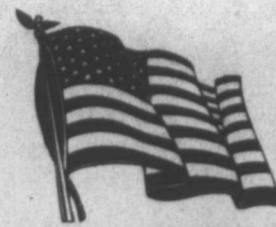

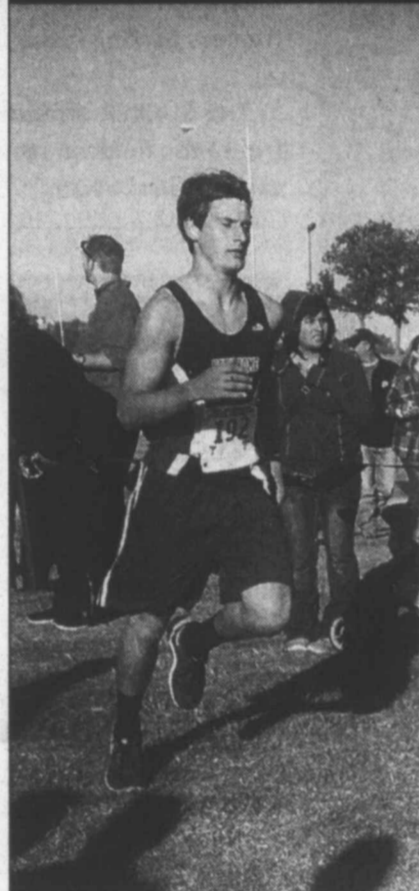

ELECTION RESULTS

Voters choose Rebekah Filley for Lynn County Attorney

In a contested race in which both candidates were write-ins, Lynn County voters chose Rebekah Filley to serve as their Lynn County Attorney for the next two years, to fill the unexpired term until the 2016 election. Filley received 606 votes, and incumbent James Craig received 399 votes in the election.

Filley will soon take over the post of County Attorney from Craig, who was appointed by Lynn County Commissioners in April 2014 to serve as County Attorney following the resignation of Co. Atty. Donnis Scott in the middle of her four-year term. Commissioners must wait eight days to canvass the election for official results, after which Filley will be sworn in to office.

Filley led in early voting in the election as well, with 209 votes to Craig's 141, and she led in 7 of 10 voting boxes in the county.

Several other uncontested county offices were also on the ballot, including County Judge (Mike Braddock), District Clerk (Sandra Laws), County Clerk (Susan Tipton), County Treasurer (Amy Schuknecht), Pct. 2 Commissioner (John Hawthorne), Pct. 4 Commissioner (Larry Durham), and Pct. 1 Justice of Peace (Nancy Guilliams), as well as District Judge Carter T. Schild-

knecht for the 106th Judicial District, which includes Lynn County. All will serve four-year terms.

New Home ISD also held a trustee election on Tuesday, for four seats on the School Board. Elected were Gregg Nieman with 135 votes, Jason Gandy with 131, Andy Maeker with 122, and Travis Smith with 102 votes. Also running was Matthew Barrington, who had 87 votes.

No other election results were available at press time late Tuesday night.

SURVEY SAYS ... City survey targets homes in northern area of Tahoka

City residents who live in homes in the northern areas of Tahoka are being targeted in a city survey that City Administrator Jerry Webster told *The News* is crucial to the city qualifying for a \$275,000 grant to make water and sewer improvements.

City employees will conduct the door-to-door survey, knocking on doors Wednesday night (Nov. 5) to hand residents the survey, and then returning to pick up the surveys on Thursday, Nov. 6, again from 6-8 p.m.

"We are targeting the areas from Ave. H to Country Club Road, and Lockwood to North 8th Streets - basically the north part of town," said Webster. "We already have current data from the south part of town, from a waterline replacement project two years ago, but the data we have for the north has expired, so we have to conduct that survey now. It's basically a demographic survey, but residents will also be asked to circle an income bracket for their household. This survey will be confidential and we

wouldn't ask for it except that we must have an accurate count of all low-to-moderate income households within the city limits in order for Tahoka to qualify for the Texas Dept. of Agriculture Community Development Block Grant funds," he added.

The survey will ask about the number of people living in the household, numbers of males/females, ethnicity and household income (by choosing an income bracket in the survey). No personal identifying information will be

sought, except that the home's address must be on the form.

