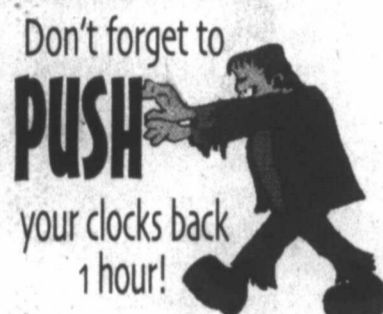

A life-Long devotion to service ...

Local pastor Lynn Long loses battle with cancer

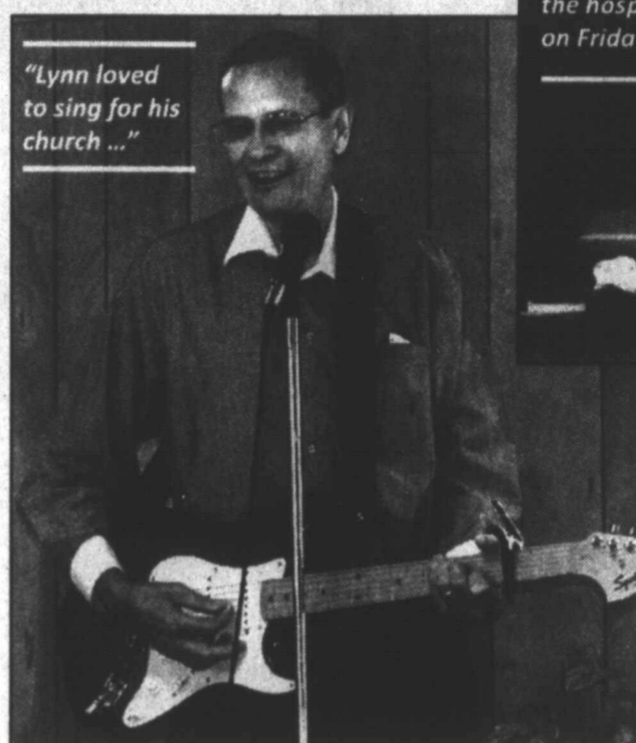
Bro. Lynn Long, pastor of Sweet Street Baptist Church in Tahoka for the past 18 years, died Tuesday morning after a hard-fought battle with cancer. He was 59 years old. Services for the pastor will be held at 10 a.m. Friday at his church home, Sweet Street Baptist, at 1300 Ave. J.

His wife Denise, three sons, and two granddaughters, and other relatives survive him.

Bro. Long began his pastorate of Sweet Street Baptist in 1994, but he had earlier ties here as well, as he served for a time as youth minister and music director for the church at the age of 19. He graduated in 1972 from Seagraves High School, and met his future wife at a church in Seagraves, where her father, Tut Jones, was pastor. He married Denise Jones on New Year's Day of 1977.

He earned his degree from Liberty Home Bible Institute and pastored his first church in Stoneburg, then Clifton. He had a heart for the mission field so he attended Rio Grande Bible Institute to learn Spanish. He started a church in Donna, Texas and after eight years of leadership, the family returned to Tahoka. He spent the last 18 years as the pulpit minister for Sweet Street Baptist Church.

He was diagnosed with cancer in 2002, and underwent many treatments during his battle of the disease. His dedication in continuing to pastor Sweet Street

Church despite his illness displayed his faithfulness and desire to do what he believed God called him to do.

"Lynn was a very, very strong Christian ... it was totally his life," says Gilda Taylor, a lifelong member of Sweet Street and longtime pianist for the church. "He was good to

work with, and very conscientious about his position as pastor, guarding what was taught in our church - but he was also a lot of fun, a big cutup, and he enjoyed giving us a hard time in a fun way - he had a great sense of humor," she added.

Taylor said it was obvious to her, and to the rest of the congregation, that the pastor's focus was his church and family, and not his illness.

"His heart's desire was to preach ... Lynn preached on Sunday and on Wednesday night before he went to the hospital on Friday (last week). In fact, he led both the singing and preaching."

Early voting ends Friday; Polls open Tuesday, Nov. 6

Early voting for two separate elections in Lynn County will end Friday, Nov. 2, for voters to mark ballots in the November General election, and for those voters residing within the city limits of Tahoka, in a City Election regarding the sale of alcoholic beverages. Early voting for both elections is underway at the Lynn County Courthouse in the county clerk's election room (first floor, east side of lobby) during regular business hours, 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m.

Both elections will be held on Tuesday, Nov. 6, for those who don't take advantage of early voting.

