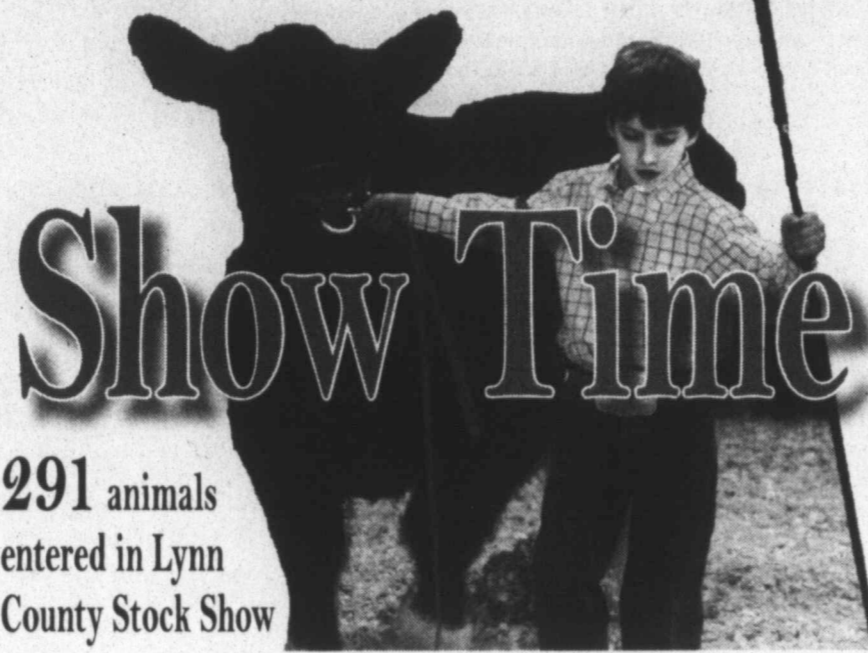

291 animals entered in Lynn County Stock Show

Lynn County youth are making last-minute preparations for the Lynn County Stock Show that begins today (Thursday) at the county show barn. County youth have entered 291 animals in the three-day event, including 161 barrows, 50 lambs, 36 steers, and 44 goats.

The show barn opened Wednesday for the weighing of steers, goats, and lambs. Thursday events begin at 9:00 a.m. with the weighing of barrows. Steer judging begins at 5:00 p.m., followed by goat judging and concluding with lamb judging.

Barrow judging begins at 9:00 a.m. Friday. All entries for baked goods must be in place from 9:00-10:00 a.m. Friday, with judging scheduled for 10:00 a.m. The Pee Wee Barrow Show

will begin after the barrow judging is concluded.

Judges for this year's show include: Kody Lucherk - steers, JoBonney Lecompte - barrows and Joel Lanier - lambs and goats.

The annual Barbeque Lunch will begin at 11:30 a.m. on Saturday, followed by the awards presentation and auction at 1 p.m.