"The city is applying for the CDBG grant funds to drill new wells that supplement our city water system," Webster explained. "Because the wells supplement the entire city system, the survey data must also be city-wide, and as I said all data we have on the northern portion of the city is outdated. We ask our citizens to cooperate in this survey, so that we may complete our application for the grant funds."

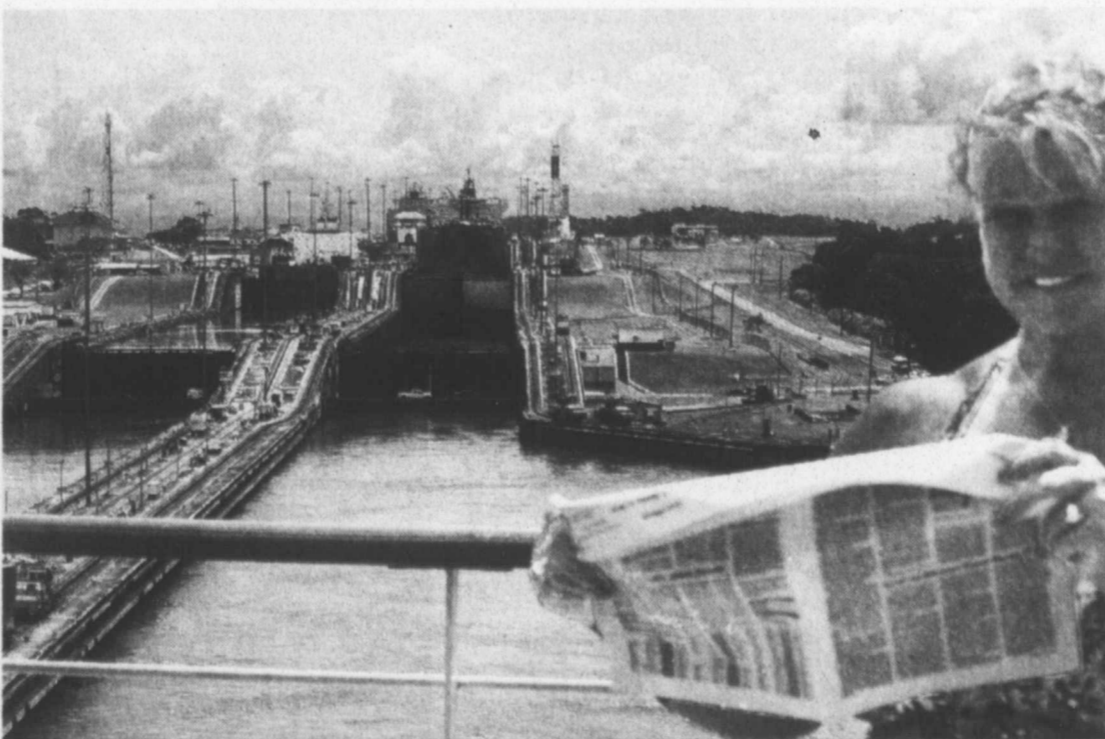

Lights Out

Xcel power outage affects area residents

Residents of Tahoka and Wilson were without power for nearly three hours Monday night, from just before midnight to 2:40 a.m. Tuesday, during rainy conditions that flooded some areas.

"The power outage was caused by a transmission outage that affected a singular circuit, which included all of Wilson and Tahoka residents," said Steve Deaton, Regional Community Manager with Xcel Energy. Xcel restored power at 2:40 a.m. to the 1729 customers affected.

The Xcel outage also affected approximately 3900 of Lyntegar Electric Cooperative's meters, which were off for 1-1.2 hours.

According to Ross Aten, Lyntegar's Manager of Engineering, "Xcel lost their 115 kV feed at the Lynn County Interchange. This knocked off the 69 kV transmission lines serving Lyntegar's New Home, Wilson, New Moore, Draw, and Central Substations, causing the outage. Xcel backfed the 69 kV transmission from the Garza County Interchange at Post and Brownfield Switching Station to get the five subs back on."

