

Prayers, tears and smiles offered at groundbreaking ceremonies

A crowd of about 100 people gathered last Thursday evening at the site of Butterfly Blessings of Laela Duran, for groundbreaking ceremonies heralding a home-building project for the Louis Duran family in Tahoka. Prayers and blessings, tears and smiles were a part of the celebration as several local pastors and others led the event held at the site of the project, at 1318 Ave. K. Sylvia Hernandez Duran, speaking on behalf of her family, expressed their deep appreciation for the outpouring of love and generosity of the commu-

Louis and Sylvia Duran, with their daughter Charlie, and son Mikey, appeared humbled by the crowd of supporters at the property located adjacent to Sylvia's mother's home. "We appreciate so much what you are doing for our family," she told the group, with tears in her eyes.

"This is a God project," said Dr. Steven Bonner, minister of the Tahoka Church of Christ and project coordinator of the Butterfly Blessings planning committee. "This is going to be such a blessing for all who participate, and we thank the Duran family for allowing this community to let them show their love and concern for the family who lost their beautiful 8-year-old Laela Marie [in a house fire in November]," he added. Dr. Bonner led the group in dedicating the site, asking God's blessings on the property and home that would be built there, and on the people involved in the Butterfly Blessings project.

Rev. Bill Fuller, pastor of First Baptist Church of Tahoka, welcomed the group to groundbreaking ceremonies and opened with prayer, asking God to bless the community and to keep safe

all who worked on the project. Vernon Baker, pastor of First United Methodist Church of Tahoka, is resource coordinator for Butterfly Blessings. He read scripture and told the group "this project is growing so fast, we can hardly keep up with all the voluntary contributions of supplies and labor ... just a few minutes ago we found out that someone has volunteered to provide all the landscaping for the project. God is in charge here, and we are just trying to keep up," he

Tahoka Mayor John Baker, also

committee as project planner, expressed his appreciation to a rapidly growing list of "partners" in the area, businesses who have already volunteered materials and/or labor for the project. Representatives from several companies were on hand for the ceremonies, including James Jordan and Margaret Trantham from Betenbough Homes in Lubbock, the company that provided several house plans from which the family chose their home, a donation that effectively 'got the ball rolling' in the Butterfly Blessings project. Betenbough also provided contacts with many of their suppliers who were interested in helping with the project.,

John Wilson, General Contractor for the project, said that he was pleased to serve on the Butterfly Blessings team and expressed his appreciation for the skilled laborers and other volunteers who are teaming up to make this dream a reality. As general contractor, he also said one of his main concerns was that no one would come to harm on the building project.

Tahoka ISD Superintendent Steve Burleson also spoke briefly at the ceremony, before the Duran family was invited to be the first to use their shovels to break the ground at the home site as onlookers applauded. Members of the committee then used their shovels to officially break the ground, and then invited all onlookers at the event to come take a turn with the shovels. The crowd surged forward with smiles and congratulations for the Duran family, each handing off a shovel after turning over a spade of soil. The ceremonies, intended to be brief, took well over an hour as friends and neighbors greeted each other after participating in the official groundbreaking.

The following Friday and Saturday, the first weekend in March, the area was prepared for the concrete base of the home. It is anticipated that concrete will be poured this weekend, which will have to set before work kicks into high gear the weekend of March 23-25. 
The Almanac noted some other folklore, none of which I ever heard exactly as they were listed:

Wilson ISD promotes positive behavior

Aggressive student behavior is a problem that has existed in schools for decades. Bullying is a nationwide issue that all schools struggle to deal with. According to a recent survey done by the Lynn County Agricultural Extension Office, bullying is rated as the number one problem for students in Lynn County. Wilson ISD works hard to educate our school community on how to deal with this problem utilizing character building.

Wilson ISD has had numerous programs to deal with the issue of aggressive behavior among students. Lessons provided by the Lynn County Extension Office to prevent bullying behavior have been given by Corporal John Gonzales and Amy Baugh for students in grades Pre-K-12.

