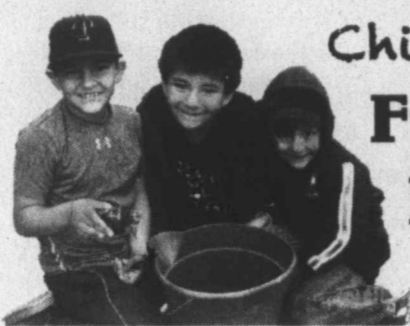

## Children: Start your turtles! Fun, food, prizes offered at Harvest Festival Saturday

Tahoka Homecoming events to precede on Friday

Lots of activities will be offered at the 38th annual Lynn County Harvest Festival to be held at the courthouse square in Tahoka this Saturday, Oct. 5, following the Oct. 4 Tahoka Homecoming festivities. The festival features live entertainment, an art/photo show, an outdoor movie, food booths, games, and cash prizes from audience participation. Admission to the festival is free. Bring lawn chairs for seating on the courthouse lawn.

The Harvest Festival Princess and Queen will be crowned during the afternoon, and an outside movie night on the square will be offered at dark to conclude the day's activities.

Handicap parking for the Harvest Festival will be designated on the south side of the courthouse, to allow closer access to the event for drivers with handicap parking stickers.

The fun starts at 10 a.m. with turtle races for the children (kids must bring their own turtles, decorated, for the races). Like last year, the turtle races will be held in the street on the east side of the courthouse, instead of the north side.

Food and game booths also open at 10 a.m. Entries in the art/photo show will be displayed in a booth at the festival, with awards to be presented at 3 p.m. on stage at the festival. People may vote on their favorite art/photo entries at a table set up near the display.

Something new at the festival this year will be the ShutterShack photo booth, sponsored by the Harvest Festival Committee. For \$5 a session, one or more people may have four photos printed, and for extra fun there will be a video screen on the outside of the photo booth that shows outsiders what is going on inside the booth. It's photo fun for all ages, and will available in a booth on the

north side of the courthouse.

Throughout the day, trivia questions will be asked from the stage, with the audience winning cash prizes for correct answers throughout the day. In addition, "Minute to Win It" type contests will be offered on stage for prize money. Area merchants are generous at Harvest Festival, donating the cash for the prize giveaways. Cadillac Jack's band will perform throughout the day as well.

The Princess contest starts at 1:30 p.m. on stage, with 23 young ladies from Tahoka and O'Donnell vying for the title of Princess. There are nine Harvest Festival Queen scholarship candidates, from Tahoka, New Home and O'Donnell high schools, with that contest starting at 3 p.m. See a list of all candidates on page 3.

The City/County Library will have their annual Silent Auction fundraiser, with bids closing at 3:30 p.m. The popular booth features a variety of items on which to bid, with all proceeds benefitting the local library.

This year's Harvest Festival raffle ticket offers four chances to win on the ticket that is being sold by Harvest Festival Queen and Princess candidates. The grand prize is a \$1,000 prepaid Visa card, and other prizes on the ticket include a \$250 prepaid Visa card, \$100 food voucher at Thriftway Grocery in Tahoka, and \$100 gasoline from Witt Butane in Tahoka. The four drawings for the prizes on this ticket will be held during the afternoon of the festival, most likely between 4:30 and 5 p.m. and all winners will be announced from the stage, as well as printed in *The News*.

Also new to the festival this year will be a live auction at 4 p.m. for the Lynn County Heritage Quilt, sponsored by the Lynn County Pioneers Senior Citizens Center. The quilt features names of area

citizens, and a reserve bid of \$1,000 has already been received by the center, so bidding will start at that point. Proceeds from the auction benefit the Senior Citizens Center.

The Harvest Festival Movie on the Square will begin at dark, around 8 p.m. Bring quilts or lawn chairs for seating on the courthouse lawn. The movie will be shown on the wall of Tejada's Café, facing the courthouse, and admission is free. THS Student Council will sell popcorn and soft drinks.

This year the movie night is going retro, showing a 1993 family film, a much-loved American sports comedy coming-of-age film that tells the story of a group of young baseball players during the summer of 1962. In a small American town, Scotty is the new boy in the neighborhood, seeking desperately to fit

in, so he joins the local sandlot baseball team that practices every day. The story revolves around the boys on the team, and a dog so large and savage that it has become a neighborhood legend, known as the "Beast". One day the boys' last ball lands in the backyard of the Beast. Attempts to recover the ball lead to a series of events, with the boys learning the real story behind the Beast's owner.

