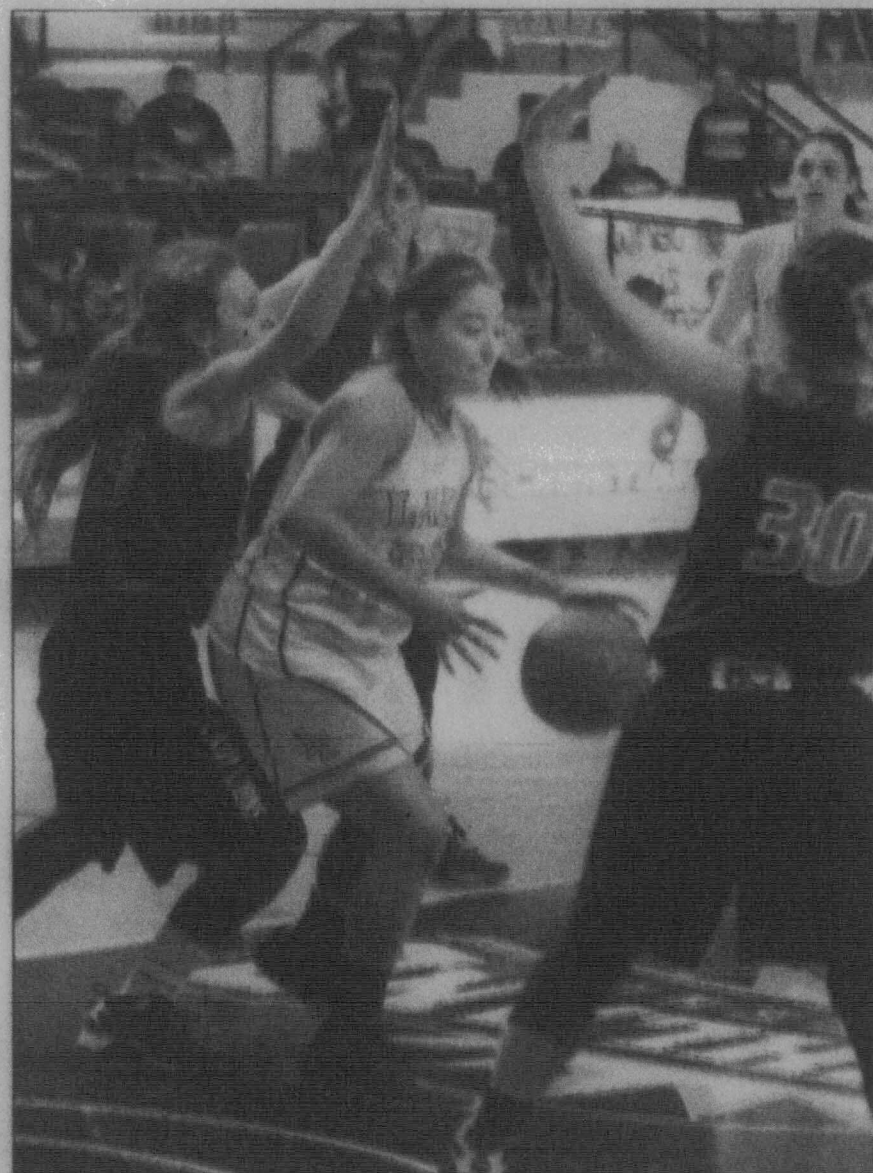

## O'Donnell's Lady Eagles end hoop season at Reg. Tourney

After finishing last season just one game short of the state tournament, this year's O'Donnell Lady Eagles have been on a mission.

With many of those players back from last year's Region II-1A runners-up, and with last year's regional champion Garden City getting upset last week, many looked at Coach Terry Collins' Eagles as one of the teams to beat on their return trip to the regional tournament at Abilene Christian University.

For the third time in the past four seasons, however, the Lady Eagles finished their hoop season in that tournament by falling to the Roby Lions, 52-37, on Friday night.

Adding to the Eagle girls' frustrating finish is the fact they ended their season by falling to a team that they beat 49-36 this past December in the Borden County tournament at Gail.

"No doubt tonight's frustrating," OHS Coach Terry Collins said shortly after the loss.

