Lmimanaluous Tun County voters elected Abraham Vega for Lynn County Sheriff in Thesday's Republican Primary, choosing the longtime Lynn County Vote of $977-432$ Deputy over challenger Albert Flores, also a LCSO deputy, resulted in a runoff betwother hotly-contested race, for 106th District Allorney

Mack Furlow. Furlow led the ticket with 3,210 votes and Munk had 2,562 in a three-way race for the seat in the 106th Judicial District that includes Lynn, Garza, Gaines and Dawson counties.

Because there was no Democratic candidate for sheriff, Vega will be unchallenged in the November General Election, and will take office on January 1, 2017. He is currently the Chief Deputy at LCSO, and will succeed
