 418 worldwide Safety Day events in 2010.

"The purpose of the event was for youth to become aware of potential dangers in their daily lives, take responsibility for their own safety, prevent incidents around the home and on the farm, reduce the extent of injuries if incidents occur, respect parents' safety rules and share safety tips with their family and friends," said Amy Baugh, Lynn County Extension Agent with AgriLife Extension, and coordinator of the event.

"Unintentional injuries are the leading cause of morbidity and mortality among children in the United States. About 20 children die every day from a preventable injury, which is more than children who die from all diseases combined. (CDC, 2008) Progressive Agriculture Safety Day is a great way to teach children and their parents ways to prevent tragic deaths and disabling injuries," says Baugh.

As a result of Safety Day, according to student evalua-

tions, 71% strongly agree that they should never point a gun at anyone - ever; 71% strongly agree that they can influence their friends to NOT use tobacco; 67% strongly agree that if their houses catches on fire, they should stay low to the floor, find an exit, and/or make noise until they are rescued; 66% strongly agree that a helmet protects

their brains from serious injury or death; 66% strongly agree that they should always wear a seatbelt while riding in a vehicle; 66% strongly agree that the decisions they make now can affect them the rest of their lives; and 60% strongly agree that it is important to always think about safety. (The majority of the remaining responses was "agree.")

Progressive Agriculture Safety Days are sponsored nationally by Bunge North America, Agrium, Farm Credit, John Deere, Toyota, Monsanto, and Pioneer. Local sponsors and donors were the Texas AgriLife Extension Service in Lynn County and Lyntegar Electric Cooperative, Inc. Each participant received a free Safety Day t-shirt and packet of safety information.

Baugh said the success of Safety Day is due in large part to the generous support of many local organizations and volunteers. Learning sessions at the event included electrical safety by Brady Askew with Lyntegar Electric Cooperative, Inc.; ATV safety by Caitlynn Martin, Lynn County Youth Board member,

and Amy Baugh Texas AgriLife Extension Service - Lynn County Extension Agent; helmet safety by Vivian Jimenez, Julia Allen, and Donald Crenshaw with Lynn County Hospital District; tobacco prevention by Sherri Scott with Texas Department of State Health Services; passenger safety presented by Brandon Henry with Texas Department of Transportation; Hot or Not burn prevention by Courtney Holwerda and Tammie Baker with University Medical Center Trauma and Burn Unit; fire safety presented by the Tahoka Volunteer Fire Department - Steve Sanders, Kevin Larpenner, Ross Aten, Vernon Baker and Kent Stone; firearm safety presented by Justin Cogburn and Steve McKay with the Tahoka Police Department; and safety jeopardy quiz game presented by Harley Reynolds, Gretchen Henley, and Hannah Thomas, Lynn County Youth Board members.

Others assisting with the planning and implementation of the event include Bryan Reynolds, Lynn County Extension Agent with Texas AgriLife Extension Service, Christy Bingham, Texas AgriLife Extension Service office manager, Jynna Askew and Patrick Wells, Lynn County Youth Board members, the City of Tahoka and First Baptist Church (facilities), and Jim Bingham with Lynn County Sheriff's Department. "Special thanks goes to Lynn County elementary school administrators and 4th and 5th grade teachers for allowing the youth to participate and choosing to spend the day with us," said Baugh.

Additional 20 hours required in drivers ed courses in Texas

As of May 1, anyone enrolling in a driver education course will be required to complete an additional 20 hours of behind the wheel instruction, including 10 hours of night-time instruction.

This training is in addition to the 32 hours of classroom training, seven hours of behind-the-wheel training and seven hours of in-car observation/practice that are already required.

The provision applies to applicants enrolling in a minor or an adult driver education course, a driver education course conducted by a school district or a Parent-Taught Driver Education (PTDE) course. This provision does not apply to persons enrolled in the new six-hour adult education course required for first-time applicants between the ages of 18 and 24.

The additional hours were required under HB 339, which passed in the 2009 session of the Texas Legislature.

Texas Education Code §1001.101(b)(3) provides that the driver education (DE) course must require the student to complete 20 hours of behind-the-wheel instruction in the presence of an adult meeting the following requirements