"One of our goals all season has

been to get to state. Right now, this is one of those nights where we're all wondering what we could have done to make this night better for us. Probably the most frustrating part about this game right now is just that we could have done a better job in that second half of just putting that ball in the basket."

The Eagle girls led 7-5 at the end of the first quarter and 21-15 at the half. Things started to turn in the second half as Roby outscored O'Donnell 19-9 in the third quarter to go up 34-30. Roby outscored the Eagles 18-7 in the final period.

Roby's all-everything guard Isabell Carrion led the Lions' attack against O'Donnell with 17 points.

Eagle junior Selena Castro had 11 points to lead all OHS scorers. After recently sustaining a knee injury, Castro exemplified the Eagles' grit and toughness.

"Our trainers told us that they haven't seen many kids keep playing like Selena did with the type of injury that she's been facing," Collins said. "After playing 36 minutes the other

## ELECTION RESULTS Abraham Vega elected Sheriff; runoff race set for DA seat

Lynn County voters elected Abraham Vega for Lynn County Sheriff in Tuesday's Republican Primary, choosing the longtime Lynn County Sheriff's Deputy over challenger Albert Flores, also a LCSO deputy, by a vote of 977-432. Another hotly-contested race, for 106th District Attorney, resulted in a runoff between current DA Michael Munk and challenger Philip Mack Furlow. Furlow led the ticket with 3,210 votes and Munk had 2,562 in a three-way race for the seat in the 106th Judicial District that includes Lynn, Garza, Gaines and Dawson counties.

Because there was no Democratic candidate for sheriff, Vega will be unchallenged in the November General Election, and will take office on January 1, 2017. He is currently the Chief Deputy at LCSO, and will succeed Sheriff Jerry D. Franklin, who declined to run in this year's election.

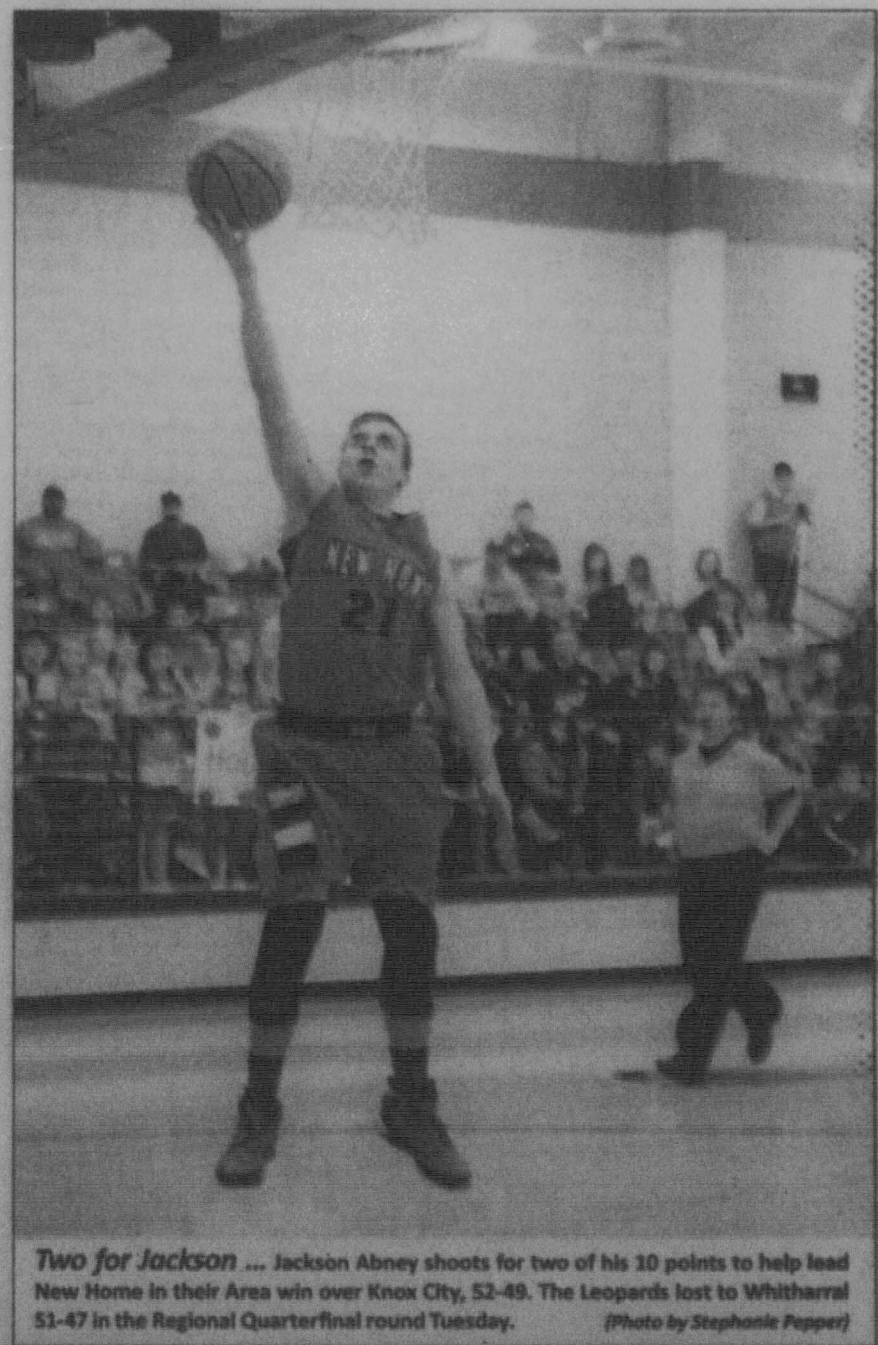
"I appreciate your vote of confidence and I pledge to serve as your Sheriff to the best of my abilities. Thank you for this opportunity," said Vega shortly after election results