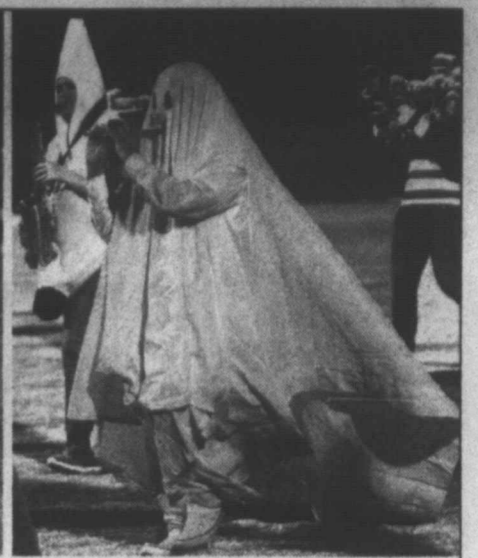

Book features Tahokans Dalton Wood, Red Harvick

A book recently released by former Plainview Daily Herald editor Danny Andrews features, among many others, former Lynn County News Editor and Publisher Dalton Wood (also a former Herald editor) and former Tahoka resident Red Harvick, a longtime basketball official.

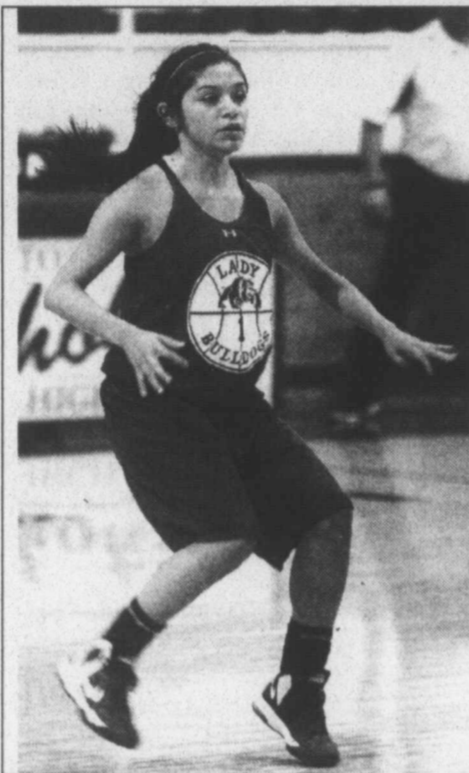
Drawing on his diverse life experiences as a journalist, sports broadcaster, basketball magazine publisher, sports official and active Christian layman and community member, former editor Danny Andrews has written a 442-page book of some 250 stories called "Things I Have Saw and Did." The title is derived from a grammatically challenged sports officiating friend and the subtitle "50 Years of Thinking Out Loud" from the name of his column at The Herald and his musings as alumni director at Wayland Baptist University.

The stories include his family; growing-up years in Plainview; longtime friends and chance encounters with celebri-

ties; experiences in school and Wayland; playing, officiating, reporting on and broadcasting sports; interesting Herald and Hearst newspaper colleagues and experiences; faith, church and mission ventures; and a collection of miscellaneous tales.

Andrews brings his subjects to life with vivid detail, humor and pathos, hoping to foster in readers memories of their own similar experiences, to take them vicariously to meet with presidents in the White House, confront cantankerous newspaper readers, share humorous glimpses of sports officiating and broadcasting, relate tales that prove this is a small world after all and, perhaps, encourage their own faith journey.

Career opportunities explained at TDCJ seminar

Current hiring opportunities and career benefits for Correctional Officers with the Texas Department of Criminal Justice will be presented at a hiring seminar on Thursday,

Nov. 6, at 6:30 p.m. at the Texas Tech University Health Science Center located at 3601 4th Street in Building #8, room 100 in Lubbock.

There will be booths and representatives from the Montford Unit (Lubbock), the Smith Unit (Lamesa), the Rudd Unit (Brownfield) and the Daniel Unit (Snyder) with additional representation from different departments such as Laundry/Food Service, Maintenance, Transportation, Agribusiness, Chaplaincy, Parole and others.

A recruiter will be on hand to explain the current pay plan, outline the employee benefits and retirement program, explain the duties and requirements of a Correctional Officer and answer questions. A \$4,000 recruiting bonus is available for new Correctional Officers who agree to work at one of 15 units across the state.

Olton Mustangs bounce Tahoka Bulldogs 27-13

The Olton Mustangs broke a halftime deadlock and went on to defeat the Tahoka Bulldogs 27-13 here last Friday.