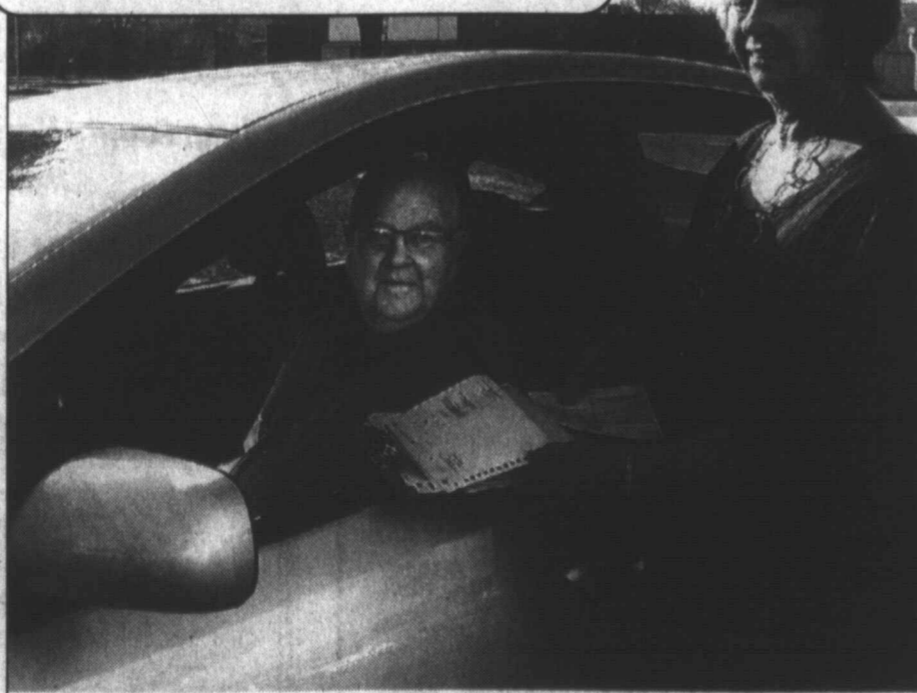
Polls will open from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. on Election Day, at various locations throughout the county for the General Election, and at one location only for the City Election, which is a

separate ballot.

In the City Election, open only to those registered voters who reside within Tahoka city limits, citizens will have an opportunity to vote their opinion on whether to allow the legal sale of alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption.

Both the General and City Election ballots will be available at the courthouse during the early voting period. Voters may only vote in their designated polling location on Election Day, as designated by the Prec. Number printed on their voter registration cards, so it is likely that voters who wait until Election Day who want to mark ballots in both the General and City elections may have to go to two different polling locations on Election Day.

There are 3,876 registered voters in Lynn County who are eligible to vote in the Nov. 6 election, according to county officials. As of Tuesday afternoon, with only a few days left in the early voting period, county election officials report 482 county citizens have marked ballots.

PRINTED on my desk calendar in the space for this coming Sunday are the words, "Daylight Savings Time Ends." I just wish that were true, permanently, because many of us are tired of having to change our clocks one hour forward or backward twice a year. And, although I usually say twice a year that I am tired of this nonsense, for the first time I have discovered an organization of people who agree with me.

The group is called standardtime.com, and it gives some history of how daylight savings time started, and some changes over the years. It also suggests that "the way you can stop this madness of changing the time twice a year" is to write your congress member a letter or e-mail, tell them you want to stop messing with the clock and refer them to standardtime.com for more information.

They suggest you can get the Congressional e-mail directory at www.congress.org.

Daylight time started in the U.S. during World War I, "primarily to save fuel by reducing the need for artificial lighting. Most states discontinued it after that war, but it again was observed nationally during World War II.

That war is long over, and our power usage is probably up, not down, during daylight savings time. So enough, already. I agree with the statement of standardtime.com: "If we are saving energy, let's go year round with daylight savings time. If we are not saving energy, let's drop it."

I don't really care whether we are on standard time or daylight time. A day is still 24 hours, some dark and some light. But we need to adopt one or the other and stick with it.

I'm tired of having to stay up until 2 o'clock in the morning twice a year just to reset my clocks.

said Taylor. Bro. Long died the following Tuesday morning, Oct. 30.

"He fought cancer for 10 years, and battled it hard. If it had been anybody else, they would have been in the hospital or resting at home - not in the pulpit," Taylor said. "He would be very weak, and I would watch him during the service and think, 'he won't be able to get up to the pulpit,' but he found the strength every time. We would tell him to sit down instead of trying to preach standing behind the pulpit, but it was so very important to him, he would not sit down to preach. He was definitely a fighter," she added.

