Charges filed in crash causing serious injury to young boy

Two more traffic accidents on roads in Lynn County were reported this week, and details were released on a June 28 smashup, which led to charges against a Tahoka man after a 10-year-old boy lost a leg in the collision.

DPS Trooper Wanda Raney, who investigated all three of the accidents, gave this account of what occurred 10 miles north of Tahoka where a family from Colorado had parked on the shoulder of the highway to change drivers shortly after midnight Thursday, June 27:

Two adults and three minors were in a 2002 Chevrolet Tahoe driven by Juan Cruz Guzman, 34, with a 38-year-old woman, two 16-year-olds and the 10-year-old boy as passengers. The child was getting back into the Tahoe and his left leg was still outside the rear door when the door was struck by a 2003 Chevrolet van coming off the highway onto the shoulder. The child's leg was virtually severed by the impact.

The boy was airlifted to University Medical Center in Lubbock, where he remained this week. The only other injury treated was for Guzman, who was taken by EMS ambulance to Lynn County Hospital, where he was treated for a broken

rib, and released.

The driver of the Chevrolet van, identified as Carl Sammy Williams, 47, of Tahoka, was arrested and charged with intoxicated assault with a vehicle involving serious bodily injury, and also charged with felony failure to stop and render aid. Trooper Raney indicated the case would be referred to the next session of a 106th District grand jury.

On U.S. 84 Saturday about a mile west of Southland, a 2010 Dodge pickup, driven by Octavio Rescon-Espinoza, 38, of Lubbock, pulling a horse trailer, lost its transmission, which fell out and caught fire, causing damage to a passing vehicle. That car, a 2006 Dodge Stratus, was driven by Chase Greathouse-Graves, 20, of Post. There were no injuries.

Around 10 p.m. Monday a tanker truck overturned on County Rd. 22 about two miles east of FM 1054. The 2012 Mack truck with a load of oilfield production fluid was driven by Frank Cavazos, 26, of Brownfield, when it slid off the road and rolled over. Aerocare ambulance took Cavazos to Lubbock UMC, where he was treated and released.

The trend of summertime family violence incidents in Tahoka con-

100th Celebrating a Century!

Oleta Smith, oldest living person born in O'Donnell, to celebrate birthday July 13th

Oleta (Moore) Smith, who was honored at O'Donnell's Centennial Celebration in September 2010 as the oldest living person born in O'Donnell, will have another important milestone to observe this Saturday, July 13. She will celebrate her 100th birthday, marking a century of life, with most of it lived right here in Lynn County.

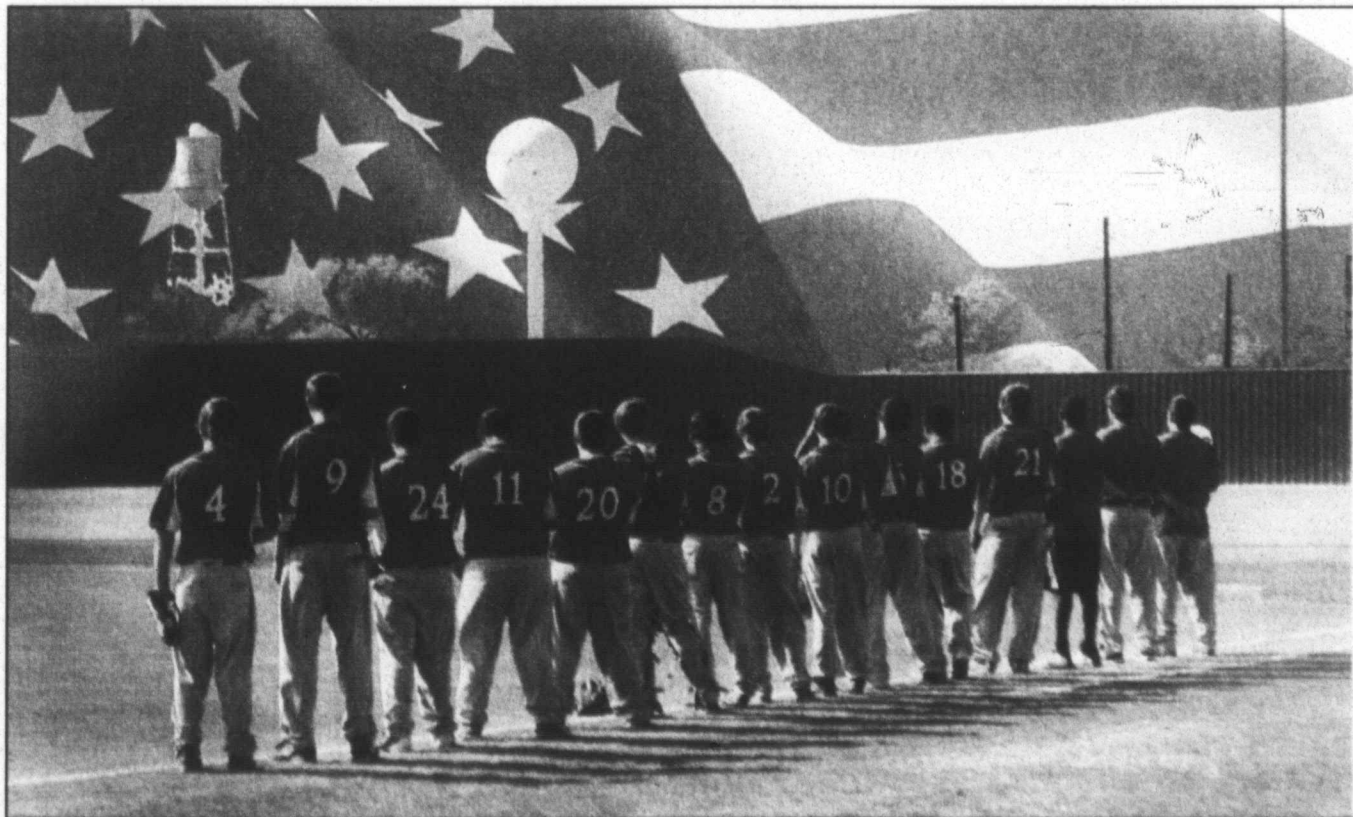
She is a true Lynn County pioneer, whose family helped settle this land. Her grandparents, the H.E. (Ed) Baldrige family, came up the Caprock from the direction of Gail on Jan. 6, 1901. Their wagons, with household and personal belongings, were pulled by horses and they had a few cows and poultry in the mix that made the move to the area that would soon be named O'Donnell. Other settlers quickly followed their lead.