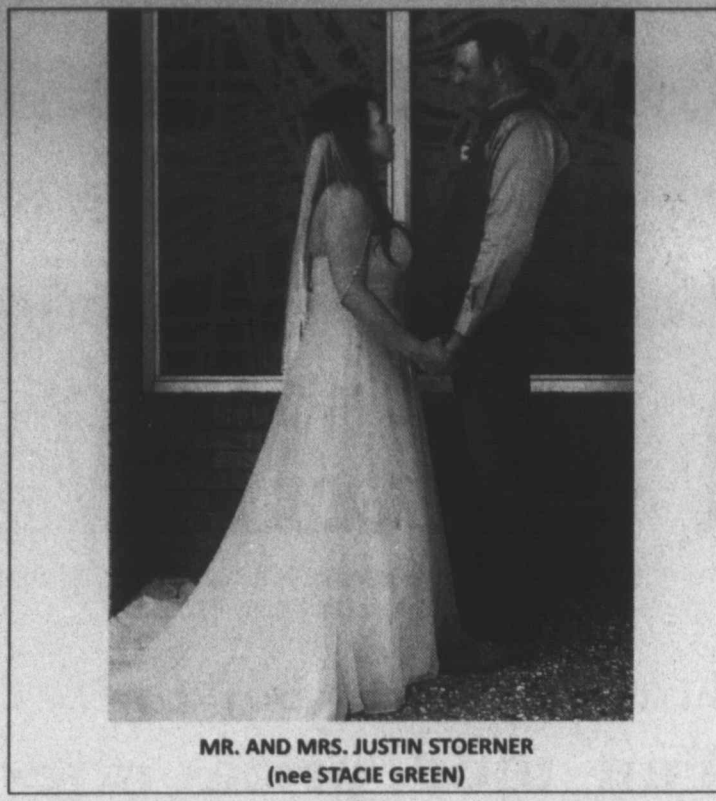
Douglas Ray Taylor

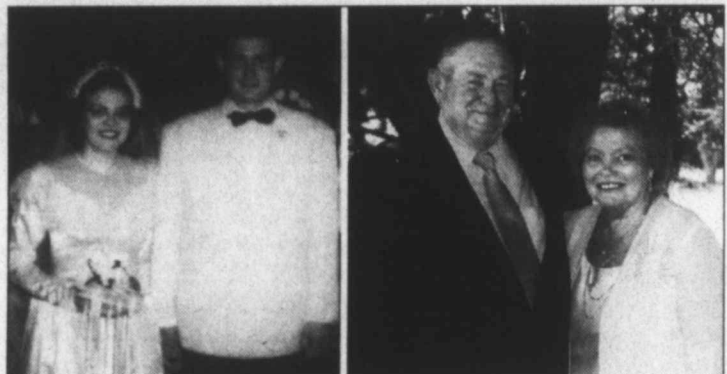
The groom is the son of Martin and Robin Stoerner of Lockney.

