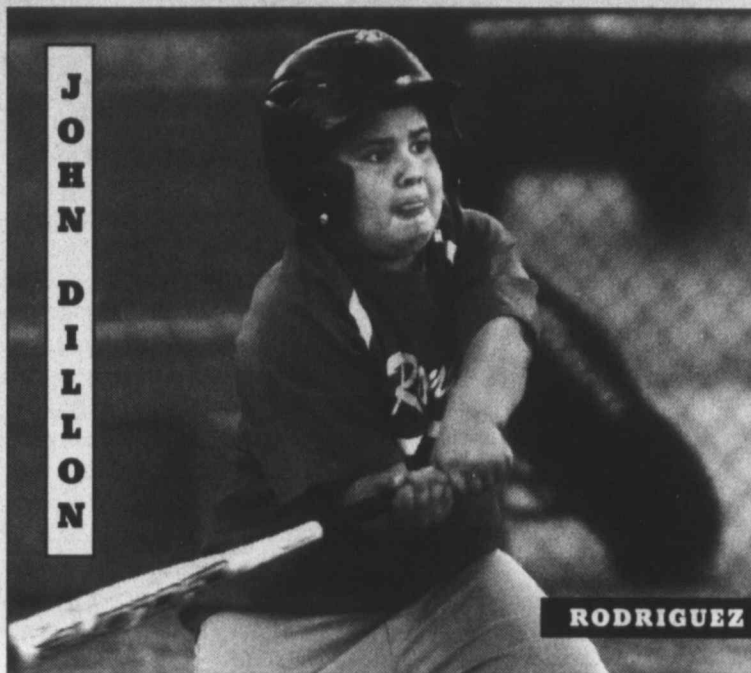

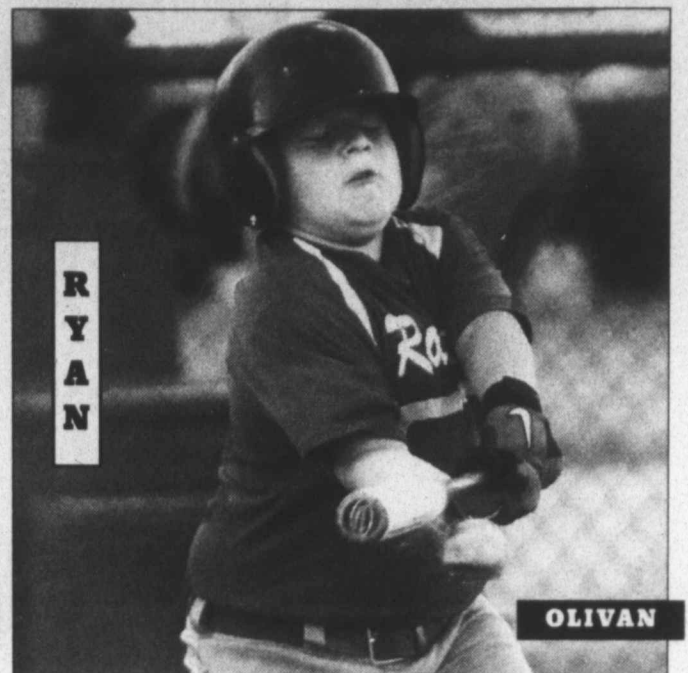

More domestic violence cases reported in town

Tahoka Police were called to the scenes of four domestic disturbances during the last week, with three of those reported Saturday and one Sunday morning.

One incident involved a brother and sister, who told police he attacked her after she asked him if he had stolen her cigarettes. He denied an attack, saying, "she just barged into my house accusing me of stealing her cigarettes, and I threw her out."

A 23-year-old woman treated for a head injury at Lynn County Hospital said a 34-year-old woman had struck her with a beer bottle.

