Lynn County voters chose the Republican candidates in the local races

GUILLIAMS

Tuesday's General Election, electing Republican candidate Nancy Guilliams for Lynn County Justice of Peace, Precinct 1, over incumbent Dana McKay on the Democratic ticket, and choosing Danny Martin (Rep) over Larry Durham (Dem) for Lynn County Commissioner,

Precinct 4: Local elecofficials tion

MARTIN reported Guilliams had 539 votes to McKay's 426 in the JP race, and Martin had 296 votes to Durham's 207 for Commissioner.

At press time Wednesday morning, however, Judge McKay indicated she will file for an official recount of the ballots in the JP race, questioning the validity of how the ballots were counted.

Republican candidate Jim Landtroop ousted State Rep. Joe Heflin (D) in his bid for re-election in District 85, according to statewide reports, and in Lynn County Landtroop had 865 votes to Heflin's 425.

In the New Home ISD election for four trustees, Andy Maeker led the ticket with 167 votes, Gregg Nieman had 159, Travis Smith 141, and Matthew Barrington 116. The fifth candidate lost by a very small margin, with 109 votes cast for Rebecca Ussery.

U.S. Rep. Randy Neugebauer, District 19, easily carried Lynn County voters with 1,000 votes, to 261 for Andy Wilson (D) and 25 for Richard "Chip" Peterson (LIB). Gov. Rick Perry (R) also carried county ballots with 852 votes, with challenger Bill White (D) getting 375 votes. 106th District Judge Carter T. Schildknecht (R), unopposed, had 1,049 votes in Lynn County.

James Powell, with 268 votes, led the ticket in Lynn County for Precinct 1 Director in the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District

Of the 3,847 registered voters in the county, only 34% cast ballots, or 1,310 people, of which 313 cast straight Republican Party ballots and 150 cast straight Democratic ballots.

There were 7 provisional ballots cast, which remain uncounted until the county voter registrar's office can verify their voter registration, according to local election officials. Provisional ballots are those cast by voters who, for an unknown reason, are not listed on the voter registrar list.

Tires slashed, sugar put into gas tank

Tahoka resident Cristina Medel told police Monday that someone had slashed two tires on her 2006 Ford Taurus and also apparently had put sugar into the gas tank. Police observed sugar on the spout of the tank. The two tires were valued at \$125.

Only three persons were jailed in Lynn County during the last week, leaving the jail population at 37, with 12 of those held for Hockley County and two for Gaines County.

Back to the Future...

Tahoka ex returns to serve community in medical field

One of Tahoka's own has returned to the community to serve in the medical field here, returning back to her roots as part of her future. Shannon (Garvin) Hammonds has joined Melanie Richburg, FNPC, in seeing patients at the Lynn County Hospital District (LCHD) Family Wellness Clinic, coming back to the Tahoka community after completing her medical training. Now certified as a Family Nurse Practitioner, Hammonds is offering her services at the local clinic.

She grew up in Tahoka, and graduated (as Shannon Garvin) in 1995 from Tahoka High School. She married Tahoka native Mitchell Hammonds and the couple moved to Lubbock. He became a firefighter for Lubbock Fire Dept. and she continued her education of community for me," she adds.

Hammonds shares patient care duties with Melanie Richburg, whom she says is both her friend and mentor, as well as "mother hen" when she needs to be. "Melanie is the reason I came back," Hammonds is quick to admit. "I did my rural healthcare hours here, working under Melanie, for 18 months as a student. There was not a single day I didn't learn something from her - she is absolutely great, and she is always watching out for me like a mother hen. She is smart, levelheaded, down to earth with her patients, and she so obviously cares about them as individuals and about what is going on in their lives. And she is so much fun ... I love working with her.