Taylor said that the pastor was very compassionate, and a good friend to his congregation.

"He was a very good preacher and a very good pastor - and a church isn't always fortunate enough to get both," said Taylor. "Lynn was also a very good singer, both he and Denise

loved to sing for the church. He spoiled us severely, really, and we will have a hard time filling his shoes. He was also our handyman, and did so much for the church behind the scenes, and he was involved with the youth, in vacation bible school, teenkid programs - really in every aspect of the church," she explained.

"And, I never saw a man more in love with his wife. He was very devoted to Denise, and to his family. He will be missed," said Taylor.

His congregation, his family, and friends will celebrate Bro. Long's life at services scheduled for 10 a.m. Friday, Nov. 2. The family will receive friends from 6-8 p.m. tonight (Thursday) at Sweet Street Baptist Church.

Dr. James Duane Carter of Tahoka, passed away on Monday, October 22, 2012 at the age of 80. He was born January 11, 1932 in Garza County, to James and Lillian (James) Carter. He married Bennie Pridmore, his high school sweetheart, on December 21, 1952 in Tahoka. They were just shy of celebrating their 60th wedding anniversary.

Duane was in the U.S. Navy for 28-1/2 years. He served in many capacities: land, air, and sea.

Leopards top Wilson 54-8

The New Home Leopards rolled over Wilson 54-8 last week for New Home's sixth win of the season against just two losses.

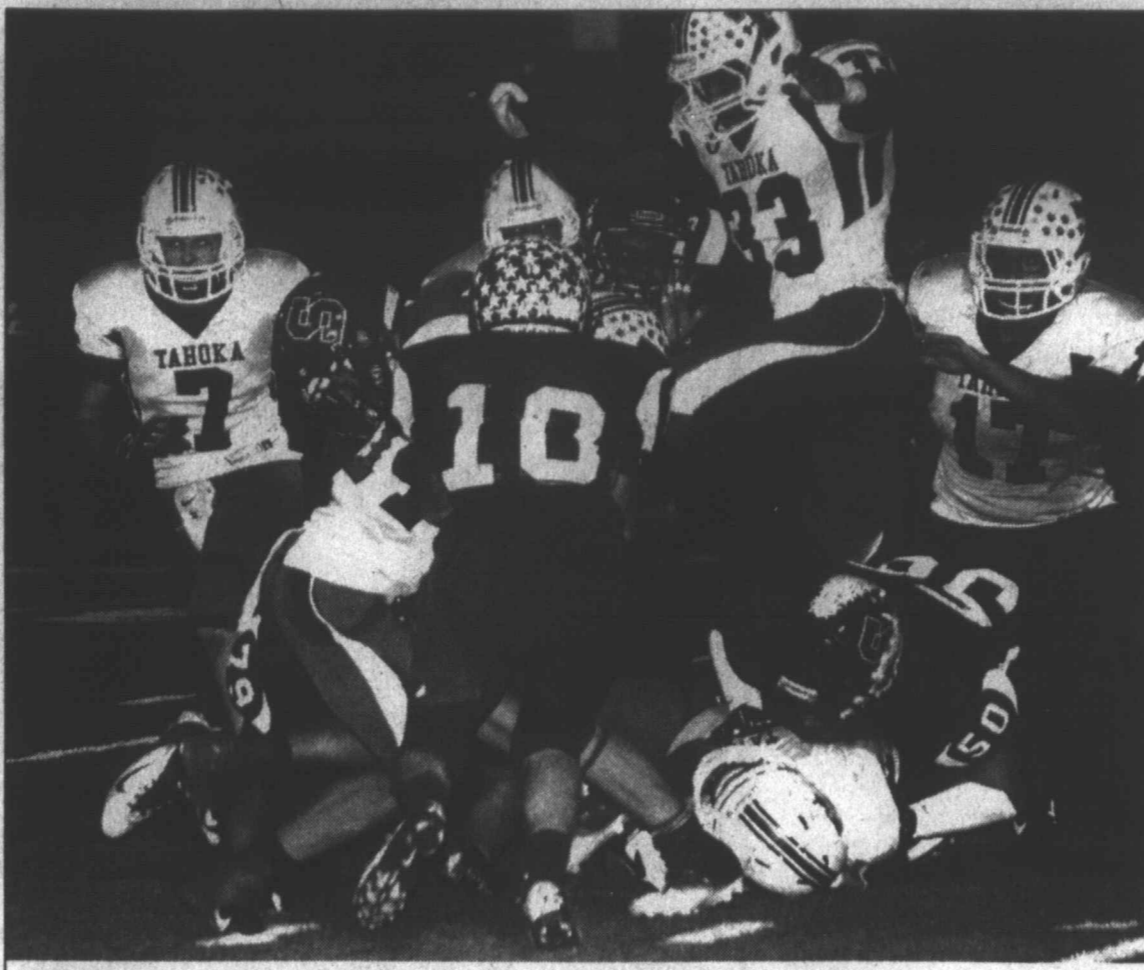
The game was halted at the end of the third period by the 45-point rule when Josh Paul scored his fifth touchdown of the game on an 18-yard run. Paul also scored on a 52-yard punt return, runs of 47 and 54 yards and a 13-yard pass from Zach Paul. Taylor Shellman scored TDs on runs of 1 and 11 yards, and Payton Romero ran 54 yards for still another Leopards touchdown.

