# Wind energy project slated for Lynn/Borden counties

A wind energy project targeting the southern portion of Lynn County and Borden County is in the works, with representatives from the project meeting with landowners and other interested persons in an informative session held at O'Donnell High School auditorium last week. Steven K. DeWolf, representing Wind Tex Energy, LP, led the meeting and reported on the progress of the project. The Stevens Wind Project encompasses 50,000 acres of land and involves over 100 landowners.

"We are into our fourth year on this project, and I have good news," DeWolf told the group. "In 2011 we finished the interconnection studies with ERCOT (The Electric Reliability Council of Texas), and made tax agreements with the school districts involved (including O'Donnell ISD in Lynn County, and Borden County ISD). Recently, we signed an agreement to partner with Mesa Power Group, LLC (a com-


The partnership with Mesa Power is, according to DeWolf, a big boost for the project. Mesa has already invested substantial funding in ordering wind turbines that can be used for this project, and the partnership with the well-known company has increased credibility for the project.

"We are going to use Americanmade turbines, a new and better designed turbine from General Electric that is expected to have increased net capacity. We expect these turbines to perform substantially better than other turbines for this area," DeWolf said. "This project will have 233 1.6 megawatt extremely efficient turbines for that increased capacity. We are in the right place for one of the best wind energy projects in Texas, with the best wind and the best connection to ER-COT," he added.

"Also, we are planning to ask Lynn County for an amended reinvestment zone to include a little more land for this project, and will also seek small amendments to the tax abatement agreements with Lynn County and the Lynn County Hospital District," said DeWolf.

"We are expecting financing for this project to be completed by the end of the 2012, and construction to start immediately afterwards in early 2013," he told the group.

Originally, the project incorporated even more area, but in December a portion on the north edge of OISD's area was sold to Cirrus Wind Energy as a separate project. That project will have a different interconnection through the Panhandle and Lubbock area, and is reportedly in the beginning phases of construction.



# Lynn County Hospital closer to hiring new administrator

Lynn County Hospital is closer to choosing a new administrator to succeed current chief executive Jim Morris, as hospital officials scheduled a second meeting today (Thursday) with a candidate for the position.

The applicant, one of the candidates being considered, had indicated a wish to meet with hospital staff, physicians and board members, and a chance to look at the town.

Today's meeting was discussed at last Thursday's regular board meeting, where members also approved cancellation of an election of three directors as all three current members have filed unopposed for re-election.

The board also looked at a drawing and heard comments from two employees regarding the remodeling planned for the former Family Dollar building, which the hospital purchased last year and now plans to use for both the Fitness Center and the Family Wellness Clinic. No timetable has been set for the project.

Present were Jerry Ford, president, Jannis Horwood, James Craig, Victoria Baker, Sharon Isham and Cal Huffaker (by phone), and employees Melanie Richburg and Julia Allen. Board member Nancy Guilliams was absent.

#### **County extension agent Amy Baugh resigns**

Amy Baugh, Texas AgriLife Extension Service agent in Lynn County, has resigned her position here effective March 31, to accept a position outside the extension service.

"My 15+ year Extension career has been a great experience both professionally and personally. I have tremendously enjoyed working with you, your families, your communities, and your organizations, and I wish you all the best in your endeavors," said Baugh.

"I truly believe that Extension delivers invaluable programs and goes above and beyond to provide Texans with the resources they need to succeed. My programs, events, and efforts would not have been as successful without your help, presence, enthusiasm, and encouragement. It was truly a pleasure to be a part of your lives," she added.

Baugh has accepted a position at Texas Tech University as Administrator of Financial Conflict of Interest in the Office of the Vice President for Research.

#### **Post Office Moves to Shook Building**

Saturday night of last week the post office fixtures were moved from the old wooden building on the north side of the square where it has been for years to the two-story brick building about 200 feet west and north on the corner of Main and Harper streets. The new location for the post office is a great improvement over the old one. It is in the lower story of the A.D. Shook new two-story brick building, facing east with a plate glass front, handsomely finished, with cement floor, steel ceiling, making it practically fireproof. The lobby is light, roomy and comfortable. In front is a wide cement sidewalk that extends around nearly three sides of the block making the post office very accessible in bad weather. Jack Alley, the post master is arranging everything so as to be able to handle the work expeditiously and accurately with a minimum amount of labor to himself and assistant.

#### **Founder of News**

visits Tahoka

Otis Lilly of Amarillo, who is in Tahoka today, Friday, paid The News a pleasant call this morning. Mr. Lilly is representing the Fox Typewriter now, but was the founder of The Lynn County News in 1903. Mr. Lilly, with the help of his young wife, published The News for about twelve months when his health failed

and he had to sell out and move to a lower altitude. Mr. Lilly sold The News to the Boyd brothers of Snyder, who ran the paper about eight months when they mixed too much in local politics and had to quit and pick cotton for a living. The News plant was idle from October 1904 to June 1905 when the present management (H.C. Crie, editor) brought The News to life again and have managed to keep it going pretty regularly ever since.

## **Weevil Wars: Program** sees progress

· While it might be premature to say that Texas has finally, after more than 100 years, ridded itself of the dreaded boll weevil, an eradication program that began in the 1990s has made the once eternal pest a thing of the past in most of the state. A report out of South Texas indicated that the boll weevil has been eradicated everywhere except the Rio Grande Valley

The Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation has been successful in minimizing the effects of the boll weevil on the state's cotton. Lindy Patton, executive director of the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation, said the report is "somewhat accurate," but said he is waiting to see what this year brings before celebrating too much. The one area where the battle continues is in the valley, where the weevil first entered this country in the late 1800s. Since the national eradication program began, the boll weevil has been wiped out over most of the country, including the Southeast, Southwest and far West.

"Because cotton is grown in so much of the state and the state is big, Texas has had to go in phases," Patton said. "We're getting close, but the Valley is still a challenge.'

"I think we've made it a little bit easier to farm cotton in the state," Patton said. "The recordbreaking years all came after the boll weevil had been removed as a pest. We still have to keep our guard up: I know farmers feel like it's been a long time coming, but the program has been effective. I think we can be happy about what we've accomplished."







# Remember to "Render!" **Taxable property renditions** are due April 16.

#### Does this apply to you?

If you own tangible personal property that is used to produce income, such as the equipment or inventory owned by a business, it does.

#### What is a rendition?

A rendition is a report to your county appraisal district that lists all of the taxable property that you owned or controlled on Jan. 1 of this year. This often applies to furniture, fixtures, equipment or inventory owned by a business.

#### What are the advantages of filing? • You give your opinion of your property's value.

- You record your correct mailing address so your tax bills will go to the
- If your property's value depreciated, you can file a report of decreased

#### What is the deadline?

- The last day for filing 2012 renditions is April 16.
- An automatic extension is available if requested in writing by the April 16 deadline.
- The chief appraiser may grant an additional 15 days after the deadline for an owner who shows good cause in writing.

#### REMEMBER!!

Filing is your responsibility. If you render late, don't render or file an incomplete or false rendition, you may face a 10 to 50 percent penalty.