In the spring of 1909, young Ben Moore got a job working for Ed Baldrige as a cowboy. This job placed him at O'Donnell for the arrival of the first train on July 10, 1910 and he asked the Baldrige's daughter, Addie, to be his date for the day of picnicking. He was a photographer and carried his camera to the event, and is credited with taking the first picture of the first

train to reach O'Donnell. He and Addie fell in love, and married on April 2, 1911 at the Baldrige home northeast of the new town of O'Donnell. The first child born to the couple was Oleta.

"My father was farming this place three miles due east of O'Donnell when their first child, Oleta, was born on July 13, 1913," reported Oleta in an account in the O'Donnell 100-year history book. "The same faithful Dr. Thompson got to their home to greet the newborn who had already arrived, assisted by neighbor women, Mrs. Marion Ballew, Mrs. Nick Schooler, an Mrs. A.R. Kimble."

The first child that Dr. A.W. Thompson delivered after he arrived in O'Donnell was on July 4, 1911, a baby boy named Warren born to Haffard and Dovie Smith - who was destined to become the husband of Oleta Moore.

Warren Smith and Oleta Moore were married on Dec. 22, 1940. Their wedding was the first formal wedding held in O'Donnell at the First Methodist Church. Warren was a farmer and gin operator. Oleta taught school over a period of 43 years. Her first school at Fairview in Dawson County ran for seven months, with a salary of \$80 per month. Warren served three years in the army during World War II in the European Theatre of operations. Eight months of this time he was a prisoner of war in a camp in northern Germany. After his release from the POW camp and discharge from the Army, he returned home and the couple had two sons, Denzal and David. Warren died in 2000.

David married Esther Quintana. He died in 2008. Denzal lives in Lubbock and Cape Cod, MA.

Oleta is the longest serving member, in total years, of O'Donnell Methodist Church, joining the church in 1921. She graduated from OHS in 1931 as

Valedictorian of her class, and enrolled in Texas Tech, where she worked for her room and board in Tech's first girls' dormitory. Her degree in Home Economics was earned with honors in the Class of 1938. After graduating, she taught at Muleshoe two years, and then began her long teaching career at O'Donnell in 1940.

She served the local school system and the State of Texas Home Economics program with distinction, having served on statewide boards and committees in education. She was a state president and also served on the national board of directors for the home economics education programs. She also served her church in the local, district and conference levels, having served two different times as the Northwest Texas Conference's United Methodist Women Vice President.

"During her teaching career, my mother also was a volleyball coach and taught choir, in addition to her home economics classes," said her son, Denzal. "She was very dedicated to her work and her students, and took the O'Donnell choir to Radio City Music Hall to perform on several occasions, as well as one trip to Washington to perform," he recalled.

"She started the Young Homemakers group in O'Donnell, which eventually became a state and national organization," he added. "She was a fabulous cook and a beautiful seamstress, making many of her clothes."