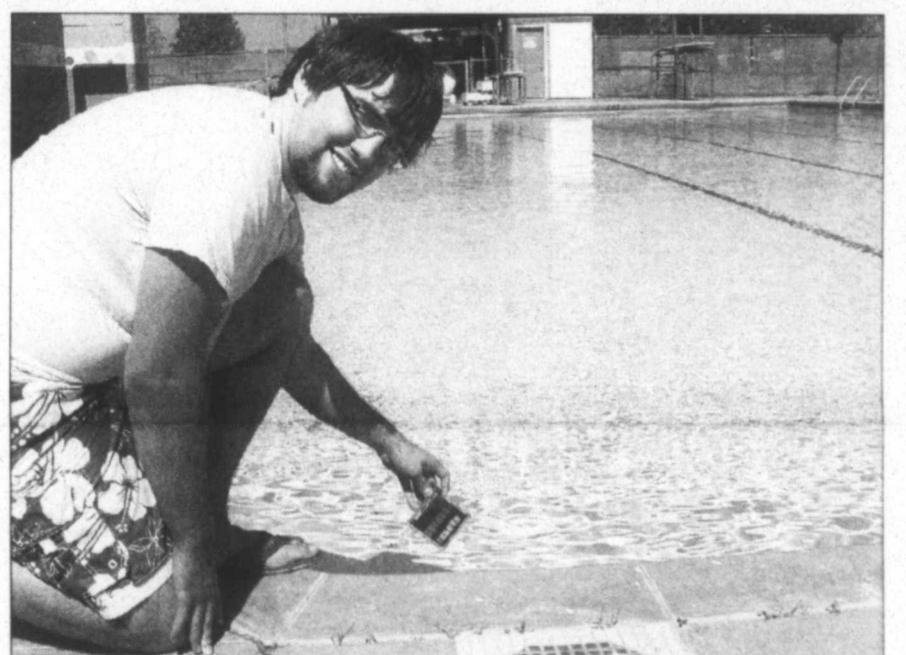
When police were called to a Tahoka home where a man and his son had been in an argument and scuffle Saturday, they also seized a marijuana plant apparently owned by the younger man.

An officer was sent to a Tahoka address Sunday morning in reference to a disturbance. Two men reportedly were involved in a verbal argument.

Last Friday night, a Tahoka policeman stopped a 36-year-old Arlington woman on U.S. 380 for driving while intoxicated with three minor children in the vehicle. She was jailed.

Two other persons were jailed during the week, on charges of assault on a family member with previous conviction, and disorderly conduct. The jail was holding 16 persons early this week, with two of those held for Andrews County.

Dispatchers at the Lynn County Sheriff's Dept. answered 340 calls in May, including 138 for the county, 118 for City of Tahoka, 33 for animal control, 17 for City of O'Donnell, 27 ambulance calls and 7 fire alarms.

Cancer survivors, relay team walkers sought for June 21st Relay For Life

Area citizens are encouraged to participate in the June 21st Relay For Life event at the Tahoka High School football field, and all Lynn County cancer survivors and caregivers are invited to come walk the special survivors lap. Anyone interested in participating in this celebratory event should contact Julia Allen, chairman, at Lynn County Hospital District, phone 998-4533 ext. 333.

Area citizens are encouraged to form Relay For Life teams to participate in the event that raises funds for the American Cancer Society for cancer research.

The 12-hour Relay For Life, scheduled for 7 p.m. Friday, June 21 through 7 a.m. Saturday, June 22, is an overnight community fundraising walk. Teams of people camp out around a track, and members of each team take turns walking around the track. Food, games and activities provide entertainment and build camaraderie at the event.

What makes a Relay For Life event special?

- **Survivors Lap:** During the Survivors Lap, all cancer survivors at the event take the first lap around the track, celebrating their victory over cancer while cheered on by the other participants who line the track. Relay For Life events also recognize and celebrate caregivers, who give time, love, and support to their friends, family, neighbors, and coworkers facing cancer.
- **Luminaria Ceremony:** The Luminaria Ceremony takes place after dark, so we can remember people we have lost to cancer, honor people who have fought cancer in the past, and support those whose fight continues. Candles are lit inside of personalized bags and are placed around the Relay track as glowing tributes to those who've been affected by cancer.
- **Fight Back Ceremony:** This emotionally powerful ceremony inspires Relay participants to take action. The Fight Back Ceremony symbolizes the emotional commitment each of us can make in the fight against cancer. The action taken represents what we are willing to do for ourselves, for our loved ones, and for our community to fight cancer year-round and to commit to saving lives.

