# Wreck injuries fatal

An O'Donnell man died late Saturday after a Friday morning crash on U.S. 87 north of Tahoka.

Alberto Castro Jr., 23, was transported to Covenant Medical Center in Lubbock with critical injuries after the crash about 5:30 a.m. Friday, nearly three miles north of Tahoka, according to the Texas Department of Public Safety. He was pronounced dead at 6:15 p.m. Saturday.

Investigators believe Castro was driving a 2000 Kia Sportage SUV south on U.S. 87 when the vehicle began veering to the west side of the road. Castro lost control when he tried to swerve the vehicle back to the center of his lane but overcorrected, causing the

Kia to roll over once before stopping in a bar ditch on the side of the highway.

In Seminole this week, attorneys for 106th District Attorney Brian Kingston, charged with misdemeanor driving while intoxicated in Gaines County on Sept. 9, filed a motion in county court seeking recusal of Gaines County Attorney Joe Nagy from prosecuting Kingston on the charge. The motion asked that an attorney pro tem be appointed to prosecute the case, which has been scheduled for Gaines County Court in January.

# School leases baseball field from City of Tahoka - Cost: \$1

The Tahoka ISD Board of Trustees met in regular session on Thursday, November 10, approving a lease of the Tahoka baseball field and the softball field from the City of Tahoka. The lease was for \$1.00 a year, for a term of five years with an additional three terms of five years each. TISD maintains the fields.

The Board approved the 2011-2012 Highly Qualified Teachers report as presented by Superintendent Steve Burleson. Trustees also discussed the new STAAR End of Course grading policy with the administration. The STAAR End of Course test is taking the place of the high school TAKS test for the current ninth grade students. It will be the test that all high school students in the future will have to pass to graduate from high school. The current sophomore, juniors, and seniors will still take the TAKS test. This item will be on the December agenda also.

School principals gave reports concerning each of their campuses. The superintendent also gave an enrollment report for the District through the second six weeks of school and the Texas Education PEIMS Snapshot date. On the PEIMS Snapshot date there were 605 students enrolled in the school dis-

we had on this date in 2010. This number is what TEA looks at for funding the school district during the next two years," noted Supt. Burleson.

The next regular board meeting was scheduled for Thursday, December 12, at 6:30 p.m.

FOR MANY YEARS, daily newspapers used to carry a cartoon called "They'll Do It Every Time," drawn by Jimmy Hatlo, and it always pointed out things that people do which are considered out of step with everyone else.

Hatlo died around 1965, but before that he did some interesting things that most people could identify with, perhaps because many of us are too negative or pessimistic:

# Avenue N to get new water lines

Tahoka City Council met in routine session Monday night to consider city business, including approval of paperwork to implement a Texas Community Development Block Grant contract to replace waterlines on Avenue N in the city. City officials can request CDBG grant funds every two years, and has used these funds to replace the most urgent water line systems underneath city streets. City Administrator Jerry Webster says the water line underneath Ave. N will be replaced from North 2nd southward to S. 4th or 5th streets, as far as the funds allow replacement.

In other business, council members considered two bids to build a new fence around the city's wastewater treatment plant, approving the lower bid of \$13,384 from RC Construction of Lubbock. The other bid was for \$15,372 from C3 Fence in Slaton.

Brady Askew was appointed as the

city's representative to the Lynn County Appraisal District Board for a twoyear term, and the council approved monthly bills. An agreement with the Texas Municipal Retirement System to access the TMRC city portal was approved, which allows the City Administrator internet access to retirement system information regarding city employees.

TISD police officer Tom Tejeda met with the council to discuss school parking issues on city streets. Webster told The News that the slanted parking on N. 4th adjacent to the elementary gym was a temporary solution to see how it worked out, but that school and city officials may contact residents affected by the parking about the possibility of making all the streets around the school campuses one-way on a permanent basis instead of just during school hours.



Here is just a short list of the cancers that smoking increases your chances of getting: mouth, throat, esophagus, bladder, cervical, lung, larynx, and pancreas. And then there are these health problems; coronary heart disease, diabetes, high blood pressure, emphysema and bronchitis.

The good news is that if you stop smoking today you will start to feel better today and continue to feel better each day. Below are a few healthy changes you can expect IF you stop smoking.

· 20 minutes after quitting: Your heart rate and blood pressure drop.

• 2 weeks to 3 months after quitting: your blood circulation improves and your lung function increases.

• 1 to 9 months after quitting: the coughing & shortness of breath decreases-the cilia (tiny hair like structures that move mucus out of the lungs) start to regain normal function in the lungs, increasing the ability to handle mucus, clean the lungs, and reduce the risk of in-

· 1 year after quitting: the excess risk of coronary heart disease is half that of a continuing smoker's.

· 5 years after quitting: the risk of cancer of the mouth, throat, esophagus and bladder are cut in half. Cervical cancer risk falls to that of a non-smoker. Stroke risk can fall to that of a non-smoker after 2-5 years.

· 10 years after quitting: the risk of dying of lung cancer is about half that of a person who is still smoking. The risk of cancer of the larynx & pancreas decreases.

County committee members are an important component of the operations of FSA and provide a link between the agricultural community and USDA. Farmers and ranchers elected to county committees help deliver FSA programs at the local level, applying their knowledge and judgment to make decisions on commodity price support programs; conservation programs; incentive indemnity and disaster programs for some commodities; emergency programs and eligibility. FSA committees operate within official regulations designed to carry out federal laws.

To be an eligible voter, farmers and ranchers must participate or cooperate in an FSA program. A person who is not of legal voting age, but supervises and conducts the farming operations of an entire farm may also be eligible to vote. Agricultural producers in each county submitted candidate nominations during the nomination period, which ended on Aug. 1.

Eligible voters who do not receive ballots in the coming week can obtain ballots from their local USDA Service Center. Dec. 5, 2011, is the last day for voters to submit ballots in person to local USDA Service Centers. Ballots returned by mail must also be postmarked no later than Dec. 5. Newly elected committee members and their alternates will take office Jan. 1, 2012.

Place the trimming back in with the unused dough. After the tortillas are rolled and trimmed, heat frying pan on medium to high heat. Cook tortillas one at a time for 1-2 minutes on each

# BBB receives numerous complaints about Lubbock co.

Recently, BBB has been receiving a large volume of complaints on a local company called TRANS-MISSION KING. BBB opened the file on Transmission King in January of this year, and complaints first started appearing in late June. At this time the volume of complaints in the last two weeks has passed the number of complaints since the first complaint was opened in June. The address on file for the company is 5001-B 34th St. in Lubbock, TX.

Transmission King currently has an "F" rating with BBB for not answering to a complaint filed earlier this year. Most of the complaints coming in generally allege paying anywhere from several hundred dollars to several thousand dollars for repair services. Most of the complaints allege that once the vehicles are returned, they were not in drivable condition if the vehicles were returned at all

In a couple of instances, it has been reported that consumers who had already paid for service were denied access to their vehicles currently in the shop.

To this point, BBB has been unable to verify any type of business formation filings with either the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts or the Lubbock assumed name filings, and BBB is unsure as to whether or not Transmission King is in good standing with any regulating agency.