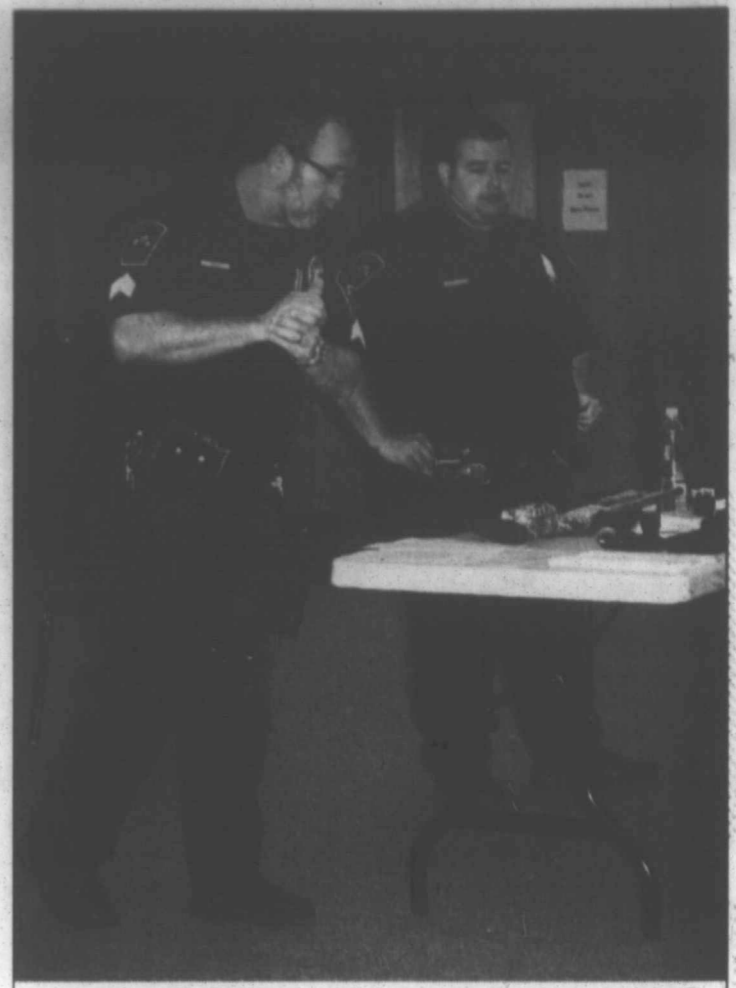

Girls Little Dribbler tournament slated here

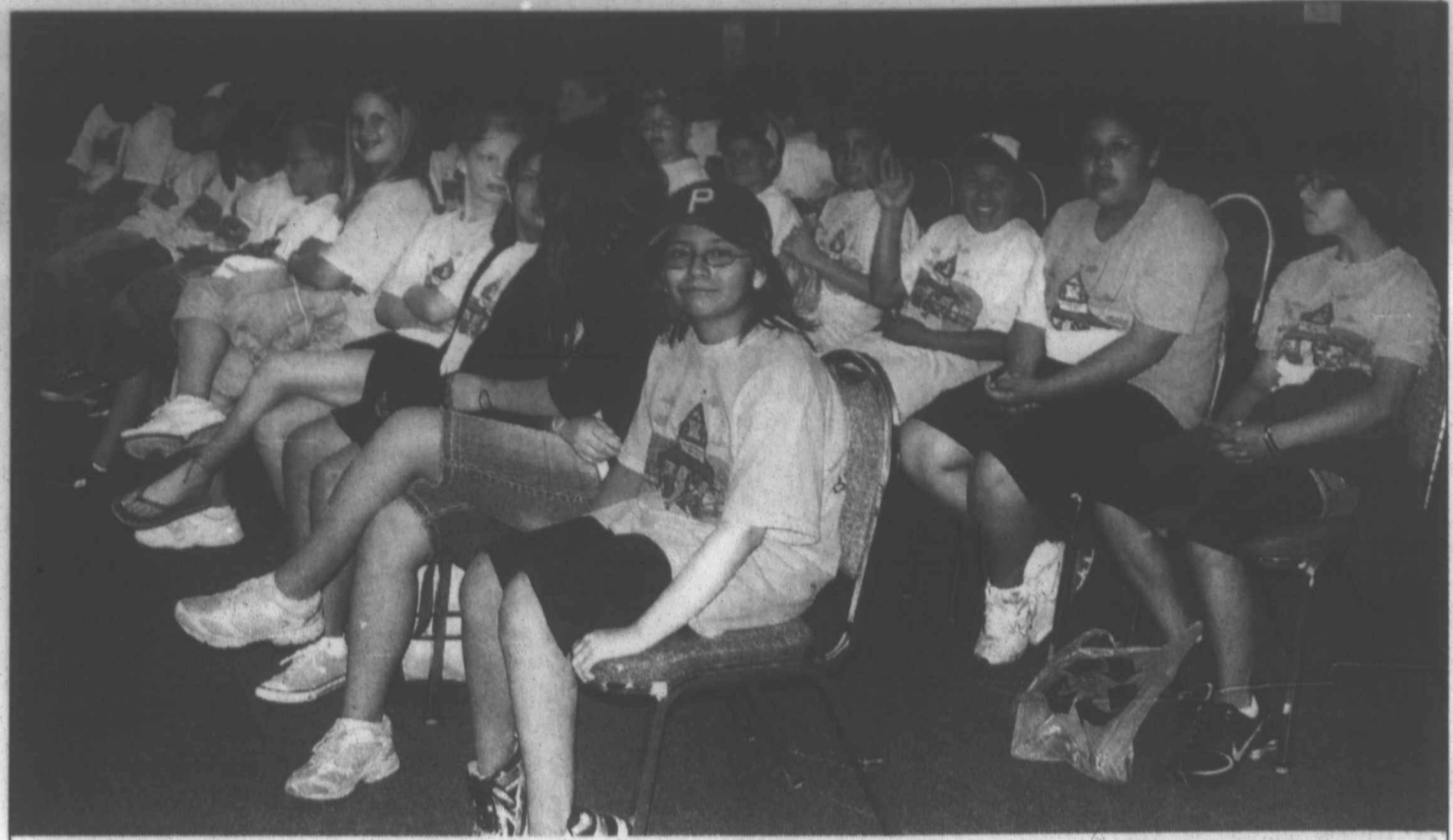

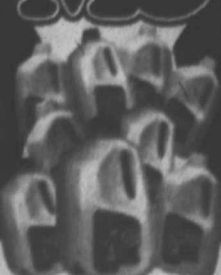

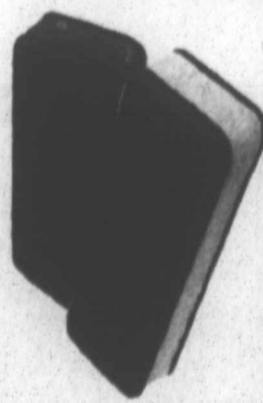
