Grant funds provide equipment: Lynn County ambulances get new cardiac monitors

Lynn County EMS has long provided essential first aid service to the citizens of Lynn County, with caring and dedicated healthcare personnel working under the auspices of Lynn County Hospital District (LCHD). To provide that care, the EMS ambulances must have the right equipment and tools for the EMTs to use, and this week the EMS Director announced that new cardiac monitors and other equipment has been added to the ambulance fleet. "As you may know, Julia Allen [with LCHD] has worked very hard on securing a grant for new ambulance equipment for Lynn County EMS, and it is my pleasure to announce that we have received a Local Projects Grant in the amount of \$18,975 for the purchase of three new Cardiac Monitors and three ambulance refrigerators. This equipment is now ready for use," said EMS Director John Baker, NRP, Lynn County Hospital District.

This equipment helps LCHD EMS stay on the cutting edge of patient care, and gives paramedics the ability to better assess and monitor their patients in the pre-hospital environment, says Baker. "The See-Thru CPR function is one of the most exciting aspects of the new monitors, as it gives real time feedback to the crew during CPR and measures core elements such as depth, rate, and interruptions which are regarded as the hallmarks of quality CPR. It also allows EMS to see the underlying rhythm without stopping compressions," he explained. Currently, two of three ambulances are mobile ICU certified. Soon, the third truck will meet this requirement, as well. "All of this means better patient care for Lynn County," says the director. "From LCHD EMS, thank you for the opportunity to serve such a great group of people," he added.

Tahoka, O'Donnell Methodist pastors leaving for new posts

The Methodist pastors at Tahoka and O'Donnell/Draw United Methodist Churches have been reappointed to new locations by the Northwest Texas Conference of the United Methodist Church, and will soon be leaving their posts in Lynn County. Gene Hudgins, pastor at Tahoka FUMC, is moving June 25 to Anson to pastor the Methodist church there. His last day to preach in Tahoka will be June 22. Billy Everett, a retired Methodist preacher from Lubbock, will serve the Tahoka Methodist Church beginning June 29.

"I have really enjoyed my time and ministry in Tahoka. There are great God fearing folks in the Methodist church and community that will be dearly missed and I will always remember ministry time here," said Rev. Hudgins. Pastor Weston Pendergrass is leaving the O'Donnell/Draw Methodist churches to go to serve in Haskell, and his last Sunday here will be June 22. Their new pastor, Cam Givan, will begin serving the O'Donnell/Draw churches on June 29.

IF YOU HAVE the beginnings of arthritis in a knee, walking the equivalent of an hour a day may help your arthritis and prevent disability, according to research from a guy in the Boston University department of physical therapy.

"People with or at risk for knee arthritis should be walking around 6,000 steps per day, and the more walking one does the less risk of developing functioning difficulties," said the study's author, Daniel White.

Now they tell me. This is information I could have used about 10 or 15 years ago, when I could have walked the 6,000 steps, which the researcher says would take most people about an hour. I no longer walk further than 6 feet without a cane, and I probably haven't taken 6,000 steps in the last five years.

The woman who also lives in my house, however, walks several miles every day, and is in great condition, so I am sold on the value of walking.

Part of my joint problem is because I suffered an injury as a child that messed up the knee and caused one leg to be a couple of inches shorter than the other. This is unfortunate, because I never was very tall at any age, including maturity, which I hope to reach any year now.

No true Texans are supposed to be short guys, so I've had to live with my size grudgingly for years. I am so short that one leg doesn't even reach the ground, and the other one just barely does.

On occasion, I have told my tall friends, "I used to be six feet tall, but I've been sick." None of them bought that story. ***

The program survives today as the Texas Heritage Trails, an award-winning heritage tourism initiative under the Texas Historical Commission, and it still attracts visitors to communities of every size.

In the Texas Plains Trail Region, our volunteer board relies on annual contributions from our 52 counties, in proportion to population, to support its robust educational mission. Each June we contact county judges to request funding for the coming year's work, supporting projects like our publications, Quannah Parker Trail, and marketing program. Day in and day out, we shine the spotlight on each county's heritage and culture—at minimal cost.

We hope the county judges and organizations of our region will see fit to fund the Texas Plains Trail once again this year. In times of shrinking federal grants and state budgets, this is

the best way to ensure the long-term sustainability of a program that has showcased our communities to eager travelers for nearly half a century.

O'Donnell cotton producer Travis Mires is in NCC Emerging Leaders Program

Travis Mires, an O'Donnell cotton producer, is participating in the first of three training sessions in the National Cotton Council's (NCC) 2014-15 Emerging Leaders Program.

Sponsored by a grant to The Cotton Foundation from Monsanto, the Emerging Leaders Program strives to help participants gain a better understanding of: 1) the NCC's role, including its programs, policy development and implementation process; 2) Cotton Council International's role in developing and maintaining export markets for U.S. cotton, manufactured cotton products and cottonseed products; 3) the broad spectrum of issues that affect U.S. cotton's economic well-being; and 4) the U.S. political process. The program, which provides class members with intensive professional development training, also equips them to increase their involve-

ment in these and other NCC activities.

