

Good crowd attends County Stock Show

good crowd turned out for the 2016 Lynn County Stock Show last week, as county youth demonstrated their showmanship skills in exhibiting pigs, goats, lambs and steers to win awards as well as cash prizes in Saturday's sale.

The annual event requires many hours of planning and preparation by the Lynn County Stock Show Association and numerous volunteers to help put on the show, as well as the support of county commissioners and sponsors who generously contribute to the show. Bill Miller, Jason Spence and Shiloh Braddock shared auctioneering duties at this year's event. Slate May and Brady Askew were announcers for the show.

This year marked the 38th year of the Sale at the stock show, as the first sale was held in 1978, according to show sponsors - and it was also Bill Miller's 38th year of auctioneering at this year's sale. This was the 78th annual county stock show, with the first one held in 1938, but it wasn't until 1978 that the show added the sale to the event. At that first sale, a total of just over \$41,600 was raised, according to stock show records. Last year, the sale brought in \$184,860, and this year's sale tally is still being counted as additional add-ons come in.

Grand Champion winners at this year's show included Connor Cook, representing New Home FFA, who showed the Grand Champion Barrow; Jared Green, Tahoka FFA, Grand Champion Steer; Kyley Gill, New Home FFA, Grand Champion Lamb; and Ian Cobb, New Home FFA, Grand Champion Wether Goat. Two new divisions were added to this year's show for the younger events, with Kalee Jordan showing the Grand Champion Miniature Hereford, and Bryce Gill showing the Grand Champion Pee Wee Goat. Both represented New Home FFA as well.

Reserve Grand Champion winners included Celee Smith of Lynn County 4-H (Lamb), Dane Armes of New Home FFA (Barrow), Jace Jordan of Lynn Co. 4-H (Steer), Kalee Jordan of New Home FFA (Pee Wee Goat), Jadyn Woodley of Tahoka FFA (Miniature Hereford), and Ian Cobb of New Home FFA (Wether Goat).

The 2016 Stock Show was dedicated to Math and Linda Bartley in appreciation for their longtime support of Lynn County youth at this annual event. During the presentation, Bill Miller noted that this was the first time that a second generation family member had been awarded the honor, referring to the fact that Math's parents, Edward and Dean Bartley, had

previously won in years past.

Brook Tyson won the Overall Showmanship award at the show, as well as Senior Steer Showmanship. Ashton Link won Senior Swine Showmanship, Celee Smith won the Senior Lamb Showmanhip, and Ian Cobb won the Senior Goat Showmanship award. In the junior division, Lainee Cook won the Junior Swine Showmanship; Jace Jordan, Junior Steer Showmanship; Kyley Gill, Junior Lamb Showmanship; and Kaylee Walker, Junior Goat Showmanship.

Two new divisions were added to this year's show, with Jadyn Woodley winning the Miniature Hereford Showmanhip, and Bryce Gill winning the Pee Wee Goat Showmanship award.

The Wacie Barnett Memorial Scholarship was awarded to Hadley Reynolds, presented by the Russel Barnett family. Hadley is a senior at Tahoka High School, and the son of Bryan and Paula Reynolds. The Danae Donald Scholarship, given in memory of Danae Donald, by her parents,

Pay property taxes by Jan. 31 or face additional interest fees

Lynn County property owners who have not yet paid their 2015 property taxes have a little over one week left if they plan on getting by with no additional fees, interest or penalties tacked on their original bills.

January 31 is the deadline to pay property taxes. However, because Jan. 31 falls on a Sunday this year, the Lynn County Appraisal District will accept payments without a penalty through 5 p.m. Monday, Feb. 1. After that, the late payment fees, penalties and interest begin to add up quickly.

Those who wait until after Feb. 1 will pay an additional seven percent in penalties and interest. Every month following that, the penalties and interest go up by two percent through June when

the penalty fee remains at 15 percent. Property owners who want to

pay their taxes in person have until 5 p.m. Monday, Feb. 1 to pay their taxes (without additional interest) at the Lynn County Appraisal District office, located at 1615 Main Street in Tahoka. If paid by mail, taxes must be postmarked by Jan. 31 to avoid penalties.

There is an option for homeowners over age 65 or disabled, to pay their taxes in four installments instead of a one-time full payment. To make the installment payments, the homeowner must notify the Appraisal District before the end of January, by phone or in person, of their intent to pay their tax bill in this method. The first payment is due by the end of January, with the other three payments due in March, May and July. For more information, contact the Appraisal Office at 806-561-5477.


Path of a Property Tax Dollar





Four vehicle accidents, inlast Wednesday, Jan. 13, with the first one reported at 10:23 a.m. on County Road 1, about a half mile west of a shooting range in northern Lynn County. Officers said that a 1996. Ford pickup driven by Joseph Gragert, 28, hit a muddy ditch and rolled over, but the driver and his passenger were apparently not injured.

At 4:10 that afternoon, Kevin Palos, 19, of Big Spring, suffered reportedly minor injuries when his Ford Explorer rolled over in the median as he was driving southbound on US 87 about 3 miles north of Tahoka. The hood of the vehicle caved in during the rollover, but officers on the scene said that Palos was able to get himself out of the vehicle before they arrived. He was transported by Lynn County EMS to a hospital for observation of his injuries, which included some gashes on his head.

On Thursday evening, a 2013 Ford Pickup was damaged when it hit a deer three miles south of Tahoka on US 87 at 6:56 p.m. John Ray Givins, 64, was the driver. Officers reported the truck sustained too much damage to be driven, and called a wrecker to haul it off, but no injuries were reported.

On Friday, a semi-truck rolled over on US 87 near County Road 34, just north of O'Donnell. The truck overturned in the median at 4:14 a.m. No injuries were reported, and the driver's name was un-

Deputies investigated a case of vandalism in Wilson that occurred at midnight Saturday. Mary Garcia, at 1506 13th St., reported that she was in her living room when she heard a loud crack at the front window, and discovered someone had shot a bb gun at the window, breaking the outside window pane but not the interior pane. An officer who was in the area stopped a suspicious vehicle and a suspect is being questioned in the case.

Two cases of domestic violence were investigated on Monday. On Monday evening, a 32-year-old male was arrested on charges of disorderly conduct at a residence west of New Home after an altercation with his wife, when he attempted to slash her car tires with a knife. When officers arrested the man they had to first take him to the hospital to be treated for a cut on his hand, and then they took him to jail. And at 11:35 p.m., deputies were called to a home in Wilson where a father and juvenile son were reported in a verbal altercation. The juvenile had left the scene and officers were unable to locate him. No arrests were made.

Eleven inmates were added to the Lynn County Jail during the past week, including six being held for Ector County, one for a grand jury indictment out of Dawson County, one for an arrest made by the Game Warden for a hunting provisions violation, one for public intoxication, and one for driving while intoxicated second offense. Total inmate population included 22 for Ector County, 17 for Lynn, and one for Dawson County.