He says that his mother has loved shoes and hats all of her life, and in fact had several hats made for her by a designer in New York. She also had a fondness for beautiful shoes, and for many years donned 4-inch heels for her work and civic events.

"She had beautiful dresses and gorgeous hats, and she only

wore 4-inch heels," said Denzal. "She wore 4-inch heels until she was 86 years old. She fell down her porch steps onto a concrete sidewalk - only breaking her glasses, if you can believe it - and so she then made a concession to wearing only 3-inch heels," he added with a laugh.

She lived for many years in O'Donnell, and moved to Lynnwood Independent and Assisted Living Center in Tahoka in 2003, where she has resided for the past ten years. Her friends and family will help her celebrate her 100th birthday in ceremonies this weekend.

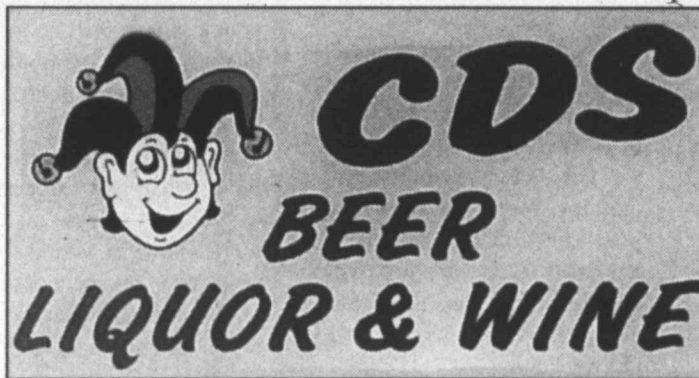

Sautéed Mushrooms in Wine Sauce

- 2 pints sliced fresh Mushrooms
- 1/2 stick Butter
- 1/2 cup Worcesters Sauce
- 1/2 sweet yellow medium Onion
- 2 cups Red Wine
- 2 tablespoons Cornstarch

Chop onion into small pieces and place in skillet with butter. Heat over medium heat until onions are translucent. Add mushrooms, Worcester and one cup of Red Wine to the skillet and cover. Stir occasionally until mushrooms are cooked through. While mushrooms and onion are cooking, dissolve cornstarch in the remaining wine using a whisk to stir into wine. Make sure cornstarch is completely dissolved or it will leave lumps in the sauce. When mushrooms are done, add cornstarch mixture and stir until mixed completely. Turn heat to simmer and cover. If mixture is too thick, you can add additional wine or water to thin to your liking. This is great with steak or chicken, and is best served hot off the stove. Enjoy!

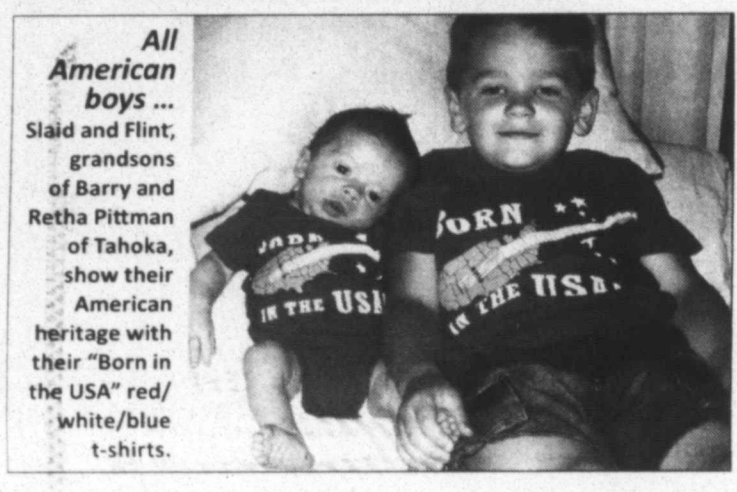

Texas sales tax holiday will be Aug. 9 to 11

Texas Comptroller Susan Combs reminds shoppers they can save money on certain items priced under \$100 during the state's annual sales tax holiday. This year, the sales tax holiday is scheduled for Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 9-11.

The law exempts most clothing, footwear, school supplies and backpacks priced under \$100 from sales tax, which could save shoppers about \$8 on every \$100 they spend during the weekend.

"Texas families can take advantage of the sales tax holiday when doing their back-to-school shopping," Combs said. "The tax holiday applies to a variety of items ranging from pens to jeans to help shoppers around Texas save some of their hard earned money."

Lists of apparel and school supplies that may be purchased tax free can be found on the Comptroller's website at www.TexasTaxHoliday.org. This year, shoppers will save an estimated \$74.1 million in state and local sales taxes during the Sales Tax Holiday.

The dates for the tax holiday weekend are established by the Legislature in the state tax code. The sales tax holiday has been an annual event since 1999.