Josh Paul gained 162 yards rushing on only 8 carries. Romero had 62 yards in 2 efforts and Shellman 42 yards in 6 carries.

Wilson's only touchdown came in the second quarter when Matthew Richardson passed 14 yards to Jeremy Atchison. Richardson completed 4 of 9 passes for 50 yards for the Mustangs, whose leading rusher was Austin Castillo with 44 yards on 6 carries.

Two motorcyclists jailed in county after high-speed chase

Two motorcyclists flying north through Tahoka last Thursday eventually were arrested west of the city and taken to Lynn County jail, charged with evading arrest.

Two Tahoka police officers who had been advised that the two motorcycles were traveling northbound at a high rate of speed just north of O'Donnell clocked the bikes at 110 mph. Lights and sirens were activated, but the motorcycles continued their journey north and, due to traffic on the highway, lost their pursuers.

Minutes later, police were advised that Terry County officers were pursuing one of the motorcycles headed back

into Lynn County on U.S. 380. Soon, officers had the suspect in custody, and he was taken to jail. Officers here later were advised by state troopers that the other cyclist had tried to escape by driving through a Terry County cotton field, but was arrested when he fell off the bike. He also was brought to Lynn County jail.

The motorcyclists, both from Odessa, were males, age 23 and 20.

Only seven persons were being held in Lynn County jail early this week, with three of those held for Gaines County.

In addition to the two men arrested last week for evading arrest, one other person was jailed for unlawfully carrying a weapon.

New Animal Control Director to focus on adoptions, wellness

Ashlee West, the new Director of Lynn County Animal Control Services, says she will focus on a wellness program for the animals at the Lynn County Animal Shelter, as well as getting the dogs fostered/adopted as quickly as possible. She is a lifelong animal lover and five-year member of the Board of Directors of the Humane Society of Texas, a non-profit, volunteer organization that provides housing and shelter for animals.

West, who is working under the jurisdiction of Lynn County Sheriff Jerry D. Franklin, began her duties here Oct. 1. County residents who need animal control services should call the Sheriff's Office, at 561-4505, and West will be notified. The former phone number for Animal Control Services has been disconnected, and all calls should go through the Sheriff's office dispatch.

West grew up in neighboring Terry County, where she came to love animals early on.

"We lived in the country, and had dogs dumped on us all the time," West says. "My par-

ents hated it, but I loved it," she added with a laugh. "I started taking care of animals when I was a kid, and they were my friends. We didn't have any close neighbors, so the dogs became my friends. I was never afraid of them, although I was cautious around the ones who had obviously been mistreated and needed time to adjust."

Her affinity for animals has

organization that actually does something for the animals despite having limited funds. I focused on animal welfare and wellness programs, refining the programs and making sure they were taken care of by the standards set by animal organizations. The last few years I was focused on the Humane Society's wellness clinic for animals," she explained.

She brings a wealth of knowledge about animal care and adoption procedures, and

continued throughout her life.

"I've fostered over 200 animals in the last five years," West admits. She volunteered in college with different animal rescue groups. Six years ago she started fostering cats for the Humane Society, and shortly afterwards began fostering dogs as well.


"Within two months of fostering with the Humane Society, I became the cat coordinator for them. When they lost the dog coordinator, I took that on as well, and was the cat/dog coordinator - all volunteer, of course," she says with a laugh. "I have learned so much that I didn't know, being with an or-

has numerous contacts through the Humane Society. Since accepting the job as Animal Control Director here, West says she has stopped fostering animals at her home in order to focus on the demands of her new job.

