# Charges filed in crash causing serious injury to young boy

Two more traffic accidents on roads in Lynn County were reported this week, and details were released on a June 28 smashup, which led to charges against a Tahoka man after a 10-year-old boy lost a leg in the collision.

DPS Trooper Wanda Raney, who investigated all three of the accidents, gave this account of what occurred 10 miles north of Tahoka where a family from Colorado had parked on the shoulder of the highway to change drivers shortly after midnight Thursday, June 27:

Two adults and three minors were in a 2002 Chevrolet Tahoe driven by Juan Cruz Guzman, 34, with a 38-year-old woman, two 16-year-olds and the 10-year-old boy as passengers. The child was getting back into the Tahoe and his left leg was still outside the rear door when the door was struck by a 2003 Chevrolet van coming off the highway onto the shoulder. The child's leg was virtually severed by the impact

ally severed by the impact.

The boy was airlifted to University Medical Center in Lubbock, where he remained this week. The only other injury treated was for Guzman, who was taken by EMS ambulance to Lynn County Hospital, where he was treated for a broken

rib, and released.

The driver of the Chevrolet van, identified as Carl Sammy Williams, 47, of Tahoka, was arrested and charged with intoxicated assault with a vehicle involving serious bodily injury, and also charged with felony failure to stop and render aid. Trooper Raney indicated the case would be referred to the next session of a 106th District grand jury.

On U.S. 84 Saturday about a mile west of Southland, a 2010 Dodge pickup, driven by Octavio Rescon-Espinoza, 38, of Lubbock, pulling a horse trailer, lost its transmission, which fell out and caught fire, causing damage to a passing vehicle. That car, a 2006 Dodge Stratus, was driven by Chase Greathouse-Graves, 20, of Post. There were no injuries.

Around 10 p.m. Monday a tanker truck overturned on County Rd. 22 about two miles east of FM 1054. The 2012 Mack truck with a load of oilfield production fluid was driven by Frank Cavazos, 26, of Brownfield, when it slid off the road and rolled over. Aerocare ambulance took Cavazos to Lubbock UMC, where he was treated and released.

# 100th Oleta Smith, oldest living person born in O'Donnell, to celebrate birthday July 13th

leta (Moore) Smith, who was honored at O'Donnell's Centennial Celebration in September 2010 as the oldest living person born in O'Donnell, will have another important milestone to observe this Saturday, July 13. She will celebrate her 100th birthday, marking a century of life, with most of it lived right here in Lynn County.

She is a true Lynn County pioneer, whose family helped settle this land. Her grandparents, the H.E. (Ed) Baldridge family, came up the Caprock from the direction of Gail on Jan. 6, 1901. Their wagons, with household and personal belongings, were pulled by horses and they had a few cows and poultry in the mix that made the move to the area that would soon be named O'Donnell. Other settlers quickly fol-

lowed their lead.

In the spring of 1909, young Ben Moore got a job working for Ed Baldridge as a cowboy. This job placed him at O'Donnell for the arrival of the first train on July 10, 1910 and he asked the Baldridge's daughter, Addie, to be his date for the day of picnicking. He was a photographer and carried his camera to the event, and is credited with taking the first picture of the first

train to reach O'Donnell. He and Addie fell in love, and married on April 2, 1911 at the Baldridge home northeast of the . new town of O'Donnell. The first child born to the couple was Oleta.

"My father was farming this place three miles due east of O'Donnell when their first child, Oleta, was born on July 13, 1913," reported Oleta in an account in the O'Donnell 100year history book. "The same faithful Dr. Thompson got to their home to greet the newborn who had already arrived, assisted by neighbor women, Mrs. Marion Ballew, Mrs. Nick Schooler, an Mrs. A.R. Kimble.

The first child that Dr. A.W. Thompson delivered after he arrived in O'Donnell was on July 4, 1911, a baby boy named Warren born to Haffard and Dovie Smith - who was destined to become the husband of Oleta Moore.