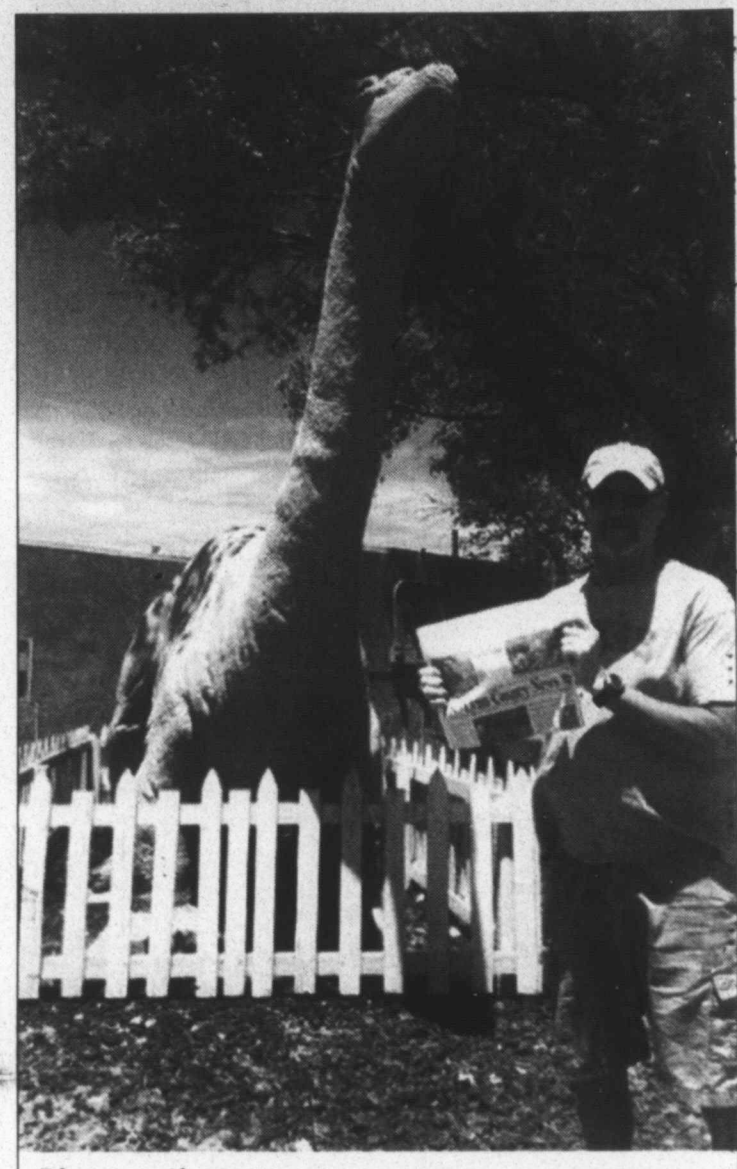

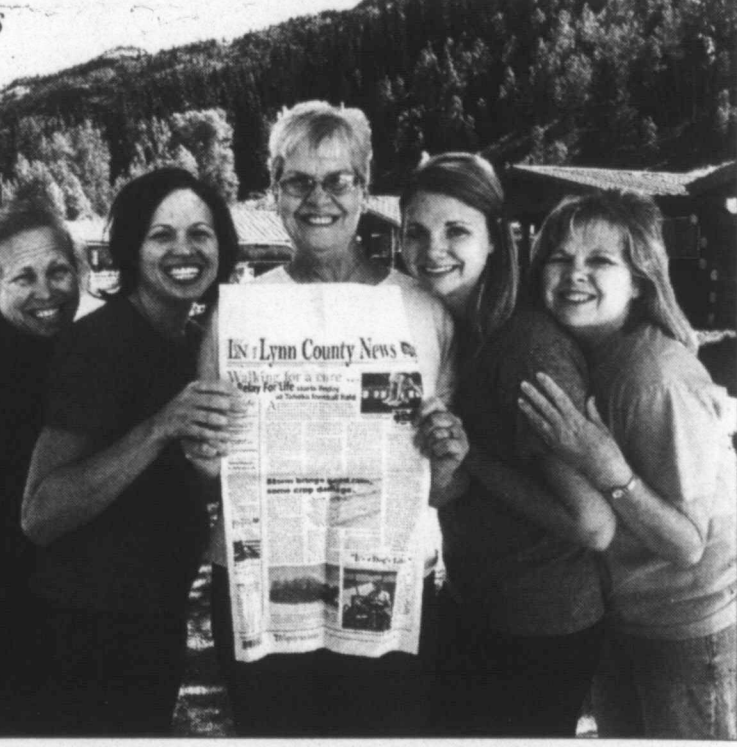