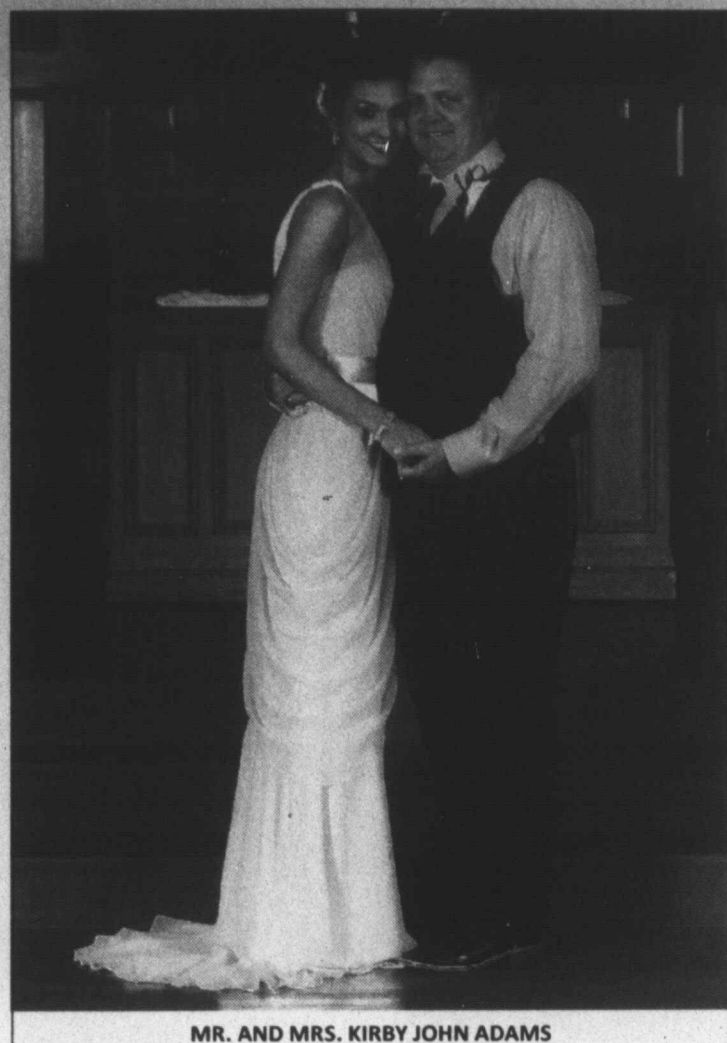

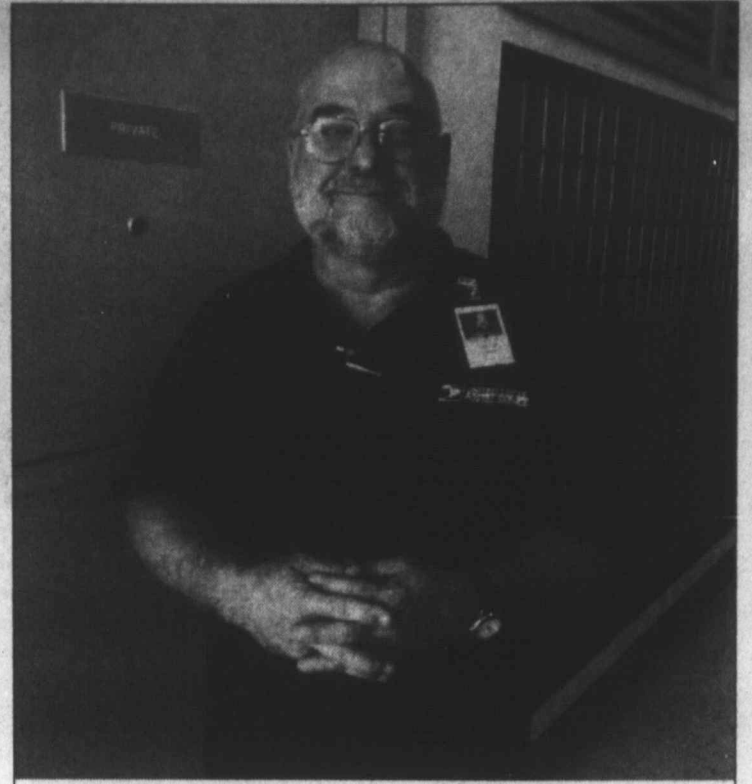


Tahoka eighth graders honored at banquet

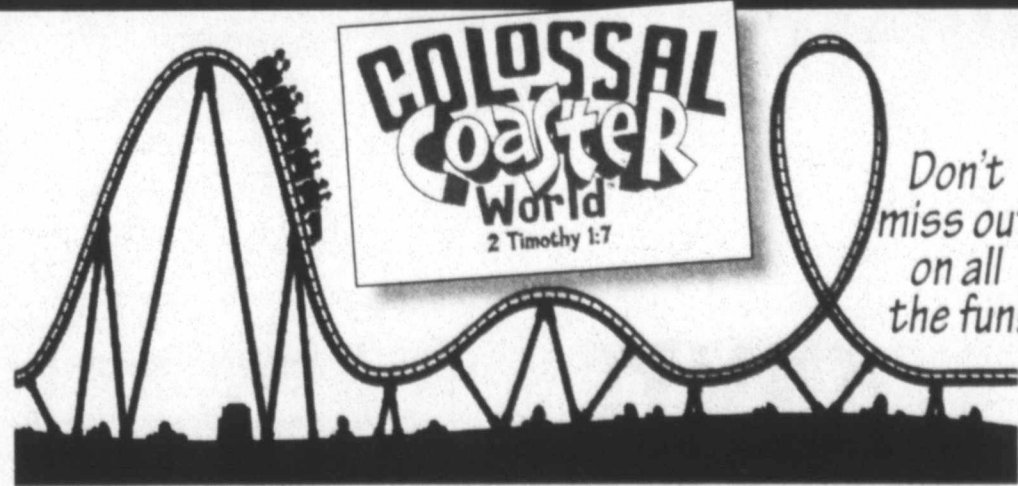

'44 Commencement exercises for Tahoka class tonight
 48 Seniors will get diplomas, three in armed forces

Commencement exercises will be held in the Tahoka High School auditorium tonight, beginning at 8:30 o'clock, and diplomas will be awarded to 48 graduates, 23 boys and 25 girls.