Angry girlfriend accused of assault in altercation

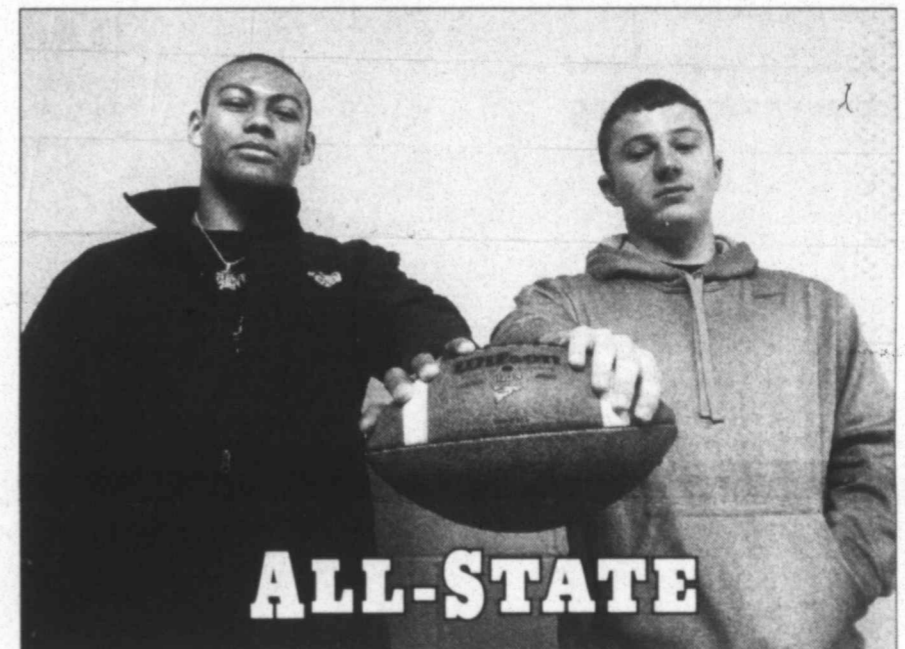

Blood Drive slated here Tuesday

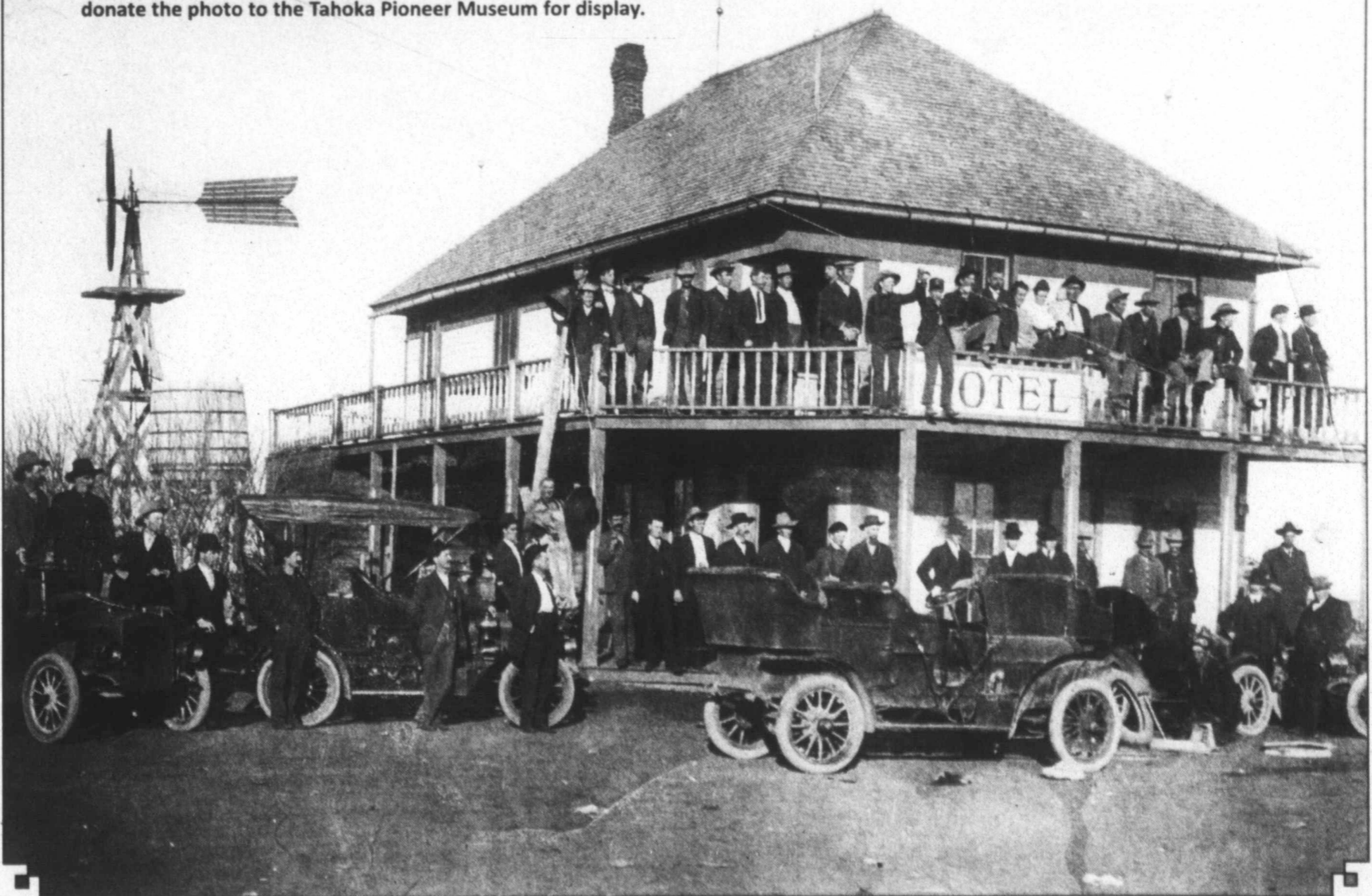

Times gone by ... A News reader brought by this historical photo of the old Stokes Hotel on the square in Tahoka, depicting a crowd of people and several vintage vehicles, in 1912. According to information from "Grassroots Upside Down: A History of Lynn County," the Stokes Hotel was built in the early days of the town's origins and was a popular meeting place for people in 1907.


The hotel survived the catastrophic fire on Dec. 30, 1915 that destroyed 13 businesses on the square in Tahoka, which started from a blowing curtain catching the flame from an oil heater. However, another fire in March of 1923 destroyed the landmark hotel that was located north of Guaranty State Bank and Craft's Tailor Shop on Sweet Street. The News will donate the photo to the Tahoka Pioneer Museum for display.