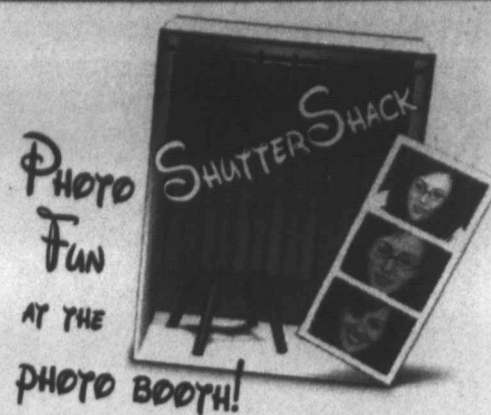

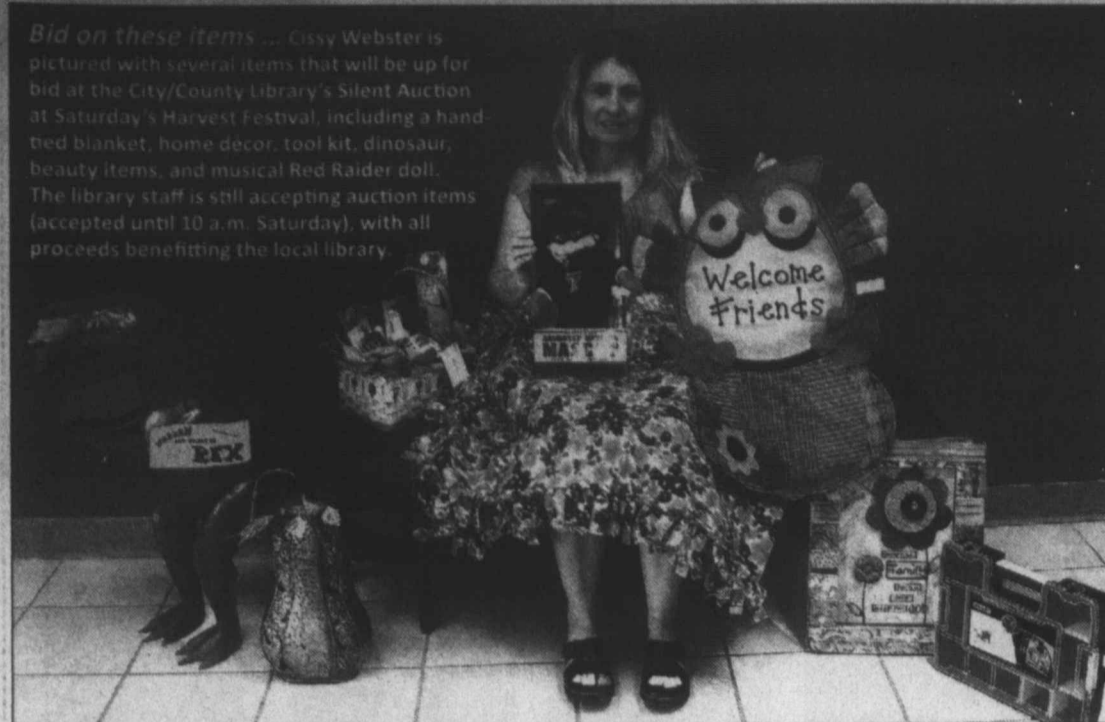

### Tahoka VFD to serve burger meal Friday night at school cafeteria

Tahoka Volunteer Fire Dept. members will grill hamburgers and serve them with their famous firemen's 'taters and onions' prior to the Tahoka Homecoming football game on Oct. 4, as a fundraiser to raise money for a new pumper truck. The firemen will serve the meal from 5:30-7:30 p.m. Friday, Oct. 4 in the Tahoka school cafeteria, with everyone welcome to attend. A minimum \$5 donation per plate will be accepted.

for the fire department. Their goal is to raise \$75,000 for a down payment on a new pumper truck to add to the department's fleet, and they already have \$15,000 of that saved from previous donations. "The pumper truck we currently use is a 1991 model, and it still works," said Steve Sanders, Fire Chief. "Currently, our policy is that because we only have one pumper truck, it does not leave the city limits - that way the city is never without a pumper truck if there's a fire. The plan would be to keep the 1991 model in service to use when responding to fires in

the rural portions of the county," he explained. Sanders said that when the Tahoka VFD raises enough funds for the down payment, the new truck would be ordered and the balance would be paid out of the \$3 donations on city water bills, as well as with other donations that may come in. "We really appreciate - and count on - the \$3 donations on city water bills, but we also receive some funds from the county in their annual budget, as well as donations from county residents and landowners in appreciation for our services," added Sanders. He said they have not yet finalized the cost of a specific pumper truck, but are considering the options available and hope to be able to order the new pumper truck by next fall.

## More scam schemes reported in Tahoka

Tahoka Police this week said they had reports of two more scams by phone calls during the last week, with one successfully swindling a business of several hundred dollars. One of the scams was another attempt to extort money from a local Hispanic woman by claiming that a relative needed money, but the woman hung up on the caller. In the other, a business which sells gift cards was bilked in a scheme involving numbers on a card after someone called the store and claimed the store was not collecting the proper amount of sales taxes on card sales.

Police arrested two Tahoka men on outstanding warrants, one last Wednesday and the other on Friday.

Lynn County jail was holding 22 persons early this week, including 7 held for Andrews County. Among those most recently jailed were persons charged with theft of property, order of the court, harassment and judgment on three matters, including no liability insurance and expired drivers license.

Dispatchers at the sheriff's office processed 303 calls in September, including 131 for the county, 82 for City of Tahoka, 20 for O'Donnell, 43 for animal control, 22 ambulance calls and five fire alarms.

