Early voting starts Monday for elections

Early voting for Nov. 5 elections begins Monday, Oct. 21 and continues for two weeks, ending Nov. 1. Lynn County residents may vote in the Special Election for nine constitutional amendments, and O'Donnell ISD and New Home ISD residents will have special elections as well, including a Tax Ratification Election (TRE) for OISD, and a bond election for \$4.8 million in improvements at NHISD.

Early voting for the constitutional amendment will be held at the Lynn County Clerk's Office on the first floor of the Courthouse, during regular business hours, 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Early voting for New Home ISD's bond election will also be conducted at the County Clerk's office. Early voting for O'Donnell ISD's TRE election will be conducted at the O'Donnell Administration Building

Voters are reminded to bring a photo ID as well as their voter registration card to vote.

Nine constitutional amendments will be on the general election ballot for voters to consider.

Beginning Monday, the Lynn County Voter Registrar's Office, located in the county annex office at 1521 Ave. J in Tahoka, will offer a new service - an Election Identification Certificate (EIC) photo identification for voting. Lynn County Assessor-Collector Donna Willis, who is also

the Voter Registrar for Lynn County, said this week that her office can now provide the service for free for any registered voter who does not currently have another form of photo ID.

New state laws require all voters to present a photo ID, such as a current driver's license or passport, to vote in any election in Texas. If a voter does not have a valid photo ID, then they may apply for the EIC photo identification at the local office.


The upcoming Nov. 5 elections, including the General Election for Constitutional Amendments, the O'Donnell ISD Tax Ratification Election, and the New Home ISD Bond Election, will all require voters to present valid photo IDs to election officials before they may receive a ballot - even if the official has known the voter for many years.

"All election officials are now required by state law to ask voters to provide a Voter Registration Card and a valid photo ID," explained County Clerk Susan

Tipton, who is also the election administrator for Lynn County. "In small communities like ours in Lynn County, the requirement may seem extreme to those voters who may have known the election officials for many years, but regardless, all election officials must see each voter's

Those who have a current, valid Texas Driver's License or U.S. passport, or some other valid photo ID, won't need the Election Identification Certificate (EIC)

photo ID - it's the law," she said.

"In fact," says Willis, "you won't be allowed to apply for an EIC if you already have a valid photo ID. The EIC is only for those who do not have some other form of photo identification, and the EIC is only good for voting - it cannot be used anywhere else as a valid photo ID," she

identification at the polling location before the voter will be permitted to cast a vote:

. Texas Driver license issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety · Texas Election Identification Cer-

tificate (EIC) • Texas personal identification card

issued by DPS · Texas concealed handgun license

issued by DPS · United States military identification card containing the person's photo-

• United States citizenship certificate containing the person's photograph United States passport

"An applicant for an EIC must present certain documentation proving they are a U.S. citizen, such as a birth certificate or naturalization papers, or other documents (call for more information)," explained Willis. "There is a one-page application form that must be completed as well, and then we can take a photo here at our office and print out a page that will be a valid photo ID that they can take to the polls to vote. Within a few days, the applicant will receive an EIC card in the mail that will replace the printed paper they received at our office, and that EIC card may be used as a valid photo ID for voting only - it's not good for anything other than voting," she stressed.

New Deal zaps Bulldogs, 49-16

The unbeaten New Deal Lions were too strong for Tahoka last Friday, and the Lions beat the visiting Bulldogs 49-16 in the district 2-A (Division I) opener.

It was the second game in a row for the Bulldogs to face unbeaten, state-ranked teams, losing to No. 7 Anson and then to No. 12 New Deal. This week, Coach John Cornelius and the Bulldogs will be at home against Sundown, which was open last week and is 3-3 for the year. It will be the first district game for Sundown.

Tahoka, now 3-4 overall and 0-1 in district, has had success against Sundown in the past, even when the Roughnecks were strong favorites.

The Lions scored 21 points in the first quarter, and were 14-0 ahead before Tahoka running back Xavier Pinkard ran 2 yards for a touchdown and QB Trystan Hilger ran for 2 points to cut the lead to 14-8.

That was as close as the Bulldogs got, as LaDareon Hunter led New Deal's ground attack with four touchdowns and 114 yards.

Bulldog running back Ke' Shawn Hood gained 105 yards on 16 carries, and scored on a 3-yard run in the third quarter. Hilger added 40 on 13 carries and twice ran for extra points.

Linebacker Ray Parmer led the defense and was counted in on 16 tackles. Also doing well on defense were Santiago Martinez, Dillon Trevino, Dom Herrera and Isiah Vega.

HEN I FIRST heard (on the Today Show last week) about a Brooklyn restaurant that has banned conversation during meals, my first thought was that this will never work, because nearly everyone likes to talk while eating out. But after I later checked for details, I decided it might be a popular policy after all.

For one thing, the restaurant only schedules the silent meals once every few weeks, so it might be a welcome concept. According to one report, restaurant noise is the second most common complaint of diners—next to poor service—with 19 percent citing loud noise as the biggest irritant.

The name of the restaurant in Brooklyn, which is trying the silent meals, is Eat. The owner probably has a dog named Dog and a cat named Cat.

