Auction raises \$30,000 for local hospital

Just over \$30,000 was raised for Lynn County Hospital District at Saturday's Billy Tomlinson Memorial Hospital Benefit Auction, as attendees bid generously for items donated by many area businesses, organizations, and individuals. Tahoka Rotary Club, who sponsors the event, reported that contributions (after expenses) totaled approximately \$30,000 as of Tuesday morning, with some funds still expected in upcoming days.

The tally is about \$5,000 above last year's report of \$25,450, which is good news for the locally owned and operated hospital, which uses the funds to purchase medical equipment or upgrade facilities. This was the 32nd annual fundraiser for the hospital.

Other organizations also help with the event, with members of the Tahoka Volunteer Fire Dept. and Tahoka Masonic Lodge helping prepare the meal, 4-H Club members providing and selling drinks, and Phebe K. Warner Club members making their popular homemade ice cream to sell by the cup. Hospital directors and staff, and Lynn County EMS, served the meal and helped set up for the auction. All proceeds benefitted the hospital.

The new hospital administrator, Stace Holland, arrived in Tahoka to attend the auction as well, speaking at the event and meeting many county residents. He reportedly told the crowd, "We are excited to be here, and I am amazed by this show of community support for the hospital."

Many volunteers assisted with running the auction, including auctioneer Bill Miller and emcees Cal Huffaker and Amy Preston, with Rotary Club members and other volunteers assisting as spotters and moving auction items to the podium, and recording buyer information on auction items.

The headaches and irritation could be because they're trying to figure out how they are going to pay for these new wheels.


Perhaps fortunately for my health, I'm not able to buy very many new cars.

Locals recognized during National **Volunteer Week**

Dear Editor:

The Points of Light Foundation has set the week of April 16th thru the 20th as National Volunteer Week. Would you please recognize those individuals that volunteer within Lynn County in all activities?

One such program of volunteers is the South Plains Senior Companion Program. The program has volunteers (seniors over 55 years of age who perform inhome services for homebound adults) who work within Lynn County for 20 hours per week. The Companions worked 3748 hours during 2011. The Independent Sector has placed a value of \$21.35 on a volunteer hour. Therefore the Lynn County Companions have contributed \$79,832 to residents of Lynn County.

The Companions presently active in Lynn county are: Belia Alvarado, Gloria Garza, and Mary Gutierrez.

The South Plains Senior Companion Program is funded thru the Corporation for National Service, as part of the National Senior Service Corps. Local sponsorship is thru South Plains Community Action Association, Inc. Some funding for Senior Companion services are received thru the Texas Department of Aging and Disabilty Services (DADS). The program does not charge the clients for the services offered by the volunteers. Several fund raisers are done each year to supplement the federal and state funds received. The program has companions also active in Bailey, Cochran, Garza, Hockley, Lamb, Terry and Yoakum counties. In the eight counties the companions contributed a total of 59,002





Tahoka would blister the ball all day at the plate, collecting 15 hits. Four of those were by second baseman Tino DeLeon, who finished the day 4 for 5 with a double and 4 RBIs.

ness for workers and motorists, TxDOT will join the Federal Highway Administration and other transportation partners April 23-27 to observe National Work Zone Awareness Week. Work zones can be haz-

ardous for motorists and highway crews working to improve Texas' highways. Because of increased safety measures and public outreach, TxDOT has seen a decline in work zone fatalities for two consecutive years.

In 2010, 100 people were killed in highway construction and maintenance zones in Texas, down from 108 the previous year. While there has been a decline in work zone fatalities and crashes, there is still work to do. Since 1938, there have been 270 TxDOT employees killed, with 200 of those deaths occurring in work zones.

In 2010, the Lubbock District had three work zone fatalities and 412 crashes. Eighty-five percent of those killed in work zones are drivers or their passengers. Speeding and inattention are the most common causes cited. Rear-end collisions account for one in three crashes.
