County attorney files for re-election

Lynn County Attorney Rebekah Filley has officially filed for re-relection, completing the application process to file on the Republican ticket during the past week, according to John Baker, Lynn County Republican Chairman. Baker says he is anticipating more candidates for other county positions, but that the candidates have not yet completed the filing process. Candidates have until Dec. 14 to file for a place in the March 1 Primaries.

No one has filed locally on the Democratic ticket, according to County Party Chairman Heather Jester.

Filing previously for local positions, on the Republican ticket, are Donna Willis, for another term as County Tax Assessor/Collector; Matthew S. Woodley for Commissioner Precinct 1; Don Blair for another term as Pct. 3 Commissioner; and Abraham Vega for County Sheriff.

No changes have been added during the past week to the slate of three candidates for the 106th District Attorney position, all of whom filed earlier. They are Michael Munk (incumbent), Philip Mack Furlow, and Roxanne Cofer Cox, all on the Republican ticket. The 106th Judicial District includes Lynn, Garza, Dawson and Gaines counties.


The Republican and Democratic Primary elections will be held in March 2016, with the winners from the primaries having a place on the ballot in the November 2016 Election.

Crime takes a break this week

It was a good week for Tahoka and Lynn County during the past week, at least in regards to any criminal activity. Law enforcement officials had few reports, with Tahoka Police reporting only two arrests on outstanding warrants.

One arrest was for four traffic warrants on a Tahoka woman, including no drivers license, no proof of insurance, expired motor vehicle inspection, and expired registration. One man was arrested for active warrants on aggravated assault and criminal mischief in Lynn County.

Lynn County Jail had 43 inmates, including 3 for Dawson County, 24 for Ector, and 16 for Lynn County, including charges of tampering with physical evidence, child support, no drivers license, and one for possession of marijuana.

Citizens urged to mow weeds, remove rubbish from property

Officials at the City of Tahoka are reminding citizens to mow weeds and remove all junk or rubbish from their property, to comply with city ordinances. Dale Summers has been hired as the new employee for the city's Code Enforcement Office, and he will be canvassing the city to target areas that need to be addressed by homeowners.

Summers says that if a property is identified in violation of city codes, he will notify the resident that they have a certain number of days to comply (usually 10 days, depending on the

code violation). If the issue is not resolved within 10 days, the matter will be sent to Municipal Court Judge Steve McKay and property owners may be fined.

"We are asking residents to take a look around their property and clean it up before we have to ask them to comply with city ordinances," said Summers this week. "These ordinances are in place not only to beautify our city but also for health and safety reasons. Please take the time to maintain your property," he added.



URLE PETTIT, former editor of the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal, wrote a piece recently about the beauty of autumn. 

It is an open air train, so anyone planning to ride should wear coats or other winter weather gear.