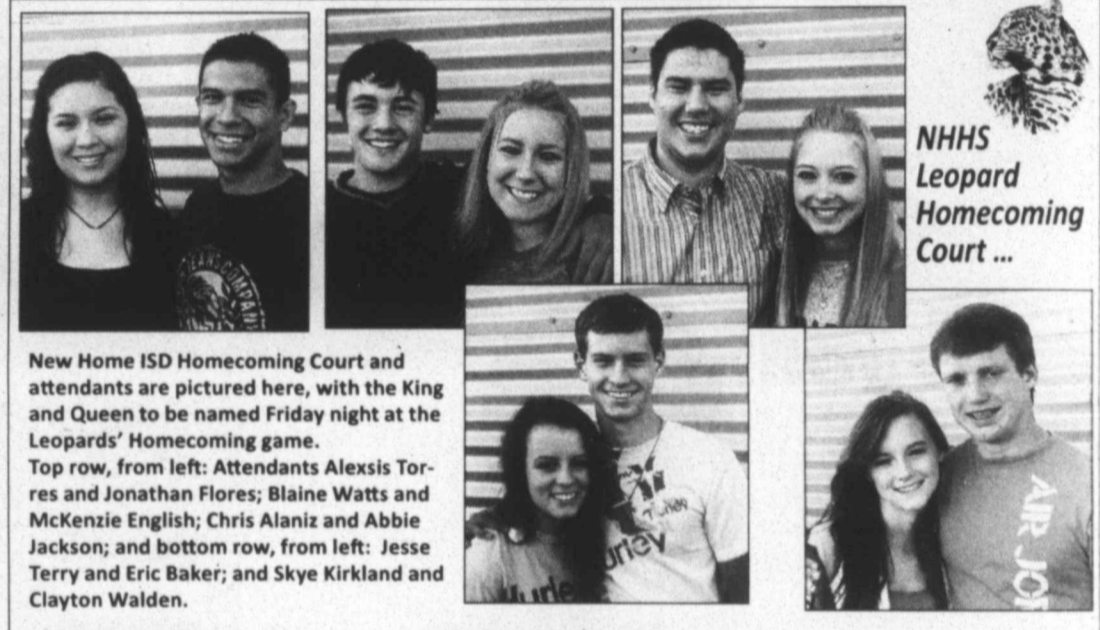

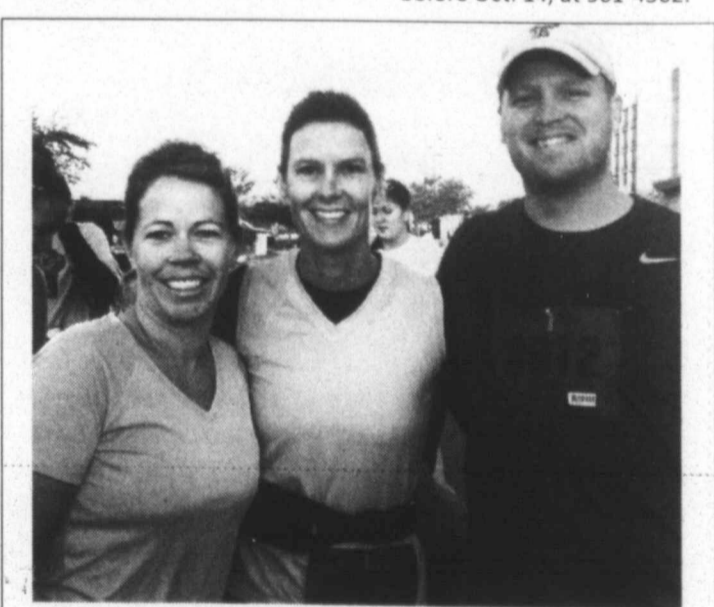

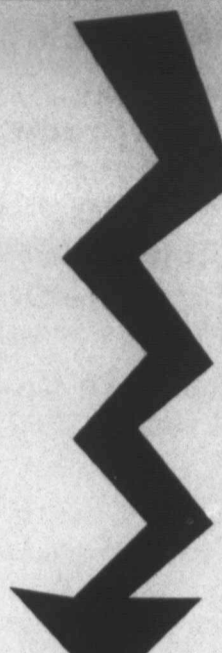