Last week, there were only a few dogs remaining in the county animal shelter, as West has overseen the adoption of several dogs. "I adopted out three dogs in one day - sometimes it just takes good contacts and a little elbow grease. We only have three puppies and one adult today (this was last Thursday), but I really don't like to keep puppies at the shelter because they are so susceptible to disease, so I am trying to get them fostered out until they can be adopted," said West.

She gets help with cleaning the shelter facilities through the Sheriff's department, which now supervises inmate trustees to clean and sanitize the shelter daily. "When they get through cleaning, they walk the dogs in the fenced area, and they love doing that," West says. "The trustees have all been very polite and well-mannered. It's a chance for them to do something good for the county, and it's good for the dogs to be walked, and to adjust to being around different people. I really appreciate the trustees who help at the shelter, and hope it is a practice that we can continue," she added.

She has lots of ideas about improving the services of the

Lynn County Animal Shelter, but is practical about the limited availability of funds and the physical limitations of the small shelter here. She has been trained in euthanizing animals if the need arises, but prefers to try for fostering or adoption when possible.

"If we can make something people can be proud of, we can get a lot of support in what we do for the animals, and for the community," says West. "We still need volunteers, especially volunteers that specifically want to help with the adoption process. Finding a home for an animal is only half the battle - we need to find the right home for them."

She is also seeking volunteers to help run the Lynn County Animal Control Services new facebook page, as well as volunteers to help with fostering puppies/dogs until they can be adopted.

West plans to have donation bins at several locations in the county to accept donations of supplies for the shelter. Heading the supply list right now is the need for heat lamps/bulbs, to help provide heat to the animals during the colder weather ahead. Ongoing supply needs also include paper towels, bleach, trash bags, dog treats and toys, and towels. She anticipates that a donation bin will be placed at the Lynn County Sheriff's Office and at the east entrance of the Courthouse, and hopes to have one at all four City Hall locations in the county, and possibly other locations. Check the facebook page for updated lists of supply needs and locations of the donation bins.

In the coming weeks, West says she will begin offering a microchip program, for shelter animals as well as for local residents to microchip their pets. The microchip program provides a way to get lost animals back to their owners, and West is anxious to start the program here. More information will be provided at a later date regarding this program.

NOTICE OF ELECTION

In accordance with the provisions of the Texas Agriculture Code, Chapter 74, Subchapter D, and 4 Tex. Admin. Code, Chapter 3, Subchapter A, the Texas Department of Agriculture (the Department) will conduct a board election in the Southern High Plains Caprock Boll Weevil Eradication Zone, in order to select a representative of the above-referenced zone to serve on the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation Board of Directors. The board is charged with administering the boll weevil eradication program in Texas.

The Southern High Plains/Caprock Eradication Zone consists of all of Cochran, Hockley, and Lubbock counties; that part of Terry County that is north of a line 1.25 miles south of the Hockley County line from FM 303 east to Highway 385 and all land north and east of a line with boundaries of County Road 230, County Road 525 also known as Cemetery Road, and County Road 280 to the Lynn County line; that part of Lynn County north and east of a line 5 miles north of Hwy 380 following County Road 18 that extends from the Terry County line east for 10 miles, then turns south to Hwy 380, and runs east to the intersection of FM 212 before turning south to the Borden County line; that part of Crosby County that is above the Caprock Escarpment, that part of Garza County that is above the Caprock Escarpment; and that part of Dickens County that is above the Caprock Escarpment

Any cotton grower having planted cotton in the year 2012 within the zone defined above is eligible to vote, and, if he or she resides in the Southern High Plains Caprock Zone and has at least seven years experience as a cotton grower, can have his or her name placed on the ballot as a candidate in the board member election. A cotton grower is defined as a person who grows cotton intended to be commercial cotton. The term includes an individual who, as owner, landlord, tenant or sharecropper, is entitled to share in the cotton grown and available for marketing from the farm, or share in the proceeds from the sale of the cotton from the farm or from an indemnity or other payment received from or related to the planting, growing, or failure of the cotton. Any person eligible to vote in the board member election that resides in the Southern High Plains Caprock Zone and meets the seven-year experience requirement may place their name in nomination for election to the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation Board by written application to the Department at the address provided below. Nomination forms are provided by the Department and must be signed by the nominee and at least ten other eligible voters. The nomination form must be received by the Department at its office located in Austin by November 5, 2012, and must provide the legal residence of the applicant. A nomination form may be obtained by contacting the Department office or any county agent located in the voting area.

The board election will be held by mail balloting. Ballots will be mailed to cotton growers by November 20, 2012. All ballots cast by mail must be postmarked no later than December 5, 2012, in order to be valid.