Bullying is also addressed on the school website. Articles regarding what to do "When You See or Hear Bullying" and "Employee Guidelines for Reporting Bullying, Sexual Harassment, Dating Violence, and Sexual Violence" is helpful to parents, students and teachers in the prevention of bullying and other serious issues students may face.

Items were purchased and distributed by the school to educate students about how to properly handle challenging social situations properly. Ribbons, bracelets and other items were provided to students as well as teachers to wear and remind each other of the dangers of engaging in aggressive behavior. A pledge to stop bullying was signed by the students and is posted in the school cafeteria. Student's role played and then made posters discouraging inappropriate social behavior. These posters are on display throughout campus. The elementary students grades Pre-K – 1st are meeting weekly with the counselor in a program called Dino Anger Manage-

Information endorsed by TEA was handed to students and parents. This includes state wide bullying information and resources to discuss and educate students and parents. District and Campus Snapshots were conducted by agencies associated with the Texas Education Agency reported positive findings about the culture of the Wilson Independent School Dis-

In April 2011, a school safety audit was conducted by

independent school safety examiner Tommy Townsend from Shallowater. The district filed this School Safety Report with the Texas School Safety Center. The report was positive and the students and the teachers interviewed affirmed that the school provides a positive learning environment for all.

A Positive Behavior Intervention Support Team is in place and meets regularly to discuss specific needs for positive behavior in the classroom, hallways and other common areas. The team is now working with ESC 17 behavior experts to develop a long-term plan for Wilson ISD. Positive student behavior is constantly reinforced by providing those engaging in positive behaviors character bucks. These character bucks are then placed in school wide drawings for prizes.

Future events are being planned to encourage positive behavior as well in our Wilson school family. Catholic Family Services is planning to hold a positive behavior week-long summer camp for Wilson students ages 13-16. Communities in Schools will be holding a family night to encourage positive school and community alliance in continuously improving the school.

Wilson Independent School District strives to provide a positive program and environment for our students despite nationwide problems such as bullying and cyber bullying. Working together with parents and families, our school districts throughout the state can minimize these problems for all.

Contested races set in four city/school elections in May

Four local elections in Lynn County will offer contested races on May 12, due to last-day filings with several entities on Monday. Three school elections (Tahoka, Wilson and O'Donnell) will have contested races for voters to consider, as well as the City of Tahoka election. Other elections in the county may be canceled, with either a full slate of candidates or, in two cases, not enough candidates to fill the seats available on the city council.

In the Tahoka City Council election, Max Mendieta III filed to run against incumbent Ronny Jolly for the District 2 seat, with incumbents Ray Box (District 5 At-Large) and Jeff Martin (District 4) unchallenged for reelection. Four candidates have filed for two At-Large places on the Tahoka ISD Board of Trustees, including Heath Brewer, Aaron McCleskey, and incumbents John Hawthorne and Cathy Box.

Three candidates have filed for two places on the Wilson ISD Board of Trustees, including Anissa Purswell and incumbents April Moore and Daniel Clark. The Wilson city election has a full slate of uncontested candidates, including Mayor Donald

Klaus seeking reelection, and incumbent Oscar Follis and Clyde Wilke filing for the two council

In O'Donnell, four candidates have filed for two places on the O'Donnell ISD Board of Trustees, including Mandy Stidham, Jessie Perez, Norma J. Mecalco and incumbent Monty Hancock. Perez had previously filed for a seat on the O'Donnell City Council but has since withdrawn his candidacy to file for the school board instead. Mayor Scott Martinez filed for reelection for the City of O'Donnell, but only one candidate has filed for two seats on the council. Janie Garza filed during the last week for a council

Two of three incumbents, Ross Fillingim and Quinn Decker, filed for re-election to the New Home City Council, but no candidates filed for the remaining seat on the council.

And, finally, Lynn County Hospital District has a full slate of unchallenged incumbents seeking reelection to the Board of Directors, including Jerry Ford, Nancy Guilliams and Jannis Horwood. Early voting for elections will

be held April 30-May 8.