The loss left Tahoka at 2-7 for the year and 0-4 in district, with the final game for Tahoka scheduled at unbeaten Abernathy this week.

Olton scored touchdowns on four pass plays, three of them caught by Bryan Valencia, including the game's opening score late in the first quarter, a 73-yard strike thrown by Kyle Peggram.

Early in the second quarter, Tahoka tied the score when Dillon Trevino ran 6 yards, followed by an extra point kick by Ryan Mendez.

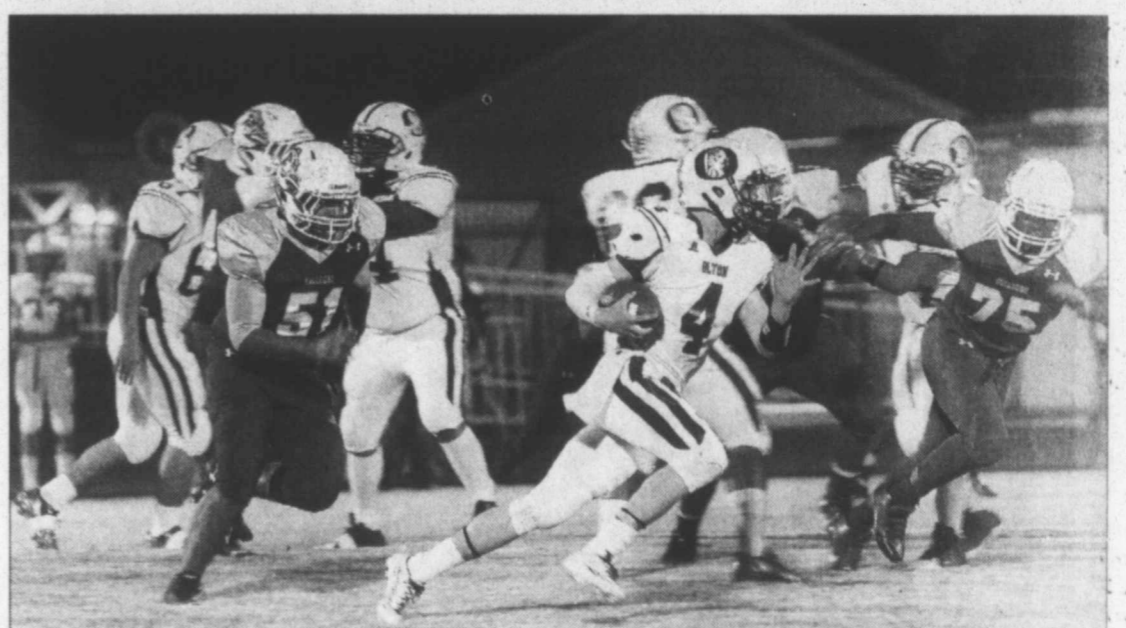
Olton scored twice in the third period, both on passes from T.J. McCall, making it 21-7 after three quarters.

Trevino scored his second touchdown of the night with 6:47 left in the game, going 11 yards, and after the extra point failed, Tahoka trailed 21-13. Near the end of the game, an Olton short pass play made the final score 27-13.

Luke Fleenor led Tahoka ball-carriers with 99 yards on 16 efforts. Trevino had 66 yards in 15 carries. Roman Parmer completed 6 of 16 passes for 48 yards, with no interceptions. Hadley Reynolds caught 2 passes for 33 yards for the Bulldogs.

