I would sleep on the way back, and would be wide awake when I got home, which meant that I go back to sleep, oh well.



not listed as a game bird. There is no closed season or bag limit on these birds, but it is recommended that plumage remain on the bird until it reaches its final destination in order to verify its identity.

Remember that each hunter is required to carry a valid Texas hunting licenses with a migratory bird stamp identification when dove hunting.

The daily bag limit for doves is 15 mourning, whitewinged, and white-tipped

doves in the aggregate, to include not more than two Pick up your license. Stake and Wildlife Department. He whitetips. Hunters may possess twice the daily bag limit (except for opening day). Legal shooting hours are from one half hour before sunrise to sunset.

> After purchasing the APH permit you will be sent or given a public hunting lands map booklet.

> There are eight counties with hunting units in the Panhandle including 16 units in Floyd County alone. Be sure to check the availability of hunt units, which vary on dates and game allowed for harvest. You must also register at each site.




