Good news!

City waterline improvement plans in final stage; construction may begin this year

by JUANELL JONES he City of Tahoka received good news last week from the Texas Water Development Board, approving all the preliminary plans for the \$2 million grant project to replace city waterlines within the city limits. The new design will replace the city's antiquated waterline system - some of which is nearly a century old - that requires the entire city water system to be shut off for any major repairs, as the lines all connect.

"Category C - which is all the environmental studies and assessments, water models and preliminary plans has been approved," said Mayor John Baker. "This means we have the okay to proceed to Category D to finalize the project with shovel-ready plans. And actually, we weren't waiting for the approval of Category C before we began making these shovel-ready plans, as we are already currently involved in that process. We anticipate

that we will be putting out for bids for construction sometime this summer, and that actual construction on the new waterlines will begin before the end of the year," he added.

Baker explained that Category C has been the major hurdle in the waterline project, because it included all the environmental studies and assessments which is very time-consuming, as well as the preliminary plans that (See WATERLINES, page 6)

Eight file for area elections

Eight candidates have filed for positions on area ballots during the first week of the filing period, which opened Wednesday, Jan. 29.

In Lynn County, the hospital, four cities and three school districts will have elections on May 10. Candidates may file through Feb. 28 for city and school board elections, and through March 3 for the hospital board election.


There is already a contested race in the City of O'Donnell election, with incumbent Scot Martinez filing for reelection as Mayor and candidate Jesse Perez also filing for the seat. Two of three council members have also filed for re-election, including Raymond Zepeda and Dana Brownlow.

Incumbent Mike Renteria has filed for re-election on the O'Donnell ISD Board of Trustees, for one of two seats on the board.

Two incumbents have filed for two of three city council seats with the City of Tahoka, with Jeff Martin filing for District 4, and Ray Box filing for the At-Large District 5 seat. Incumbent Jimmie Bingham has filed for re-election to the Pct 3 seat on the Tahoka ISD Board of Trustees.

Tahoka ISD Board extends superintendent's contract

Tahoka Independent School District Board of Trustees voted to extend Superintendent Steve Burleson's contract for another year at the same salary, in action at the January board meetings. The first meeting, held Jan. 23 was adjourned early due to the board president being called away from the meeting, and trustees continued the meeting the following Thursday, on

Supt. Burleson noted that the filing period opened Jan. 29 for the school board election, with three trustees having terms expiring in the 2014 elections, including Frank McLelland and Jimmie Bingham (three-year terms) and a one-year unexpired term currently held by Sharla Askew. The filing period continues through Feb. 28.

The Board recognized Kordell Baker, Ray Parmer and AJ Rohlfs for being named to the Texas High School Coaches Association's Academic All-State Football Team for 2013-14. Parmer and Rohlfs were named to the 2nd Team, and Baker was named Honorable Mention.

District principals presented cam-


pus reports and then presented each school's different forms of recognition honoring the Board of Trustees, since January was "School Board Recognition Month." The theme for the Board's recognition was "Rising to New Heights." There were videos shown to honor the board from the elementary and middle schools, featuring their students performing in each video. Cards and posters were also placed in the boardroom from the campuses, expressing appreciation for the trustees' hard work.

Trustees approved a waiver request to Texas Education Agency for the missed school day when water was shut off at the school in December due to a water line break that could not be repaired in time for school. The superintendent reported enrollment at 602 students through the end of the third week of the second semester, which is seven less students than last year at this



Birthdays of Washington and Lincoln.


Valentine's Day (Feb. 14, tell someone you love them)





UIL changes put county Schools in new districts

The Texas University Interscholastic League (UIL) has announced its bi-annual conference realignments, putting all four county schools in new districts, and moving all schools' designations up a notch.

The UIL is renumbering all its classifications, starting a new Class 6A, and moving all schools up one number. Current six-man schools now become 1A, current 1A schools including Tahoka become 2A, present 2A schools become 3A, and so

The cutoff numbers are as follows (high school enrollment figures):

6A-2100 and above. 5A-1060 to 2099.

4A-465 to 1059 (Division I, 686-1059; Division II, 465-

3A-220 to 464 (Division I, 315-464; Division II, 220-314). 2A-105 to 219 (Division I, 158-219; Division II, 105-157).

1A-104.9 and below (Division I, 55-104.9; Division II, 54 and below).

According to figures listed on a UIL website and recently submitted by schools as of one day in October, Tahoka's enrollment was 187, which would put Tahoka in Class 2A, Division I. O'Donnell with 71 and New Home with 62 would be in Class 1A Division I. Wilson's enrollment was not listed, but the Mustangs will be in Class 1A, Division II.

All Class 1A schools will continue to play six-man foot-







included computer-generated water models, estimated cost projections, and other design

"We are getting closer to the day when I can say we will never have another boil water notice!" said Baker. "This project replaces 85 percent of the current waterline system - and that is because the other 15% has already been replaced in several phases over the past few years due to necessity - and when it is finished all of the waterlines will be new or nearly new, And, the construction should be 100% funded through the **Economically Distressed Areas** Program (EDAP) grant through the Texas Water Development Board, as was the engineering and design phase. No bonds, no matching funds, no cost to our citizens is what our goal is for this project," he added.

"We are very pleased to get official approval of Category C on this project, and anticipate construction will be underway before the end of this year," said the mayor.


