

MONG the things I used to have when I was a lot younger that I wish I still had are abundant energy and a small waistline, which sort of go together, but now are just fond memories.

I could eat all the ice cream and chocolate pie my mother (or anyone else) would let me have, and be ready for more of the same an hour later. Now, my doctor warns me I should not even look at pictures of things like that, or my body will swell up and maybe explode, making. a really disgusting mess, especially if I happen to be at church or some other public gathering when it occurs.

When I was a kid, diabetes, cholesterol and hietal hernias (hyena's hernia?) had not yet been invented by doctors and pill pushers, so people could eat anything they liked and it wouldn't hurt them. (I couldn't find "hietal" in the dictionary, so that must be wrong—perhaps I should just say "heartburn").

Anyway, I miss the ability to eat good stuff and stay slim. But there are some other things that I had as a youngster that I sure am glad I no longer have to struggle with, and these include earaches, toothaches and hiccups.

I used to have earaches and hiccups a lot, and it about drove me bananas. An earache is really miserable. I remember my mother heating water so I could drop a few drops into my ear, and that would give relief from the pain for about 15 seconds, then have to be repeated. This happened too frequently for a few years until it finally stopped: when I was about 12 or so. I put so much water in my ears for a while that I have had water on the brain ever since.

Hiccups, too. I once had hiccups for four days without stopping. According to an article I read last week, there's no known reason for hiccups, it doesn't mean that anyone who hiccups is a drunk, and the many folklore remedies like holding your breath, breathing into a sack or being suddenly frightened really work. Years ago I had hiccups frequently; in later years it has been thankfully rare.

One guy reportedly had hiccups continuously for 60 years before he died. Elvis Presley may have suffered from hiccups ("m-m-m, I'm all

I really haven't had many toothaches, but I remember how aggravating they were. Occasionally I get a toothache from playing my saxophone too long.

Did I just hear someone mutter that my playing saxophone also gave them an earache?





Funding available to spur growth in communities

Ag Secretary Tom Vilsack announced the availability of funding to promote long-term economic growth and community vitality in rural areas. This includes \$30.6 million in zero-interest loans and \$9.2 million in grants to establish revolving loan funds that finance business and economic development activities in rural areas. Applications for these funds will be accepted through the Rural Economic Development Loan and Grant (REDLG) Program. Rural utilities that are eligible for USDA financing under the Rural Electrification Act and have the capacity to serve as intermediary lenders may apply to USDA Rural Development to administer the funds locally for the benefit of specifically identified projects. These intermediaries relend REDLG funds at zero percent expansion, business technical assistance and job training, and community facilities projects that support economic development.

USDA also has the availability of two individual grants from funds appropriated for the Rural Business Enterprise Grant (RBEG) program: a single \$500,000 grant for rural transportation projects and a single \$250,000 grant for Federally Recognized Native American Tribes. Funds may be used to provide technical assistance and training to help rural communities improve passenger transportation services or facilities. Mail applications to Texas State Office, 101 S. OHS's Kaitlin Bell wins two State Track silver medals

O'Donnell High School sophomore Kaitlin Bell has gone to the state level in the girls' 3200 meter race. She was considered one of the favorites in that race. and bettered her time from the regional meet that put her there.

Unfortunately, she was running against the same girl who beat her last year, Garden City senior Kamie Halfmann who posted a time of 11:28.10 to Bell's 11:37.39 recently in Austin.

In fact, six of this year's competitors competed in the same race last year. Bell, a sophomore, only knows that Halfmann will be competing at the collegiate level for Angelo State University.

On the other hand, she owns a silver medal for this year's 3200 meter run, 1600 meter, and last years' as well, plus a 5th place medal for last year's state cross-country event. She ran the 1600m race in 5:23.48 for second place behind Halfmann.

Also competing in the state track meet was Donovan Pesina, placing 5th in the 400m boys event (51.35), and the 4x400 girls relay team who came in 9th.