Anyway, the restaurant that serves local, organic foods hosted its first silent meal, serving a \$40, four-course dinner to 17 patrons. The only rule was no talking.

The owner told the patrons they must not talk for 90 minutes during meals, so the patrons can focus more on the taste, texture and nutritional value of the food. The patrons were warned that rule-breakers would have to finish their meals on a bench outside, and reportedly most people followed the rules.

The meal featured chili basil summer squash soup, something called arugula salad with a curry vinaigrette and Rupert cheese, plus whole-wheat pasta with eggplant puree or scallops and

It's a good thing I wasn't there. I would have stood up and loudly demanded my \$40 back (and wound up outside on the bench). I'm

not sure any of that stuff is edible. A few restaurants have banned cell phones, which is a good idea. It's rude to use a cell phone in a public place, unless it's an

Many restaurants are too noisy, especially for us older people. I know one place in Slaton that has the best food and the worst music in North America. Noise is not a problem with any of Lynn County's great eating places, though. Don't look for any of the local restaurants to set any rules about being quiet for 90 minutes. I know some people who just can't go that long anywhere without




Hazard mitigation planning meeting slated Oct. 23rd

Martha Pearl Cooley Miller

Martha Pearl Cooley Miller, 76, passed away on Friday, October 11, 2013 after a long illness. Pearl was born in Anson, Jones County, Texas, on February 22, 1936, to Earl Leo and Izora Mae (Moore) Cooley. She was the only girl of four children, with two older brothers: Charles Stanford and Joe Earl, and one younger, Burl Leo, all of whom survive

When she was a little girl, the family relocated from Anson to Dawson County, where her father raised dry-land cotton. There she attended school in O'Donnell, where she graduated High School in 1954. That was the year that she made the acquaintance of her future husband, Edward Eugene Miller, of Tahoka. In September, with their two best friends, they drove across the state line to Oklahoma, and were married in Hollis, Harmon County.

Their first child, Gary Edward, was born a year later, followed in 1959 by Jeana Ruth and in 1967 by Gregory Lee. Pearl and Ed raised Gary and Jeana in Tahoka until the early 1960s, when they relocated to Big Spring, where Greg was born. There they were owners of an oilfield electric service company, and in the mid-1970s, they started an agricultural transport company. Pearl helped manage the business and did the book-keeping for both companies and the ranch until this year, when her illness

made it impossible to do so. Pearl is preceded in death by her parents. She is survived by her husband Ed, her children Gary and his wife Paula of Midland; Jeana Newman of Chapel Hill; and Greg and his wife Tanya, also of Midland. She is also survived by six grandchildren and four great grandchildren.





In other business, commissioners approved a resolution authorizing application through SPAG for a grant to be administered by Lynn County Pioneers Senior Citizens Center for providing home-delivered meals to homebound or elderly persons. The grant is sought annually to fund the program.

Commissioners also approved a new county application permit to cross county roads, which would be applicable for those companies that seek permission to cross a county road to construct pipelines or utilities.

End-of-fiscal-year amendments were approved in several departments, and monthly bills were approved. County Judge H.G. Franklin led the session, with all four commissioners

West Texas couple to attend 68th straight **Baylor Homecoming this weekend**

You might say that Harold (BA '49, JD '51) and Bettye (BA '46) Green are the Baylor Homecoming king and queen.

They won't be crowned this

weekend. The Homecoming court will, in fact, be several decades younger than Harold and Bettye. But you'd be hard-pressed to deny them the title when you learn that they've been as

constant a presence as football and parades; this weekend will mark the 68th consecutive Baylor Homecoming they've attended.

"We came to our first one after we were married on March 22, 1946," Bettye says. "It's just a habit. There's nowhere else we'd want to go."

The Greens make the 345mile trek from their home in Tahoka, Texas (30 miles south of Lubbock) for nearly every home Baylor football game, with Homecoming weekend serving as the highlight of every autumn. Of course, you don't attend an event for nearly 70 years without a close call here and there. Harold and Bettye remember twice thinking they might not make it.

"Many years ago, I was working on a trial," remembers Harold, an attorney. "The judge knew

I loved Baylor and wanted to go to Homecoming. He told me, 'I'll tell you on Friday if I think you'l be able to make it. But tell your wife to pack and be ready just in case.' I didn't think it was going to happen. But late that Friday afternoon, he called me over and said, 'Call your wife. Tell her you all are going to Waco at 5

o'clock.' And we drove there that night and were there for the game the next

came a major injury in 1986 to keep the streak alive. "I broke my hip and was in the hospital three weeks,"

she says. "That was in early October. Thankfully, Homecoming was in late October that year. Just before the weekend, I got out of the hospital, I got a wheelchair, and I told the doctor, 'We're going.' And sure enough, we made it. We sat in the handicapped section and made it just fine.'

For Harold and Bettye, the chance to attend another Homecoming is a connection not only to their past, but to the institution that remains an integral part of their lives.

"I can't explain it," Harold says. "When you're from Baylor, you're from somewhere special. People know us as the Baylor couple. So many of our classmates aren't around anymore. We just enjoy being able to still