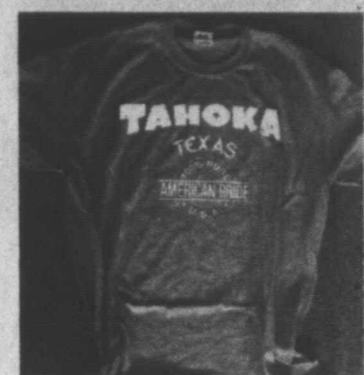

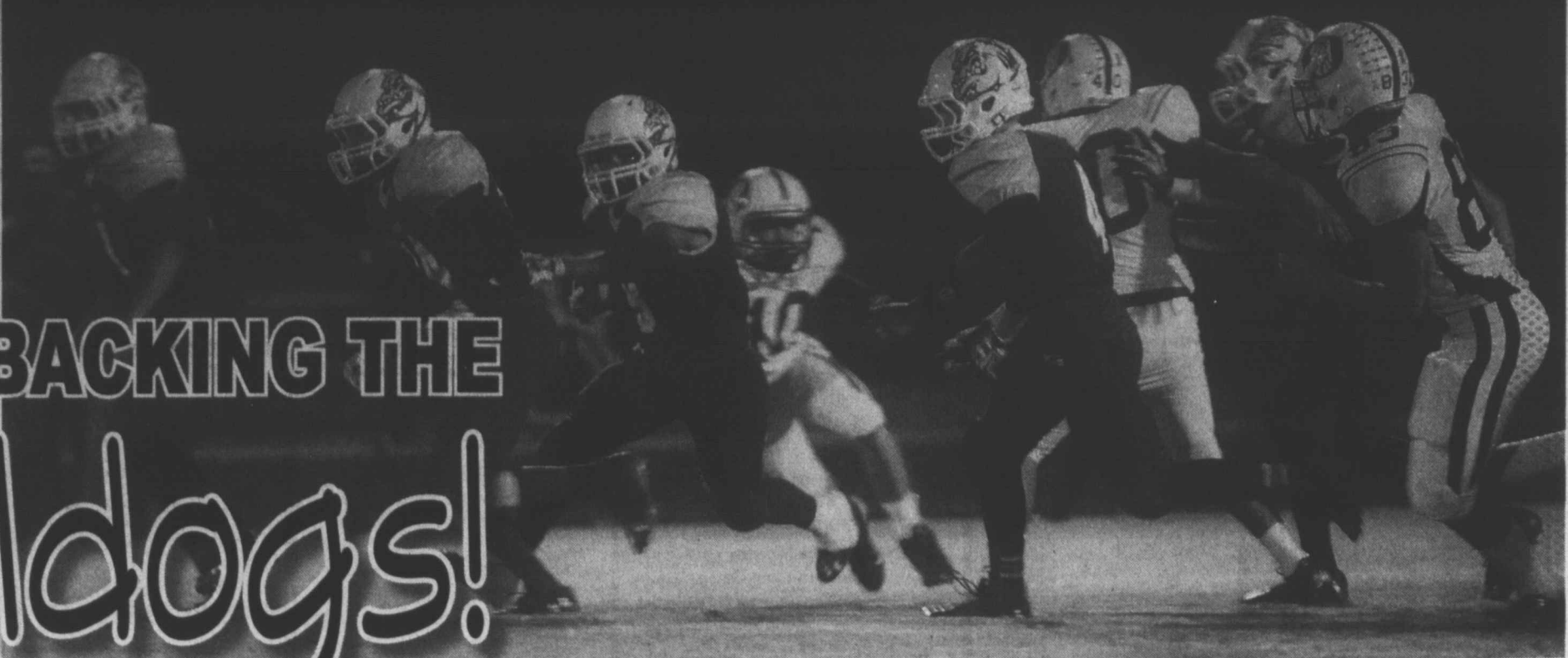

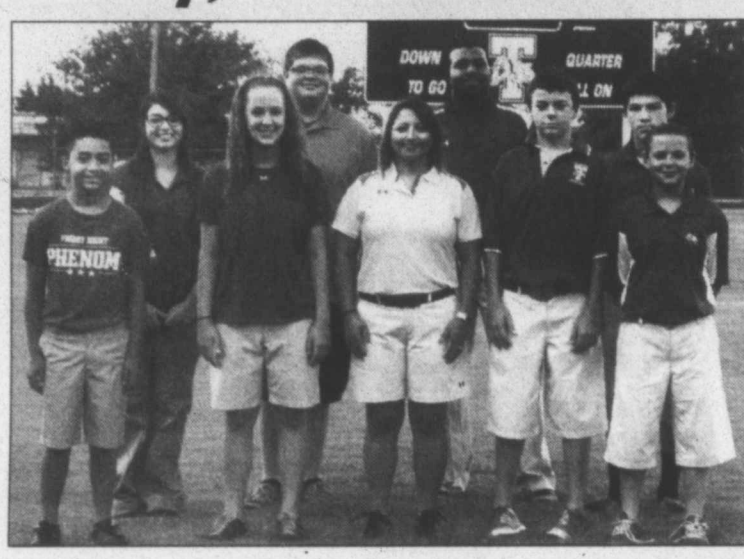