"But I have to admit, I never intended to return to Tahoka," Ham-


at Texas Tech School of Nursing, earning her Bachelor of Science degree in nursing in 2006. She worked two years in the Surgical ICU and two years in the Burn ICU unit at University Medical Center. While working on her Master's degree at TTU School of Nursing, she was required to complete rural healthcare hours and opted to come to Tahoka's Family Wellness Clinic to work under Melanie Richburg. In August 2010 she earned her Master of Science degree in nursing, certified as a Family Nurse Practitioner, and on Oct. 11 she officially joined the LCHD team of health practitioners.

"It's both easier and harder to treat people who knew me as a child and teenager here," laughs Hammonds. "I have had patients who come in, take a look at me and say, 'Wow, it hasn't been that long since you were a little girl running around the church'," she says with a grin. "And then I just have to say, yes, but I've grown up since then. At the same time, having a history here establishes an immediate sense monds adds. "I really expected to continue working with UMC and stay in Lubbock. My husband, Mitch, is a fireman there, and I always said we would not uproot our children from their schools and friends. But then Mitch's mother (Joanne Hammonds) died, and we spent a lot of time here with the family, and Melanie kept asking me, 'are you sure you won't consider working here?' and I began to think, maybe God has another plan for us. I had been saying 'absolutely no', to Melanie for 16 months, and then I felt like we just needed to come home. Mitch and I talked about it, and asked the kids how they felt, and they were very excited about moving to Tahoka. And so, here we are, back again," she explained.

"I had already gotten to know so many people again through working as a student with Melanie, but I knew we, as a family, would want to be completely invested in the community if we were going to move back here. And it has been great, God has blessed (See HAMMONDS, page 3)

Healthy Hand Washing

We all know that washing our hands is important and also a very EASY healthy way to prevent sickness from spreading. Sneezing, coughing, and shaking hands or close contact with people who are infected can spread bacteria. You can also pick up strep by touching objects such as books, doorknobs, tables, or other hard surfaces that were touched by a contaminated person and then touching your nose or mouth. So washing your hands often is a key to the reduction of spreading germs.

The Center for Disease Control and Prevention recommend the following steps for hand

· Dispense your paper towel before you wash. Touching the handle after washing just contaminates your clean hands again.

 Wash your hands with hot running water and soap. Children

should use warm running water. · Rub your hands together for around 30 seconds. That's about as long as it takes you to sing "Happy Birthday" to yourself

· Wash your wrists, backs of your hands, between your fingers and under your fingernails.

· Leave the water running while you dry your hands with a paper towel.

Use the paper towel as a barrier between the faucet and your clean hands when you turn off the

· Use the paper towel to turn the doorknob or handle, and turn off the light if necessary. Again creating a barrier between you and the bacteria located there.

· Throw towel away after opening door. Most public restrooms keep a trash can at the door for this very reason.

If soap and water are not available, use gel hand sanitizers or alcohol-based hand wipes containing 60% to 90% ethyl alcohol or isopropanol. Most supermarkets and drugstores carry these products. Carry one or both with you when you travel, and keep

Hospital board hears presentation on retirement plan

At the regularly scheduled meeting of the Lynn County Hospital District Board of Directors on Thursday, October 28, members heard a presentation by Ralph Wallace of the Texas County/District Retirement System. Wallace stated that in comparison to other retirement systems throughout the nation, TCDRS is in a much more stable condition due to the way the system is structured which combines a defined benefit plan with a defined contribution plan.

According to Wallace, funding for the plan comes from three sources: employee contribution, employer contribution and investment earnings. From 1967 through 2009, 76% of plan funding came from investment earnings and the economic downturn in 2008 had a definite impact, which, according to Wallace, will take several years to recover from. The hospital district has participated in TCDRS since 1977 and each year the district sets the contribution rates for the upcoming fiscal year. The board tabled setting the rates until the November meeting.

In other business, medical staff privileges were granted for Shannon Hammonds, FNP, and approval was given for the Infection Control Policy and Procedure manual.

Members present at the meeting were Jerry Ford, President, James Craig, Jannis Horwood, Victoria Baker, Frances Truehart and Nancy Guilliams and Jim Morris, administrator. Absent was Cal Huffaker.