were posted.

A total of 1,456 Lynn County citizens (39% of 3,766 registered voters) marked ballots in the Republican Primary, including 425 in early voting. Only 8 county citizens voted in the Democratic Primary, most likely due to the fact that all local races were on the Republican ticket.

In the DA race in the Republican Primary, Philip Mack Furlow, with 3,210 votes, edged out Munk

The fire started between 2 p.m. and 2:15 p.m. Wilson firefighters prevented the fire from spreading to other buildings, and expected that the fire may smolder and burn for several more days. Crews remained on scene to monitor the situation.

The mote plant suffered earlier losses from fire on Sunday, Feb. 7, when a large fire consumed multiple warehouses and the plant office, with Wilson VFD requesting assistance from other area fire departments.

**Grant Garvin wins \$10,000 scholarship**

Tahoka High School senior Grant Garvin participated in the 2016 San Antonio Stock Show Junior Sale Trap Shoot on February 19-21, winning a \$10,000 scholarship for his efforts.

Grant, 18, son of Daniel and Tiffanie Garvin of Tahoka, shot a perfect score of 100 on Friday the 19th, which automatically put him into the finals on Sunday morning. The finals consisted of the top five scores out of 811 participants. The five all shot scores of 100, which is the first time in the four-year event's history that this has happened. The top three shooters in the shootoff would receive a scholarship of \$10,000. Grant secured a top three placing after the first round of 25 shots and was assured the scholarship. He then shot two more rounds of 25 only dropping one bird to win Reserve Champion.

This was the second scholarship Grant has won in recent months. At the Heart of Texas Waco Stock show in October, Grant was the overall winner claiming the top prize of \$1000.

Last week's tournament was the first of the year and Grant will be shooting in close to a dozen ATA and 4H tournaments in the coming months. Anybody wanting to learn more about what 4H shooting has to offer can come out to Palmer's Gun Club and see for yourself. Practice on Monday's at 5:00 has begun and will continue into June until the District tournament has been shot," said Daniel Garvin.

by 648 votes, but only carried 48.5% of the total votes cast in the four-county 106th district and now faces a runoff with current DA Michael Munk, who had 2,562 votes (38.7%). A candidate must carry 50% of the total votes cast to win an election. The other candidate, Roxanne Cox, had 838 total votes (12.6%).

Furlow also led the Lynn County Republican ballot with 712 votes (55%), followed by Munk with 479. Breakdown by counties is as follows:

Lynn County: 712 Furlow, 479 Munk, 103 Cox.  
Garza County: 432 Munk, 382 Furlow, 141 Cox.  
Gaines County: 1194 Furlow, 682 Munk, 313 Cox.  
Dawson County: 969 Munk, 922 Furlow, 281 Cox.