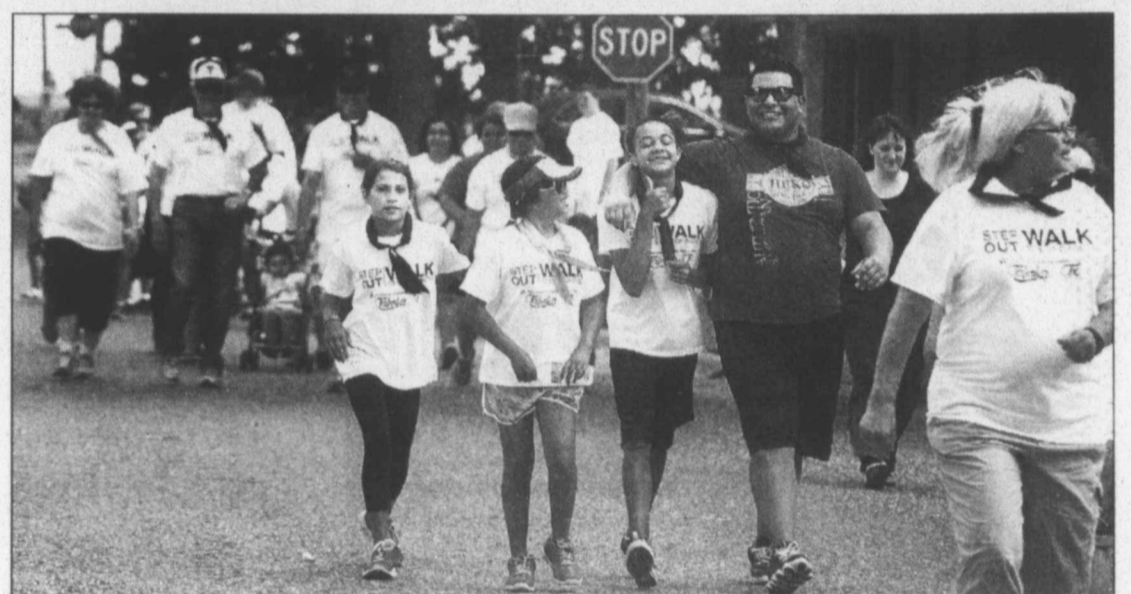
During the week of June 15 in Memphis, Tenn., and St. Louis, MO, Mires and eight other class members will receive communication skills training, an agribusiness briefing and an orientation to the Memphis-based NCC. The class will observe the NCC's policy development process at the NCC's 2015 Annual Meeting in February while the third session in Washington, D.C., will provide them with a focus on policy implementation and international market development.

NCC Chairman Wally Darneille a Texas cooperative marketing executive, said the Emerging Leaders Program, which was initiated with the 2013-14 class, "is designed to encourage and equip industry members so they are better prepared to handle the responsibilities of being a U.S. cotton

industry leader."

Other members of the 2014-15 class are: Chris Alphin, a Windsor, Va., ginner; Jon Koehler Bibb, a Tunica, Miss., producer; Scott Gunn, a Columbus, Ga., textile manufacturer; Brad Harrison, a Yuma, Ariz., producer; Chad Mathis, Jr., an Arlington, Ga., producer; John Romines, a Memphis, Tenn., merchant; and Brett Underwood, warehouseman, and Steven White, cooperative marketer, both from Lubbock.

There is no age limit for Emerging Leader Program candidates whose primary livelihood must be derived from at least one of the seven raw cotton industry segments. Nominations are made by one of the following: a certified interest organization, NCC officer or NCC director. Selections are made by the NCC chairman in consultation with the NCC President's office and NCC Member Services.

Water Saving Tips for households

While the recent rains have helped with the drought, this area is substantially below in rainfall over the last four years. Demand for water is ever increasing across Texas as the population increases. Homeowners must do their part to help conserve water, even during rainy days.

A typical family in Texas uses 60-80 gallons of water per person, per day. The largest water users are the shower, clothes washer and toilets, using about two-thirds of the water used in an average household. Toilets use up to 27%, clothes washer uses up to 20.9%, and showers account for 17.3%. While faucets account for about 15.3%, leaks account for 13.8%, and dishwashers, baths, and other uses account for the rest of household water.

With these household water saving tips, homeowners should be able to save a substantial amount of water in the future.

Leaky Faucets - Leaky faucets can lose as much as 20 gallons of water per day. Leaky pipes and faucets not only waste water, but damage wood and may create stains and rust.

Showers - Older showerheads may use from 2-10 gallons per minute, while newer shower heads use about 2-3 gallons per minute. Switching to a new showerhead will reduce water usage, as will simply taking shorter showers.

Toilets - To reduce the amount of water in the tank, displace some of the water. A plastic bottle filled with water would be one example. Any object placed in the tank should not release or leak materials into the tank. Nev-

er use a bucket in the tank unless it is contained in a plastic bag. The object placed in the tank should not interfere with any of the mechanisms or tank operations. Other devices purchased to go inside the toilet tank such as the toilet dam, early closure flapper or a dual flusher are good methods to use.

Turn off the water - Brushing teeth can take up to 2 gallons of water if water is not shut off. Shaving can take up to 5 gallons if the tap is left running, so turn off the water.