Among the group will be three youths who are in the armed forces of the United States. Kenneth Carter, now in the Navy, and Maurice Smith, now in the Army, were each members of the Seniors class this year until called into service by the Selective Service board at the end of the first semester this year. Both were granted furloughs to come home for the graduating exercises.

One young man, Doyle Manor, lacked just a few weeks of graduating with the class of 1934. He has received much educational training since he has been in the Army, far more than enough to entitle him a diploma along with the members of the 1944 Senior class. He is in the Army air Corps.

Euella Dollins won the honor of delivering the valedictory address, and Clara Faye Nordyke will be Salutatorian.

The commencement address will be delivered by Dr. Doyle D. Jackson of the Texas Technological College, and Truett Smith, president of the school board, will present the diplomas, Principal Leo Jackson certifying the list of graduates.

A trio composed of Patricia Hill, Dorothy Lee Carmack, and Mary Beth Fenton, members of the class, will sing "Come Where the Blue Bells Ring." Mrs. Marcus Edwards will be the piano accompanist.

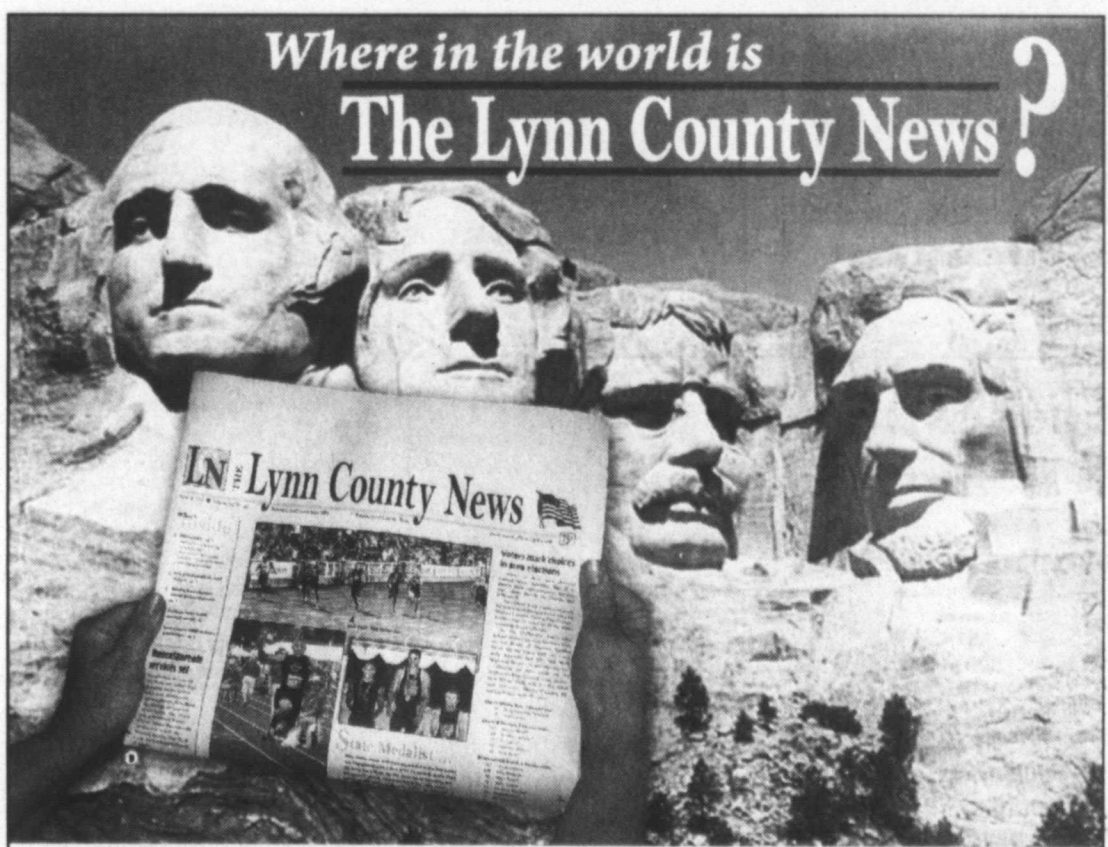