He was born November 15, 1989 in Graham and was a graduate of Graham High School.

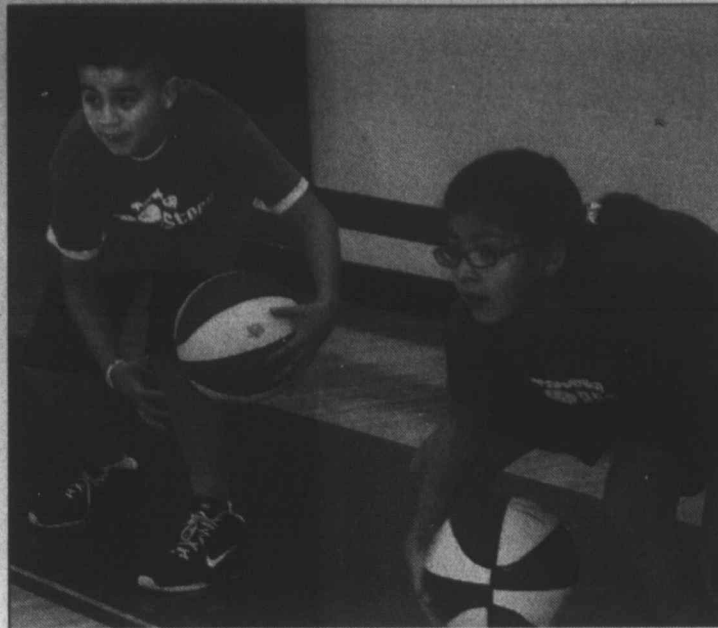

The map was approved to designate roads over which the county has actual authority.

In other business, commissioners approved the position of District Court Bailiff, naming John Key, a former Gaines County Sheriff, to fill the position and approving a salary for the job. Changes to the county's

worker's compensation plan were approved, and monthly bills were paid. Sheriff Jerry D. Franklin reported on his department's activities.

Lynn County Judge H.G. Franklin presided at the meeting, with all four commissioners present including Danny Martin, Keith Wied, Don Blair and Mike Braddock.

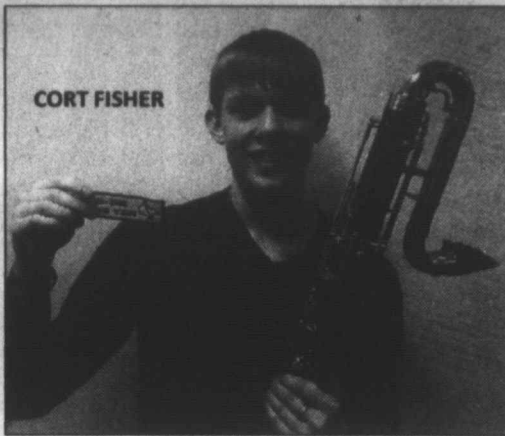
