The most encouraging thing about the 12 -week experiment by researchers from the University of Birmingham was that drinking water is the easiest way to lose weight.
(The university is in Alabama, but the study was not directed by Drs. Billy Bob and Bubba).
The research project "involved 84 obese adults." (That's college-speak for fat, 'y'lll). Those who drank 500 ml of water 30 minutes before a meal lost almost 10 pounds more than participants who did not drink water. Tap water, not sparking water, soda, or sports drinks, was the only beverage allowed for. the study.
Dr. Helen Parretti, a clinical lecturer at the university, said ${ }^{\text {this: }}$ "The
"The beauty of these findings is in the simplicity. Just drinking a pint of water, three times a day, before your main meals may help reduce your weight... Losing a few extra pounds over the course of a vear can besigh it's a simple messaze that has to help with that weight loss. It's a simple message that
Well, gee, my doctor never told me drinking water wo help me lose weight. He probably figured I would resent the suggestion that $I$ was too fat, and perhaps feared $I$ might waddle out of his office in a huff and seek a second opinion. I wouldn't have done that, unless I could have found a blind physician. 1 am reminded of the story of two men brought before a judge for fighting.