Warren Smith and Oleta Moore were married on Dec. 22, 1940. Their wedding was the first formal wedding held in O'Donnell at the First Methodist Church. Warren was a farmer and gin operator. Oleta taught school over a period of 43 years. Her first school at Fairview in Dawson County ran for seven months, with a salary of \$80 per month. Warren served three years in the army during World War II in the European Theatre of operations. Eight months of this time he was a prisoner of war in a camp in northern Germany. After his release from the POW camp and discharge from the Army, he returned home and the couple had two sons, Denzal and David. Warren died in 2000.

David married Esther Quintana. He died in 2008. Denzal lives in Lubbock and Cape Cod,

# Sautéed Mushrooms in Wine Sauce

2 pints sliced fresh Mushrooms 1/2 stick Butter 1/2 cup Worcester Squce

1/2 sweet yellow medium Onion 2 cups Red Wine 2 tablespoons Cornstarch

Chop onion into small pieces and place in skillet with butter. Heat over medium heat until onions are translucent. Add mushrooms, Worcester and one cup of Red Wine to the skillet and cover, stir occasionally until mushrooms are cooked through. #### Commissioners begin budget talks

Lynn County Commissioners met Monday morning at the Lynn County Courthouse to consider county business and to begin budget work sessions to prepare for setting the new budget for the upcoming financial year. Commissioners Keith Wied, Mike Braddock, Don Blair and Danny Martin were present with County Judge H.G. Franklin presiding.

Budget amendments in two county offices were approved, and monthly bills were approved as presented. One item on the agenda was tabled until a later date regarding bids for repairs at the county show barn.

District Attorney Michael Monk met with the group to discuss his 2013-14 budget, as commissioners began budget considerations. They will be meeting with all county officials in the next several weeks as budget talks continue.

#### AGRICULTURE AND THE ENVIRONMENT

Careful stewardship by farmers has spurred a nearly 50 percent decline in erosion of cropland by wind and water since 1982.

Conservation tillage, a way of farming that reduces erosion (soil loss) on cropland while using less energy, has grown from 17 percent of acreage in 1982 to 63 percent today. At the same time, total land used for crops declined by 15 percent (70 million acres).

Farmers have enrolled a total of 31 million acres in the Conservation Reserve Program to protect the environment and provide habitat for wildlife. Since its inception in 1985, the program has helped reduce soil erosion by 622 million tons and restored more than 2 million acres of wetlands.

## State Champion!

### **Grant Garvin wins trapshooter events** to claim three Championship titles

Grant Garvin competed in the Texas Trapshooters Association Championship this past weekend in Amarillo, winning several events and claiming the State Championship in two age groups, as well as Over All Championship for being the top shooter in Zone 2. He shot against not only youth of his own age, but men and women of all ages from Texas, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Missouri, Kansas and Nebraska. He shot in 9 events and shot at over 1000 targets in the five-day event.

Garvin won two Doubles events, one Handicap event leading into the weekend when the Texas State Championship events started. On Saturday, he shot in a 200 singles championship at 16 yards. He shot 189 targets in a 30 mile wind to claim the State Championship in Sub-Junior (his age group) and C Class Division (all ages). He won the Sub Junior and Over All Championship for being the top shooter in Zone 2 which is the zone that Lynn County resides. He took the Gold Medal for High Score in the AIM State Championship in the same event for youth shooters.

On Sunday, he shot in Texas Handicap Championship where all shooters shoot from different yardages due to known ability. He was State Runner-Up, losing to the Champion by one target as a Sub-Junior.

"Five different State Champions from the southwestern U.S. participated in his age group and to come out of this tournament as well as he did says a lot about his ability due to the shooters at this State Shoot," said a sponsor.

Grant, 15, is the son of Daniel and Tiffanie Garvin of Tahoka, and attends Tahoka High School. He has shot in seven 4-H and ATA events this spring and summer, competing in not only Trap but Skeet and Five Stand. He has never finished outside of the top five in any event of any tournament he has participated, winning several events along the way.

He was the 4-H High Over All Champion for Senior 1 in District 2 shot in Garza and Gaines County, June 28-29, and expresses his appreciation to Greg Henley and Charles and Vicki Ashbrook with the Lynn County 4H shooting program for their help. Ray Mason, Mark Kirkpatrick and Monk Palmer from the Garza County 4-H were also very instrumental in getting him ready for the State Championship and their hard work is also appreciated.