The runoff between Munk and Furlow will be held May 24. Whoever wins the runoff election will be the next District Attorney, as there are no Democratic candidates for the seat and the Republican candidate will be unchallenged in the November General Election.

Late Tuesday night, Furlow was unavailable for comment, but Munk made the following statement:

"I knew it would be close," Munk told *The News*. "But I'll need to work that much harder to get my message out. Thank you to all my supporters and we will not give up the fight," he added.

Matt Woodley won the Precinct 1 County Commissioner seat, by a vote of 199-152 over Glenn Heinrich. Woodley will be unchallenged on the Democratic side in the November General Election, and he will take office on Jan. 1, 2017.

In the District 19 U.S. Representative race, Glen Robertson led the Republican ticket in Lynn County ballots, with 451 votes. Jodey Arrington had 360 votes, and Michael Bob Starr carried 167 votes. Other candidates included 95 for Jason Corley, the candidate from Lynn County; 86 Donald May; 83 Greg Garrett; 32 DeRenda Warren; 24 John Key; and 23 Don Parrish.

In the presidential race, Lynn County citizens voted for Ted Cruz on the Republican ticket, casting 678 votes for Cruz, 294 for Donald Trump, 182 for Marco Rubio, and 92 for Ben Carson, with a handful of votes for others. As of

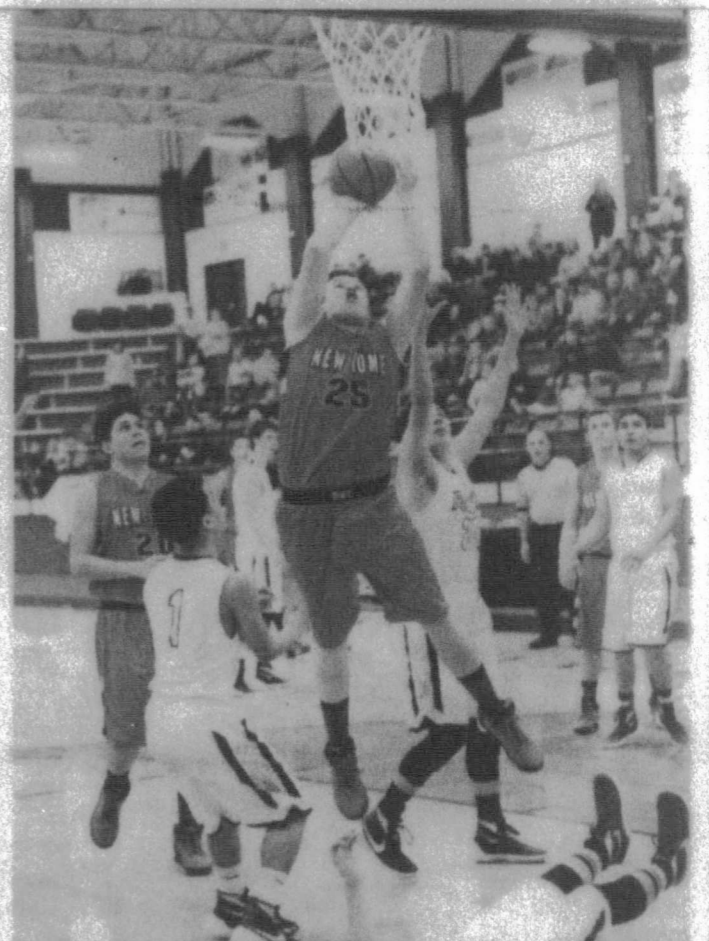
Local uncontested races on the Republican Primary included Rebekah Filley for County Attorney with 1,104 votes, Donna Willis for Tax Assessor/Collector with 1,166 votes, Don Blair for Pct. 3 Commissioner with 224 votes, and John Baker for County Republican Chairman with 1,109 votes.

County voters approved all four propositions on the Republican ballot, 951-322 for Prop. 1; 708-564 for Prop. 2; 1,027-252 for Prop. 3; and 1,146-96 for Prop. 4. In the Democratic Primary, the 7 voters who marked ballots in Lynn County approved all six referendums.

**New Home Coach Shane Moore named Coach of the Year**

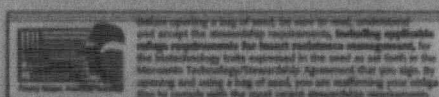
